Combination of Rays wins and Yankees losses needed to win the AL East title for the fifth time in franchise history and the first since earning back-to-back division crowns from 2020-21.

RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their final homestand of the season, a nine-game stretch against the Astros (3-0), Athletics (three to play), and Red Sox (three to play), tonight at Tropicana Field...have won three straight, five of six, seven of nine, 12 of 17, and 14 of their last 20 games to improve to a season-high 31 games over .500 for the first time since finishing 2023 at 36 games above the mark (99-63)...have won back-to-back sets, are 4-1-1 in their last six series, and 10-5-1 in their last 16...are an MLB-best 34-17 across their last 51 games (July 20–pres.)...following this series, each of their final three opponents currently occupy a postseason spot (vs. BOS, at NYY, at PHI)...have qualified for the postseason for the 10th time in 29 seasons and sixth time in the last eight years (2019–pres.)...are attempting to finish a season with the AL's best record for the fifth time, joining their division titles in 2021, 2020, 2010, and 2008...lead the second-place Yankees by 3.5 games in the AL East standings, holding an advantage of 3.0 games or more each day since Aug. 3...have led the division for 80 consecutive days (June 27–pres.) and spent a total of 120 days at the helm overall and 119 days with the AL's best winning pct., both of which are franchise records.

- ★ The Rays pushed across multiple runs in six of the eight frames they came to the plate and all nine starters hit safely in Sunday's 14-4 win over the Astros...they completed their franchise-record 15th sweep of the season, surpassing 2021 (14), while becoming 10th AL team since 2002 to tally 15 sweeps in a campaign and the second since 2020 along with the 2022 Astros (15).
- ★ It marked their third sweep over Houston, first since July 10-12, 2015 at Tropicana Field...they reached the 90-win threshold for the 10th time in club history (see "The Ray Way" for more).
- ★ **Freddy Peralta** departed after authoring 5.0 hitless innings ahead of **Brody Hopkins'** major league debut in the 6th...it marked the ninth time a Rays starting pitcher completed an outing of 5.0 hitless frames or more, first since **Ryan Pepiot** (5.0IP) on Sept. 4, 2025 vs. CLE.
- ★ Rays pitchers have allowed 13 runs over the last six games, turning in a majors'-best 2.21 ERA (53.0IP, 13ER) and 0.89 WHIP in that span (Sept. 8–pres.)...the rotation has yielded one or zero runs in five of its last six outings, pitching to a 1.27 ERA (35.1IP, 5ER) in that span while holding opponents to a 171/209/236 (21-for-123) line—all marks lead MLB in that stretch.
- ★ The Rays have played 54 runs over their last nine games since Sept. 4, good for an AL-best 6.0 runs per contest...they have scored six runs or more in six of those nine games compared to five of their previous 20 games (Aug. 14–Sept. 3).

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays placed **RHP Tyler Wells** (right forearm tightness) on the 15-day IL (retro Sept. 13), reinstated **OF Jake Fraley** (hernia) from the 60-day IL, recalled **RHP Alex Cook** from Triple-A Durham, and optioned **C Kenny Piper** to Durham...to make room on the 40-man roster, **OF Jacob Melton** (right hamstring strain) was recalled from Durham and placed on the 60-day IL... additionally, **RHP Michael Grove** was claimed off waivers by the Braves.

TO THE VICTOR GOES THE SPOILS—Yesterday, MLB announced **Victor Mesa Jr.** as AL Player of the Week for Sept. 7-13, his first career weekly honor and the second by a Ray this season, joining **Junior Caminero** from June 21-28...Mesa Jr. went 10-for-18 (.556) with 2 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, 6 RBI, 4 BB, 8 R, 2 SB, and a 1.914 OPS in six games, leading MLB in average, slugging pct. (1.278), and OPS...he is the first Rays rookie to earn a weekly honor since **Nathaniel Lowe** in July 2019 and the first Tampa Bay outfielder, regardless of rookie status, since **Manuel Margot** in May 2022.

