IT'S ELECTRIC—The Rays continue a six-game homestand against the Rangers (3-0) and Marlins (three to play) today at Steinbrenner Field...are 6-2 in their last eight games, 12-3 in their last 15, 14-6 in their last 20, 17-8 in their last 25, 19-11 in their last 30 and 24-15 in their last 39 following a 9-14 start...are 12-4 over a span in which 15 of 19 games will take place at home (May 19–June 8), after which 59 of their remaining 97 games (60.8%) will be on the road...have won the first three games in a stretch of three straight series (9G) vs. sub-500 clubs (TEX, MIA, BOS)...12 of their previous 14 opponents entered with a .500 or better record (April 14–June 1)...are third in the AL/sixth in MLB in run differential (+47)...are a season-high four games above .500 for the first time since the end of 2023 (99-63)...have been above .500 for a season-high nine consecutive days...are tied with the Blue Jays for second in the AL East, 5.5 GB the division-leading Yankees (38-23)...have had at least a share of second place in 10 of the last 12 days since May 25...held fourth place for 16 consecutive days from May 8-23...have spent two days in first, 14 in second, 19 in third, 30 in fourth and four in fifth.

★ The Rays recovered from a 3-1 deficit in the 9th inning in last night's 4-3 walk-off win over the Rangers, securing their third series sweep of the season and second in their last three home sets (also: May 23-25 vs. TOR)...it marked their first sweep over Texas since Sept. 17-19, 2018 at Globe Life Park and was their first time completing a sweep in walk-off fashion since Aug. 16-18, 2024 vs. AZ.

★ Tampa Bay's five walk-off wins are tied for third most in MLB (BOS/MIA - 6)...it took the Rays 62 games to reach five walk-offs, their fewest since 2008 (55G).

★ The Rays have won 10 straight games when scoring four runs or more, and their 26-6 (.813) record in such games is tied for fifth in the majors.

★ Tampa Bay has scored first in three straight, six of eight, 10 of 13 and 16 of its last 23 games after doing so in only 12 of its first 39 games to begin the season...the club has won nine of its last 10 games when playing the opening tally, and its 21-7 (.750) record when scoring first ranks second in the AL behind the Tigers (28-6/.824).

★ The Rays are unbeaten in their last five series (4-0-1), their longest stretch since going 5-0-2 from July 9–Aug. 2, 2024, and have won five straight home sets...they have won four consecutive series openers, their longest streak since June 21–July 2, 2024 (4)...their last longer streak was nine straight from July 25–Aug. 22, 2023.

FADE TO ZACK—The Rays have won each of Zack Littell's last seven starts, with the righty going 5-0 with a 2.96 ERA (45.2IP, 12ER), 1.01 WHIP and .249 (42-for-134) opp. average in that span, tallying 27 strikeouts and four walks...it marks the longest team winning streak in a Rays pitcher's starts since Tampa Bay won eight straight Shane McClellanahan starts to open the 2023 season (March 30–May 8, 2023) and is tied for the fifth-longest streak in franchise history...the longest is 11 starts, set by Matt Moore from 2012-13...Littell's streak is tied with STL Miles Mikolas for the longest active run in the majors.

★ Littell is coming off his first career complete game on May 31 at HOU, the first by a Ray since Ryan Yarbrough on June 3, 2021 at NYY.

HERO OF THE DAY—Last night, Taylor Walls recorded the seventh walk-off, infield single in franchise history and the first that plated multiple runs...since play-by-play data is fully available (1974), it marked the third walk-off, multi-run, infield single in the majors, joining COL Seth Smith on Sept. 9, 2009 vs. CIN and CIN Chris Denorfia on July 15, 2006 vs. COL (Stats Perform)...it marked Walls' third career walk-off plate appearance and second this season, joining May 20 vs. HOU (sacrifice fly)...he is one of seven AL hitters with multiple walk-off PA this season...it was also the Rays second multi-run, infield single in as many games, joining Jake Mangum on May 4 vs. TEX—no other club has multiple such hits in 2025...the victory marked the Rays second win this season when trailing by multiple runs entering the 9th inning, joining April 19 vs. NYY—the Rays, Dodgers (3) and Diamondbacks (2) are the only clubs with multiple such wins...the Rays rank among AL leaders in walk-off wins (T2nd, 5) and last-at-bat wins (T3rd, 9), going 8-2 in their last 10 games decided in the final at-bat...they lead the majors in wins when trailing after seven (6) and eight (4) frames.

