# GLOBE LIFE FIELD

**GLOBE LIFE FIELD:** The brand new Globe Life Field saw its grand opening this season under dampened circumstances due to the coronavirus pandemic, as virtually no fan attendance was permitted for any regular season game.

A scheduled ribbon-cutting for the building and the Chris Stapleton/Willie Nelson concert on March 14 were both postponed on March 12. Tours were originally scheduled to commence on March 17, but they did not begin until June 1. After MLB announced on March 12 that all Spring Training games would be suspended and the start of the 2020 season would be delayed by at least two weeks, the club cancelled the scheduled exhibition games at Globe Life Field against the St. Louis Cardinals (March 23) and Rangers prospects (March 24). The first regular season game that Globe Life Field was scheduled to host was on March 28 vs. Los Angeles-AL. The facility hosted workouts for Rangers players residing in the DFW area in May and June ahead of the Summer Camp restart.

Globe Life Field is the Rangers' third home park, following Arlington Stadium (1972-93) and Globe Life Park in Arlington (1994-2019). Each of the three ballparks have opened in shortened MLB seasons (1972, 1994, 2020). According to Elias Sports Bureau, the Rangers' three parks represent 3 of the 5 all-time instances of a facility opening in a shortened MLB season (1918, 1919, 1972, 1981, 1994, 1995, or 2020). The others to qualify: Cleveland's Progressive Field in 1994 and Colorado's Coors Field in 1995.

Globe Life Field became the first park in MLB history to host an Interleague game for its regular season opening with the park's formal debut coming in the game on July 24 vs. Colorado. According to Elias Sports Bureau, the July 24 regular season debut of Globe Life Field became the 3rd-latest opening date in a calendar year for a new full-time ballpark (min. 100 games) in the modern era (since 1900).

**BY THE NUMBERS:** After producing minimal offense for the bulk of its first season, Globe Life Field saw higher production toward the end of the campaign for a final combined slash line of .231/.318/.384/.701 with 66 home runs and 268 runs in 30 games (8.9 R/G; 2.2 HR/G). Ranked 19th among 30 MLB parks in BA, 16th in OBP, 22nd in SLG, and 21st in OPS. It was the lowest average in Arlington since an overall .223 figure in Rangers' first season in 1972, the year prior to the introduction of the designated hitter. It was the lowest OBP/OPS since 1983 (.317 OBP/.678 OPS), and lowest SLG since 1990 (.383), both campaigns at Arlington Stadium. The overall 8.933 runs per game was lowest since 2014 (8.926). There were 8 seasons at Globe Life Park in which the HR/G average was lower than this year's 2.20 HR/G figure, last in 2015 (2.19 HR/G).

Over the first 22 games at the park, there were 181 runs scored (8.2 R/G) and 37 HR (1.7 HR/G). In the final 8 contests in the new venue, teams combined for 87 runs (10.9 R/G) and 29 home runs (3.6 HR/G). The facility produced 11 triples, T6th-most in MLB.

**IM OPEN:** Of the 30 games at GLF in '20, there were 6 played with the roof open, with Texas going 2-4 in those contests. Texas won the final 2 contests in open-air conditions after losing the first 4 such games, but club was still out-scored 47-to-24 overall in the 6 tilts. Games with the roof open saw an average of 11.83 R/G, while run output has been 8.21 R/G with the roof closed.

The only time in Summer Camp in which the club played with an open roof at Globe Life Field was an intrasquad game on Friday, July 17. While the team held some workouts with the roof open or cracked in May and June, the 7/17 date was the only instance of an open roof for an intrasquad or game setting prior to the regular season.

**GROUND RULES:** While Joey Gallo hit multiple popups that appeared to be high enough to hit roof trusses at Globe Life Field during the regular season, the only ball documented to have hit a part of the roof during a game in the 2020 regular season came on July 26 vs. Colorado. In that game, the third ever at the facility, Rockies' Ryan McMahon hit a popup to second base in the top of the 9th inning that hit the roof. The ball bounced off one of the trusses above the infield and was caught by 2nd baseman Rougned Odor for the out.

**RAISE THE ROOF:** Globe Life Field is the 12th full-time park in MLB history with either a fixed roof or retractable roof...on that list, 8 of the 12 are now active ballparks, with 7 of those 8 being retractable roof stadiums (lone fixed dome is Tropicana Field). Rogers Centre in Toronto did not host games in 2020 due to restrictions related to the pandemic that were imposed by the Canadian government.

MLB games have also been staged at Japan's Tokyo Dome in 2000, 2004, 2008, 2012, and 2019.

**GLOBE LIFE FIELD GROUND RULES**

**FOUL TERRITORY / FIRST AND THIRD BASE LINES**

- Protective netting over top of fan seating area beyond both dugouts: Dead Ball.
- Fair bounding ball striking the metal railings affixed to the top of the green walls along the Left and Right Field lines in foul territory: Out of Play, Two Bases.

**OUTFIELD AREA**

- Fair bounding ball striking the portion of the wall that is recessed above the padded outfield wall: Out of Play, Two Bases.
- Batted ball in flight striking the metal railings (above the yellow line) affixed to top wall in Right Center Field: Home Run.
- Bounding batted ball striking the metal railings (above the yellow line) affixed to top wall in Right Center Field: Out of Play, Two Bases.
- Batted ball in flight striking Right Field Videoboard: Home Run.

**ROOF TRUSSES**

- Batted ball strikes roof, roof truss, or roof cable over fair territory: In Play.
  - If caught by fielder, batter is out, and runners advance at own risk.
- Batted ball strikes roof, roof truss, or roof cable over foul territory: Dead Ball.
- Batted ball striking the roof, roof truss, roof cable or any cabling over fair territory and landing foul: Foul Ball.
- Batted ball striking the roof, roof truss, roof cable or any cabling over fair territory and landing fair: Fair Ball, Live and in Play.

# 2020 TEXAS RANGERS SEASON IN REVIEW

## FINAL OVERALL RECORD: 22-38 (.367)

Fifth in A.L. West Division, 14.0 games behind Oakland

Home: 16-14

Road: 6-24

**WINS AND LOSSES:** The Rangers went 22-38 (.367) this season to finish in 5th place in the A.L. West, 14.0 games behind Oakland in the abbreviated 60-game season that was a product of the global coronavirus pandemic. It marked the team's 4th straight season with a losing record, the 1st time with 4 consecutive sub-.500 marks since 2005-08 (4 in a row), this after one losing campaign in 8 years from 2009-16.

The team's .367 winning percentage was the 2nd-lowest in MLB (PIT-.317, 19-41) and Texas had the A.L.'s lowest figure for the 4th time in club history (also 1972, 1973, 2014). Club has still not finished with lowest win pct. in MLB since 1973. It was the 3rd-lowest win pct. in Texas history (1972-2020), trailing only 1972 (.351, 54-100) and 1973 (.352, 57-105), and the 4th-lowest mark in Washington/Texas franchise history (1961-2020), with addition to the list being the 1963 Senators (.346, 56-106). Team's winning pct. was - .114 lower than in 2019 (.481), the 4th-largest decline in MLB to Houston (-.177), Washington (-.141), and Boston (-.119).

