BIRD WATCHING: The St. Louis Cardinals continue their three-game weekend series against the Arizona Diamondbacks this afternoon after posting a 5-4 win in last night's series opener...the team's six-day roadtrip will continue next week (Mon.-Wed.) in Anaheim, CA when the Cardinals play a three-game series against the Los Angeles Angels...with a make-up game slated for next Thu. (July 23) at Busch Stadium vs. Arizona, the Cardinals are scheduled to play 20-straight days before their next open date on August 6.

FLIGHT PATTERN: St. Louis entered play today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 8.5 games behind 1st place Milwaukee, and 2.5 games behind 2nd place Chicago. The Cardinals are currently tied for the final NL Wild Card spot with Miami and are 2.5 games in front of Arizona.

BREAKING BAD NO MORE: With their win last night, the Cardinals posted a win in their opening game after the All-Star break for the first time since 2015 when they bested the Mets 3-2 at Busch Stadium to open play after the break...last night's win was the Cardinals first post-All Star opening win on the road since a 7-4 victory at Cincinnati in 2004.

IT'S WHACKING DAY: The Cardinals .606 win pct. (114-74) against the Diamondbacks is their best against any opponent (min. 25 games) and the highest in MLB vs. the Snakes among National League and common interleague opponents. **RAZING ARIZONA:** St. Louis is 54-40 (.574) all-time at Chase Field, the best win pct. by any annual visitor and the club's 3rd-best winning pct. in any road city.

THE ROAD AHEAD: The Cardinals are scheduled to play 38 games on the road following the All-Star break, their most since playing 39 post-ASG road games in 2007. **HOME BODIES:** The team's 52 Home games before the ASG break this season matched the 1973 season for their most in a full season.

WE MEET AGAIN: After **Jordan Walker** edged out hometown hero **Kyle Schwarber** to win the T-Mobile MLB Home Run Derby on Monday at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia he now finds himself again matched up with **Schwarbs** as they both own the longest active on-base steraks in MLB at 19 games...**Walker** has also hit safely in 8-straight games, the longest active hit streak among Cardinals batters.

TURF MONSTER: **Masyn Winn** enjoyed an all-around solid game last night as he singled in 2 runs in the opening inning & delivered his team-high 6th sac. fly in the 8th. Twice he staved off D-Backs run-threatening rattles with his plays in the field with runners at 3rd base...**Winn** leads all current Cardinals in career batting on turf fields with his .338 mark (24-71). **MASYN AT CHASE:** **Winn's** two-out, two-run single in the first last night ran his hitting streak at Chase Field to 6 games, matching **Willie McGee** (1998-99) for the Cardinals 2nd longest at this ballpark, trailing **Yadier Molina's** 15-game run here from 2016-22.

WETHERHOLT'S BOLT: Exactly one week after signing his 8-year contract extension, **JJ Wetherholt** drilled his 14th HR last night in his Chase Field debut - the club's single-season record for HR's by a rookie leadoff batter, passing **Masyn Winn's** 13 HR's as a rookie leadoff man in 2024.

ARIZONA CONNECTIONS

Nolan Arenado played five seasons in St. Louis (2021-25), where he was a three-time NL All-Star and the winner of one Silver Slugger Award and a pair of Platinum Gold Gloves Awards...traded to Arizona with cash considerations for RHP Jack Martinez (Jan. 13, 2026).

Matthew Liberatore was born in Peoria, Ariz.... graduated from Mountain Ridge High School in Glendale...signed his letter of intent to the University of Arizona before being drafted by the Rays.

JoJo Romero played college baseball at Yavapai College in Prescott, Ari...committed to transfer to the University of Arizona, but first spent a season at Yavapai due to transfer restrictions, and was subsequently drafted before transferring.

George Soriano made his MLB debut vs. Arizona (April 16, 2023), tossing 3.0 scoreless innings of one-hit ball with a pair of strikeouts...fanned Corbin Carroll for his first career strikeout.

Jon Jay played 84 games for Arizona in 2018.

Kyle Driscoll previously worked two seasons (2024-25) as Pitching Coordinator with Arizona.

Dbacks Hitting Coach **Joe Mather** was selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2001 MLB Draft... played parts of two years in St. Louis (2008, '10).

Dbacks 1B Coach **Dave McKay** served in the same position for St. Louis for 16 seasons (1996-2011).

Casey Chenoweth served as a Diamondbacks hitting coordinator from 2020-22 in Scottsdale prior to joining the Cardinals organization.

Daniel Descalso played two seasons for the Diamondbacks (2017-18)...served as a Special Assistant to Baseball Operations for Arizona in 2023.

Brandon Allen played parts of three seasons (2009-11) with the D-Backs...made his MLB debut with Arizona (Aug. 22, 2009 at Minute Maid)... singled off **Brian Moehler** for first career hit.

Ildemaro Vargas was signed by St. Louis as an international free agent (June 26, 2008) and played seven seasons in the Cardinals minor league system (2008-14).

Zac Gallen was selected by St. Louis in the 3rd round of the 2016 MLB Draft...pitched two seasons in Cardinals minor league system before being traded to Miami as part of the package to acquire **Marcell Ozuna** (Dec. 14, 2017).

Hall of Fame Manager **Tony La Russa** was a Dbacks Baseball Operations Executive for parts of four seasons (2014-17).

D-Backs Player & Media Relations Coordinator **Kat Ritter** previously worked as a Cardinals Communications Gameday Associate in 2019.

Arizona VP of Latin American Scouting **César Gerónimo** previously worked six seasons (2011-16) as a Cardinals international crosschecker.

