TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY	
Sept. 28, 2022: Aaron Judge hits his 61st HR of the season at Toronto, tying Roger Maris (61HR in 1961) for the most home runs in a single season in American League history. The HR was hit in the seventh inning off Tim Lincecum.	
Sept. 28, 2008: On the season's last day in Game 1 of a doubleheader at Fenway Park, Mike Mussina records his 20th win, becoming the oldest pitcher in MLB history to win 20 games for the first time.	
Sept. 28, 1968: Mickey Mantle plays his final career game, starting for the Yankees at Boston's Fenway Park. Hitting third, he bats in the top of the first and pops out to Red Sox shortstop Rico Petrocelli before being replaced in the field at 1B by Andy Kosco.

ATA GLANCE: The Yankees will play their final game of the regular season with the final game of a three-game set vs. Baltimore (2-0 thus far)...are 5-0 on the homestand after sweeping the White Sox and winning their first two games vs. the Orioles.

- ▶ **Their 93-68 (.578) record is tied with Toronto (93-68, .578) for the best in the AL and the third-best in the Majors**, trailing only Milwaukee (96-65, .596) and Philadelphia (95-66, .590).
- ▶ Including their current series, have won 12 of their last 14 series (since 8/11).
- ▶ **Own a season-high-tying seven-game winning streak since 9/20 (also 7G from 8/24-30)...are 10-1 in their last 11 games (since 9/16), 13-3 in their last 16 games (since 9/11), 24-8 in their last 32 games (since 8/24), 29-11 in their last 40 games (since 8/15) and a Major League-best 33-14 in their last 47 games (since 8/6).**
- ▶ Their +163 run differential is the highest in the AL and the second-highest in the Majors, trailing only Milwaukee (+170).
- ▶ **Are a season-high 25G over .500.**
- ▶ Are 49-31 at home this season...marks their **34th straight winning season at home (since 1992)**...according to *Elias*, their streak is the second-longest in Major League history, trailing only their own 47-year streak from 1918-64.
- ▶ *With a win today and a Blue Jays loss*, the Yankees can clinch the AL East.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees won their season-high-tying seventh straight game with a 6-1 victory against the Orioles on Saturday at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Cam Schlichter** (7.0IP, 2H, 0R, 1BB, 9K, 2HP) made his final regular season start and earned his fourth win of the year after tossing 7.0 scoreless innings...**RF Aaron Judge** (2-for-4, 1R, 1HR, 3RBI) drove in three of the Yankees' six runs, hitting his 53rd home run of the season with a go-ahead solo home run in the first inning and a two-run single in the fifth inning...**DH Giancarlo Stanton** (2-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 1RBI, 1BB) reached base three times and hit his 24th home run of the year with a solo shot in the second inning...**3B Ryan McMahon** (2-for-3, 2R, 1HR, 1RBI) hit his 20th home run of the year with a solo shot in the second inning...**LF Cody Bellinger** (1-for-3, 1RBI) drove in a run in the fifth inning with a sac fly...**2B Jazz Chisholm Jr.** (0-for-2) left the game after being hit in the left forearm with a pitch in the fifth inning...the initial x-rays and CT scan were negative.

FAN-TASTIC: The Yankees recorded their 20th sellout of the season on Saturday with a paid attendance of 46,085...**their 20 sellouts this season match their second-most at the current Yankee Stadium, trailing only their 23 sellouts in 2018 (20 in 2011).**

- ▶ The Yankees have drawn 3 million fans at home for their Major League-record 25th straight season when there was full attendance (also 1999-2019, '22-24).
- ▶ **Have averaged 42,375 fans per home gate this year, marking the highest average home attendance in the AL and the third-highest in the Majors**, trailing only the Dodgers (49,537) and Padres (42,402)...have finished only one of their last nine full attendance seasons (since 2015) with a higher average attendance (averaged 42,998 fans in 2018).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters have hit a Major League-leading 272HR this season, 31 more than the next highest team (Los Angeles-NL: 241HR)...their 272HR this season are their second-most in a single season in franchise history and the sixth-most by any team in Major League history (see chart on left).

- ▶ **Yankees batters** have won each of their last three games they did not homer, four of their last five such games and five of their last seven.
- ▶ **Have hit a Major League-record 49HR in the first inning this year** (previous: Atlanta Braves' 47HR in 2023)...have scored in the first inning in a Major League-best 64 games this year...are 45-19 (.703) in those games.