Team's fifth-place finish marked just the third last-place standing since 2008 (also 2014 and 2018). The Rangers' last-place finishes in the six-division era (since 1995) have come in 2000-01-02-03-07-14-18-20. Club was eliminated from the division race on 9/16 and eliminated from postseason contention on 9/20.

Texas opened the year with a 3-8 record through 8/6, going 2-8 after a 1-0 win on Opening Day, 7/24 vs. COL, the first game ever at Globe Life Field. From 8/7-15, club went 7-1, tied with BAL for best record in MLB in that span among teams with 3+ games. That stretch included a season-best 4-G win streak, 8/11-15. Through 8/15, club had a 10-9 record and was in 2nd place in the A.L. West, in position for a postseason spot at the nearly one-third point of the campaign. From 8/16-9/24, Rangers were an MLB-worst 9-29 (.237). Over that stretch, club lost season-high 8 in a row from 8/16-23, and went 3-18 from 8/16-9/7, fewest wins in any 21-G span since 6/30-7/24/14 (also 3-18). Team won 3 straight to end the year, longest season-ending win streak since 2011 (club-record 6-G win streak).

Rangers were season-high one game above .500 on 2 occasions: after wins on 7/24 (1-0) and 8/15 (10-9). Club's low point was at 19 games below .500 following loss on 9/24 vs. HOU (19-38).

The club finished 5-13-2 in 20 series this season, 4-4-2 at home and 1-9-0 on the road. Texas went 2-9-1 in last 12 series, losing 7 in a row from 8/17-9/7, longest such streak since a run of 0-7-0 in series from 6/30-7/27/14.

Rangers played just 9 opponents in the 2020 regionalized schedule, going 16-24 (.400) vs. A.L. West clubs and 6-14 (.300) against teams from the N.L. West. The .400 win pct. against division foes is 2nd-lowest in the past 18 seasons beg. 2003 (.368, 28-48 in 2018). Had equal road win totals against N.L. clubs (3-7) and A.L. clubs (3-17). Texas finished 13-7 (.650) vs. A.L. West opponents at Globe Life Field.

### RANGERS 2020 TIMELINE

- Feb. 21 – Rangers play Cactus League opener against the Royals in Surprise, a 5-4 win.
- March 11 – Rangers play final Spring Training game, a 6-4 loss in 5 innings (called due to soggy field conditions) to the San Francisco Giants in Surprise.
- March 12 – An afternoon announcement from MLB cancels Spring Training games and delays the start of the 2020 season by at least two weeks...it had been a day off for Rangers players and staff...the cancellations include a scheduled Spring Training finale against the St. Louis Cardinals at Globe Life Field on March 23, as well as an exhibition contest against organizational prospects on March 24.
- March 15 – Rangers Spring Training operations in Arizona formally shut down.
- March 16 – A team charter flies many players and staff from Arizona back to the DFW Metroplex.
- June 10-11 – Rangers select five players over the five-round 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft.
- July 3 – First official day of 2020 Summer Camp.
- July 21-22 – Exhibitions vs. Colorado Rockies at Globe Life Field.
- July 24 – Opening Day vs. Colorado Rockies – first regular season game ever at Globe Life Field.
- Sept. 15 – MLB formally announces Globe Life Field as the host of the 2020 NLDS, NLCS, and World Series.
- Sept. 27 – Rangers play season finale against Houston Astros.
- Sept. 30 – MLB announces plan for limited ticket sales to attend 2020 NLCS and World Series at Globe Life Field.

**THE WAITING IS THE HARDEST PART:** Between Rangers regular season games on 9/29/19 vs. NYY and 7/24/20 vs. COL, 299 days passed, easily the longest span in team history. Previous longest span was 259 days between games on 8/10/94 and 4/26/95. After the club played its earliest opener ever in 2019 (3/28/19 vs. CHC), the Rangers played easily its latest-ever Opening Day in 2020 (7/24/20 vs. COL), nearly 4 months after a scheduled lid-lifter on 3/28/20 at SEA.

**ATTENDANCE:** The 2020 season was a year in which fans were not allowed at games due to the global coronavirus pandemic, something that had never happened previously in MLB history. Through the end of the regular season, there had yet to be fans for an MLB game at the new Globe Life Field. The few who were able to view games in person at the Rangers' new home ballpark in 2020 included: club ownership, team employees (for season's first and last games), the family of Rockies' outfielder Sam Hilliard (7/24-26 vs. COL), and the family of Rangers' outfielder Shin-Soo Choo (9/27 vs. HOU season finale).

Through 2019, the Rangers have topped the 2 million mark in home attendance in 23 of 24 and 29 of 31 years beginning 1989.

**BASERUNNING:** Texas finished T2nd in the A.L. and T4th in MLB with 49 stolen bases: 55-SD, 51-MIA, 50-SEA, 49-TEX/KC. The 49 figure over 60 games would be equal to around 132 stolen bases over a regular 162-game campaign, which would have been right in line with the team's 2019 figure (MLB-high 131 SB). Club ranked 5th in MLB with 63 steal attempts, as the 77.8% success rate (49 SB/63 SBA) finished 5th in the A.L. and 11th in the Majors. Team's 14 caught stealing were T3rd-most in A.L./MLB. Baserunners went 19-for-last-23 (82.6%) in steal attempts beg. 9/5.

Rangers had 2 games of season-high 4 steals: 7/29 vs. ARI and 9/5 at SEA. Club was 4-for-4 in steal tries in those games, and went 3-for-3 or better on 4 total occasions in 2020 (also 3-for-3 on 8/1 at SF and 9/27 vs. HOU).

Team accounted for one of the 6 steals of home in MLB this season, as Leody Taveras pulled the trick on a double steal in the 6th inning on 9/9 vs. LAA. Texas had a club-record 4 steals of home in 2019.

Isiah Kiner-Falefa and Leody Taveras tied for the club lead with 8 stolen bases in '20, T7th-most in the A.L. Taveras has opened his career at 8-for-8 in SB attempts, one of 3 MLB players to go 8-for-8 or better in 2020, as PHI's Roman Quinn was 12-for-12 and BOS' Xander Bogaerts was also 8-for-8.

**BATTING:** Texas finished with an A.L.-low .217 (420-1936) batting average in 2020 (.2169), 2nd-lowest in MLB (.212-CIN) and the lowest single-season figure in Washington/Texas franchise history (previous .2171 in 1972). Team has finished in A.L.'s bottom 3 in batting average in 3 of the past 4 seasons (9th in 2019), and 4 of the 5 lowest marks in Texas history have come in the past 5 seasons beginning 2017. Rangers' .285 on-base pct. was also lowest in club history, .364 slugging pct. is 5th-lowest since the move to Texas and lowest since 1982 (.359), and .648 OPS was 2nd-lowest in Rangers history (.581 in 1972). All 3 figures were A.L. lows and ranked 29th in MLB, as only Pittsburgh (.284 OBP/.357 SLG) had lower marks. The Rangers' .205 road BA set a club record and was somehow only the 3rd-lowest mark in MLB, as CIN and PIT both had .204 away batting averages.

Rangers' A.L.-low 224 runs ranked 29th in MLB (219-PIT), and 3.73 runs per game was 3rd-lowest average in team history (2.99 in 1972, 3.64 in 1982). Season-high 9 runs on 8/2 at SF, as every other MLB team had at least 2 games with 10-or-more runs in 2020.

