TONIGHT’S STARTERS: RHP SANDY ALCANTARA (13-8, 3.46) vs. RHP MICHAEL WACHA (8-8, 3.32)

A LONG, HOT NIGHT: The Royals suffered a 9-6, series-deciding loss to Miami last night, a game that lasted 3 hours and 4 minutes, was played at a first-pitch temperature of 98°F and saw the Royals blow a 3-run lead.

- + Staked to a 2-0 deficit before even getting a turn to bat, the Royals rallied for 5 runs in the bottom of the 1st inning, thanks to a **Carter Jensen** leadoff HR, a **Jac Caglianone** RBI double, a **Salvador Perez** go-ahead, 2-run HR and a **Michael Massey** RBI double.
- + The Royals were held to just 4 hits after the 5-run 1st, however they did draw 5 walks from the 2nd through 9th innings, all of which were left stranded as they ended the night just 1-for-9 with runners in scoring position.

AMERICAN LEAGUE AUGUST HONORS: Major League Baseball announced this morning outfielder **Jac Caglianone** and left hander **Noah Cameron** were named American League Player and Pitcher of the month, respectively, for August, as voted on by media members across MLB.

- + **Jac Caglianone** led the AL last month in batting average (.411), slugging pct. (.684), OPS (1.113) and RBI (26).
- + Cags is the 13th different Royal (18th instance) to win the American League Player of the Month Award, and the first since **Bobby Witt Jr.** in July 2024.
- + **Noah Cameron** went 4-0 in 5 starts last month and ranked among the American League leaders (min. 5 GS) in IP/GS (6.2, 1st), WHIP (0.80, 1st), opponents' avg. (.155, 2nd), HR/9 (0.27, 2nd), wins (3rd) and ERA (1.87, 4th).
- + Cameron is the 11th different Royals pitcher (18th instance) to win the AL Pitcher of the Month Award, and the first since **Kris Bubic** in May 2025.
- + The Royals have both the American League Player and Pitcher of the Month in the same month for the first time since July 1985, when **George Brett** and **Bret Saberhagen** took the honors...they're the second Major League team to do so this season joining the Rays, who had **Junior Caminero** and **Drew Rasmussen** win the awards in June.

SWEEPSTAKES: After losing the 1st 2 games of the series, the Royals are hoping to win tonight to avoid what would be their 11th series sweep...if not, they would break a tie with the Rockies and A's for the most times being swept this year.

- + Their 10 times being swept this season are already more than twice as many as the 4 sweeps they suffered in each of 2024 and 2025.
- + They're 5-10 this season when at risk of being swept, and they have lost each of their last 4 such games.

SERIES SPEAKING: With their loss last night, the Royals fell to 17-24-4 in series play this season, while snapping a run of 5 consecutive winning series which dated back to Aug. 14-16 at Angel Stadium...only the Red Sox (9), Rays (8) and Yankees (6) have had longer streaks among American League teams this season...it was the Royals longest series win streak since April 22-May 8, 2025 (5 straight series).

- + Marked Kansas City's 1st series loss since being swept in 3 games from Aug. 10-12 at Dodger Stadium.

LIFE LATELY: The Royals have lost each of their last 3 games to mark their longest losing streak since a 4-game skid from Aug. 9-12...this comes on the heels of a 15-game stretch in which they went a Majors-best 13-2.

- + They've still won 13 of their last 18 games since the start of their series in Anaheim on Aug. 14, a stretch in which they have the best record in the American League and the 2nd-best run differential (+25).
- + The Royals lead American League teams since Aug. 14 in runs per game (5.3), batting average (tied, .275), on-base percentage (.350) and OPS (.798).
- + Royals starting pitchers rank 7th in the American League since Aug. 14 with a 4.15 ERA (45 ER in 97.2 IP) and Royals relievers rank 5th with a 3.52 ERA (24 ER in 61.1 IP).

HOT BATS: The Royals have lost back-to-back games despite scoring at least 3 runs, snapping a 13-game win streak in such games...they lost only 4 games in between Aug. 11 and last Tuesday night and they scored a total of 3 runs in those games, including 2 shutout defeats.

