IN THE TRAINER'S ROOM: RHP Logan Henderson (right elbow), RHP Shelby Miller (right elbow), **DF Garrett Mitchel**l (left oblique), **LHP Jordan Montgomery** (left elbow) and **LHP Connor Thomas** (left elbow) are on the 60-day injured list.

IN THE STANDINGS [195 days]: The Brewers spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: <u>FIRST</u>: 81, <u>SECOND</u>: 57, <u>THIRD</u>: 43, <u>FOURTH</u>: 11, <u>FIFTH</u>: 3.....the team finished in first place, ahead of the second-place Cubs by 5.0 games, third-place Reds by 14.0 games, fourth-place Cardinals by 19.0 games and fifth-place Pirates by 26.0 games.....the Brewers spent the last 63 days of the season [7/28-9/28] in sole possession of first place, clinching a postseason berth on September 13 and the NL Central on September 21.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have qualified for the postseason seven times in the last eight seasons and in three straight seasons.....the team has won the NL Central four times in the last five seasons and three years in a row....Milwaukee was just two games away from qualifying for the postseason in nine straight seasons (2017-25), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers have produced 86+ wins in each of the last eight full seasons (2017-25), including a franchise-record 97 this season....this does not include 2020....the Brewers (8), Astros (8) and Dodgers (13) are the only teams with 86+ wins in at least each of the last eight full seasons.....the Brewers have 763 wins since 2017 (4th in MLB/2nd in National League).

TEAM STREAK: The Brewers had a pair of double-digit winning streaks this season... the team won 11 consecutive games from 7/6-7/21 and a franchise-record 14 in a row from 8/1-8/16.....the Brewers were the first team in the Major Leagues since the 2015 Blue Jays (11 games twice) to have multiple winning streaks of 11+ games in a season and the first National League team to do it since the 1935 Cubs (11 and 21 games).

AT HOME: The Brewers went 52-29 at home this season, tying the Dodgers and Padres for the third-best record in the Major Leagues.....the team was 17-8-1 in series play.... Milwaukee won 50+ home games for the eighth time and first time since going 51-30 in 2018.....the team had a season-high 7-game home winning streak from 8/8-8/22.

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers went 45-36 on the road this season, posting the best record in the Major Leagues....the team was 13-11-2 in series play.....Milwaukee had a franchise-record-tying 9-game road winning streak from 7/23-8/16.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy completed in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he became the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team made 26 replay challenges this season (18-8).

# ALSO IN THE BULLPEN: #46 - RHP QUINN PRIESTER (29g, 24gs, 13-3, 3.32) 2025 Arsenal: Sinker (41.7%) - Slider (27.2%) - Cutter (20.4%) - Curveball (9.2%) - Changeup (1.5%)

PRIESTER AT A GLANCE: Quinn Priester, 25, went 13-3 with a 3.32 ERA in 29 games/24 starts this season.....the team went 17-7 in his starts.....he had 9 quality starts..... opponents batted .245 (145-for-593, 18hr).....he went 10-3 with a 2.96 ERA as a starter (130.2ip, 43er) and 3-0 with a 5.06 ERA in relief (26.2ip, 15er).....the team won 19 consecutive games (16 starts) in which he appeared from 5/30-9/18.....during this stretch, Priester recorded a personal 12-game winning streak while posting a 2.84 ERA (107.2ip, 95h, 36r, 34er, 26bb, 96k, 13hr).....he was acquired from Boston on April 7 in exchange for DF Yophery Rodriguez, a Competitive Balance Round A selection and a player to be named (RHP John Holobetz on May 5).....he began the season at Triple-A Worcester (1 start).

POSTSEASON: Made his first career postseason appearance in Game 3 of the NLDS at Chicago as he started and took a 4-3 loss (0.2ip, 3h, 4r, 4er, 2bb, 1k, 1hr, 39 pitches).

LAST SEASON: Priester went 3-6 with a 4.71 ERA in 11 games/7 starts with Pittsburgh (10g/6gs) and Boston (1gs).....his teams went 1-6 in his starts.....he had 2 quality starts..... opponents batted .277 (56-for-202, 7hr).....he went 1-5 with a 4.42 ERA as a starter (36.2ip, 18er) and 2-1 with a 5.54 ERA as a reliever (13ip, 8er).....Priester was traded by Pittsburgh to Boston on 7/29/24 in exchange for INF/OF Nick Yorke.

CAREER: Is 19-12 with a 4.45 ERA in 50 games/39 starts (257ip, 127er) while pitching for Pittsburgh (2023-24), Boston (2024) and Milwaukee (2025).....has gone 13-11 with a 4.17 ERA as a starter (207.1ip, 96er) and 6-1 with a 5.62 ERA as a reliever (49.2ip, 31er).....Priester was selected by Pittsburgh in the first round (18th overall) of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft out of Cary-Grove (IL) High School.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 8-3 with a 4.05 ERA in 16 games/12 starts (86.2ip, 39er).....went 7-2 with a 3.82 ERA in 13 games/10 starts in 2025 (70.2ip, 30er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: IS 9-6 with a 3.96 ERA in 28 games/22 starts [147.2ip, 65er].....went 6-1 with a 2.91 ERA in 16 games/14 starts in 2025 [86.2ip, 28er].