- ★ Mesa Jr. has hit safely in a career-high nine straight games (Sept. 4–pres.), batting .484 (15-for-31) with 3 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, 8 RBI, and a 1.478 OPS in that span...min. 100 PA, his 1.014 OPS over his last 40 games since July 7 is the best in the AL.
- ★ His .518 slugging pct. on the year would be the fourth best by a Tampa Bay rookie (min. 200PA) behind **Bubba Frammell** (.568) in 1998, **Jonny Gomes** (.534) in 2005, and **Evan Longoria** (.531) in 2008.

THE CAMINER-SHOW—**Junior Caminero** has homered three times in his last eight games to take sole possession of the AL lead with 40 HR...he is attempting to join **Carlos Peña** (2009, 39HR) as the only Rays to earn at least a share of the AL home run crown...Peña's 39 HR that season matched **NYY Mark Teixeira** for the Junior Circuit lead...Caminero would need 6 HR across the Rays final 13 games to match Peña's club record from 2007 (46HR)...he has gone deep 21 times at Tropicana Field, two shy of the most long balls at home in a season in Rays history, a mark set by Peña in 2007 (23HR).

- ★ He is already the first player in club history with multiple 40-HR campaigns (2025: 45HR) and the second player in the modern era (since 1900) to accomplish the feat in multiple age-22-or-younger campaigns (age as of June 30; 45HR in 2025), joining MLN **Eddie Mathews** (1953-54).

THE COUNTDOWN—Several Rays are within reach of notable accomplishments:

- ★ **Chandler Simpson** (.305) is five points behind AL Triple Crown candidate **HOU Yordan Alvarez** (.310) for the AL batting title, attempting to join **Yandy Diaz** (2023) as the only Rays to pace the AL in average...he could become the sixth player in AL/NL history to win a batting title within their first two major league seasons and the third since 1942 alongside SEA **Ichiro Suzuki** (.350, 1st season - 2001) and Rays Hall of Famer BOS **Wade Boggs** (.361, 2nd season - 1983).
- ★ **Simpson** leads the AL in singles (141), triples (6), and stolen bases (41)—only four players (5x) in the modern era (since 1900) have paced the AL or NL in all three categories over a full season: LAD **Maury Wills** in 1962, NYY **Snuffy Stirnweiss** in 1944, SLB **George Sisler** in 1922, and DET **Ty Cobb** in both 1917 and 1911 (Elias)...no Ray has ever paced the AL in singles, and only **Carl Crawford** (4x, last: 2010) and **Mallex Smith** (2018) have had the most three-baggers...Crawford (4x, last: 2007) and **Jose Caballero** (2024) are the only Rays to lead the league in steals.
- ★ **Simpson** is three singles shy of **Crawford's** club record from 2003 (145)...his 142 singles are already the most by an AL hitter since HOU **Jose Altuve** (145) and BOS **Dustin Pedroia** (149) in 2016.
- ★ **Diaz** (.301) is on pace to become the second player in franchise history to finish back-to-back qualified seasons with a .300 average or better...only **Crawford**, who turned the trick twice in his career, has accomplished the feat as a Ray, doing so between 2005-07 and 2009-10...the pair are the only players in team history to have multiple qualified .300 or better seasons.
- ★ **Bryan Baker** (40SV) is attempting to join **Alex Colomé** (2017, 47SV) as the only Rays to pace the majors in saves over a full season...he has converted 29 straight save opportunities and could become the 12th AL pitcher (13x) since saves became an official statistic in 1969 to record a streak of 30 consecutive saves or more within a single season and the second since 2017 along with CLE **Emmanuel Clase** (34) in 2024.
- ★ **Between Junior Caminero** (HR), **Simpson** (SB), and **Baker** (SV), the Rays could become the third club since 1969 to have the league leaders (AL or NL) in homers, stolen bases, and saves on the same team, joining Cleveland in 1995 (HR - **Albert Belle**; SB - **Kenny Lofton**; SV - **Jose Mesa**) and Cincinnati in 1970 (HR - **Johnny Bench**; SB - **Bobby Tolan**; SV - **Wayne Granger**) according to Elias.
- ★ The pitching staff leads the majors with a 1.14 WHIP, which would surpass the club record established in 2022 (1.15) and signal the lowest mark since the 2024 Mariners (1.08)...the Rays are attempting to post the majors' best WHIP for the third time, joining 2023 (1.18) and 2012 (1.17).
- ★ The Rays need to go 5-8 or better over their final 13 contests to record their sixth straight month with a .500 record or better...it would mark the first time in franchise history they have finished a full season with a .500 record or better in every month and tie the team record for consecutive such months (also: July 2019–Sept./Oct. 2020).