- + Spanning their last 6 series since Aug. 14, the Royals are averaging 5.3 runs per game, which leads the American League and ranks 4th in the Majors to only the Cubs (6.5), Brewers (5.9) and Cardinals (5.4).
- + In their last 6 games since a week ago tonight in Toronto, the Royals have produced 10 multi-run innings—tied for the most in the AL—including their 5-run 1st last night.

HOME: The Royals tonight continue their penultimate stay of the season, a 9-game homestand vs. the Marlins (0-2), Blue Jays and Diamondbacks...Tuesday night began a stretch in which they will play 15 of their last 24 games at Kauffman Stadium, where they are 36-32 (.537), which is the 6th-best home record in the American League.

- + Their back-to-back losses have snapped the Royals 7-game home win streak...they have only 6 home losses since July 5, a stretch in which they're 17-6 (.773) here, with the best home record in Major League Baseball.
- + They have not been swept at Kauffman Stadium since June 30-July 2 vs. the Rays, and tonight they will seek to avoid their 4th home series sweep of the season.
- + The Royals are 5-3-3 on 11 homestands this season.
- + The Royals rank 2nd in the AL at home in on-base pct. (.333), slugging pct. (.436) and OPS (.770), are tied for 2nd in batting avg. (.266) and 3rd in runs per game (4.9).

AMERICA’S SHORTSTOP: In 27 games since returning from the IL on Aug. 4, **Bobby Witt Jr.** is slashing .305/.393/.448 (32-for-105) and is tied for the Majors lead during that time with 27 runs scored, matching **Pete Crow-Armstrong**.

- + Witt Jr., who has won the American League *Rawlings* Gold Glove at shortstop each of the last two seasons and won the American League Platinum Glove last year, is tied with Crow-Armstrong for the lead among players at all positions with 24 Outs Above Average in 2026.
- + He leads the AL in fWAR (6.4) and is 3rd in the Majors behind Crow-Armstrong (9.3) and **Shohei Ohtani** (6.8).
- + Witt Jr. ranks T-3rd in the Majors this season with 38 stolen bases, and since his 2022 debut, he leads the Majors with 186 steals, which are 22 more than any other player.

SECOND THOUGHTS: The Royals are 24-19 (.558) since the All-Star break, which—despite losing their last 3 games—is the 5th-best record in the American League, trailing only the Red Sox (29-17), Rays (27-18), Yankees (26-18) and Astros (24-18).

- + Their 2nd-half play marks a significant improvement for the Royals, who were 21 games under (38-59) before the break, which tied for the worst record in the Majors.
- + The Royals win pct. has improved from .392 before the break to .558 since, for a difference of +.166, best in MLB.
- + The Royals are 8-5-1 in 14 series since the All-Star break—including this week's series loss vs. the Marlins—after going 9-19-3 in 31 sets in the 1st half.

LEADING OFF: **Carter Jensen** last night hit his 6th leadoff home run, setting a Royals single-season record...it's tied for the 2nd most leadoff HR in the AL, behind **Joc Pederson** (7).

- + He added another solo HR in the 4th last night to mark his 2nd career multi-HR game...the homers marked his 20th and 21st of the season, making him the 13th rookie primary catcher in Major League history to eclipse 20 home runs in a season, and he's just the second left-handed hitter to do so, following **Matt Nokes** (32) in 1987.
- + Carter joins **Jac Caglianone** as the only two Royals to reach the 20-HR mark this season, becoming the fifth set (sixth instance) of left-handed batters to do so within a single season in Royals history, and the first since the trio of **Eric Hosmer** (25), **Brandon Moss** (22) and **Mike Moustakas** (38) turned the trick in 2017.
- + All 6 of Jensen's leadoff homers have come as a catcher...according to *Elias*, he's the first player since at least 1900 to hit 6 leadoff HR in a season as a catcher.
- + The Royals 1st-inning offense has been among the best in the Majors since June 1, an 81-game stretch in which they lead all 30 teams in batting average (.290), rank 2nd in runs (57), 3rd in OPS (.857) and T-3rd in HR (19).