CHASING LIGHT—This marks the 14th time the Rays will play a series of three games or more consisting entirely of day games, including the fifth instance at home (Stats Perform)...three of the previous four were season-opening series (2025 vs. COL, 2023 vs. DET, 2022 vs. BAL), with the lone exception coming from April 9-11, 2021 vs. NYY...the club is 14-10 in day games, going 9-3 in its last 12 dating back to May 3 at NYY on the heels of a 5-7 start...the Rays have won three straight daytime affairs at Steinbrenner Field (8-7 overall).

RIDE THE LIGHTNING—The Rays have outscored opponents, 88-31 (+57), during their 12-3 stretch, their best mark over any 15-game span since April 5-21, 2023 (+58)...only the Tigers (2x, last: +60 from April 23–May 9) have recorded a better run differential over any 15-game span this season...during that stretch (since May 20), the Rays lead MLB in run differential, runs per game (5.9), runs allowed per game (2.1), slugging pct. (.472), OPS (.805), HR (24), XBH (55), RBI (83), SB (25), opp. average (.202), opp. on-base pct. (.257), opp. OPS (.579) and WHIP (0.95).

MASTERS OF PITCHING—The Rays staff has allowed 3 ER or fewer in a team-record 13 straight games, the longest single season streak in the majors since a 15-game stretch by the Astros from Aug. 23–Sept. 9, 2022...since the streak began on May 23, the Rays have pitched to a 1.71 ERA (115.2IP, 22ER) and 0.93 WHIP while holding opponents to a .196/.252/.303 (89-for-416) line—all marks except the opp. slugging pct. (2nd behind SF - .293) lead the majors in that span...the club has also allowed four runs or fewer in 16 straight games, tying the longest single-season streak in franchise history (also: Sept. 16–Oct. 3, 2021) and tied for third longest in the majors since 2018 (see table to the right).

★ Rays pitching has recorded 10 SO or more in a season-high-tying four straight games, joining April 12-15...they reached the mark four times in their previous 18 games combined (May 13-31)...their last longer streak was five games from Sept. 22-27, 2024.

★ Rays starters have yielded three runs or fewer in 16 straight outings dating back to May 19 vs. HOU, their longest streak since a 17-start run to conclude the 2024 campaign...the rotation has an MLB-best 1.99 ERA (99.1IP, 22ER) in that span.

★ The Rays bullpen has turned in a 1.86 ERA (48.1IP, 10ER) over the last 18 games since May 17, fourth in the majors behind the Cubs (0.82), Giants (1.63) and Blue Jays (1.74).

ENTER CAM-MAN—Junior Caminero has homered six times in his last eight games, going 12-for-32 (.375) while collecting 9 XBH (3 2B, 6HR) and 9 RBI with only 5 SO in that span...it took him 62 team games to record 15 HR—since the club became the Rays in 2008, only Logan Morrison (56G, 2017), Evan Longoria (60G, 2016) and Carlos Peña (44G, 2009) have reached the mark in fewer team games...since 1987, Caminero is one of four players age 21 or younger to reach 15 HR within his team's first 62 games, joining SD Fernando Tatis Jr. (17HR, 2020), FLA Giancarlo Stanton (15HR, 2011), FLA Miguel Cabrera (16HR, 2004) and STL Albert Pujols (19HR, 2001)...Caminero is on pace for 39 HR and 104 RBI—Peña is the only player in franchise history to reach those marks (46HR/121RBI in 2007)...two players have hit them in an age-21-or-younger season since 1901: Eddie Matthews of the Milwaukee Braves in 1953 (47HR/135RBI) and Mel Ott of the New York Giants in 1929 (42HR/151RBI).

