The Brewers begin their 2026 road schedule this afternoon....the team went a Major League-best 45-36 on the road last season, including a 9-game winning streak that tied a franchise record from 7/23-8/16.

Let's Play Two!

The Brewers and Royals are meeting in a doubleheader for the 23rd time ever and for the first time since they split on 7/16/99 at County Stadium....their last doubleheader played in Kansas City came on 5/1/94 with the Royals winning both games.

They're Out of Our League

The Brewers are 107-59 (.645) since 2022 during Interleague Play, which marks the best record in the majors.

What's Glove Got to do With It

The Brewers have yet to commit an error through 6 games, which breaks the franchise record for most games into a season without an error....the previous record was 5 games to begin 2000....the Brewers, Reds and Astros are the only three teams in the majors without an error this season.

All or Nothing

Of the 17 runs allowed by Brewers pitching this season, 15 have scored via the home run.

Smooth Criminals

The Brewers have gone 15 for 16 in stolen base attempts....the team's 15 steals lead the Major Leagues.

The Brice Is Right

Brice Turang has hit safely in each of the team's 6 games this season while batting .409 (9-for-22, 1hr, 5rbi) with a .500 OBP/.727 SLG/1.227 OPS....Turang is the only player on the team to hit safely in every game.

TODAY'S GAMES: Are the first and second games of a 6-game road trip to Kansas City (3g) and Boston (3g)....the Brewers are coming off a 5-1 homestand to open the season against Chicago-AL (3-0) and Tampa Bay (2-1)....following this trip and an off day next Thursday, the team returns to American Family Field for 6 games in 7 days against Washington (3g) and Toronto (3g).

MANAGER: **Pat Murphy** (330g, 195-135, .591) is in his third season as Brewers manager....he was voted NL Manager of the Year in 2024 and 2025....he is one of four managers ever to win Manager of the Year in consecutive seasons, joining the Braves' Bobby Cox (2004-05), Rays' Kevin Cash (2020-21) and Guardians' Stephen Vogt (2024-25)....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell....he signed a multi-year contract extension on 2/20/26.

COACHES: Returning from the 2025 staff is offense & strategy coordinator **Jason Lane** (11th season/1st in current role), pitching coordinator **Jim Henderson** (5th season/1st in current role), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (4th season/3rd in current role), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (8th season), bullpen coach **Charlie Greene** (3rd season), lead hitting coach **Eric Theisen** (2nd season/1st in current role) and third base coach **Matt Erickson** (3rd season/1st in current role)....assistant pitching coach **Juan Sandoval**, hitting coach **Guillermo Martinez**, hitting coach **Daniel Vogelbach** and first base coach **Spencer Allen** are all in their first seasons on the coaching staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made three replay challenges this season, going 3-0....their challenge came on 3/31 vs. Tampa Bay as an out call at first base involving Jake Bauers was overturned.

2025 IN REVIEW: The Brewers went 97-65 to finish in first place in the NL Central, 5.0 games ahead of the Cubs....Milwaukee had the best record in baseball for only the second time in franchise history (1982) and set a franchise record for regular-season wins....the team beat the Cubs, 3 games to 2, in the National League Division Series before getting swept by the Dodgers in the National League Championship Series.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have qualified for the postseason seven times in the last eight seasons and three seasons in a row....the team was just two games away from making the postseason in nine straight seasons (2017-25), missing out in both 2017 and 2022 by a single game....Milwaukee has won the NL Central in four of the last five seasons and three seasons in a row.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only Major League teams with 86+ wins in each of the last eight full seasons (2017-25)....this does not include the shortened 2020 season....the Brewers have 768 wins since 2017, which ranks fourth in the majors behind the Dodgers (858), Astros (811) and Yankees (794).

PATRICK AT A GLANCE: Chad Patrick, 27, will be making his second start of the season.....Patrick received no decision in a 6-1 win last Saturday vs. Chicago-AL as he allowed 1 run on 5 hits in 4.1 innings (1bb, 4k, 1hr, 74 pitches).....Patrick was acquired from Oakland on 11/15/23 in exchange for INF Abraham Toro.....he was selected by Arizona in the fourth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Purdue University Northwest.....he was traded by Arizona to Oakland on 7/31/23 in exchange for INF Jace Peterson, who is now a consultant to player development with the Brewers.

LAST SEASON: Patrick went 3-8 with a 3.53 ERA in 27 games/23 starts during his first Major League season.....he had four stints with the team (Opening Day-7/5, 8/18-8/19, 8/24 and 9/9-end of season).....the team went 8-14 in his starts.....he had 5 quality starts.....opponents batted .248 (113-for-455, 13hr).....he was among 2025 National League rookie leaders in starts (1st), strikeouts (1st, 127) and innings pitched (2nd, 119.2).

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 2-4 with a 2.89 ERA in 16 games/13 starts (71.2ip, 23er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 1-4 with a 4.30 ERA in 12 games/11 starts (52.1ip, 25er).

CAREER vs. ROYALS: Patrick made his first Major League start last April 1 in Milwaukee against Kansas City and received no decision in a 5-0 win (4.2ip, 3h, 3bb-1bb, 5k).

SPROAT AT A GLANCE: Brandon Sproat, 25, will be making his second start of the season.....Sproat made his Brewers debut last Sunday vs. Chicago-AL and received no decision in a 9-7 win (3ip, 6h, 7r, 7er, 4bb, 3k, 3hr, 86 pitches).....he was acquired from the Mets with INF/OF Jett Williams on January 21 in exchange for RHP Freddy Peralta and RHP Tobias Myers.....he entered the 2026 season as the fifth-best prospect in the Brewers organization according to *Baseball America*.....Sproat was selected by the Mets in the second round of the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida.

LAST SEASON: Sproat entered the 2025 season as the second-best prospect in the Mets organization according to *Baseball America* with his changeup rated best in the system.....he went 8-6 with a 4.24 ERA in 26 games/25 starts at Triple-A Syracuse.....he was named International League Pitcher of the Month for July (5gs, 2-0, 0.67era).....Sproat was selected by the Mets on September 7 and went 0-2 with a 4.79 ERA in 4 starts.....he made his Major League debut on 9/7 at Cincinnati and carried a no-hitter into the sixth inning but took a 3-2 loss (6ip, 3h, 3r, 3er, 4bb, 7k).

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Sproat made his Milwaukee debut in his last outing.

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 0-2 with a 5.91 ERA in 2 starts (10.2ip, 7er).