THE RAY WAY—With Sunday's win vs. HOU, the Rays clinched the 10th 90-win season in franchise history and fifth in their last eight non-shortened seasons since 2018—only the Dodgers (8) and Yankees (6, 3 wins shy of 7) have more in the timeframe...they have nailed down the 10th postseason berth in franchise history, first since 2023, and sixth in the last eight seasons (2019-26)...all 10 postseason appearances have come in the last 19 seasons since becoming the Rays in 2008...they clinched a postseason berth on Sept. 11, earliest in franchise history, surpassing 2023 and 2020 (both Sept. 17).

- ★ The Rays own the majors' third-best winning pct. since their 2008 rebrand (1.613-1.351/.544), trailing the Dodgers (.587) and Yankees (.572).

CLEMENTE NOMINEE—Yesterday, **Cedric Mullins** was announced as the Rays 2026 Roberto Clemente Award nominee...the honor is presented annually to one player from each of the 30 franchises who best represents the game through extraordinary character, community involvement, philanthropy, and positive contributions, both on and off the field...recent Rays nominees include **Pete Fairbanks** (2025), **Jason Adam** (2024), and **Shane McClanahan** (2023)...**Nelson Cruz** (2021) is the only Rays player to win the award, but he did so as the Twins nominee after joining the Rays at the trade deadline...Mullins will be honored tonight in a pregame ceremony beginning at 6:17 p.m following the honorary first pitch.

THE GREEN AND GOLD—The Rays and Athletics begin their second set of a six-game season series tonight after the Rays recorded a sweep from Aug. 10-12 in West Sacramento...the Rays have won six of their last seven games against the Athletics (July 2, 2025–pres.) and won six of the last nine meetings at home...they are 5-1-2 in their last eight series against the A's (May 2, 2022–pres.)...they have gone an 13-2 in their last 15 matchups with AL West opponents (July 29–pres.) after starting 6-7.

- ★ The Rays 9 HR in August's three-game series at ATH matched their fourth most in team history in a three-game series and were their most since April 7-9, 2023 vs. the A's at Tropicana Field (11HR).
- ★ **Yandy Diaz** has reached base safely in 17 straight games against the Athletics, the longest streak in franchise history and MLB's second-longest active streak behind NYY **Paul Goldschmidt** (20G)...he is slashing .343/.416/.567 (23-for-67) with 6 2B, 3 HR, 9 RBI, and a .983 OPS during the streak.
- ★ **Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in each of his seven career games with a PA vs. the A's, going 13-for-26 (.500) with 5 SB.

TONIGHT'S START—Griffin Jax will toe the rubber for his 21st start and 32nd appearance of the year, including his 12th start and 15th outing at home...marks his 21st straight start after pitching out of the bullpen in each of his first 11 appearances...is the 37th start of his major league career...will be his third start since being reinstated from the 15-day IL (right elbow discomfort) on Sept. 2...acquired from the Twins for **RHP Taj Bradley** on July 31, 2025.

- ✦ Min. 300 changeups thrown in 2026, Jax's 39.3 pct. whiff rate on the pitch is the ninth best among active AL arms.
- ✦ Has logged a 3.59 ERA (90.1IP, 36ER) in 20 starts compared to an 8.00 ERA (9.0IP, 8ER) in 11 relief outings this year.
- ✦ In starts when he receives three runs of support or more this season (six starts), he is 5-0 with a 2.61 ERA (31.0IP, 9ER) compared to 1-8 with a 4.10 ERA (59.1IP, 27ER) in 14 starts when receiving two runs of support or fewer.
- ✦ With 0.2 innings pitched tonight, Jax would reach 100.0 innings in a campaign for the first time in his career...his previous season high in innings was in 2021 (82.0IP) as a rookie with Minnesota...he would join **Nick Martinez** (166.1IP), **Shane McClanahan** (118.0IP), **Drew Rasmussen** (160.1IP), and **Ian Seymour** (122.1IP) as the fifth Rays arm to pitch 100.0 innings or more this year.
- ✦ With a win tonight, Jax would set a new single-season career high (8).