Team finished among A.L. leaders in sac flies (T1st, 18), bunt hits (3rd, 9), triples (5th, 9), and HBP (T8th, 24). Ranked last in league in XBH (151) and TB (704), and club's -88 run differential was worst in MLB. Team also finished among circuit trailers in walks (13th, 167) and doubles (14th, 80), also posting 4th-most strikeouts (548). Rangers' 3.92 PA/SO was lowest average in club history, slightly ahead of 2019 (3.93 PAK).

The offense was not shut out until game no. 55 this season (9/22 at ARI), one of the final 2 teams in MLB to be blanked (LAD were not shut out in 60 G). Teams shut out one or zero times in 2020: 0-LAD, 1-TEX/BOS/TB. Rangers' 11 games with exactly one run were tied with MIL for most in Majors.

Weighted runs created plus (wRC+) is a statistic which weighs several elements, including park factor, to measure the offensive value of a player or team (100 is league-average). According to FanGraphs, the 2020 Rangers' wRC+ of 67 is the 2nd-lowest in baseball history, trailing only the 1920 Philadelphia Athletics (also 67).

**Clutch Hitting:** Texas batted an MLB-low .218 (86-394) with runners in scoring position, easily the lowest mark in club history (previously .227 in 1992) and 52 points below the 2019 figure (.270). The figure sat at .211 with 2 games remaining, but Texas went 6-for-15 in final 2 games to finish at .218. Offense hit .200 (7-35) with the bases loaded, T3rd-lowest in MLB to KC (.122) and CIN (.159). Team's .227 BA (67-295) in close-and-late situations was 12th in MLB.

**CHALLENGES:** The Rangers were successful on 7-of-14 (50.0%) in manager challenges using replay review in 2020. MLB's seventh year using comprehensive instant replay. Team ranked 6th in the A.L. and T11th in MLB in overturn percentage. It was Chris Woodward's second season as Texas manager, and he is now 38-for-63 (60.3%) on challenges in 2019-20. Rangers finished above the league average (44.10%), but trailed club's 2019 success rate (63.3%). The club had 7 overturned calls, 5 stands, and 2 confirmed. The 7 overturns were T11th in MLB. Rangers went 7-for-final-11 in challenges beginning 7/31. The team had just one challenge over 21 games from 8/19-9/10, including 12 straight without a challenge from 8/19-9/1. From 7/31-8/14, the team recorded 4 consecutive overturned calls on challenges.

**COME-FROM-BEHIND WINS/CLOSE GAMES:** The Rangers' 11 come-from-behind wins were T5th-fewest in the A.L.: 9-SEA, 10-BAL/BOS/MIN, 11-TEX/KC. Club overcame a season-high 4-run deficit to win on 8/12 vs. SEA, turning a 4-0 deficit after 5 1/2 innings into a 7-4 victory.

The Rangers won at home in the bottom of the 9th or later once in 2020, a 5-4, 10-inning win on 9/25 vs. HOU. It was the club's first walk-off victory since 8/31/19 vs. SEA.

Club won twice when trailing after 8 innings, both extra-inning games against the Astros in which the Rangers trailed in the 9th inning (9/1 at HOU, 9/25 vs. HOU). Went 5-0 at home in games decided in the 7th inning-or-later, and finished 5-5 in contests decided in the last at-bat.

Texas lost 14 times after having the lead at some point, T8th-most in the A.L. Rangers joined 6 playoff teams as the only MLB clubs to go undefeated both when leading after 7 innings and also after 8 frames: TEX, ATL, CHC, MIA, OAK, STL, TB. Club's largest lead in a loss was a 3-run edge on 2 occasions: 9/19 at LAA, 9/23 at ARI.

The team suffered 3 walk-off losses, T4th-most in A.L. and T6th-most in MLB. Those 3 losses: 8/4 at OAK, 8/19 at SD, 8/20 at SD. The consecutive losses at Petco Park in August marked the first time for the club to lose back-to-back extra-inning games in walk-off fashion since dropping 3 straight from 9/16-18/02 at SEA.

Rangers finished 7-6 (.538) in one-run games in 2020, T5th-best mark in the A.L. and T9th-best in MLB. Team dropped 4 of final 6 games decided by one run after opening the year with a 5-2 record. Posted a pair of 1-0 wins (7/24 vs. COL, 9/16 at HOU), joining MIL (2) as only MLB clubs with multiple such wins in 2020.

**DAYS IN EACH POSITION:** First (1); Second (7); Third (20); Fourth (14); Fifth (24). Texas finished 5th in the A.L. West, 14.0 games behind Oakland in the abbreviated 60-game season. Team's fifth-place finish marked just the third last-place standing since 2008 (also 2014 and 2018). The Rangers' last-place finishes in the six-division era (since 1995) have come in 2000-01-02-03-07-14-18-20. For the second time in three seasons (also 2018), Texas had more days in last place than any other position in 2020. Lone day in first place (tied) came with an Opening Day win on 7/24 vs. COL, as team has not been alone in 1st place since winning the A.L. West in 2016. Club was in 2nd place in the division as late as Aug. 15, in position for a playoff spot under the 2020 format, but slipped into 3rd place the next day and spent the season's final 23 days in last place beginning 9/5.

Team finished 14.0 GB in the A.L. West, the 3rd-largest deficit in the junior circuit (16.0-BOS, 15.0-BAL). Texas gained ground in the division on just 5 of the season's final 29 days beginning 8/30. Club was eliminated from the division race on 9/16 and eliminated from postseason contention on 9/20.

**DAYS OF WEEK:** Sunday: 5-5; Monday: 1-4; Tuesday: 3-6; Wednesday: 4-5; Thursday: 0-6; Friday: 5-5; Saturday: 4-7. Club did not finish with a winning record on any day of the week for just the 3rd time in team history (also 1982 and 2014). The 0-6 mark on Thursdays is the only time in Rangers history to go winless on a day of the week in a season, as club has not won a Thursday contest since 9/26/19 vs. BOS. Only other MLB teams with a winless day of the week in 2020 were PIT (0-6 on Mondays) and BOS (0-4 on Mondays). Texas won each of final 3 Sunday contests to finish at 5-5 on the seventh day.

**DAY/NIGHT:** Texas was 6-13 (.316) in day games and 16-25 (.390) at night. The .316 day win pct. was lowest in A.L. and 2nd-lowest in MLB (PHI was .250, 5-15). It was the 2nd-lowest day win pct. in Rangers history (.250, 10-30 in 1973). Rangers won 3 of final 5 day games after losing 8 in a row from 8/16-9/10, longest day losing skid in a single season since going 0-8 from 5/17-7/6/86. The .390 night win pct. was 4th-lowest in A.L. and T6th-lowest in MLB. It was the 4th-lowest night win pct. in Rangers history, as only lower figures came in 1972 (.327, 34-70), 2014 (.356, 42-76), and 1973 (.385, 47-75).