★ Over his last 13 games since May 23, Caminero is batting .373 (19-for-51) while leading the majors in XBH (14), doubles (T1st, 7), total bases (47), RBI (20) and slugging (.922).

WELCOME HOME—The Rays have won nine of their last 10 games at Steinbrenner Field on the heels of a 3-13 stretch in their previous 16 from April 15–May 19...Brandon Lowe has a career-high 12-game home hitting streak, batting .409 (18-for-44) with 5 2B, 5 HR, 8 RBI and an .864 slugging pct...the last Ray with a longer home streak (single-season streaks only) was Avisail Garcia (16G) from May 10–June 29, 2019...Curtis Mead has hit safely in eight consecutive home games (.391/.59-for-23, 4XBH)...Jonathan Aranda's .375 (42-for-112) home average ranks third in MLB behind ATH Jacob Wilson (.285) and LAD Freddie Freeman (.376).

HERE COMES REVENGE—The Rays and Marlins continue the 2025 iteration of the Citrus Series this afternoon...the Rays lost two of three games from May 16-18 at loanDepot Park, their first series loss to Miami since July 20-22, 2018 at Tropicana Field...they went 3-1 vs. the Marlins last season and have won six of nine, 14 of 18, 17 of 22 and 26 of the last 32 matchups...Tampa Bay has won six straight season series over Miami (2019-24), the longest streak by either club in the history of the head-to-head series...min. 20 games, its 25-6 (.806) record against the Marlins since that streak began in 2019 is the second best by any team over a single opponent, trailing the Astros over the Rockies (17-3/.850).

★ Yandy Diaz is batting .337 (29-for-86) with 7 2B and 15 RBI in 23 career games vs. Miami, the fifth-highest average against the Marlins among active players (min. 75AB).

TODAY'S START—Zack Littell will make his 13th start of the campaign and seventh at home this afternoon...marks his 60th career start (215th appearance) and 31st at home (108th appearance)...is on a five-decision winning streak, the longest of his career as a starter...the Rays have won his last seven starts...has allowed three runs or fewer in nine straight starts, the longest single-season streak of his career...is 5-2 with a 2.97 ERA (57.2IP, 19ER) in those starts after going 0-3 with a 6.88 ERA (17.0IP, 13ER) over his first three...five of his last six starts have been quality...is in his second season as a full-time starter after joining the Rays rotation in July 2023...claimed off waivers from the Red Sox on May 12, 2023.

LAST TIME OUT—Littell earned his fifth win in his last seven starts after he tossed his first career complete game on May 31 at Daikin Park in Houston (W, 9.0IP, 10H, 3ER, BB, 6SO, 2HR)...allowed a leadoff home run to Jeremy Peña before setting down five of his next eight batters...Peña then hit his second long ball of the game in the 3rd inning, a two-run shot that resulted in a 3-3 tie...was tagged for a single in the 4th inning before he retired 11 straight batters from the 4th-8th frames...surrendered hits in each of the first four innings before getting through the 5th, 6th and 7th innings on just 23 pitches...finished the game with a career-high 117 pitches after receiving 12 runs of support in the final four frames.

- ✦ It was the 10th complete game in MLB this season and the first by a Rays pitcher since Ryan Yarbrough on June 3, 2021 at NYY.
- ✦ His career-high 117 pitches were the most by a Ray since Jake Odorizzi (118) on May 27, 2017 at MIN and most by a Ray in a CG since David Price (118) on Sept. 30, 2013 at TEX.
- ✦ He worked into the 7th inning or later for the fifth time this season... no other Rays pitcher has done so more than three times (Bradley).

GONE FISHING—Littell will be making his first career start/third appearance vs. the Marlins...the previous two came with the Giants in 2022...across 3.1 scoreless innings in his two relief outings against Miami, he allowed three hits with four strikeouts...he earned a hold in 1.1 innings in his first outing on April 10 in San Francisco and earned the win in with 2.0 innings of one-hit ball in the second contest on June 3 in Miami.

