<u>Vaughn Man Gang</u> Andrew Vaughn is the first player in franchise history to have an RBI in each of his first 5 games with the team.....his 10 RBI tied Brian Anderson (2023) for most in franchise history after the first 5 games with the team

Vaughnderful!

Andrew Vaughn is the first player in MLB to have at least 1 hit and 1 RBI in each of his first 5 games with a team since **Nathaniel Lowe** did it with Texas in his first 5 games in 2021..... the last player to have at least 1 hit and 1 RBI in each of his first 6+ games with a team was **Bobby Murcer** with the Cubs in 1977 (first 7 games).

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is game 1 of a 6-game road trip to Los Angeles-NL (3g) and Seattle [3g] coming out of the All-Star break....following this trip and an off day next Thursday, the team returns to American Family Field for a 6-game homestand against Miami [3g] and Chicago-NL (3g).

IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without Bob Uecker on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970)....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

IN THE STANDINGS (122 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 10*, SECOND: 55, THIRD: 43, FOURTH: 11, FIFTH: 3.....the Brewers are currently in second place, trailing the firstplace Cubs by 1.0 game (*9 days tied for first from 3/18-3/26 before playing a game).

AT HOME: The team is 33-17 at home, going 12-4-0 in series play.....are 21-8 in the last 29 home games, including 10-1 in the last 11 with a season-high 6 straight wins

 $\underline{\text{ON THE ROAD}}.$ The team is 23-23 on the road, going 6-7-2 in series play....are 13-5 in the last 18 road games.....have had two season-high 5-game road winning streaks [5/25-6/2 and 6/19-7/2].

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he is the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

<u>COACHES</u>: Returning from 2024 is associate manager **Rickie Weeks** (2nd season), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (7th season), assistant pitching 6 strategy coach Jim Henderson (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach Charlie Greene (2nd season), hitting coach Connor Dawson (4th season), assistant coach Daniel de Mondesert (2nd season), infield coach Matt Erickson (2nd season) and third base coach Jason Lane (10th season/5th in current role).....first base coach Julio Borbón, lead hitting coach Al LeBoeuf and hitting coach Eric Theisen are all in their first seasons on the staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team has made 15 replay challenges this season, going 9-6.....their last challenge (won) came on 7/7 vs. Los Angeles-NL as an out call at third base involving Isaac Collins was overturned.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times in the last seven seasons (2018-24) and won the NL Central in four of the last seven, three of four, and two in a row....Milwaukee is one of five teams to make the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons, joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees (6)....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseasor eight straight seasons (2017-24), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons [2017-24].....this does not include 2020.....the Brewers have 722 wins since 2017 [4th in MLB/2nd in National League].

BREWERS vs. DODGERS

SUMMARY: Are 74-100 all time, including 3-0 this season.....went 3-4 last season.....the team has not had a winning season against the Dodgers since going 5-1 in 2014.

at MIL: Are 40-50 all time, going 35-42 at American Family Field and 5-8 at County Stadium....are 3-0 this season.....went 2-2 last season.

at LA: Are 34-50 all time at Dodger Stadium.....went 1-2 last season.....are 2-11 in the last 13 games.

PRIESTER AT A GLANCE: Quinn Priester, 24, will make his 18th appearance and 13th start of the season.....Priester last pitched last Friday vs. Washington in relief and earned an 8-3 win [6ip, 4h, 2r, 2er, 2bb, 5k, 1hr, 86 pitches].....the team is 6-6 in his starts.....he has 4 quality starts.....opponents are batting .234 [79-for-337, 11hr].....he has gone 4-2 with a 2.90 ERA as a starter [62ip, 20er] and 3-0 with a 5.06 ERA in relief [26.2ip, 15er].....Priester was acquired from Boston on April 7 for OF Yophery Rodriguez, a Competitive Balance Round A selection and a player to be named [RHP John Holobetz on May 5].....he began the season at Triple-A Worcester [1 start].

LAST SEASON: Priester went 3-6 with a 4.71 ERA in 11 games/7 starts with Pittsburgh [10g/6gs] and Boston [1gs].....his teams went 1-6 in his starts.....he had 2 quality starts..... opponents batted .277 [56-for-202, 7hr].....he went 1-5 with a 4.42 ERA as a starter [36.2ip, 18er] and 2-1 with a 5.54 ERA as a reliever [13ip, 8er].....Priester was traded by Pittsburgh to Boston on 7/29/24 in exchange for INF/OF Nick Yorke.

CAREER: Is 13-11 with a 4.97 ERA in 38 games/27 starts (188.1ip, 104er) while pitching for Pittsburgh (2023-24), Boston (2024) and Milwaukee (2025).....has gone 7-10 with a 4.74 ERA as a starter (138.2ip, 73er) and 6-1 with a 5.62 ERA as a reliever (49.2ip, 31er).....Priester was selected by Pittsburgh in the first round (18th overall) of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft out of Cary-Grove (IL) High School.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 6-2 with a 3.56 ERA in 11 games/7 starts (60.2ip, 24er).....is 5-1 with a 3.02 ERA in 8 games/5 starts this season (44.2ip, 15er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 5-6 with a 4.89 ERA in 21 games/15 starts (105ip, 57er).....is 2-1 with a 4.09 ERA in 9 games/7 starts this season (44ip, 20er).

RHP Freddy Peralta will be making his 21st start of the season and second against the Dodgers.....Peralta last started last Sunday vs. Washington and earned an 9-1 win (6.2ip, 3h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 7k, 103 pitches).....the team is 13-7 in his starts.....he has 9 quality starts, including 3 in a row.... opponents are batting .199 (81-for-407, 12hr).....he has won each of his last 6 starts, posting a 2.60 ERA (34.2ip, 23h, 10r, 10er, 6bb, 40k, 3hr).....he is 3-2 with a 2.75 ERA in 7 career starts against the Dodgers (36ip, 23h, 11r, 11er, 17bb, 36k, 5hr), including a 9-1 win this season on 7/7 in Milwaukee (6ip, 5h, 0r, 1bb, 7k).....he has gone 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA in 2 career starts at Dodger Stadium (8ip, 7h, 4r, 4er, 7bb, 10k, 1hr).
