The Brewers are 96-54 (.640) since 2022 during Interleague Play, trailing only the Dodgers (92-49, .652).. the team has gone 22-16 (.579) during Interleague Play this season including 10-2 in the last 12 games.... Milwaukee had a 7-game Interleague winning streak snapped last night.

Call for a Priester

Quinn Priester is on a 7-game winning streak over his last 9 games/6 starts while posting a 2.52 ERA during this stretch (50ip. 41h. 15r. 14er. 9bb. 48k).

That's a Fact, Jack!

Jackson Chourio enters the day on a career-high 16-game hitting streak, batting .371 (23-for-62) with 3 HR and 14 RBI....during this streak, he has a .403 OBP/.581 SLG/.984 OPS.

Let's Touch Base

Christian Yelich has reached base safely in 28 consecutive games. batting .330 (36-for-109) with 6 HR and 24 RBI....during this stretch, he has a .387 OBP/.550 SLG/.937 OPS.

Making a Run at It

Christian Yelich needs just 4 runs for 1,000 in his Major League career.

TODAY'S GAME: Is game 6 (4-1) of a 6-game road trip to Los Angeles-NL (3-0) and Seattle (1-1) coming out of the All-Star break....following this trip and an off day tomorrow, the team returns to American Family Field for a 6-game homestand against Miami (3g) and Chicago-NL (3g).

IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without Bob Uecker on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970).....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

AT HOME: The team is 33-17 at home, going 12-4-0 in series play.....are 21-8 in the last 29 home games, including 10-1 in the last 11 with a season-high 6 straight wins.

ON THE ROAD: The team is 27-24 on the road, going 7-7-2 in series play,....are 17-6 in the last 23 road games....have had three season-high 5-game road winning streaks, coming from 5/25-6/2, 6/19-7/2 and 7/6-7/21.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he is the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn ...Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23. replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

COACHES: Returning from 2024 is associate manager Rickie Weeks (2nd season), EDACHES: Returning from 2024 is associate manager Rickie Weeks (2nd season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (7th season), assistant pitching & strategy coach Jim Henderson (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach Charlie Greene (2nd season), hitting coach Connor Dawson (4th season), assistant coach Daniel de Mondesert (2nd season), infield coach Matt Erickson (2nd season) and third base coach Jason Lane (10th season/5th in current role).....first base coach Julio Borbón, lead hitting coach Allerand and hitting coach First Theirs are all in their first seasons on the staff. LeBoeuf and hitting coach Eric Theisen are all in their first seasons on the staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team has made 15 replay challenges this season, going 9-6.....their last challenge (won) came on 7/7 vs. Los Angeles-NL as an out call at third base involving Isaac Collins was overturned.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times in the last seven seasons [2018-24] and won the NL Central in four of the last seven, three of four, and two in a row.....Milwaukee is one of five teams to make the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons, joined by the Astros [7], Braves [7], Dodgers [7] and Yankees (6).....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseaso eight straight seasons (2017-24), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons [2017-24].....this does not include 2020.....the Brewers have 726 wins since 2017 [4th in MLB/2nd in National League].

PRIESTER AT A GLANCE: Quinn Priester, 24, will make his 19th appearance and 14th start of the season.....Priester last pitched last Friday in a start at Los Angeles-NL and earned a 2-0 win (6ip, 3h, 0bb, 10k, 77 pitches).....he notched the second double-digit strikeout game of his career and second in his last 4 outings (also 6/28 vs. Colorado)..... the team is 7-6 in his starts.....he has 5 quality starts.....opponents are batting .230 (82-for-357, 11hr).....he has gone 5-2 with a 2.65 ERA as a starter (68ip, 20er) and 3-0 with a 5.06 ERA in relief (26.2ip, 15er)......Priester was acquired from Boston on April 7 for OF Yophery Rodriguez, a Competitive Balance Round A selection and a player to be named (RHP John Holobetz on May 5).....he began the season at Triple-A Worcester (1 start).

LAST SEASON: Priester went 3-6 with a 4.71 ERA in 11 games/7 starts with Pittsburgh (10g/6gs) and Boston (1gs)....his teams went 1-6 in his starts.....he had 2 quality starts..... opponents batted .277 (56-for-202, 7hr).....he went 1-5 with a 4.42 ERA as a starter (36.2ip, 18er) and 2-1 with a 5.54 ERA as a reliever (13ip, 8er).....Priester was traded by Pittsburgh to Boston on 7/29/24 in exchange for INF/OF Nick Yorke.

CAREER: Is 14-11 with a 4.82 ERA in 39 games/28 starts (194.1ip, 104er) while pitching for Pittsburgh (2023-24), Boston (2024) and Milwaukee (2025).....has gone 8-10 with a 4.54 ERA as a starter (144.2ip, 73er) and 6-1 with a 5.62 ERA as a reliever (49.2ip, 31er).....Priester was selected by Pittsburgh in the first round (18th overall) of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft out of Cary-Grove (IL) High School.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 6-2 with a 3.56 ERA in 11 games/7 starts (60.2ip, 24er).....is 5-1 with a 3.02 ERA in 8 games/5 starts this season (44.2ip, 15er).