CAREER vs. DODGERS: Earned a 2-0 victory in his only career outing against Los Angeles, coming this season on 7/18 at Dodger Stadium (6ip, 3h, 0bb, 10k, 77 pitches).

# ALSO IN THE BULLPEN: #62 - LHP JOSÉ QUINTANA (24gs, 11-7, 3.96) 2025 Arsenal: Sinker (44.0%) - Changeup (22.1%) - Curveball (14.5%) - 4-Seam Fastball (11.7%) - Slurve (7.7%)

QUINTANA AT A GLANCE: José Quintana, 36, went 11-7 with a 3.96 ERA in 24 starts during his first season with Milwaukee.....the team went 15-9 in his starts.....he had 8 quality starts.....opponents batted .241 (120-for-497, 18hr).....he was on the 15-day injured list from 5/14-5/31 with a left shoulder impingement, retroactive to 5/11, and returned to the 15-day injured list from 9/17-9/30 with a left calf strain, retroactive to 9/15.....Quintana signed with Milwaukee as a free agent on March 5.....he is signed through the 2025 season with a mutual option for 2026.....name is pronounced "keen-TAH-nuh."

POSTSEASON: Quintana is 0-2 with a 3.25 ERA in 9 games/7 starts (36ip, 26h, 15r, 13er, 14bb, 30k, 2hr).....he has pitched in the postseason with Chicago-AL (2017), St. Louis (2022), New York-NL (2024) and Milwaukee (2025).....he pitched in relief in Game 3 of the NLDS at Chicago, tossing 3.0 scoreless innings (2h, 1bb, 2k, 49 pitches).

MR. COLOMBIA: Quintana, born in Arjona, Colombia, is his country's all-time leader in nearly every statistical category in the Major Leagues, including games (383), starts (357), wins (113), innings pitched (2101.1) and strikeouts (1.816).....he pitched for Colombia in the 2017 World Baseball Classic.

BEEN THERE, DONE THAT: Quintana has made 357 starts since 2012 - his first season - trailing only Max Scherzer (373).....this includes nine seasons of 30+ starts.

CAREER: Is 113-110 with a 3.76 ERA in 383 games/357 starts (2101.1ip, 877er).....is in his 14th Major League season while pitching for Chicago-AL (2012-17), Chicago-NL (2017-20), Los Angeles-AL (2021), San Francisco (2021), Pittsburgh (2022), St. Louis (2022), New York-NL (2023-24) and Milwaukee (2025).....was an All-Star in 2016 as he finished 10th in American League Cy Young Award voting.....Quintana was originally signed by the Mets as a non-drafted free agent on 4/26/06.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 9-9 with a 4.47 ERA in 24 starts (129ip, 64er).....went 4-5 with a 5.08 ERA in 12 starts this season (62ip, 35er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 57-57 with a 3.74 ERA in 193 games/181 starts (1058.0ip, 440er).....went 7-2 with a 2.97 ERA in 12 starts this season (69.2ip, 23er).

CAREER vs. DODGERS: Is 4-2 with a 2.32 ERA in 15 games/12 starts against Los Angeles (73.2ip, 59h, 24h, 19er, 27bb, 61k, 6hr), including 1-0 with a 3.75 ERA in 2 starts this season (12ip, 6h, 5r, 5er, 4bb, 9k, 2hr).

RHP Freddy Peralta will make his third start of the 2025 postseason.....he went 1-1 with a 4.66 ERA in 2 starts against Chicago in the NLDS (9.2ip, 7h, 5r, 5er, 5bb, 15k, 3hr).....he earned a 9-3 win in NLDS Game 1 in Milwaukee as he allowed 2 runs on 4 hits in 5.2 innings (3bb, 9k, 2hr, 95 pitches) and took a 6-0 loss in Game 4 in Chicago as he allowed 3 runs on 3 hits in 4.0 innings (2bb, 6k, 1hr, 84 pitches).....Peralta went 17-6 with a 2.70 ERA in a career-high 33 starts this season....the team went 20-13 in his starts....he produced 13 quality starts.... opponents batted .193 (124-for-643, 21hr).....Peralta is 4-2 with a 3.29 ERA in 8 career starts against the Dodgers (41ip, 28h, 15r, 15er, 20bb, 40k, 6hr), going 2-0 with a 3.27 ERA in 2 starts in 2025 (11ip, 10h, 4r, 4er, 4bb, 11k, 1hr).