STANTON ISLAND: DH/OF Giancarlo Stanton reached base three times and hit his 24th home run of the year with a solo shot in the second inning on Saturday vs. Baltimore...marked his 453rd career home run, surpassing Carl Yastrzemski for 40th place on the all-time home runs list.

- ▶ Has homered in consecutive games for the fifth time this season (also 2G from 7/25-26, 7/31-8/1, 8/11-12 and 8/19-20).
- ▶ Has hit .429/.500/1.143 (6-for-14) with 3R, 1 double, 3HR, 9RBI and 2BB over his last four games (since 9/24).
- ▶ Has hit 23HR in his last 60 games (since 7/8), the fifth-most in the Majors over that span.
- ▶ Is hitting .284/.352/.670 (56-for-197) with 34R, 7 doubles, 23HR, 58RBI, 20BB/31BB, 1HP and 1SF over his last 61G (since 7/6).

WINNING WAYS: The Yankees have recorded at least 90 wins for the seventh time in their last eight 162-game seasons (2017-19, '21-22, '24-25)...are one of only two teams to record at least seven 90-win seasons over that span, joining the Los Angeles Dodgers (eight: 2017-19, '21-25)...have recorded at least 90 wins in 22 of their last 29 full seasons since 1996 (1996-99, 2001-07, '09-12, '17-19, '21-22, '24-25)...their 22 seasons are the most in the Majors over that span (next: Atlanta-16).

- ▶ **The Yankees have clinched their 33rd consecutive winning season (since 1993), marking the second-longest streak in the four major sports (MLB/NFL/NBA/NHL)**, behind only their 39 straight winning seasons from 1926-64.
- ▶ *With a win today*, would match their 2024 win total.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 25 of their last 32 starts (since 8/24), going 19-5 with a 2.74 ERA (184.0IP, 56ER) and 168K over that span...have allowed 2ER-or-fewer in 38 of their last 48 starts (since 8/5), posting a Major League-best 2.89 ERA (270.2IP, 87ER) during that stretch.

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge drove in three of the Yankees' six runs on Saturday vs. Baltimore, hitting his 53rd home run of the season with a go-ahead solo home run in the first inning and a two-run single in the fifth inning...**his 20HR in the first inning this season are the most home runs in the first inning in a single season in Major League history**...28 of his 53HR this year have tied the game (four) or given the Yankees the lead (24)...**his 24 go-ahead home runs are the most in the Majors.**

- ▶ **Has hit at least 50HR in a single season for the fourth time in his career** (also 52HR in 2017, 62HR in 2022 and 58HR in 2024), tying the Major League record for most 50HR seasons...**is the fourth player — and second Yankee — to record four such seasons**, joining Sammy Sosa (4x: 1998-2001), Mark McGwire (4x: 1996-99) and Babe Ruth (4x: 1920-21, '27-28).

▶ **His Major League-leading 361BB this season are the most in AL history (since 1955 when IBB were first tracked)**...marks the most by any Major League player in a single season since 2010 when St. Louis' Albert Pujols recorded 381BB...**his 361BB are more than each of the other 29 Major League teams.**

- ▶ Has reached base safely in 135 of his 151 games this year, batting .331/.458/.691 (178-for-537) with 136R, 30 doubles, 2 triples, 53HR, 114RBI, 124BB/361BB, 7HP, 7SF and 125B...**leads the Majors in BA by 20 points, OBP by 62 points, SLG by 75 points and OPS by 143 points...his 10.1 WAR (FanGraphs) is 1.1 higher than the next highest player (Seattle's Cal Raleigh: 9.0 WAR)...**

▶ **would be only the third player in Major League history to hit at least 50HR and win a batting title in the same season, joining Mickey Mantle (1956) and Jimmie Foxx (1938)...**his 53HR would be the most by any player who has won a batting title...would also be only the fifth player in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to lead the Majors in BA, OBP and SLG in a single season...would join Miguel Cabrera in 2013, Barry Bonds in 2002, Larry Walker in 1999 and George Brett in 1980.

▶ Would become the fifth player in franchise history to lead the Majors in batting average...would join DJ LeMahieu (.364 BA in 2020), Mickey Mantle (.353 BA in 1956), Joe DiMaggio (.381 in 1939) and Lou Gehrig (.363 BA in 1934)...would also become the 10th player (11th time) in franchise history to win the AL batting title...would join Bernie Williams (1998), Paul O'Neill (1994), Don Mattingly (1984), Mickey Mantle (1956), Snuffy Stirrweiss (1945), Joe DiMaggio (1939-40), Lou Gehrig (1934) and Babe Ruth (1924).

