CLEVELAND GUARDIANS (11-9) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (8-14) April 20, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 1:35 EDT - Game #23/Home #13 LHP Logan Allen (1-1, 2.30 ERA) vs. RHP Mitch Keller (1-2, 4.30 ERA)

THE PIRATES: are in the final game of a seven-game homestand where they've gone 3-3 so far (3-1 vs. Washington and 0-2 vs. Cleveland)...Are also in the final game of a stretch with 13 out of 16 games being played at PNC Park (the only road series in that span came from April 11-13 at Cincinnati, where they were swept)...Will embark on a sixgame road trip to Anaheim (Tuesday-Thursday) and Los Angeles (April 25-27) following today's series finale against the Guardians.

CAN'T CATCH ME: Oneil Cruz swiped his MLB-best 10th stolen base of the season in Saturday's game...It was also Cruz' 30th consecutive successful stolen base without being caught (began on April 28, 2024, at San Francisco)...He was last caught stealing on April 22, 2024 (by Milwaukee's William Contreras)...Cruz is two stolen bases shy of

tying Tony Womack (1997) for the second-longest streak by a Pirates player since 1924.

ONEIL, OH YEAH: Oneil Cruz has hit five home runs and stolen 10 bases through his first 19 games of this season...He joined Elly De La Cruz (2024 Cincinnati Reds) and Ken Williams (1922 St. Louis Browns) as the only Major League players since 1901 to record five-plus homers and 10-plus steals through his first 20 games played in a single season.

KE'-VELAND: Ke'Bryan Hayes singled in his first at-bat in Saturday's game against the Guardians...Hayes has now hit safely in six of his seven career games against Cleveland, going .407 (11-for-27) with five runs, four doubles, a home run, five RBI and a 1.133 OPS.

GO WEST, YOUNG BUCS: The Pirates will head to California following today's game to begin a six-game road trip that starts on Tuesday against the Angels in Anaheim... Pittsburgh is 7-8 all-time on the road vs. the Angels, but has won six of its last nine games

in Anaheim...Next weekend, the Pirates will play three at Los Angeles' Dodger Stadium.

THE SUPPORT SYSTEM: Since scoring four runs for Mitch Keller during his first start of the season on March 28 at Miami, Keller has received one run of support over his last four starts (since April 4) while he was in the game...Over his last two starts (April 9 vs. St. Louis and Tuesday vs. Washington), Keller has a 2.03 ERA (13.1ip/3er) with nine strikeouts while allowing 10 hits and three walks.

EV'S ELECTRICITY: Enmanuel Valdez tripled on Saturday afternoon after hitting his first home run of the season on Friday...Across his last eight games (since April 12 at Cincinnati), Valdez has recorded four extra-base hits (two doubles, one triple, one home run), seven RBI and five walks...Valdez is 7-for-16 (.438 average) with three doubles, a home run and nine RBI when runners are on base.

REHAB ASSIGNMENT: Pitcher Colin Holderman, who was placed on the 15-day injured list with a right knee sprain on April 6, began a rehab assignment at Triple-A Indianapolis on Saturday vs. Toledo, pitching a perfect seventh inning in Indianapolis' win.

A FINE EYE: Andrew McCutchen has drawn at least one walk in each of his last four games since April 14 vs. Washington (five walks total), tied with Ke'Bryan Hayes (April 4-7) for the longest-such streak by a Pirates player so far in 2025...McCutchen's 1114 career walks are the second-most among all active players, trailing only Cleveland's Carlos Santana (1286)...As a team, the Pirates have drawn 79 walks this season, which rank

PITCHING PROWESS: Over its last 10 games, Pittsburgh's pitching staff has posted a 3.07 ERA (91.0ip/31er), the ninth-best ERA in MLB during that span.

fourth in the National League and seventh in all of Major League Baseball.

LEAN ON THE LEFTIES: Lefthander Caleb Ferguson tossed a scoreless eighth inning in Saturday's game against Cleveland...This season, Pittsburgh's lefties have posted a 2.85 ERA (88.1ip/28er), good for second in the National League (Philadelphia, 2.50) and eighth in all of Major League Baseball...The Pirates' left-handed pitchers lead all of Major League Baseball with 88.1 innings pitched as a group, while their 70 strikeouts are the sixth-most in all of MLB.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

April 20, 1990: Bobby Bonilla homered twice and drove in three runs as the Pirates beat the Cubs, 9-4, in a rain-shortened, seveninning game at Wrigley Field. Bonilla hit each of his homers off Cubs starter Mike Bielecki, including a solo shot in the second and a two-run homer that brought home Andy Van Slyke in the third. Pittsburgh struck out only one Chicago batter in the victory.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected by the Pirates in the 2nd round of the 2014 Draft.

STARTING OFF: The 29-year-old Keller is in his seventh Major League season...He signed a five-year contract extension through the 2028 season on February 23, 2024... He earned Opening Day honors in both 2023 and 2024, which made him the first Pirate to do so since Francisco Liriano started three straight season openers from 2014-16... He was selected by the Pirates in the second round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME: Keller suffered the loss on Tuesday vs. Washington, allowing three runs on two walks and six hits while striking out three batters over 6.0 innings of work... He threw 105 pitches, his most since throwing 107 on July 8, 2024 vs. New York (NL).

<u>VS. CLEVELAND</u>: Keller will make his fourth career start against the Indians/ Guardians...He suffered a loss at Progressive Field last September 1, allowing four runs (three earned) on 11 hits and 3 home runs while striking out seven in 5.1 innings.

INTERLEAGUE: Keller is 10-15 with a 4.46 ERA (173.2ip/86er) and 188 strikeouts in 32 career inteleague starts...He allowed seven runs over 3.2 innings in his only interleague start this season in Pittsburgh's Home Opener on April 4 vs. New York (AL)...Keller is 3-5 in 13 starts against the AL Central, including going 2-2 with a 3.42 ERA in 2024.

THE 700 CLUB: With his strikeout of St. Louis' Pedro Pagés in the seventh inning of his start on April 9, Keller recorded his 700th career strikeout...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the fastest pitcher in club history to reach 700 strikeouts with Pittsburgh by innings (718.1)...The previous record was held by Bob Veale, who took 740.0 innings... Per Elias, he's also the third-fastest pitcher in team history to reach the 700-strikeout mark with Pittsburgh by games (136), behind Gerrit Cole (126) and Veale (135).

KEEPING IT 100: Heading into the 2024 All-Star break, Keller was 10-5 with 105 strikeouts in 114.1 innings pitched...He became the fourth pitcher in club history to have 10-plus wins, 100-plus strikeouts and 100.0-plus innings pitched prior to the All-Star break, along with Gerrit Cole in 2015, Bob Veale in 1966 and Bob Friend in 1960.

AS A PIRATE: The Pirates selected Keller in the second round of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft out of Xavier High School in Cedar Rapids, Iowa...He was rated by Baseball America as Pittsburgh's No. 1 prospect in each season from 2018-20...He was also recognized by the same publication as a top-100 prospect in the game from 2017-20.

SIGN HERE PLEASE: The Pirates signed Keller to a five-year contract extension through 2028 last year on February 23...He became the third member of the current team to sign a long-term contract extension, along with Ke'Bryan Hayes and Bryan Reynolds.