**DELAYS:** The Rangers did not endure any delays in the abbreviated 60-day season, the club's first in Globe Life Field, and the team's only postponement was not weather-related (see separate text). With 4 of the 10 teams in the "West region" in 2020 playing home games in retractable roof stadiums (TEX, ARI, HOU, SEA), and 5 of the remaining 6 clubs historically incurring minimal home rainouts (LAA, LAD, OAK, SD, SF), the potential for delays were very low. The Rangers' last delay was a 2-hour, 52-minute rain delay before first pitch on 9/2/19 at NYU. The club has not seen a delay in Arlington since 6/9/19 vs. OAK, a rain delay of 1 hour, 5 minutes before first pitch.

**DESIGNATED HITTERS:** In the first season in MLB history in which all teams utilized the designated hitter for every game, Rangers DH's combined for a slash line of .200/.270/.288/.559 with 4 home runs and 22 RBI. They had the lowest OPS and SLG in the Majors, ranking 27th in OBP and 23rd in batting average. It was the lowest OPS and SLG in any season by Texas DH's since the DH was implemented in 1973, and 2nd-lowest BA and OBP in club history to only 1988 (.197 BA/.257 OBP). The 4 HR and 22 RBI were both T2nd-fewest in MLB in '20. Fewest HR: 2-ARI, 4-TEX/OAK/WSN. Fewest RBI: 21-ARI, 22-TEX/SF. Texas started 11 different players at DH for the 2nd straight season: Calhoun-19, Choo-13, Dietrich-9, Refsnnyder-5, Solak-5, Trevino-3, Gallo-2, Chirinos-1, Odom-1, Santana-1, Tejada-1.

**DOUBLEHEADERS/POSTPONEMENTS:** Texas endured a single postponement in 2020, as the club's scheduled game on 8/27 vs. OAK at Globe Life Field did not take place following a decision to postpone by the A's players. It was the first-ever postponement at the Rangers' new ballpark, the first for Texas overall since 8/6/19 at CLE, and first in Arlington since 7/1/19 vs. LAA.

The postponement on 8/27 was made up as part of a doubleheader when Texas split a pair of 7-inning games on 9/12 vs. OAK. The 7-inning doubleheader was a concept introduced in MLB for the first time in 2020 as an accommodation for clubs attempting to make-up many postponed contests in a short timeframe. Texas won the first game on 9/12 by a 5-2 score, and lost the 2nd game by a 10-1 margin. Team has played 4 doubleheaders in 2019-20 after just one twinbill over 5 seasons from 2014-18 (9/6/17 at ATL). Rangers are 7-2-10 in 19 twinbills (day/night or split) since dropping both games to the Yankees on 5/3/07 in Arlington. Over the last 26 seasons beginning 1994, Rangers have gone 15-8-16 in doubleheaders (day/night or split).

**EXTRA INNINGS:** Texas played 4 extra-innings games in 2020, going 2-2 (1-0 at home, 1-2 on road). Team has been .500-or-better in extras for 6 straight seasons. One of the rule adjustments from MLB in 2020 allowed each extra inning to begin with a runner on 2nd base. Team suffered walk-off losses in the 10th inning on back-to-back days, 8/19-20 at SD, and then won final 2 games with extra frames (both 10 innings) against the Astros, one on 9/1 at Minute Maid Park and the other on 9/25 in Arlington. All four of the team's extra-inning games lasted just 10 innings, as Rangers have not played a longer game (by innings) since a 5-3 loss in 11 innings on 9/10 vs. TB.

**FIELDING:** Texas had a .981 (40 E/2057 TC) fielding percentage, 12th in the A.L. and 25th in MLB. Team had a higher figure in 2019 (.982), and this year's mark ranks 24th in club history. Team's 35.83 total chances per 9 innings was 3rd-lowest in MLB to the Reds (35.38) and Twins (35.40).

After just 2 errors in team's 1st 9 games through 8/10, club would not go 3 straight without an error the rest of the way. Season-best 4-G errorless streak from 8/5-10. Had season-high 3 errors on 3 occasions: 8/21 at SEA, 8/26 vs. OAK, 9/22 at ARI. Over the final 13 games beginning 9/9, club had a .971 (13 E/448 TC) fielding pct.

**HOME/ROAD:** Texas finished with a 16-14 (.533) record at home in the first season at Globe Life Field, 10th-highest win pct. in the A.L., as 11 of 15 A.L. clubs had winning home records in '20. The Rangers have had a winning home record in 2 straight and 5 of the past 6 seasons. After going 1-3 in 1st 4 games in Globe Life Field history, team won 6 of next 7 from 7/29-8/12. From 8/17-9/11, had a 4-8 home record before winning 5 of final 7 G.

Club went 6-24 (.200) on the road this season, the lowest away win pct. in a season in franchise history and the 6th-lowest in MLB history. Those with lower figures were the 1935 Boston Braves (.167, 13-65), 1916 Philadelphia A's (.169, 13-64), 1945 Philadelphia A's (.171, 13-63), 1909 Washington Senators (.195, 15-62), and 1904 Washington Senators (.197, 15-61). The 2020 Pirates also had just 6 road wins, but played 2 fewer away games, going 6-22. After opening with a 3-5 record on the road, Texas went just 3-19 over final 22 away contests this season, including a span in which team was 1-13 on road from 8/16-9/15. Only back-to-back away wins in '20 came 8/14-15 at COL.

**HOME RUNS:** Texas batters hit 62 home runs, T12th in A.L. and T23rd in MLB. Team's 1.03 HR/G ranked 24th in MLB and the Rangers' lowest since 2014 (0.69 HR/G). Over first 51 games through 9/18, batters had 45 HR (0.88 HR/G), the 2nd-lowest total in MLB at that point (44-PIT). In final 9 contests beg. 9/19, Texas hit 17 HR (1.89 HR/G), 2nd-highest figures in MLB (20-LAD).

Team hit HR in season-high 6 straight from 7/26-8/2. Longest spans with multiple HR were a pair of 3-G streaks toward season's end, 9/19-21 and the final 3 G from 9/25-27. Club had a pair of season-long 4-G home run droughts (8/9-12, 9/15-18).

Club leaders Joey Gallo and Rougned Odor each finished with 10 HR, and no other Ranger had more than 5 HR. Texas joined Arizona (Kole Calhoun/Christian Walker) as the only ML clubs to have only 2 players with 6+ HR. Had 17 different players hit at least one HR, just one less than 2019 (18) despite far fewer games.

**Home Runs By Month:** July-5; August-22; September-35. The team's 35 HR in September – 4th-most in MLB – were just one shy of Rangers' total in that month in 2019.

Texas hit 27 HR in 30 G at home in the first season at Globe Life Field, T5th-lowest home total in MLB. Only other MLB team with fewer than 28 HR at home that played at least 30 home games was Cleveland (25 HR in 30 home games). Team's 0.90 HR per game at home this season is the 2nd-lowest figure since the Rangers moved into Globe Life Park in 1994 (0.63 HR/G at home in 2014). Club hit 35 HR on the road, T4th-lowest total in the A.L.

Texas homered at least once in 38 of 60 games. Team hit multiple HR in 18 contests. Hit season-high 5 HR on 9/20 at LAA, most in a game since 9/22/19 at OAK (5). It was just the 2nd time the Rangers had ever seen 5 different players hit home runs in a game in Anaheim (also 8/7/09).

