Carlos Gómez (LF), Jonathan Lucroy (C) and Aramis Ramírez (3B) started in the 2014 Midsummer Classic.

TODAY'S GAME: Is the fifth game (1-3) of a 6-game homestand against Pittsburgh (1-2) and Washington (0-1) leading into the All-Star break.....following the break, the team takes a 5-game road trip to Minnesota (2g) and Chicago-NL (3g).

IN THE STANDINGS [107 days]: The Brewers have spent the following number of days alone or tied at each position in the NL Central standings: FIRST: 93, SECOND: 13, THIRD: 1, FOURTH: 0, FIFTH: 0.....the team is in first place, leading the Cardinals by 5.0 games, Pirates by 7.5 games, Reds by 8.0 games and last-place Cubs by 8.0 games.

<u>SERIES-LY SPEAKING</u>: The Brewers are 17-10-3 in series play. <u>Game 1</u>: 15-16, <u>Game 2</u>: 18-12, <u>Game 3</u>: 18-11, <u>Game 4</u>: 3-2 <u>Sweep Wins [4]</u>: at NYM (3g, 3/29-3/31), at STL [3g, 4/19-4/21], vs. CWS (3g, 5/31-6/2), vs. TEX (3g, 6/24-6/26) <u>Sweep Losses [1]</u>: at PHI (3g, 6/3-6/5)

AT HOME: The Brewers are 28-16 at home, going 10-3-1 in series play.....the team has gone 23-9 in its last 32 home games after a 5-7 start.....the Brewers had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from May 29-June 10.....the team won nine consecutive series prior to dropping 2 of 3 games to Pittsburgh from July 9-11.

<u>ON THE ROAD</u>: The Brewers are 26-25 on the road, going 7-7-2 in series play.....the team has gone 13-21 in its last 34 road games after a 13-4 start.....the team had a season-high 4-game road winning streak from April 9-13.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.....Murphy spent the previous eight seasons (2016-23) as bench coach.....his only Major League managerial experience previously came in 2015 as interim manager of the Padres, replacing Bud Black in June (42-54).....he enjoyed a 25-year college head coaching career primarily at the University of Notre Dame (1988-94) and Arizona State University (1995-2009).....Murphy went 1,000-457-4 as a college coach and was on pace to be the winningest coach in NCAA history before he transitioned into the professional ranks.

CDACHES: First base coach Quintin Berry (4th season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (2nd season/1st in current role), hitting coach Connor Dawson (3rd season), assistant pitching coach Jim Henderson (3rd season/1st in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (6th season), third base coach Jason Lane (9th season/4th in current role), run prevention coordinator Walker McKinven (5th season/1st in current role) and hitting coach Ozzie Timmons (3rd season) all returned from the 2023 staff..... Rickie Weeks (associate manager), Daniel de Mondesert (assistant coach) and Charlie Greene (bullpen coach) are in their first seasons on the coaching staff, all Major League coaches for the first time.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 22 replay challenges this season, going 13-9.....their last challenge (lost) came on 7/7 at Los Angeles-NL as a foul ball hit by Willy Adames stood.

# TODAY'S STARTER: #60 - LHP DALLAS KEUCHEL (3gs, 0-0, 4.61)

KEUCHEL AT A GLANCE: Dallas Keuchel, 36, will be making his fourth start of the seasson.....Keuchel last started last Sunday at Los Angeles-NL and received no decision in the Brewers' 9-2 win (4.1ip, 3h, 0r, 5bb, 0k, 94 pitches).....the team has gone 3-0 in his starts.....opponents are batting .278 (15-for-54, 3hr).....he was acquired by Milwaukee from Seattle on June 25 in exchange for cash....signed to a Minor League contract with the Mariners on April 5, he went 7-4 with a 3.93 ERA in 13 starts at Triple-A Tacoma (71ip, 64h, 36r, 31er, 22bb, 45k, 10hr) before he was dealt to Milwaukee....name is pronounced "KAl-kuhl."

LAST SEASON: Keuchel went 2-1 with a 5.97 ERA in 10 games/6 starts with Minnesota.....he went 1-1 with a 6.39 ERA as a starter [25.1ip, 18er] and 1-0 with a 5.11 ERA in relief [12.1ip, 7er].....he had 1 quality start.....the team went 4-2 in his starts....opponents batted .298 [45-for-151, 3hr].....he also made 6 starts at Triple-A St. Paul, going 1-0 with a 1.13 ERA....signed with Minnesota as a free agent on June 22.

CAREER: Has gone 103-92 with a 4.03 ERA in 281 games/266 starts [1639.1ip, 734er].....is in his 13th Major League season pitching for Houston [2012-18], Atlanta [2019], Chicago-AL [2020-22], Arizona [2022], Texas [2022], Minnesota [2023] and Milwaukee [2024].....won the 2015 American League Cy Young Award [33gs, 20-8, 2.48era] while finishing fifth in Most Valuable Player voting that season.....was an All-Star in 2015 and 2017.....is a five-time Gold Glove Award winner [2014-16, 2018, 2021].....was a member of the 2017 World Series-champion Astros as he started Game 1 and Game 5 of the World Series against the Dodgers.....Keuchel was selected by Houston in the seventh round of the 2009 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Arkansas.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 0-4 with a 10.80 ERA in 5 starts (21.2ip, 26er).....is 0-0 with an 11.25 ERA in 1 start this season (4ip, 5er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 48-55 with a 4.73 ERA in 139 games/134 starts (789.2ip. 415er).....is 0-0 with a 1.86 ERA in 2 starts this season (9.2ip. 2er).

CAREER vs. NATIONALS: Is 1-3 with a 4.19 ERA in 6 starts [34.1ip, 42h, 19r, 16er, 13bb, 20k, 1hr].....has not faced Washington since making 3 starts in 2019 with Atlanta.

RHP Colin Rea will be making his 19th appearance and 17th start of the season.....Rea last pitched on Tuesday vs. Pittsburgh and suffered a 12-2 defeat (5ip, 6h, 7r, 7er, 2bb, 3k, 1hr, 87 pitches).....he has gone 7-3 with a 4.01 ERA as a starter (89.2ip, 40er) and 1-0 with a 1.86 ERA in relief (9.2ip 2er).....the team is 11-5 in his starts.....has has 6 quality starts.....opponents are batting .238 (91-for-382, 14hr).....his only career outing against Washington came with the Padres on 6/18/16 at Petco Park (6.1ip, 4h, 2r, 1er, 2bb, 6k, 1hbp).....he had no decision in a 7-3 win.