TODAY'S GAME:

- The 28-year-old **Dustin May** makes his 19th start as a member of the Cardinals (76th career start & 90th appearance) tonight.
- The Cardinals are 9-9 in his starts this season.
- His four caught stealing on attempted base stealers, T-8th among NL pitchers with teammates **Matthew Liberatore** and **Kyle Leahy**.
- Limiting opposing right-handed batters to .214/.247/.290 (28-138) with only five walks (146 batters faced).
- Is just 1-6 with a 6.60 ERA (43.2) in nine day starts this season.
- Limiting opponents to bat .215 (18-84) on his four-seam fastball, which ranks in MLB's 95th percentile with a Run Value of 3.
- Over a 12 start span from April 10-June 15, was 5-4 with a 2.54 ERA (74.1 IP), 0.98 WHIP, and .550 OPS.
- Pitched 6.0 innings in every start over a four-game stretch (April 27-May 15), the longest streak of his career and tying **Michael McGreevy** for the longest by a Cardinal this season. All were quality starts.
- Joins **Nathan Church** (2024-26), **Hunter Dobbins** (2026), **Mark McGwire** (1997-2001), **Red Schoendienst** (1945-56, '61-63), and **Rex Hudler** (1990-92) as notable red-headed Cardinals.

LAST TIME OUT (Sunday, July 12 vs. Atlanta at Busch Stadium): ND, L, 4-2, 4.0 IP, 2 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 4 BB, 4 SO, 0 HR, 84 pitches.

- Came away with a no-decision in the Cardinals last at-bat loss to the Braves at Busch III.
- Walked a season-high four batters and exited with the Cardinals trailing 2-1 after four innings.

2026 HIGHLIGHTS:

OUCH!: Exited his July 2 start at Atlanta after two outs after being hit by a **Dominic Smith** line drive off his right ankle. Pitched to the next two batters before exiting with a right ankle contusion.

CODE RED: Threw his first complete game and shutout vs. SD (6/15) carrying a perfect game through 6.0 innings and a no-hitter 6.1. Struck out eight batters in a 3-0 win. First Cardinals pitcher to throw a one-hit shutout at home since Jaime Garcia vs. MIL (4/14/2016).

ALMOST PERFECT: June 15 shutout vs. SD saw D. May carry a perfect game into the 7th inning before his walk to **Fernando Tatis, Jr.**, snapped it, and one batter later, a Manny Machado single through the left side broke up the no-hitter.; struck out eight batters, his 3rd-highest total of the season and threw a season-high 101 pitches for the 2nd consecutive start; it was his 2nd start this season carrying a no-hitter through 6.0 innings.

POPPING THE CORK IN NEW YORK: Fired his first scoreless start as a member of the Cardinals pitching 6.0 scoreless innings of four-hit ball with six strikeouts in a 7-0 'Birds win at Citi Field (6/9), running the St. Louis win streak to five games. His first win since 4/21 at MIA (7 starts).

BASEBALL HQ TOUR: Took time on June 9 to tour MLB's Central Offices while the Cardinals spent their off-day in NYC.

OH NO-NO: Took a no-hitter in the 8th inning at MIL (5/27), broken up by a **Garrett Mitchell** lead-off double, and eventually lost 2-1; Threw a season-high 7.0 IP and fanned a then season-high 9 batters; the only Brewers batsmen to reach safely before the 8th came via a HBP and catcher's interference.

NOCTURNAL NIGHTMARE: Has made 8 starts in Day games this season (1-6, 6.81 ERA) is 4-0 with a 3.002 ERA in his 8 Night starts.

DECISIONS, DECISIONS: His 2026 season has been one of streaks starting with 2-straight loses, then 3-straight wins, a career-high 4-straight losses and he currently has consecutive wins.

DON'T WALK TO STRANGERS: Tied with **Andre Pallante** (6.8%) the 2nd-lowest walk percentage among Cardinals starting pitchers behind **Michael McGreevy** (5.8%) with 6.8%.

MAY'S DAY: Started on May 3 while wearing uniform No. 3, against his former team, the Dodgers, suffering 4-1 loss that snapped his 3-game winning streak.

MILESTONE WIN: Bested his former team the Red Sox on 4/10 in a 3-2 win. It was his 1st win as a member of the Cardinals and his 20th career win.

TIGER STRIKE: Was hit for a season-high seven runs on seven hits (and struck in leg by line drive) over 3.1 innings in an 11-6 loss at Detroit (4/4) in his second start. First Cardinals pitcher since **Mike Parisi** (2008) to begin a season allowing 6 or more runs in his first two starts of a season; and the first Cardinal to pitch the Opening Day series since **Dizzy Dean** (1936).

OPENING ACT: Took the loss in his Cardinals debut at Busch Stadium vs. TB (3/29) allowing six runs over 4.0 inning. Tied his career-high allowing 10 hits, the first Cardinals pitcher to allow double-digit hits in his debut in 55 years since **Chris Zachary** surrendered 10 to the Phillies (5/3/1971) *Elias*. Recorded his 300th career strikeout retiring **Junior Caminero**.

MAY VS. ARIZONA:

- Is making his 7th career start (8th appearance) against the Diamondbacks and his 1st as a member of the Cardinals.
- Lifetime 2-2 with with a 3.48 ERA (31.0 IP) and 27 strikeouts vs. Arizona, with all seven appearances coming as a member of the LA Dodgers (2019-25).
- His last four starts against Arizona have all been quality starts, limiting the Dbacks to one run or fewer in three outings.
- Owns a 1-1 career mark with a 3.86 ERA in his four appearances (3 starts) at Chase Field.