LAST TIME OUT—Earned his career-high-tying seventh win of the campaign after allowing 1 ER over 5.0 innings on Sept. 9 at ATL (W, 5.0IP, 2H, ER, BB, 2SO, HR)...worked 3.0 scoreless innings to begin the outing, stranding just a single in the 2nd...allowed his only run of the day on a **Drake Baldwin** solo home run to lead off the 4th before setting down six of his final seven batters (1BB) to conclude his outing.

- ✦ He has pitched 5.0 innings or more in 12 of his last 13 starts dating back to June 7 at MIA...is 6-6 with a 3.58 ERA (65.1IP, 26ER), 71 SO, and a .231 (56-for-242) opp. average in that span...has yielded 3 R or fewer in 11 of those 13 starts.

A'S IN THE BAY—Jax has made 13 career appearances (all in relief) opposite the Athletics, posting a 2-0 record with a 0.68 ERA (13.1IP, ER)...his last outing against them came on Aug. 13, 2025, when he tossed a scoreless frame of relief with 3 SO in an 8-2 victory in West Sacramento...min. 10.0 IP, his .152 (7-for-46) opp. average against the Athletics is the second lowest of any opponent he has faced in his career, behind only Houston (140, 7-for-50)...Jax has a career 7-6 record with a 3.03 ERA (77.1IP, 26ER) across 61 outings (four starts) against AL West foes...as a starter against the division, he is 2-2 lifetime with a 1.29 ERA (21.0IP, 3ER) and 18 strikeouts; three of those four starts came earlier this season.

- ✦ Jax will be making his 16th start (20th outing) against an AL opponent this season...he has gone 4-7 with a 3.28 ERA (74.0IP, 27ER) in those appearances compared to a 3-3 mark with a 6.04 ERA (25.1IP, 17ER) in five starts (12 outings) against the NL...over his career, has a 3.72 ERA (348.2IP, 144ER) in 241 outings (28 starts) against the AL, while pitching to a 5.03 ERA (107.1IP, 60ER) in 89 games (eight starts) vs. the NL.

NO PLACE LIKE DOME—In 14 appearances (11 starts) at home this season, Jax has turned in a 4.14 ERA (50.0IP, 23ER) with a 1.22 WHIP and 65 strikeouts...in those 11 starts, he boasts a 3-5 record, a 3.99 ERA (47.1IP, 21ER), a 1.23 WHIP, and 59 strikeouts, and the Rays are 6-5 in those outings...has recorded 11.70 strikeouts per 9.0 innings pitched in home games this season, the fourth-highest mark in the AL (min. 50.0IP) and the seventh-highest clip in the majors.

HOW SWEEP IT IS—Jax throws his sweeper 25.1 pct. of the time, the sixth-highest mark among AL hurlers (min. 1,250 pitches)...despite this, his usage rate has dropped 18.8 pct. on the pitch from 2025 (44.0 pct.)...in 2026, he has limited opponents to a .197 (13-for-66) average on the pitch...min. 60 AB, his 37.0 pct. whiff rate on sweepers ranks 11th in the AL...across 30 appearances this season, Jax has given up six extra-base hits on sweepers...five of them have come within his last 14 starts since June 1.

GET JAX UP AND MOVING—This marks the first time Jax has been a regular starter since his 2021 rookie season with the Twins, when he made his final 14 appearances as a member of the Twins rotation after his first four came in relief...he started two games for the Rays last season, working as an opener for **Ian Seymour** on Sept. 5 vs. CLE before starting a bullpen game on Sept. 10, 2025 at CWS...both starts lasted 1.0 scoreless frames...for his career, he is 8-13 with a 4.37 ERA (156.2IP, 76ER) in 35 starts compared to 21-28 with a 3.70 ERA (294.1IP, 121ER) in 294 relief appearances.

- ✦ Jax spent his first five professional seasons (2016-19, 2021) as a starter...he first transitioned to a full-time relief role in 2022...from 2016-21, 50 of his 55 minor league appearances were starts.