HEATING UP!: Last night's temperature at 1st pitch was 98°F, marking the 2nd-warmest game in the month of September in the 54-year history of Kauffman Stadium, trailing only a 99°F game on Sept. 8, 2013 vs. the Tigers.

- + High temperatures in Kansas City are expected to be in the mid-to-upper 90s throughout the rest of this homestand.

FISH BITES: The Royals are hosting the Marlins this week at Kauffman Stadium for only the fifth time and first since 2024...these teams have met 10 times but 4 of the last 6 series since 2016 have been in Miami...the Royals are 13-16 in 29 games vs. the Marlins, and have lost each of their last 2 series after going 1-2 vs. them in 2025.

- + Tonight, the Royals will try to avoid their 2nd sweep against the Marlins, who swept them in a 3-game set from June 5-7, 2023 in Miami.

MICHAEL WACHA is making his 28th start of the season and the 316th of his career (337th appearance) tonight in the finale of this 3-game series against the Marlins at Kauffman Stadium...it's his 8th career start vs. Miami...Michael is in his 14th Major League season in 2026 and his third with Kansas City, after spending parts of 11 seasons with the Cardinals (2013-19), Mets (2020), Rays (2021), Red Sox (2022) and Padres (2023)...he was selected 19th overall in the 2012 MLB Draft by the Cardinals.

+ Wacha joined Kansas City in December 2023 on a one-year contract...after a successful first season with the Royals—in which he went 13-8 with a 3.35 ERA in 29 starts—the two sides agreed to a new deal in November 2024, which keeps him in Kansas City through 2027, in addition to a club option for the 2028 season.

+ Michael has surrendered 3 earned runs or fewer in 67 of his 87 starts (77.0%) since joining the Royals in 2024, which are the most such starts in the AL over that span.

+ He was named an All-Star this season for the second time in his career and first since 2015 while with the Cardinals...according to *Elías*, he became the third player to have at least 10 seasons between All-Star selections, joining **Bert Blyleven** (11, 1973-85) and **Schoolboy Rowe** (10, 1936-47)...he worked a 1-2-3 3rd inning with 2 strikeouts in the 2026 All-Star Game on July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia.

LAST START: Earned a 3-0 win last Friday night in Cleveland after tossing 8.0 shutout innings of 4-hit ball with no walks and a season-high 10 strikeouts...he retired each of the 1st 6 batters he faced before allowing a leadoff single to **Patrick Bailey** in the 3rd inning...after stranding 2 baserunners in the 3rd, Wacha tossed a clean 4th inning and worked around a 1-out single by Bailey in the 5th...he set down 11 of his final 12 hitters and was lifted for **Steven Cruz** prior to the start of the 9th with the Royals ahead 3-0.

+ Became the fourth pitcher (6th instance) in franchise history to record a start at least 8.0 scoreless innings with no walks and 10 strikeouts, joining **Zack Greinke** (three times), **Mark Gubicza** on Aug. 17, 1986 vs. the Yankees and **Rich Gale** on June 26, 1978 at the Angels...it marked the 7th such outing by a pitcher in MLB this year.

+ He recorded his 5th career double-digit strikeout effort and his 1st since May 15, 2023 vs. the Royals at Petco Park (career high 11) while he was with the Padres.

+ Averaged a season-high 94.7 mph on his four-seam fastball, and Wacha threw his 2 fastest pitches of the campaign—97.8 and 96.8 mph—to **Chase DeLauter** in the 3rd inning...his 97.8-mph fastball to DeLauter was his fastest pitch with the Royals.

THREE’S COMPANY: Michael has won a season-high 3 straight starts since Aug. 17, a stretch in which he has a 2.25 ERA (5 ER in 20.0 IP) and a .181 opponents' average (13-for-72)...his 3 consecutive wins are tied with **Dylan Cease** and **Logan Henderson** for the 2nd-longest active streak in the Majors, behind **Zebby Matthews** (5 straight).