The team hit 42 homers with the bases empty, 13 with one on, 7 with 2 aboard, and did not hit a grand slam. Texas was one of 10 teams without a slam in the abbreviated season, while pitchers gave up an MLB-leading 8 of the 45 slams in the Majors in '20. From 8/20 – 9/11, Texas hit 18 consecutive solo home runs, which set a club record. Rangers were the 1st team with such a streak of solo HR since the 2018 Baltimore Orioles, who also hit 18 straight solo HR from 5/21-6/16/18 (credit Elias Sports Bureau).

Rangers did not have a pinch-hit HR, one of 17 teams to not pull the trick in '20. Also did not have a walk-off HR. Team hit 3 leadoff HR, T6th-most in MLB. Team had back-to-back HR on 2 occasions and the only multi-HR games both came in the club's last 3 contests of the year: Sam Huff on 9/25 vs. HOU (2) and Rougned Odor on 9/27 vs. HOU (2).

**Home Runs By Count:** 0-0: 15...0-1: 10...0-2: 2...1-0: 5...1-1: 7...1-2: 4...2-0: 1...2-1: 1...2-2: 10...3-0: 0...3-1: 4...3-2: 3. Rangers' 15 HR on the first pitch of an at-bat ranked 11th in MLB.

**INJURED LIST:** The Rangers had 25 injured list stints in 2020, one more than a full campaign in 2019 (24). Club had 557 games missed across those IL stints, including multiple stints for 4 different players: Elvis Andrus (2), Brett Martin (2), Joely Rodriguez (2), and Danny Santana (2). Four Rangers finished the year on the 45-day Injured List which was introduced for 2020, and while just one player spent the entire campaign on the 45-day Injured List (LHP Brock Burke), 2 others missed at least 55 games after limited action: Jose Leclerc and Corey Kluber. Two Rangers saw IL stints without a specified reason: Brett Martin (7/16-28) and Luke Farrell (8/11-9/1). Farrell was at the Alternate Training Site during that IL stay.

**INTERLEAGUE:** The Rangers went 6-14 (.300) in Interleague in '20, finishing with a losing record for the 3rd straight year after 11 straight seasons at .500-or-better vs. the N.L. from 2007-17. The .300 win pct. was the 2nd-lowest for Texas in 24 years of Interleague play beginning 1997 (.222, 4-14 in 2003). Club was 3-7 both at home and on the road against the senior circuit. Texas was 5-5 in 1st 10 Interleague games this season before losing 9 of final 10, including last 4 in a row. Since 8/25/18, Texas is 17-30 versus N.L. clubs, going 24-36 since the start of 2018. Went 1-6-1 in 8 overall series, 0-3-1 in Arlington and 1-3-0 on the road, with lone series win from 8/14-16 at COL (took 2 of 3). Team lost final 4 series vs. N.L. in '20 after that lone win.

**MONTH-BY-MONTH:** July: 2-4; August: 10-17; September: 10-17. Rangers joined PIT as only teams with multiple months of 17+ losses, as club recorded 2 of the 10 instances in MLB of 17+ losses in a month in 2020. Have not had a winning month since going 18-11 in June 2019, posting losing marks in 5 straight full months.

**PITCHING:** Pitching staff compiled a 5.02 ERA (288 ER/516.2 IP) this season, 11th in the A.L. and 23rd in MLB. It was a tick lower than 2019 (5.06), but the 9th-highest figure in Rangers history, just the 9th time with a number cracking the 5.00 mark. Through 8/15 and the team's first 19 games, Rangers had a 4.06 ERA that ranked 7th in the A.L. and 12th in the Majors. Beginning 8/16, staff posted a 5.47 ERA (213 ER/350.1 IP) in final 41 contests, the 3rd-highest figure in MLB over that season-ending span (6.41-COL, 5.75-DET).

Club allowed 10+ runs 7 times over that latter span. Pitchers posted a 4.86 ERA in September to lower final figure. Rangers allowed 10+ runs in 8 games in 2020, T4th-most in MLB (13-COL, 9-BOS/MIA, 8-TEX/DET). Highest ERA for the year was 5.24 mark after doubleheader on 9/12. Lowest mark after first 10 games was 4.06 ERA after win on 8/15 at COL.

Rangers' 3 shutouts were 7th-most in the A.L. Had league's 3rd-most walks (236) and 4th-fewest strikeouts (489), ranking 8th in circuit with a .242 opponent batting average. The .242 opponent average is the 2nd-lowest mark ever allowed by Texas pitching in

a season, only lower figure was .239 in 1989. Team's 1.38 WHIP was 12th in A.L., lowest since 2016 (1.37). Pitchers averaged 8.52 strikeouts per 9 innings, 2nd-best mark in club history (8.63 in 2019). Staff's 2.07 SO/BB ratio was lowest since 2017 (1.98). Club's 30 hit batters were 5th-most in the A.L., and staff permitted league-high 13 triples. Team's 1.41 HR/9 average was 2nd-highest in Rangers history (1.51 in 2019).

The staff allowed 8 of the 45 grand slams in MLB in 2020, most in Majors and more than double the next-closest teams: CHC/MIA/WAS (3 each). It matched the 2nd-highest total of slams against Texas in a single season in club history: 9-1988, 8-2000/2020. Among the notable slams against the Rangers in '20 were walk-off blasts on 8/4 at OAK (Stephen Piscotty) and 8/19 at SD (Manny Machado), and also a slam on a 3-0 count by Fernando Tatis Jr. on 8/17 vs. SD.

**Starters:** Texas starters combined to go 10-28 (.263) with a 5.32 ERA (170 ER/287.1 IP) in the abbreviated 60-game season. Had A.L.'s 4th-highest starters ERA, slightly lower than 2019 (5.37) but still 11th-highest in any season in club history. Rotation ERA sat at 3.40 through 8/15 (1st 19 games), after which starters posted an MLB-high 6.32 ERA (133 ER/189.1 IP) over final 41 contests beg. 8/16, raising final ERA by nearly 2 full runs. The 6.32 figure was easily highest in MLB over that season-ending span. Starters' .263 win pct. was lowest in MLB and easily lowest in Rangers history (previous .339, 38-74 in 1972).

Staff posted 2 complete games, T3rd-most in MLB (3 by CIN/PHI). The team's 2 complete games were served by Lance Lynn (2-hitter in 3-2 win on 8/14 at COL) and Kyle Gibson (CG SHO on 9/16 at HOU). Gibson's effort marked team's lone shutout in '20.

The starting pitcher figures were impacted by a total of 4 starts (2-2) employing an opening pitcher: 9/1 at HOU (Luis Garcia, won 6-5), 9/11 vs. OAK (Luis Garcia, lost 10-6), 9/12 vs. OAK-G1 (Nick Goody, won 5-2), and 9/18 at LAA (Jimmy Herget, lost 6-2). Including the openers, Rangers had 7 total games of a starter recording 3-outs-or-less due to performance or a scheduled opener. It was the third season in which MLB saw heavy usage of opening pitchers, a strategy executed by the Rangers 5 times in 2018 (all in Sept.), and 10 times in 2019 (also 7 bullpen games in '19).

