METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Phillies, 5-4, last night...The Mets have outscored their opponents 94-68 in 19 games this month...New York is in a stretch of 17 straight games without an off-day (7-7)...The Mets head out on their final road trip of the year, a seven-game trip (2-2) to Miami (2-1) and Philadelphia (0-1)...New York is off on Monday before they conclude the 2023 schedule with a six-game home stand against the Marlins (three games) and Phillies (three games).

THE BIG APPLE TV+: Friday's game against the Philadelphia Phillies will be aired exclusively on Apple TV+...Fans can access the game by using the Apple TV app or by visiting tv.apple.com.

THE LONESOME CROWDED WEST: Major League Baseball announced that nine Mets will participate in the Arizona Fall League this year: C Kevin Parada, INF Rowdey Jordan, INF JT Schwartz, INF D'Andre Smith, RHP Nolan Clenney, RHP Jordan Gerber, RHP Brendan Hardy, RHP Trey McLoughlin, LHP Tyler Thomas...They will compete as part of the Glendale Desert Dogs...Games begin on Monday, October 2.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Dominic Hamel and Paul Gervase combined to spin a three-hit shutout for the Binghamton Rumble Ponies to sweep the Somerset Patriots in the Northeast Division Series on Thursday night...Hamel tossed 7.2 scoreless innings, allowing three hits, two walks and striking out eight in the process...Hayden Senger hit a triple in the third and came home thanks to an sac fly from Luisangel Acuña...Senger provided the second run with a solo homer in the fifth...The Rumble Ponies will open the Eastern League Championship Series at Mirabito Stadium on Sunday against the Erie SeaWolves.

EL JEFF-E: Jeff McNiel has safely reached base in 14 straight games, posting a .373 OBP in that span...In 48 games since the start of August, Jeff McNeil is batting .307 (59-192) with 31 runs, nine doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 20 RBI, eight walks with five steals, a .346 OBP and a .484 SLG...McNeil has an .923 OPS in 19 games this month, recording 10-extra base hits.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga recorded his 12th win of the season last night... His 12 wins are tied for the most in franchise history by a Japanese born player. Masato Yoshii also had 12 in 1999...He is 12-7 with a 2.96 ERA (53 ER/161.1 IP) with 74 walks and 194 strikeouts in 28 starts this season...His 2.96 ERA ranks fourth in the majors and second in the National League...His 2.96 ERA is the seventhlowest by a Japanese-born pitcher in MLB history (min. 100 innings).

DOING THE SPLITS: Brandon Nimmo is batting .295 with 45 runs, 15 doubles, three triples, 11 home runs, 36 RBI, 37 walks with a .375 OBP and a .478 SLG in To games on the road this season...This compares to a .247/.346/.452 slashline in 72 games at Citi Field...Francisco Lindor has posted a .284/.351/.520 slashline with 55 runs, 23 doubles, two triples, 15 home runs and 26 walks in 78 games on the road in 2023...He has posted a .213/.311/.375 slashline in 73 games at Citi Field...Pete Alonso is slashing .237/.343/.555 with 24 home runs and 53 RBI in 74 road games...He is batting .202/.302/.473 at Citi Field.

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the loss after allowing three runs, two earned, over 5.2 innings on September 16 against the Cincinnati Reds at Citi Field...Allowed nine hits, issued two walks and struck out two batters.

PHILLY SPECIAL: Tonight, Megill will make his fourth career start against the Phillies...Through his first three career starts against Philadelphia, Megill is 2-1 with a 2.40 ERA (4 ER/15.0 IP)...In two career starts at Citizens Bank Ballpark, the right-hander is 1-1 with a 3.60 ERA (4 ER/10.0 IP)...In his last start against Philadelphia, April 29, 2022 at Citi Field, Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of the team's combined no-hitter...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis).

THREE RUNS OR FEWER: Megill has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his last six starts, the second-longest such streak of his career...The right-hander allowed three runs or fewer in his first seven starts as a big leaguer from June 23 - July 28, 2021.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: This season, Megill is 2-5 with a 7.09 ERA (37 ER/47.0 IP) in 11 road starts this season...In 12 home starts this season, Megill is 6-3 with a 3.41 ERA (25 ER/66.0 IP)...In 28 career road games (24 starts), Megill is 6-10 with a 5.80 ERA (73 ER/113.1 IP) and in 28 career home games (26 starts), Megill is 10-6 with a 4.02 ERA (61 ER/136.2 IP).

2022 RECAP: Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021..According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).
