**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets fell to the Twins, 8-4, yesterday...New York is in a stretch of 17 straight games without an off-day (0-2)...The Mets wrap up a five-game, six-day, road trip (1-3) against Washington (1-1) and Minnesota (0-2)...Following this series, the Mets head home for the start of their penultimate homestand, a seven-game stand against Arizona (four games) and Cincinnati (three games).

**NEVER FORGET:** Tomorrow, September 11, the Mets will hold a special pregame ceremony to honor the memory and victims of those who perished on September 11, 2001 and from injuries sustained in responding to the crisis...First responders from across the area will be involved to help commemorate the day...Mike Piazza, whose game-winning home run against the Braves lifted the spirits of our city when baseball resumed after the 9/11 attack, will hold a pregame press conference at time to be determined...The New York Mets will wear first responder caps during the game...Caps from the FDNY, NYPD, Port Authority Police Department, Department of Sanitation and Department of Correction will all be represented to commemorate their bravery and sacrifice.

**SENGA GENESIS:** Kodai Senga has recorded 181 strikeouts...That is the second-most strikeouts by a rookie in franchise history...He is 10-7 with a 3.07 ERA (51 ER/149.1 IP) with 70 walks and 181 strikeouts in 26 starts this season...His 3.07 ERA ranks sixth in the majors and third in the National League.

**GOT TO GO TO MO'S:** Ronny Mauricio has safely hit in six of his first seven career games...He is batting .360 (9-25) with one run, one double, one RBI, one walk and three steals in his first seven career games...He is one of five players in franchise history to record a hit in each of his first five career major league games.

**30-FOR-30:** Lindor has recorded 31 doubles and 26 home runs this season...He is looking to become the 12th player in franchise history to record a 30/30 season...The last player to accomplish that feat was Pete Alonso in 2019...He has stolen 26 bases this year...He is looking to become the fourth player in franchise history to record 30 doubles, 30 home runs and 30 steals in a single-season.

**LINSANITY:** Over his last 70 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .292 (77-264) with 54 runs, 14 doubles, two triples, 14 home runs, 41 RBI, 30 walks, 20 steals with a .372 OBP, a .519 SLG and an .891 OPS...Lindor has stolen a career-high 26 bases this season.

**I DECLARE fWAR:** Francisco Lindor ranks seventh in the majors and fourth in the National League with a 5.4 fWAR...Since he joined the Mets, Lindor has posted a 16.2 fWAR...Only Freddie Freeman (18.9) and Mookie Betts (18.3) have posted a higher mark in the Senior Circuit...His 16.3 fWAR since 2021 is fifth in the majors.

**DINGERS!:** The Mets have socked 188 home runs this season...That the fourth-most in the National League...The 2022 Mets hit 171 home runs...The team's 188 home runs the seventh-most in a single season in franchise history...Next up is the 1987 team, which hit 192 in the season...Four teams in franchise history have cracked 200+ home runs in a single year 2019 (242), 2017 (224), 2016 (218) and 2006 (200).

**DOING THE SPLITS:** Brandon Nimmo is batting .286 with 42 runs, 12 doubles, three triples, 10 home runs, 33 RBI, 35 walks with a .368 OBP and a .462 SLG in 70 games on the road this season...This compares to a .237/.340/.446 slashline in 65 games at Citi Field...Francisco Lindor has posted a .283/.352/.531 slashline with 53 runs, 22 doubles, two triples, 15 home runs and 26 walks in 73 games on the road in 2023...He has posted .214/.306/.387 slash in 66 games at Citi Field...Pete Alonso is slashing .247/.355/.588 with 24 home runs and 51 RBI in 69 road games...He is batting .202/.306/.474 at Citi Field.

**I DON'T WANT TO ROCK, DJ:** Over his last 17 games, DJ Stewart is batting .328 (20-61) with 11 runs, three doubles, 10 home runs, 19 RBI and a 1.248 OPS...In 40 games this year, Stewart is batting .265 (27-102) with 14 runs, five doubles, 11 home runs, 22 RBI, 10 walks, a .345 OBP and a .637 SLG...Stewart recorded a career-high 12 home runs in 100 games with Baltimore in 2021.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** The Mets are on their penultimate road trip of the season...New York has eight road games remaining in the 2023 campaign...New York has posted a 29-44 record on the road this year.

**TWINS-METS NOTES:** The Mets have been swept by the Twins once in franchise history, during a three-game set from June 8-10, 2004 in Minnesota.

**100:** Pete Alonso became the fourth player in Mets history to record three or more seasons with 100 or more RBI...He has previously recorded two seasons with 100 RBI (120 in 2019 and 131 in 2022)...David Wright is the franchise leader with five such seasons...Carlos Beltrán and Darryl Strawberry also recorded three seasons each...Alonso's 483 RBI since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues...He is second in the majors and in the NL with 103 RBI.

**FOR PETE'S SAKE:** Pete Alonso has recorded his third season with 40 or more home runs...He became the fifth player in major league history with three or more seasons of 40 or more homers in their first five years, joining Ralph Kiner (four), Ryan Howard (three), Albert Pujols (three) and Eddie Mathews (three)...He is the only player in franchise history with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...He is third in the majors and second in the National League with 43 home runs...Alonso's 189 home runs since he entered the league in 2019 are the most in the major leagues.

**THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY:** On this day in 1969, the Mets swept a twinbill against the Expos and moved a game ahead of the Cubs in the NL East standings...New York has now won six straight...The Mets won game one, 3-2, via walk-off fashion in the 12th inning... Jim McAndrew hurled 11.0 innings, allowing only two runs and striking out seven...Ken Boswell hit an RBI single in the 12th to win it...The Mets put up a six-spot in the third frame to down the Expos, 7-1, in game two...Nolan Ryan hurled a complete game gem, allowing a run on three hits with four walks and stuck out 11.

**DOWN ON THE FARM:** The Brooklyn Cyclones lowered their magic number to one as they defeated the Blue Rocks, 7-1, yesterday...INF/OF Jett Williams went 2-4 with a home run, one RBI and two runs...He has reached base safely in nine straight games, and is riding a four game hitting streak where he is hitting 7-16 with four extra-base hits and a 1.438 OPS...OF Stanley Consuegra hit his 22nd homer of the year in the win, pulling him into a tie with Francisco Alvarez for the most in a single-season by a Cyclones player.

### MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Earned his eighth win of the season on September 3 against the Mariners at Citi Field...Allowed three runs over 5.1 innings on five hits and two walks while striking out six batters...All three runs allowed by Megill came after surrendering back-to-back homers in the fourth.

**ADD ANOTHER ONE TO THE LIST:** Today, Megill will face the Minnesota Twins for the first time in his career...The Twins mark the 23rd opponent that Megill has faced in his career and the 10th from the American League...In 10 career Interleague games (nine starts), Megill is 4-1 with a 3.88 ERA (20 ER/46.1 IP)

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN:** This season, Megill is 2-5 with a 7.93 ERA (37 ER/42.0 IP) in 10 road starts this season...In 11 home starts this season, Megill is 6-2 with a 3.43 ERA (19 ER/49.0 IP)...Megill's 4.50 home/road ERA differential is the second-highest in the majors this season (Min. 7 GS)...Courtesy of Elias...In 27 career road games (23 starts), Megill is 6-10 with a 6.06 ERA (73 ER/108.1 IP) and in 27 career home games (25 starts), Megill is 10-5 with a 4.05 ERA (59 ER/131.0 IP).

**THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY:** On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

**COMBINED NO-NO:** Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodríguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen.

**2022 RECAP:** Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

**OPENOR:** Last year, Tylor Megill was named the Mets Opening Day Starter...With 89.2 career innings pitched entering the 2022 season, Megill had the fewest major league innings of any Mets Opening Day starting pitcher in franchise history...Became the 28th different Opening Day starting pitcher in Mets history.

**RUNS IN THE FAMILY:** His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021...According to Elias, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

### TUESDAY'S STARTER: LHP JOSÉ QUINTANA (2-5, 3.00)

**LAST TIME OUT:** Threw a season-high 7.0 innings and earned his second win of the season on September 5 against the Nationals at Nationals Park...Allowed one run, issued one walk and struck out four batters...Has seven quality starts through his first nine career starts as a Met.

**LIMITING THE LONG BALL:** Since the start of the 2022 season, Quintana has allowed nine homers, the fewest during that span (Min. 150 IP)...From August 4, 2022 - August 17, 2023, Quintana did not allow a homer over 97.1 consecutive innings...It was the longest homerless inning streak since Tyson Ross tossed 100.0 homerless innings in 2015...Courtesy of Elias

- Has reached the 40-homer mark for the third time in five big league seasons...Only one player (Ralph Kiner) has had more 40-HR seasons through his first five career seasons...Only one active player (Nelson Cruz, four) has more than three 40-HR seasons.
- Has 12 home runs and 26 RBI in his last 30 games...Had his fifth multi-homer game of the season on September 3 vs. Seattle.
- Ranks fifth on the Mets all-time home run list with 189 homers...Howard Johnson (192) is next.
- Ranks 10th in franchise history with 483 career RBI...Passed Keith Hernandez (468) on August 16...Passed Kevin McReynolds (456) on August 1.
- Ranks third in the majors and second in the NL with 43 home runs and is second in the majors and with 103 RBI...Ranks 10th in the majors and seventh in the NL with a .534 slugging percentage...Tied for seventh in the NL with 61 extra-base hits.
- Has 27 extra-base hits (nine doubles, a triple, 17 homers), 40 RBI, 29 runs scored and a 1.046 OPS in his last 45 games...Was hitting .137 (13-95) with seven XBH and a .547 OPS in his previous 26 games (his return from the IL on June 18-July 19).

- Joins Pete Alonso (53, 2019) and Darryl Strawberry (26, 1983) as the only Mets rookies to have 20 or more home runs in a season...Became the 11th rookie catcher in major league history with 20 or more homers in a season.
- His 22 homers this season are the second-most by any catcher in the majors and tied for fourth among all rookies.
- His 23 career homers before turning 22 years old are the most by a catcher since Johnny Bench had 42 from 1967-1969.
- Owns the Mets franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher...Hit a solo home run on July 1 vs. San Francisco, his first since June 10, to tie Travis d'Arnaud's franchise record for home runs by a rookie catcher...Had his second multi-homer game of the season on June 8 at Atlanta.
- Had his third multi-homer game of the season on July 18 vs. Chicago-AL...Pete Alonso and Darryl Strawberry (four) are the only Mets rookies with more... Only three other Mets have had more than one multi-homer game before turning 22: Darryl Strawberry (four), Ed Kranepool (three) and José Reyes (two)...
