**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets defeated the Nationals, 6-2, last night at Citi Field... The Mets have won back-to-back games and four of their last five... New York is in stretch of 17-straight games before the All-Star break... They are 7-6 in that span... The Mets close out the first-half with a six-game homestand (2-0) against Nationals (2-0) and Rockies (three games)... New York returns from the All-Star break with a four game set in Miami beginning on Friday, July 19.

**SAVE ME, SAVE ME, SAVE ME!** José Buttó converted the save for the Mets yesterday... He became the eighth different pitcher to record a save for the Mets this year... According to Elias, the Mets have had eight or more pitchers earn a save in two previous seasons: 1982 (10) and 1970 (9).

**ROTATE THE BOARD!** Over the last rotation (five games), the Mets starting pitchers have posted a 1.84 ERA (6 ER/29.1 IP) with 10 walks and 23 strikeouts... The Mets are 4-1 in that span... In 10 starts in July, the rotation has posted a 2.93 ERA (20 ER/61.1 IP) with 20 walks and 36 strikeouts... Their 2.93 ERA is the third-lowest in the majors in July.

**HOW SWEEP IT IS:** The Mets are looking for their seventh sweep of the season... It would mark the second time the Mets swept the Nationals this year (also, June 3-5)... The last time the Mets swept Washington at Citi Field was from October 4-5, 2022.

**IN THE CITY:** The Mets are 10-2 over their 12 games at Citi Field... The team has homered in all but one of those games, hitting .285/.373/.542 in that span with 28 doubles, two triples, 24 homers, 52 walks with a .912 OPS... The Mets pitching staff has posted a 3.76 ERA with 45 walks and 104 punchouts... New York is 23-25 at home this year (23-24) at Citi Field... Their 3.65 ERA at home is eighth in the majors and fourth in the NL... The Mets went 43-48 at home in 2023.

**DINGERS:** The Mets have hit 45 home runs over their last 26 games since June 12... That is the most home runs in the majors in that span... This included a period where the team hit a homer in 16-straight games, which was the second-longest streak in franchise history... Overall, the Mets have hit 114 home runs this season, tied for the fourth-most in the majors.

**INVADER NIMS:** Brandon Nimmo has homered in three straight games for the first time in his career... Entering June, Nimmo was batting .214/.350/.378 with 29 runs, nine doubles, one triple, seven home runs, 29 RBI and a .728 OPS... In 32 games since then, he is batting .310/.392/.603 with 29 runs, eight doubles, one triple, nine home runs, 30 RBI, 14 walks, four steals with a .995 OPS... He has safely reached base in 22 of his last 23 games, posting a .437 OBP in that span... He has brought his OPS up from .728 on May 31 to .832 entering today.

**FIRST THINGS FIRST:** In 48 games batting in the leadoff spot this year, Francisco Lindor is hitting .296/.363/.523 with 36 runs, 18 doubles, nine home runs, 28 RBI, 15 walks, 10 steals with an .886 OPS... Francisco Lindor has posted a 3.2 fWAR since May 1... That is second in the National League in that span, behind only Shohei Ohtani (3.3 fWAR)... It is fifth in the majors in that period... In 62 games since May 1, Lindor is batting .276/.336/.492 with 11 home runs and 37 RBI... The Mets are 26-21 when Lindor bats first this season.

**fWAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?:** Francisco Lindor ranks ninth in the major leagues and fourth in the National League with a 3.8 fWAR... Brandon Nimmo is 20th in the majors and 11th in the NL with a 3.1 fWAR... Nimmo's 3.1 fWAR is third among NL outfielders behind only Jurickson Profar (3.2 fWAR) and Christian Yelich (3.2 fWAR).

**THE EAST IS A BEAST:** The Mets are 15-12 against the National League East this season... They have posted a 4.40 ERA, while batting .257/.320/.425... The Mets have won 11 of their last 15 games against the division.

**RECORD SCRATCH:** The Mets are in the midst of 18 straight games against teams who currently have records below .500... The team is 6-4 in this stretch... The Mets are 28-20 this season when facing a team with a record below .500.

**AM I SEEING DOUBLE?:** Francisco Lindor has recorded 26th this season and 100 as a Met... That places him second in the majors... Lindor has recorded 25 or more doubles in three straight years... Since he entered the league in 2015, Lindor has collected 291 doubles... His 291 doubles are the 17th-most by a Puerto Rican born player... Next up is Jose Valentin (302).

**HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** Congrats to Pete Alonso who was named to the 2024 NL All-Star team... The 94th All-Star Game will take place on Tuesday, July 16 in Texas... Alonso, 29, was named to the All-Star team for the fourth time in his career, the most by any first baseman in team history – one more than Keith Hernandez... Alonso, who was also an All-Star in 2019, 2022 and 2023, becomes the 11th Met to be named to four or more All-Star teams.

**DERBY DAY:** Alonso will participate in the 2024 Home Run Derby... A two-time Derby winner, Alonso will attempt to become the second player to win the event three times (also, Ken Griffey Jr.)... He will be the sixth player to compete in the HR Derby at least five times, joining Griffey Jr. (eight), Mark McGwire (seven), Barry Bonds (six), Sammy Sosa (six) and Albert Pujols (five).

**THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT:** RHP Brandon Sproat will represent the New York Mets at the 2024 All-Star Futures Game... Sproat, who was promoted to #98 on MLB Pipeline's Top 100 Prospects, has appeared in 13 games (12 starts) with the Cyclones and Rumble Ponies this season... He is a combined 6-1 with a 1.71 ERA (14 ER/73.2 IP) with 28 walks and 85 strikeouts... In eight starts at Double-A this year, Sproat is 4-0 with a 2.05 ERA (11 ER/48.1 IP) with 12 walks and 52 strikeouts... The right-handed pitcher was selected in the second round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida... The Futures Game will be played on Sunday, July 14 in Globe Life Field in Arlington.

The Mets have hit .275/.343/.489 in that period with 83 doubles, eight, 56 home runs, 115 walks and an .832 OPS... They have outscored their opponents 212-171 during those 36 games... Their 212 runs are the second-most in the majors in that span, while their 5.89 runs/game leads MLB.

### PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Took the bump on July 6 in Pittsburgh...Allowed two runs on five hits with two walks and struck out five over 4.1 innings...He did not receive a decision as the Mets defeated the Pirates, 5-2.

**THREE'S COMPANY:** Peterson is on a career-best three-game winning streak...He has posted a 3.58 ERA (13 ER/32.2 IP) over six games (three straight wins and three no decisions) with 15 walks and 24 strikeouts.

**RETURN OF THE PETE:** Made his season debut on May 29 vs. Los Angeles-NL... Allowed three runs (two earned) on seven hits with one walk and struck out three over 5.0 innings of work...Was his first start of the season...The southpaw has started the season on the 60-Day IL after undergoing left hip surgery in the off-season...In six rehab starts this year, Peterson went 2-1 with a 1.52 ERA (3 ER/23.2 IP) with three walks and 35 strikeouts.

**STARTER/RELIEF:** Last year, Peterson made a career-high 21 starts and went 2-8 with a 5.24 ERA (60 ER/103.0 IP) in those starts...In six relief appearances, Peterson went 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (2 ER/8.0 IP).

**STRIKE 'EM OUT, STRIKE 'EM OUT:** On September 15, 2023 Peterson tallied a career high-tying 10 Ks, his first double-digit strikeout performance this season...Peterson has four 10 strikeout games in his career, one each season from 2020-2023...Peterson was one of four Mets pitchers to strikeout 10 or more batters in a game this season, along with Kodai Senga (five 10+ K games), Max Scherzer (one 10+ K game) and José Quintana (one 10+ K game)...Senga also struck out 10 batters in his start on September 14, the day before Peterson accomplished the feat.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** Peterson reached a season-high 7.0 innings pitched in two starts last season, on August 27 and September 28...Were the fourth and fifth times in his career that he has pitched 7.0 or more innings...Peterson has only had one longer start in his career, throwing 7.1 innings in a 3-2 loss to Tampa Bay on May 14, 2021...In those starts, Peterson owns a 1-0 record.

**HIGHEST HIGHS:** Peterson set career-highs in innings pitched (111.0), starts (21), and strikeouts (128)...Kodai Senga was the only other Mets starter with at least 111.0 innings pitched, 21 starts and 128 strikeouts last season.

**MAKIN' IT MAJOR:** Upon returning to the majors on June 27 after a stint with Syracuse (AAA), Peterson pitched to a 2-2 record with a 3.38 ERA (27 ER/72.0 IP) in 19 games, 13 of which were starts...Peterson pitched to a 2-7 record before the All-Star Break, owning a 6.46 ERA (39 ER/54.1 IP) in 11 starts during that time...Post-Break, Peterson pitched to a 1-1 record and a 3.65 ERA (23 ER/56.2 IP) in 16 games (10 starts).