**Relievers:** The Rangers bullpen had a 12-10 record with a 4.63 ERA (131 ER/254.2 IP) in 58 games, 5th-highest in the A.L. and 9th-highest in MLB. It was a slight improvement over 2019 (4.66), but still the 11th-highest mark in team history. Issued league's 5th-most walks (113) while ranking T9th in strikeouts (232). Allowed 1.26 HR/9, 6th-highest figure in team history (club-record 1.50 HR/9 in 2019).

Produced A.L.-low 10 saves, converting 10 of 19 (52.6%) chances for 2nd-lowest conversion rate in the league (LAA-46.2%). It was the 3rd-lowest save pct. in Rangers history (45.5% in 1976, 50.0% in 2002). Team's 19 save chances were T2nd-fewest in the A.L. (18-BAL, 19-TEX/DET). Recorded just one save over team's final 26 contests beginning 9/2, as club was 0-for-last-3 in save chances in 2020. Of the team's 10 saves for the season, 5 came in a span of 8 team games from 8/7-15, as team would go 3-for-last-9 in save opportunities beginning 8/16.

**PLAYERS USED/ROOKIES:** The 2020 Rangers used 49 players, tied for the A.L. lead and T2nd-most in MLB: 61-MIA, 49-TEX/PIT/SEA/TOR, 48-ATL/CWS/KC. The figure was just 4 shy of 2019 (53) despite playing over 100 fewer games. Team used 25 pitchers, T5th-fewest in the A.L.: 18-CLE, 19-OAK, 23-DET, 24-MIN, 25-TEX/NYY/TB. Club used 18 rookies, 5 less than 2019 (23). The 18 rookies ranked T5th-most in MLB: 22-SEA, 21-MIA, 19-HOU/STL, 18-TEX/CWS. Had 9 players make MLB debuts in '20, including 5 that had never played above the High-A level previously: Sherten Apostel, Kyle Cody, Sam Huff, John King, Anderson Tejada.

The list of 18 rookies: Sherten Apostel, Wes Benjamin, Kyle Cody, Demarcus Evans, Adolis Garcia, Ian Gibaut, Taylor Hearn, Scott Heineman, Jimmy Herget, Jonathan Hernandez, Sam Huff, John King, Joe Palumbo, Nick Solak, Leody Taveras, Anderson Tejada, Jose Trevino, Eli White. The list of 9 rookies to make their ML debut: Apostel, Benjamin, Cody, Evans, Huff, King, Taveras, Tejada, White.

**SERIES/SWEEPS:** Texas went 5-13-2 in 20 series this season, 4-4-2 at home and 1-9-0 on the road. Texas went 2-9-1 in last 12 series, losing 7 in a row from 8/17-9/7, longest such streak since a run of 0-7-0 in series from 6/30-7/27/14. Lone road series win came 8/14-16 at COL. Won final series of the year from the playoff-bound Astros, this after a span of going 0-3-1 in previous 4 series.

Rangers had one series sweep in 2020: 8/7-9 vs. LAA (3-0). Club was swept 6 times: 8/4-6 at OAK (0-3), 8/17-18 vs. SD (0-2), 8/19-20 at SD (0-2), 8/21-23 at SEA (0-3), 9/4-7 at SEA (0-4), 9/22-23 at ARI (0-2).

**SHUTOUTS:** Club's 3 shutouts were 7th-most in the A.L. The 3 SHO were all 1-0 or 2-0 victories on 7/24 vs. COL (1-0), 8/8 vs. LAA (2-0), and 9/16 at HOU (1-0).

Team was blanked just once, that coming on 9/22 at ARI. Rangers were one of the final 2 teams in MLB to be blanked (LAD were not shut out in 60 G). Teams shut out one or zero times in 2020: 0-LAD, 1-TEX/BOS/TB.

**SPRING TRAINING:** Texas posted a 12-8-0 record this spring, the second-highest win total in the Cactus League and tied for third-most in the Majors at the time of the shutdown. Texas won 9 of its last 13 games in Arizona, going 10-5 in the final 15 contests after opening with a 2-3 record. The team had nearly matched its 2019 spring win total (13-17-4) in just 20 games. The Rangers' 5-game win streak from Feb. 29-March 4 was the club's longest in Spring Training since a 6-0 span in 2009.

When Major League Baseball cancelled the remainder of 2020 Spring Training games on March 12, the Rangers were in the middle of the club's lone Arizona off day during the exhibition slate. The Rangers had a total of 12 games remaining on the spring schedule that were wiped out by the March 12 announcement: 10 in Arizona and two at brand new Globe Life Field on March 23 (final official spring game vs. St. Louis Cardinals) and March 24 (exhibition contest vs. Rangers prospects). The team's last game action came on March 11 vs. San Francisco in Surprise, a rain-soaked 5-inning game that Texas lost by a 6-4 score when umpires halted play due to soggy field conditions.

**SUMMER CAMP:** While several local Rangers players worked out at Globe Life Field in May and June, and the venue hosted more thorough workouts beginning at the end of June, the club's formal Summer Camp began on July 3. The club had workouts of some kind every day from July 3-22, other than July 12, which was the lone off day in Summer Camp. There were 15 total intrasquad/live BP/simulated "games" played among camp participants before the period was capped with a pair of exhibition games against the Colorado Rockies on July 22 (5-1 loss) and July 22 (7-3 loss). Those Summer Camp exhibition contests were tacked on to original Spring Training statistics, although the July exhibitions included a rule which allowed innings to be "rolled" after an individual pitcher reached 25 pitches in any single inning.

For a best-of-3 intrasquad series from July 16-18, the Rangers' Summer Camp teams were named in honor of Negro Leagues clubs: the Fort Worth Wonders and the Dallas Black Giants. The Negro Leagues Baseball Museum in Kansas City led a national Centennial Celebration in 2020 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the Negro Leagues, which were founded at a meeting not far from the museum on Feb. 13, 1920. The Wonders were part of a minor league Negro baseball league in the 1920's. The Black Giants played in several Negro Leagues from 1908 to 1949, including a 1949 club that featured 18-year-old 2nd baseman Ernie Banks. The Black Giants (managed by Robinson Chirinos) defeated the Wonders (Jeff Mathis) in a HR Derby on July 19 to decide the intrasquad title, 10-9. The series had ended 1-1-1 with a 6-6 tie on July 18.

**STREAKS:** Team won season-high 4 straight from 8/11-15, and also had 3-G win streaks from 8/7-9 and 9/25-27. Rangers dropped a season-high 8 straight from 8/16-23, 2nd straight season with an 8-game slide (also 7/13-22/19) after none since 2014. Texas also dropped 6 in a row, 9/2-7.

**TIME OF GAME:** Texas 9-inning games averaged 3 hours, 3 minutes, 14 seconds in 2020 (3:03:14), a drop of nearly 4 minutes (0:03:47) from the 2019 figure (3:07:01) but still over 2 minutes higher (0:02:21) than 2018 (3:00:53). The mark in 2017 was 3:10:24. The team also played 4 extra-inning games, all lasting exactly 10 innings, and had a pair of 7-inning contests as part of a 9/12 doubleheader. The latter game in the doubleheader still lasted 2:59. The 2020 campaign marked the third season with limited mound visits as part of MLB's efforts to improve pace of play.

