HERE'S THE STORY: The D-backs split the 2020 season series with the Rockies, 5-5, going 3-4 at home and 2-1 on the road...in 2019, went 9-10 vs. Rockies, 5-4 at home and 4-6 on the road.

- ♦ Last night's was the D-backs 100th win @ Coors Field.
- ♦ **Ketel Marte** has hit safely in 5 straight games to begin the season...the D-backs record is 10 games.
 - His 1.517 OPS is fifth in the Majors.
 - Has hit safely in 14 of his last 18 road games since last Aug. 10 at a .408 clip (31-for-76)/1.129 OPS with 11 doubles, 3 homers, 12 RBI, 4 walks and 3 HBP.
- ♦ D-backs starters **Taylor Widener** and **Luke Weaver**, in the last 2 starts, combined for a 2.31 ERA (3 ER in 11.2 IP) and .171 opponent average (7-for-41).

I AM A PEACOCK, YOU'VE GOTTA LET ME FLY: **Matt Peacock** made a memorable debut last night, becoming the first pitcher since 1945 to debut in an extra inning game, earn the win and collect his first hit...the last pitcher to do it was Marino Pieretti on April 19, 1945 for the Washington Senators @ Philadelphia Athletics...Pieretti got the 4-3 win with a complete game 12.0 innings and went 1-for-5 at the plate [source: Sportradar]...some additional notes on Peacock:

- Was the D-backs' 23-round pick in 2017 out of University of South Alabama, the same college as Luis Gonzalez... Peacock was signed by scout Kerry Jenkins and is Jenkins' first big leaguer.
- Briefly quit baseball for his redshirt junior season (2016) due to an injury, worked at his family's saw mill then returned for his senior season and was drafted.

IN LOVING MEMORY OF BILL BRYK: Yesterday, the D-backs issued the following statement on the passing of legendary scout Bill Bryk, who passed away at the age of 70...Bryk, whose post-playing career spanned more than 5 decades, spent the last 11 seasons with the D-backs (also Padres and Pirates):

“Brykie will be remembered not only for his tireless dedication to baseball but more importantly, for his kindness. He filled nearly every role possible in our game, from player, coach and manager to numerous positions in scouting and player development and he left a mark on multiple generations. Our heartfelt thoughts and prayers are with his wife, Jackie, and their entire family during this difficult time.”

AT A GLANCE: Second season with the D-backs...agreed to a 5-year deal through 2024 on Dec. 17, 2019.

- 4-time NL All-Star (2013-16), 3-time World Series champion ('10, '12, '14), 2014 World Series MVP and 2-time Louisville Slugger® Silver Slugger Awards™ winner ('14-15).

NO. 300: Making his 300th career appearance (297th start).

OPENING DAY NOD: Made his seventh career Opening Day start, second as a D-back, on April 1 @ Padres...started 5 openers for the Giants.

- It was his third straight season-opening start vs. Padres.

VS. ROCKIES: Most recently on Sept. 27 last season vs. Rockies, tossed 5.0 shutout innings (2 H, 0 BB, 4 K).

- In his last 7 starts vs. Rockies, his team is 6-1 and he is 5-0 with a 3.43 ERA (16 ER in 42.0 IP).
- In 36 career starts, is 17-8 with a 3.20 ERA, .252 opponent average and 214 strikeouts.

APPROACHING 300 CAREER STARTS: His 296 career starts are 10th among active pitchers behind Zack Greinke (461), Justin Verlander (454), Jon Lester (423), Max Scherzer (369), Clayton Kershaw (356), Adam Wainwright (327), David Price (311), Johnny Cueto (309) and J.A. Happ (299).

AT THE DISH: His double on April 1 @ Padres was his first since Sept. 15, 2018 vs. Rockies.

- His 19 home runs are sixth most by a pitcher since 1901 behind Warren Spahn (35), Don Drysdale (29), Carlos Zambrano (24), Milt Pappas (20) and Dizzy Trout (20).
- His last home run was on Sept. 24, 2019 vs. Rockies.

TOUCHING ALL THE BASES

D-BACKS ADDITIONAL HOME OPENER TICKETS ON SALE: The D-backs expanded the capacity at Chase Field to approximately 20,000 fans per game beginning with the home opener on April 9 vs. Reds and those additional seats went on sale on March 30.

KETEL AT HOME AWAY FROM HOME: **Ketel Marte**, in 104 road games since 2019, is hitting .323 (136-for-421)/.952 OPS with 31 doubles, 3 triples, 22 homers, 67 RBI and 39 walks.

- ♦ Among all players on the road since 2019 (min. 400 PA), ranks second with 136 hits, third with a .323 average, tied for third with 56 extra-base hits and sixth with a .952 OPS.

ASDRÚBAL ON A ROLL: **Asdrúbal Cabrera** has hit safely in 13 of his last 18 games, since Sept. 10, 2020, batting .313 (20-for-64) with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers and 14 RBI.

- Among NL players since Sept. 10, 2020 (min. 50 PA), is tied for eighth with a .609 SLG, tied for 10th with 10 extra-base hits and 11th with a .990 OPS.

VS. ROCKIES: **David Peralta** has hit in 18 of his last 22 games at Coors Field, since June 20, 2017, at a .359 pace (33-for-92)/1.018 OPS with 6 doubles, 6 homers, 24 RBI and 6 walks.

- ♦ **Tim Llocastro**, in his last 16 games since May 28, 2019, is hitting .359 (14-for-39)/.969 OPS with 4 doubles, 1 triple, 2 RBI, 3 walks and 4 HBP.
- ♦ **Christian Walker** has hit in 10 of his last 11 games, since Aug. 10, 2020, at a .375 clip (18-for-48)/1.176OPS with 3 doubles, 5 homers, 13 RBI, 4 walks and 1 HBP.

LOCASTRO TIES A RECORD (SINCE 1951): **Tim Llocastro's** steal of second base in the seventh inning on April 2 @ Padres was his 27th straight stolen base to start his career, matching Tim Raines (1979-81) for the longest streak to start a career since 1951.

NEXT STARTER: RHP MERRILL KELLY (0-1, 6.75)

- ♦ Started on April 2 @ Padres (3 ER in 4.0 IP).
- ♦ Did not face the Rockies in 2020.
- ♦ In 2019, made 3 starts vs. Rockies (1-2, 7.64), including 2 at Coors Field (May 28 and Aug. 12).
- ♦ In his last 6 road starts, since Sept. 9, 2019, is 3-3 with a 3.03 ERA (12 ER in 35.2 IP), .222 opponents average and 36 strikeouts.