+ He has won 4 straight starts five times in his career, most recently from Aug. 1-18, 2025, which was also the last time that a Royals pitcher won 4 consecutive starts.

BEST ON BEST: Tonight will mark the second time in Wacha’s career that he’s started opposite **Sandy Alcantara**, following June 10, 2019 with St. Louis at Busch Stadium, where he earned a 4-1 win after firing 6.0 shutout innings of 5-hit ball with 4 strikeouts.

+ The table below shows where both rank among the Major League leaders this year.

QUALITY TIME: Wacha recorded his American League-leading 18th quality start of the season last Friday night in Cleveland, trailing only **Sandy Alcantara** (21), **Yoshinobu Yamamoto** (19) and **Cristopher Sánchez** (19) for the Major League lead...he’s on pace to record a career-high 20 quality starts this year, which would surpass his previous high of 19 that he set during the 2015 season while he was with the St. Louis Cardinals.

+ Wacha is trying to become the first Royals starting pitcher to lead the American League in quality starts outright in a single season since **James Shields** had 27 in 2013...his teammate, **Seth Lugo**, finished 2024 tied for the American League lead with 22 quality starts alongside **Corbin Burnes**, **Logan Gilbert** and **Tarik Skubal**.

LIKE CLOCKWORK: His 170.2 innings pitched this season are the 2nd most in the AL, behind only **Cam Schlitler** (171.2)...he’s 6 outs shy of matching and 7 outs away from surpassing his total (172.2) from last year, which he did across a career-high 31 starts.

+ Michael has spun at least 5.0 innings in 26 of his 27 starts this year, which is tied with **Logan Gilbert** & **Parker Messick** for the most such starts in the American League.

+ He has worked at least 6.0 innings in 20 of his 27 starts this season, which are the most such outings by a pitcher in the American League and tied for the 3rd most in Major League Baseball, behind **Sandy Alcantara** (25) & **Yoshinobu Yamamoto** (22).

+ Wacha has tossed at least 7.0 innings in 11 of his 27 starts this year, the most by any pitcher in the AL and the 2nd most in the Majors, behind only Alcantara (13).

CAN’T WALK HERE: Wacha has issued just 1 walk over his last 4 starts—covering 26.2 innings and 101 batters faced—since Aug. 11...marks the second time in his career that he has allowed only 1 walk in a 4-start span, following Aug. 31-Sept. 16, 2022 with the Red Sox (1 walk in 25.0 IP)...he’s the second Royals pitcher this year to yield just 1 walk in a 4-start run, following **Noah Cameron** from May 27-June 13 (1 walk in 22.1 IP).

HELP ME HELP YOU: Michael has received an average of 3.43 runs of support over his 27 starts this season, which is the 3rd-lowest mark in MLB, ahead of **Tanner Bibee** (3.05) and **Shane Baz** (3.27)...he has received 3 runs of support or fewer in 18 of his last 19 starts dating back to May 15, during which he has a 3.62 ERA (48 ER in 119.1 IP).

THE ROUND-TRIP REPORT: Last Friday night at Progressive Field marked the first time that Wacha did not allow a homer in a start since July 31 at Colorado, snapping a streak of 4 consecutive outings from Aug. 6-22 in which he allowed at least 1 HR...he’s recorded back-to-back homerless starts only once this season: June 16-27 (3 straight).

TOMORROW NIGHT’S STARTER: LHP DANIEL LYNCH IV (4-4, 3.06)

- + **Daniel Lynch IV** will make his 6th start of the season and the 62nd of his career (176th appearance) in tomorrow night’s series opener vs. Toronto.

+ In his most recent start last Saturday in Cleveland vs. the Guardians, Lynch IV did not factor into the decision of an 8-3 win after yielding 2 runs on 3 hits and 2 walks in 3.1 innings, with 3 strikeouts...an E4 led off the ballgame, but Daniel escaped trouble with a strikeout and 5-4-3 double play...allowed a leadoff walk to start the 2nd then surrendered a 2-run homer to **Jo Adell** prior to another walk and a fielder’s choice/E6, but got out of the jam with another double play and a groundout...stranded a leadoff single in the 3rd, then surrendered a 1-out double in the 4th before being relieved in favor of **Anthony Gose**, who stranded the runner.