Rangers' longest game of the season was a 3:59 affair on 8/20 at SD, a 10-inning walk-off loss. Longest 9-inning contest was 3:40 on 8/30 vs. LAD. The club played a season-low 2:14 in a loss on 8/23 at SEA, the team's shortest game since the 2018 season finale on 9/30/18 at SEA (also 2:14). The first game of the doubleheader on 9/12 vs. OAK – a 7-inning game – lasted just 1:58.

**UNIFORMS:** Texas utilized 6 different uniforms in 2020, the first season in which the club featured a revamped look. There were no Players Weekend uniforms in the abbreviated 2020 season after Texas participated in the alternate uniform event for 3 straight years from 2017-19. The team did not wear any kind of throwback uniform at any point for a third straight season, this after doing so for 6 straight years from 2012-17.

The Rangers unveiled new uniforms and a new secondary logo in 2020 as the team moved into Globe Life Field, the first changes in the Rangers' uniforms since 2014, when the color black of the block "TEXAS" lettering on the jersey fronts was removed. Prior to that change, the last uniform alteration was in 2009. The Rangers had three home jerseys, two road jerseys, and a new spring training jersey beginning in 2020. The primary home white jersey featured the return of the script "Rangers" on the front for the first time since 1993. It also marked the first time that "Rangers" had appeared on the home jersey front in any font since 2008.

In addition, the club introduced a "power blue" alternate home uniform that was worn for Sunday games that also features the script "Rangers" on the front. While the club wore the all-powder blue ensemble twice (7/26 and 9/27), players elected to wear red hats/belts with the uniform on 8/9 and 9/13. Club was 3-1 overall in powder blue. It marked the first time that the Rangers had any type of powder blue home uniform. The club wore powder blue jerseys and pants as its primary road uniform from 1975-82.

The Rangers wore red tops with the no. 42 for the entire 3-game series from 8/28-30 vs. LAD, including the Sunday contest. Team finished 4-3 in red tops, all home games.

Club wore the primary home white uniform with the blue script "Rangers" lettering on 19 occasions in Arlington (9-10 overall), going 6-8 with blue hats/socks and 3-2 with red hats/socks.

On the road, Rangers went 3-14 in blue tops and 3-10 in gray uniforms.

The new secondary logo features a white block "TX" outlined with the State of Texas. It was utilized on the front of the 2020 blue spring training jersey as well as other branding applications. The Rangers' primary circle "T" logo remains unchanged. The only previous era in which the Rangers featured any type of State of Texas logo was from 1982-93. In 1982-83, the Rangers' primary logo was a red "TR" and baseball that were designed in a solid blue State of Texas outline. The "TR" was replaced by "Rangers" in script lettering from 1984-93.

All six of the jerseys featured the Texas flag patch on the left sleeve with all five regular season jerseys also including the Globe Life Field Inaugural Season patch on the right sleeve. The Rangers also updated the outline for the names and numbers on the back of each jersey to a drop shadow design. Nike was the official manufacturer of Major League Baseball uniforms for the first time in 2020.

- Spent the majority of the season in the starting rotation, his 2nd campaign with the Rangers...broke camp on the Opening Day roster for the 1st time in his career...opened as a member of the bullpen before slotting into the rotation after Corey Kluber was placed on the injured list on 7/28...pitched to an 0-6 record through 8 starts and was moved to the bullpen again in late September.
- Went 0-6, 8.80 (29 ER/29.2 IP) in 8 starts and posted 4.0 SHO IP in 3 relief outings...was just the 4th starter in Rangers history to go winless in a season of 8+ starts: Joe Saunders in 2014 (0-5 in 8 G/GS), John Dettmer in 1994 (0-6 in 11 G/9 GS), and Ed Figueroa in 1980 (0-7 in 8 G/GS)...was one of 3 starters in MLB to post such a season in 2020 along with LAA's Julio Teheran (0-4 in 10 G/9 GS) and DET's Michael Fulmer (0-2 in 10 G/GS)...Allard lost his final 6 starts from 8/16-9/12, the 1st Texas pitcher to lose 6+ consecutive starts since Scott Feldman (6 straight) in 2012.

**1 ELVIS ANDRUS****.194 AVG, 3 HR, 7 RBI, .252 OBP, .330 SLG****SHORTSTOP - R/R**

- Hampered by a back injury for much of the season, Andrus batted .194/.252/.330/.582 with 3 home runs and 7 RBI in 29 games with Texas this season...while he appeared in less than half the Rangers' games in the abbreviated campaign, it marked his lowest BA/SLG/OPS in any MLB season...his batting average was above .200 following just 2 games all season: 7/29 vs. ARI (.235) and 8/1 at SF (.208)...produced a negative baseball-reference WAR figure (-0.6) for the first time in his career.
- Spent two stints on the 10-day Injured List: 8/20-30 (lower back strain) and 9/12 (G2)-end of season (back strain)...his back ailment was a facet joint sprain, which is a ligament in the left side of his lower back...while the condition did not require surgery, he received treatment in the form of injections on 9/14.
- Was placed on the Injured List for a second and final time in between games of a doubleheader on 9/12 vs. OAK, going 1-for-3 with a run scored as the starting shortstop on 9/12 vs. OAK-G1, his final appearance of the year.

- The 27-year-old lefty made his MLB debut in 2020, going 2-1 with a 4.84 ERA (12 ER/22.1 IP) in 8 games/one start for Texas...contract selected from Alternate Site on 8/11 and remained with club the rest of the way, as his 48 days active in 2020 will exhaust his rookie status...had a 1.388 WHIP and opponents slashed .264/.316/.429/.745, as he allowed 4 HR with 7 BB/21 SO...averaged 8.46 SO/9 and had 3.00 SO/BB ratio.

- In the final season of his seven-year contract with the Rangers, Choo batted .236/.323/.400/.723 (26-110) with 5 home runs and 15 RBI in 33 games for Texas...it was lowest BA and OBP of any full season in his career...ranked among team leaders in HR (T3rd, 5), RBI (4th, 15), stolen bases (4th, 6), times on base (T4th, 41), and walks (5th, 13) despite playing in just over half of club's games in '20...hit .258 (25-97) in final 28 G after a 1-for-13 start.

• Lynn was selected as the Rangers 2020 Pitcher of the Year by the Dallas-Fort Worth chapter of the BBWAA after delivering one of the strongest performances by a Texas starter in recent years...finished the year among A.L. leaders in starts (1st, 13), innings (1st, 84.0), quality starts (T1st, 10), wins (T4th), strikeouts (5th, 89), opponent batting average (5th, .206), WHIP (7th, 1.060), and ERA (10th)...registered 2.3 wins above replacement according to baseball-reference.com, the highest figure of any Texas player and the 3rd-highest among A.L. pitchers in 2020 (CLE's Shane Bieber-3.2, TOR's Hyun Jin Ryu-3.0, Lynn-2.3).

• Named Rangers July/August Player of the Month by the writers and broadcasters that cover the team on a regular basis after opening with a 4-1 record and 1.93 ERA (11 ER/51.1 IP) in his 1st 8 starts...went 2-2, 5.51 (20 ER/32.2 IP) in final 5 G/GS to raise season ERA from 1.93 to 3.32, the lowest qualifying ERA by a Texas pitcher since Cole Hamels in 2016 (lower 3.32).