▶ Is hitting .379/.541/.821 (36-for-95) with 34R, 3 doubles, 13HR, 21RBI, 33BB/71BB, 3HP, 2SF and 9SB over his last 29G (since 8/27).

- ▶ Has reached base multiple times in a Major League-leading and career-high 101 games this season (previous: 100G in 2024)...his 101 games are the second-most by a Yankee in the last 68 years (since 1958), trailing only Derek Jeter's 104G in 1999...is one of five Yankees to reach base multiple times in at least 100 games in a season, joining Babe Ruth (nine times), Lou Gehrig (seven times), Jeter and Mickey Mantle (once)...is one of only three AL players in the last 24 years (since 2002) to reach base multiple times in as many games, joining Mike Trout (106G in 2013) and Miguel Cabrera (111G in 2011).

▶ Has reached base multiple times in 15 of his last 16 games (since 9/11), including at least three times in nine of those games...is batting .451/.600/1.020 (23-for-51) with 21R, 2 doubles, 9HR, 16RBI, 20BB/61BB, 2HP, 2SF and 1SB over that stretch.

- ▶ Has hit 9HR over his last 16 games (since 9/11), 10HR over his last 18 games (since 9/9) and 13HR over his last 29 games (since 8/27).
- ▶ In 119 career games vs. Baltimore, has hit .322/.458/.738 (134-for-416) with 113R, 20 doubles, 51HR, 109RBI, 99BB/71BB, 7HP, 2SF and 55B...his 51HR against Baltimore are his most vs. any opponent...marks the most by any Major League player vs. a single opponent since 2017...also marks the most home runs among active players vs. Baltimore.

▶ His 1.117 OPS against the AL East is the third-highest by a player vs. his own division this year (min. 100PA), trailing only Texas' Corey Seager (1.160) and the Athletics' Nick Kurtz (1.131).

POSTSEASON BOUND: The Yankees have clinched their 60th playoff appearance in franchise history (123 seasons, 48.8%)...marks the Yankees' eighth postseason appearance in the last nine seasons (since 2017) and 26th trip to the postseason in the last 31 years (since 1995)...their 26 trips to the postseason since 1995 are the most in the Majors in that span, five more than the next highest team (Atlanta-21)...the next highest AL team is Boston (15) and Cleveland (15).

- ▶ The Yankees are one of only three teams to make the playoffs in at least eight of the last nine years (since 2017), joining the Dodgers (nine: 2017-25) and Astros (eight: 2017-24).
- ▶ **Manager Aaron Boone is the second manager in Major League history to reach the postseason in seven of his first eight seasons as manager** (credit: *Elias* - min. 2G manager per season), joining Dave Roberts (first 10 seasons with the Dodgers)...is the third manager to make the playoffs in seven of his first eight seasons with the Yankees, joining Joe Torre (each of his first 12) and Casey Stengel (nine of his first 10).
- ▶ The Yankees have seven players on their active roster who have not appeared in a postseason game: **RHP David Bednar, RHP Paul Blackburn, INF/OF José Caballero, RHP Fernando Cruz, C/INF Ben Rice, RHP Cam Schlichter and RHP Will Warren**...Rice was on the Yankees' 2024 ALDS roster but did not play.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP LUIS GIL (4-1, 3.29 ERA)