**NEW YORK, NEW YORK:** Peterson pitched to a 2.79 ERA (18 ER/58.0 IP) in 14 home outings (10 starts)...Over 13 road outings (11 starts) this season, the southpaw has pitched to a 7.47 ERA (44 ER/53.0 IP)...Peterson's 4.58 home/road ERA differential was the highest in the majors among pitchers with 10 or more starts both at home and on the road...Courtesy of Elias.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Took the bump on July 7 in Pittsburgh...Hurled 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed only two hits, three walks and struck out six...The Mets earned a dramatic 3-2 win over the Pirates.

**HAVE TO ADMIT IT'S GETTING BETTER:** Over his last five starts, Manaea has posted a 1.57 ERA (5 ER/28.2 IP) with 14 walks and 27 strikeouts...Over his last three starts, Manaea has posted a 0.50 ERA (1 ER/18.0 IP) with 10 walks and 14 strikeouts...The Mets are 3-0 in that span.

- Was named a National League All-Star for the fourth time on his career on July 7. Is the 11th player in franchise history to be selected to four or more All-Star Games and is the eighth position player in franchise to be selected to four or more All-Star Games.
- Has 27 home runs against the Nationals, the second-most in franchise history against Montreal/Washington (Most: Darryl Strawberry, 31). Are tied with Aaron Judge's 27 homers against Baltimore for the most against any single opponent since 2019.
- Went 2-3 with a double and a run on July 5 at Pittsburgh. Was his 21st double of the season, matching his total from 2023.
- Launched a two-run homer in the 10th on July 2 at Washington. Has five career home runs in extra-innings tied with Kevin McReynolds for second-most in Mets history. Only Howard Johnson (Nine) has more.
- Laced a game-winning double in the ninth on June 18 at Texas. Has 79 game-winning RBI, fifth-most in franchise history.
- Has 546 RBI, seventh-most in franchise history. Carlos Beltrán (559) is next.
- Picked up his second three-hit game of the season on June 17 vs. Texas (Also: 4/13 vs. Kansas City. Has 28 multi-hit games, ninth-most in the NL and tied for 15th-most in the majors).
- Went 2-5 with a two-run homer and a two-run single on June 16 vs. San Diego. Was his ninth career five-RBI game, the second-most such games in franchise history behind David Wright (10). Are the second-most such games since 2019 behind only Nelson Cruz (10).
- Has 10 home runs and 17 doubles over his last 55 games dating to May 7. His 17 doubles during that span are tied for the fifth-most in the majors, while his 27 extra-base hits during that span are tied for the 14th-most in the majors.
- Is sixth in the NL and tied for 15th in the majors with 18 home runs. Also ranks tied for ninth in the NL in doubles (21), tied for ninth in extra-base hits (39) and tied for 15th in total bases (159).

- Hit safely in a career-best 10 straight games from June 15-28. Batted .515/.595/.939 with three home runs, five doubles, 10 RBI and seven runs during the stretch. Was the longest hitting streak by a Mets catcher since Wilson Ramos' 26-game hitting streak from August 3 - September 3, 2023.
- Went 2-5 with a go-ahead double in the sixth and an RBI triple in the 10th. Was his first career triple.
- Posted a 1123 OPS in June. Is the highest OPS by a catcher younger than 23 in a month (Min. 50 Plate Appearances) since Johnny Bench in June 1970 (1208). Courtesy of Mathew Brownstein.
- Went 3-3 with a home run, a double, a walk, three RBI and three runs on June 26 vs. Yankees. Was the third time in his career reaching base four times in a game.
- Has 30 home runs, the fourth-most by a catcher before turning 23. The only catchers with more homers prior to turning 23 are Johnny Bench (87), Iván Rodríguez (37) and Darrell Porter (31).
- Is batting .346/.429/.577 with 15 RBI and 11 extra-base hits in 26 games since returning from the IL on June 11. His 1.006 OPS during that span is the 11th-best in the NL and the 16th-best in the majors during that span (Min. 75 Plate Appearances).
- Recorded a game-tying two-run double in the eighth on June 18 at Texas as part of a three-hit night. Went 3-5 with two RBI on June 17 vs. Texas. Is the first Mets catcher with back-to-back three-hit games since Paul Lo Duca (4/4-4/6/07) and the first catcher age 22 or younger with back-to-back three-hit performances since Salvador Perez (9/17-9/20/11).