- ✦ In 29 games vs. NL East clubs, Littell has pitched to a 3-2 record with a 4.60 ERA (43.0IP, 22ER)...opponents have hit .273 (47-for-172) against him but he has fanned 39...the 4.60 ERA includes an 8.10 mark (10.0IP, 9ER) across three starts.

ALL I DO IS WIN—In his last seven starts, all Rays wins, Littell is 5-0 with a 2.96 ERA (45.2IP, 15ER)...it marks the longest team winning streak in a pitcher's starts since Tampa Bay claimed eight straight wins in games started by Shane McClellanahan from March 30–May 8, 2023...it ties the third-longest streak in an AL pitcher's starts this season behind runs by DET Jackson Jobe (8GS) and NYY Max Fried (8GS)...Littell has received three runs of support or more in six of seven starts during the streak (6.70 RSA)...he saw a total of four runs of support in his first five outings, all Rays losses (1.24 RSA)...he was 0-5 with a 5.28 ERA (29.0IP, 17ER) in those games.

- ✦ Dating back to last season's All-Star break, Littell is 10-9 with a 3.26 ERA (129.2IP, 47ER), 1.06 WHIP and .238 (115-for-484) opp. average over 22 starts...min. 100.0 IP, he ranks among AL leaders in that span in GIDP per 9.0 IP (4th, 1.11), walk rate (5th, 4.5%), fewest pitches per IP (5th, 14.7), opponent on-base pct. (11th, .277), WHIP (11th) and ERA (12th).
- ✦ Despite the recent boost in run support, he has still received 3.66 runs of support per 9.0 IP since the start of last season, tied for the seventh-lowest mark in the AL (min. 150.0IP).

HOMER (UN)HAPPY—Despite two of his last five starts being homerless, Littell has still allowed 16 HR, tied for second most in the majors with CHC Jameson Taillon behind TOR Bowden Francis (17)...he has yielded a homer in eight of his 12 starts, and 20 of the 32 runs against him (62.5%) have come via the long ball.

DIG DEEP—Opponents are batting .173 (14-for-81) against Littell with two outs compared to .286 (57-for-199) with one or zero outs...it marks the fourth-lowest two-out average among AL pitchers (min. 80 AB), trailing NYY Carlos Rodón (.129), HOU Framber Valdez (.135), and DET Tarik Skubal (.165)...opposing hitters are 10-for-40 (.250) against him with runners in scoring position, but have gone 3-for-17 (.176) with RISP and two outs.

MIDDLE FRAME DAZE—He has allowed 20 of his 32 runs (62.5%) in the 3rd (13) and 5th (7) frames...Littell has pitched to a 3.00 ERA (24.0IP, 8ER) and 0.96 WHIP in innings 1-2, a 5.40 ERA (35.0IP, 21ER) and 1.23 WHIP from innings 3-5, and a 1.72 ERA (15.2IP, 3ER) and 1.02 WHIP from the 6th inning on.

DON'T WALK THIS WAY—Since his Rays debut on May 16, 2023, Littell's 3.9 pct. walk rate ranks third in the majors (min. 1,000BF) behind SEA George Kirby (3.0%) and BAL Zach Eflin (3.5%)...he has issued one or zero walks in 45 of his 55 starts with the Rays and two walks or fewer in 52 of them.

2024 RECAP—Littell went 8-10 with a 3.63 ERA (156.1IP, 63ER) over 29 starts in his seventh major league season and second with the Rays, leading the club in starts and innings...posted his lowest ERA since 2021 (2.92) and ranked fifth in the AL (min. 150.0IP) in walk rate (4.7%)...went 5-3 with a 1.82 ERA (49.1IP, 10ER) over his final nine starts—entered that stretch at 3-7 with a 4.46 ERA (107.0IP, 53ER) through his first 20...recorded a 3.16 ERA (57.0IP, 20ER) in 10 starts against AL East opponents...had one stint on the 15-day IL (right shoulder fatigue) from Aug. 15–Sept. 1, missing 15 games...marked his first full season as a starter after joining the club's rotation in July 2023.