RHP Luis Gil will make his 11th and final regular season start this year in today's final regular season game vs. Baltimore...the 27-year-old will make the start on regular four day's rest...made his 10th start of the season on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL, allowing just 2R/ER in 6.0IP and did not record a decision (4H, 2BB, 3K, 1HR, 1WP)...**has allowed 2R-or-fewer in eight of his last nine starts (since 8/9), going 4-0 with a 2.59 ERA (48.2IP, 14ER) in that span**...has tossed at least 5.0IP in eight of those starts...in 10 starts this season, has gone 4-1 with a 3.29 ERA (52.0IP, 44H, 21R/19ER, 31BB, 39K, 3HR)...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the 60-day injured list on 8/3...made four combined rehab starts with Double-A Somerset and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, posting a 5.65 ERA (14.1IP, 11H, 9R/ER, 7BB, 24K, 4HR)...missed the first 111 games of the season on the 60-day injured list (3/24-8/3) with a right lat strain...was named the Jackie Robinson American League Rookie of the Year in 2024 after going 15-7 with a 3.50 ERA (151.2IP, 104H, 60R/59ER, 77BB, 171K, 18HR) in 29 starts for the Yankees...**was the 10th player and fourth pitcher in franchise history to be named the AL Rookie of the Year**...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 22 of his 29 starts, 2R-or-fewer in 18 of his starts and one-or-zero runs in 17 of his starts (including six scoreless starts)...**his 17 starts of one-or-zero runs allowed were the fourth-most by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in franchise history**, trailing only Jack Chesbro (18 starts in 1904), Whitey Ford (18 starts in 1964) and Ron Guidry (18 starts in 1978)...*Elias* notes his 17 such starts were the second-most in Major League history by any rookie pitcher in a single season (since 1893 when current mound distance was set, excluding openers), trailing only Philadelphia-NL's George McQuillan's 21 starts in 1908...**his 171K were the second-most by a Yankees rookie in a single season in franchise history, trailing only Russ Ford's 209K in 1910**...in 46 career Major League starts, has gone 20-9 with a 3.49 ERA (237.0IP, 173H, 96R/92ER, 129BB, 253K, 25HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 35 of his first 46 career starts and one-or-zero runs in 24 of those starts...was acquired by the Yankees from the Minnesota Twins in exchange for OF Jake Cave on 3/16/18...was originally signed by Minnesota as a non-drafted free agent on 2/13/15.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 10th start of the season on Tuesday vs. Chicago-AL, allowing just 2R/ER in 6.0IP and did not record a decision (4H, 2BB, 3K, 1HR, 1WP).

KING OF THE GIL: **Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in eight of his last nine starts (since 8/9), going 4-0 with a 2.59 ERA (48.2IP, 14ER) in that span**...has tossed at least 5.0IP in eight of those starts.

- ✦ Allowed 2R-or-fewer from 8/9-9/12, matching the longest such streak of his career (also owned a seven-start streak from 5/1-6/4/24).
- ✦ Has allowed 2R-or-fewer in eight of his 10 starts and 1R-or-fewer in four starts.
- ✦ Has allowed 1HR-or-fewer in each of his 10 starts this season and has not allowed a HR in seven starts, posting a 0.52 HR/9.0 ratio.
- ✦ Made his eighth start of the season on 9/12 at Boston, earning his fourth win of the season after tossing 6.0 hitless innings (4BB, 4K, 2WP, 1BK)...was the second Yankees pitcher this season to toss at least 6.0 hitless innings in a start, joining Clarke Schmidt (7.0IP/0H) on 6/21 vs. Baltimore.

HOME SWEET HOME: Will be making his sixth home start of the season today...in five starts at Yankee Stadium this year, has gone 2-0 with a 2.30 ERA (27.1IP, 7ER) and 19K...has allowed 2R-or-fewer in each of those starts and 1ER-or-fewer in three home starts.

- ✦ In 15 home starts last season, went 6-4 with a 3.57 ERA (75.2IP, 51H, 31R/30ER, 38BB, 93K, 11HR)...posted a .184/.294/.361 (51-for-277) slash line at Yankee Stadium in 2024...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 12 of his 15 home starts and one-or-zero runs in nine of those starts (three scoreless starts)...11 of his 31R were allowed in two starts (7R on 6/20 vs. Baltimore and 4R on 7/2 vs. Cincinnati).
- ✦ In 26 career home starts, is 9-5 with a 3.20 ERA (132.1IP, 93H, 50R/47ER, 73BB, 150K, 17HR)...has held opponents to a .192/.304/.348 (93-for-485) slash line...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 22 of his 26 home starts and one-or-zero runs in 14 of those starts (six scoreless)...has recorded six-or-more strikeouts in 14 of his 26 career home starts and eight-or-more strikeouts in seven of those starts.

VS. BALTIMORE/AL EAST: In four career starts vs. Baltimore, has gone 3-1 with a 3.66 ERA (19.2IP, 19H, 8R/ER, 5BB, 19K, 1HR).

- ✦ Made three starts vs. the Orioles in 2024, going 2-1 with a 5.27 ERA (13.2IP, 8ER)...seven of his eight runs came in his start on 6/20/24 at Yankee Stadium (1.1IP).
- ✦ Made his Major League debut vs. Baltimore on 8/3/21 at Yankee Stadium, earning the win after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings (4H, 1BB, 6K).
- ✦ **In 15 career starts vs. AL East opponents, has gone 8-3 with a 2.33 ERA (77.1IP, 48H, 22R/20ER, 49BB, 78K, 2HR)...has held opponents to a .175 BA (48-for-275).**