# JULY IN REVIEW

The Rangers went 2-4 (.333) in July, including 2-3 in season-opening 5-game homestand vs. COL (1-2) and ARI (1-1), the 1st games played at the new Globe Life Field...offense averaged the fewest R/G (2.50) in MLB for the month and connected for a total of 5 HR, T2nd-fewest in the Majors (ARI-2 HR)...pitching staff ranked among A.L. clubs in opp. BA (3rd, .212), SO/9 (4th, 9.68) and ERA (5th, 3.57)...held opponents to 4-or-fewer runs in 4 of 6 contests, but scored more than 2 runs just once.

Lance Lynn celebrated the opening of Globe Life Field by spinning one of the most dominant performances by an Opening Day starter in club history on 7/24 vs. COL (W, 6.0 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 4 BB, 9 SO, 108 pitches/64 strikes)...the 9 SO matched a Ranger record for a season opener.

# AUGUST IN REVIEW

Texas's 10-17 (.370) record in August was 3rd-worst in the A.L...went 2-12 in last 14 G of the month following 7-1 span from 8/7-15...endured season-worst 8-G losing streak (8/16-23), tied for the club's longest win drought since the start of 2004 (0-8, 7/13-22/19)...batters posted the lowest OPS on circuit (.645) while staff's 5.50 ERA (144 ER/235.2 IP) was 3rd-highest in A.L.

Lance Lynn was selected as the Texas Rangers July/August Player of the Month after going 4-1, 1.93 (11 ER/51.1 IP) with 56 SO/17 BB in 8 GS...at the time, Lynn ranked among A.L. qualifiers in ERA (2nd), innings pitched (2nd, 51.1), wins (T4th) and strikeouts (5th, 56)...it was the 1st monthly honor for the right-hander since he joined the club prior to the 2019 season.

The Rangers went 10-17 (.370) in September, T2nd-worst record in A.L...team was 7-17 in first 24 G of the season's final month, but rounded out the campaign with 3 consecutive wins over HOU at GLF (9/25-27)...launched 35 HR, 4th-most in A.L., although 3.85 R/G average was still 3rd-lowest on circuit...pitchers had a 4.28 ERA (57 ER/120.0 IP) over their last 14 G, but still allowed 4th-most runs among A.L. clubs (134).

Kyle Cody was selected as the Texas Rangers September Player of the Month in voting by the writers and broadcasters who cover the team on a regular basis...went 1-1, 1.96 (4 ER/18.1 IP) in 5 September starts, issuing one or fewer runs in all 5 outings...included his first Major League victory on 9/20 at LAA...Cody was the first rookie to win a Rangers' monthly award since RHP Tommy Hunter in July 2009.

## 2020 ALTERNATE TRAINING SITE (44)

As part of the many operational adjustments for MLB clubs in the 2020 season, each team was allowed to have a group of players train at an alternate location in order to provide readily available backups in the event of injury or illness on the active roster. This option was created due to the absence of Minor League Baseball in 2020. Dubbed the "Alternate Training Site" in official transactions, the Rangers utilized Globe Life Park as the team's alternate location this season, although this group of players regularly held workouts at Globe Life Field when the Rangers were at home and on the road.

# 2020 FIRST-YEAR PLAYER DRAFT SUMMARY

## Round 1 (Pick 14) - 2B Justin Foscue, Mississippi St.

The 21-year-old Foscue (pronounced FOSS-Q) played three seasons at Mississippi State University and was rated by *Baseball America* as the top college second baseman in the draft. Over his three years at Mississippi State, the 6-foot, 203-pound Foscue batted .297 with 19 home runs and 96 RBI, and more walks (67) than strikeouts (57) over 141 games. As a sophomore in 2019, he slashed .331/.395/.564/.959 with 14 home runs and 60 RBI in 67 games, helping the Bulldogs reach the second round of the College World Series. The right-handed batter and thrower led the team in on-base percentage (.464), walks (15), and RBI (16) over 16 games during the shortened 2020 campaign. Foscue began his college career as a third baseman before moving to second base. Last summer, he was the starting second baseman for the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team. The Alabama native was twice named Huntsville Player of the Year at Virgil Grissom High School, where he lettered four years in baseball and also played basketball. Was assigned to the Rangers' Alternate Training Site on 8/20, where he participated in workouts and scrimmages alongside fellow Texas farmhands at Globe Life Park and Globe Life Field.

## Round 2 (Pick 50) - OF Evan Carter, Elizabethton (Tenn.) High School

Carter, 17, was a four-year letterwinner at Elizabethton (Tenn.) High School as both an outfielder and pitcher. As a junior in 2019, he was named Super 22 Player of the Year, conference Pitcher of the Year, and earned first team All-State honors. Carter hit .324 with 4 home runs and 27 RBI that season while going 10-2 with a 1.34 ERA and six complete games on the mound, helping his team to a state tournament appearance. The left-handed batter and right-handed thrower was previously committed to Duke University. Carter also played football at Elizabethton High School for coach Shawn Witten, the brother of fellow Elizabethton alum Jason Witten.

## Round 3 (Pick 86) - RHP Tekoah (TK) Roby, Pine Forest High School (Pensacola, Fla.)

The 6-foot-1, 185-pound Tekoah Roby (pronounced tuh-KOH-uh) paired a 7-3 record with a 1.19 ERA in his junior season at Pine Forest High School in Pensacola, Fla., earning the 2019 Pensacola News Journal Pitcher of the Year award. The 18-year-old recorded 109 strikeouts against just 10 walks last season while contributing a .384 batting average and 28 RBI at the plate to lead Pine Forest to its first regional appearance in 12 years. Roby, a right-handed batter and thrower, had committed to play collegiately at Troy University.

## Round 4 (Pick 115) - LHP Dylan MacLean, Central Catholic High School (Portland, Ore.)

A 17-year-old left-handed pitcher out of Central Catholic High School in Portland, Ore., MacLean (pronounced muk-LAYN) was named Oregon's High School Player of the Year by Prep Baseball Report and Mt. Hood Conference Pitcher of the Year following a standout junior season in 2019. The 6-foot-3, 180-pound pitcher paced all Oregon 6-A hurlers in wins, ERA, and strikeouts last season, leading Central Catholic to the 6-A boy's baseball championship game. At age 13, MacLean pitched for Oregon in the opening round of the 2015 Little League World Series in Williamsport, Pa., striking out 12 batters over 5.2 innings in a 1-0 loss to Texas. The University of Washington commit was tabbed by *Baseball America* as the 2nd-best high school pitcher in Oregon behind Mick Abel, who was selected 15th overall by Philadelphia.

## Round 5 (Pick 145) - SS Thomas Saggese, Carlsbad (Calif.) High School

The 18-year-old Saggese (pronounced suh-GHEE-see) batted .440 with 3 home runs and 9 RBI in 7 games for Carlsbad (Calif.) High School in the shortened season this spring. The shortstop was named Most Valuable Player of San Diego's Avocado West League as a junior after batting .422 (43-102) with 10 home runs, 26 RBI, and 17 walks against 14 strikeouts. He also garnered first team All-County honors that season and was named to Prep Baseball Report's San Diego All-Prospect team. Saggese had previously committed to play collegiately at Pepperdine University.