+ Lynch IV has allowed 2 runs or fewer in each of his last 3 starts after allowing 7 runs (6 ER) in his 1st 2 starts after joining the rotation on Aug. 7.
- + In 4 games (3 starts) vs. the Blue Jays in his career, Lynch IV is 0-2 with a 6.61 ERA (12 ER in 16.1 IP) with 12 strikeouts...he hasn’t made a start vs. Toronto since 2022, but tossed a scoreless inning in relief on Aug. 3, 2025 in a 7-4 win.

+ Across 30 games (10 starts) vs. the AL East in his career, he is 0-5 with a 4.42 ERA (39 ER in 79.1 IP)...he has not allowed an earned run in 6 relief outings vs. AL East teams this season and has a 0.44 ERA (1 ER in 20.2 IP) in 19 outings since 2025...his 0.44 ERA vs. the AL East since 2025 leads the Majors (min. 15 games).

+ In 27 games (3 starts) at home this season, Daniel is 1-1 with a 2.34 ERA (9 ER in 34.2 IP) and 23 strikeouts...his last start at The K came on Aug. 23 vs. Detroit, when he tossed a season-high 4.1 innings and allowed 2 runs in an 11-7 win.

MANAGER MATT QUATRARO (kwuh-TRAIR-roe)

- + **Matt Quatraro** is in his fourth season as Royals Manager...in January, he agreed to an extension that runs through 2029 and includes a club option for 2030...the option would represent his eighth season, which would mark the 2nd-longest tenure in franchise history, trailing only **Ned Yost’s** 10 seasons as Manager.

+ His 286 wins are tied with **Hal McRae** for the 6th most in club history, 1 shy of **John Wathan** (287) for 5th...he’s 14 wins shy of becoming the fifth Royals Manager to reach 300 wins (Yost 746, **Whitey Herzog** 410, **Dick Howser** 404, **Tony Muser** 317).

+ Quatraro led the Royals to back-to-back winning seasons in 2024-25 for the first time since 2013-15...the Royals under Q are the eighth team in the Wild Card Era, according to *Elias*, to have back-to-back winning seasons after a 100-loss campaign.
- + Quatraro led the 2024 Royals to an 86-76 record in his second season as Manager.

+ Q finished runner-up in the 2024 American League Manager of the Year voting.

+ The 2024 Royals were the sixth team in the 162-game Era (since 1961), according to Elias, to have a 30-win improvement from one season to the next (excluding shortened seasons)...they were the third team to make the postseason following a 100-loss season, following the 2017 Minnesota Twins and 2020 Miami Marlins.

+ Before joining the Royals, he spent five years on **Kevin Cash’s** staff in Tampa Bay and four seasons on **Terry Francona’s** staff in Cleveland...during his 12 full seasons on a big league staff, his teams have reached the postseason seven times.

REPLAY SPECIALIST BILL DUPLISSEA

- + **Bill Duplissea** is in his 21st season with the Royals and has served as the Replay Coordinator since Instant Replay was instituted in 2014...during that time, the Royals 65.4% success rate is 1st in the Majors, ahead of the 2nd-place Yankees (64.0%).

+ Duplissea has overturned 22 of 30 challenges this season (73.3%), which is the best rate in the Majors according to the latest update sent from MLB last Friday.

+ In 12 full seasons of Instant Replay, the Royals have finished in the top 5 in success rate eight times and have finished in the top 10 in all 12 seasons.
- + Duper started with the Royals as a Bullpen Catcher in 2006, then added advance scouting duties in 2012...in his current role, he works closely with the coaching staff in scouting upcoming opponents, in addition to his in-game replay role.

+ Prior to joining the Royals, he spent 2004-05 as an Assistant Coach at the College of San Mateo, helping lead the Bulldogs to conference titles in both seasons.

+ Duplissea was a catcher for five seasons in the Los Angeles Dodgers organization, reaching Triple-A Albuquerque in 2000.
