**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets returned to action and split a doubleheader with the Brewers...The victory in game two of the twinbill snapped a four-game losing streak...New York is 19-25 on the road compared to 30-13 at Citi Field in 2025...The Mets continue six-game homestand (1-1) against Milwaukee (1-1) and the Yankees (three games)...Following this homestand, the Mets hit the road for the final time before the All-Star break, heading to Baltimore (three games) and Kansas City (three games).

**PLAYER OF THE MONTH:** Congrats to Juan Soto who was named the National League Player of the Month for June...This is the first time that Soto has earned the award...It is the second time this year that a Mets player has won the Player of the Month Award after Alonso earned the honors for May...Soto joined Darryl Strawberry (May, 1987), as the only Mets player to have 10 or more home runs and 20 or more walks in a calendar month...Courtesy of Sarah Langs...In 27 games last month, Soto hit .322/.474/.722 with 25 runs, three doubles, 11 home runs, 20 RBI, 25 walks and two steals.

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** Congrats to Francisco Lindor who was named the National League's starting shortstop in the All-Star Game...Lindor will make his first trip to the Midsummer Classic as a member of the Mets and his fifth overall after making four straight AL All-Star teams with Cleveland from 2016-19...He will become the third Mets shortstop to start for the National League, joining Buddy Harrelson (1971) and José Reyes (2007). Reyes was named a starter in 2011, but was injured and didn't start...The last time the Mets had a fan-elected starter was in 2016 when Yoenis Céspedes started in the outfield...The 2025 All-Star Game on Tuesday, July 15 in Atlanta.

**SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT:** According to Elias, Francisco Lindor has hit 257 home runs and stolen 196 bases as a shortstop...Only two players in major league history had 200/200 (HR/SB) as a shortstop - Derek Jeter (255 HR, 351 SB) and Jimmy Rollins (229 HR, 469 SB).

**MILB PITCHER OF THE MONTHS:** Congrats to RHP Jonah Tong who was named the Eastern League Player of the Month...Tong claimed his second straight Eastern League honor as he went 3-0 with a 0.93 ERA in five starts as he allowed three earned runs on 11 hits and nine walks while striking out a league-best 43...He led the league in average against (.113), WHIP (0.69), hits allowed per nine innings (3.41) and strikeouts per nine innings (13.39)...Tong allowed just two extra-base hits (a double and a triple) in June. Tong, 22, was selected in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of the Georgia Premier High School in Statesboro, GA...St. Lucie Mets right-hander Wellington Aracena earned POM honors as he went 1-1 with a 1.13 ERA in five outings (two starts), allowing three earned runs on eight hits and 11 walks over 24.0 innings...He led the league in average against (.104) and was second in strikeouts (29) and WHIP (0.79). He allowed one earned run over his last 20.0 innings in June...Aracena, 20, was signed by New York (NL) as an international free agent out of Mao, Dominican Republic.

**THE DAVID:** The Mets are 8-0 in Peterson's home starts this season...The team's eight consecutive wins in Peterson's starts are tied with Taijuan Walker (8-0 in 2021) for the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history...The team's 11 straight home wins in David Cone's starts to open the 1989 season are the most...Courtesy of Elias...The Mets are 14-3 in his 17 home starts since the beginning of 2024 and 39-17 in Peterson's games at home in his career.

**WE FOUND NIMMO:** Brandon Nimmo connected for his third career grand slam in game two yesterday...That is tied for the fourth-most by a player in franchise history...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader with six grand slams...Six players have hit five grand slams for the Mets, including Francisco Lindor...Over the last 34 games, Brandon Nimmo is batting .311 (41-132) with 19 runs, six doubles, eight homers, 20 RBI, 10 walks, six steals and a .906 OPS.

**THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT:** Congrats to RHP Jonah Tong and OF Carson Benge have been selected to participate in the 2025 All Star Futures Game on Saturday, July 12 at Truist Park in Atlanta...Tong, the Mets #4 prospect and #92 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100 prospects leads all of minor league baseball with 115 strikeouts and is second in the minors with a 1.73 ERA in 14 starts...He is also second in MiLB and first in all of Double-A with a .137 opponent's batting average, while his strikeout percentage (K%) of 40.5% is second in all of MiLB...Tong was selected by the Mets in the seventh round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Georgia Premier Academy...Benge, the Mets #3 prospect and #81 prospect in MLB Pipeline's Top 100, was promoted to Binghamton on June 23 after starting the year with High-A Brooklyn...Benge slashed .302/.417/.480 with an .897 OPS in 60 games with the Cyclones...He was selected by the Mets with the 19th overall pick in the 2024 draft out of Oklahoma State.

**ED, EDD AND EDDY:** Edwin Diaz recorded his second four-out save of the season last night (also: 5/24 vs. LAD)...Has recorded three strikeouts in five of the games he has saved this season, tied with Mason Miller for the most such games in the majors...His 23 career saves of four or more outs are the fourth-most in the majors since 2016...He ranks sixth in the NL and tied for 11th in the majors with 17 saves...He has not allowed a run in 21 of his last 22 games dating back to April 26.

**WALK TO ME:** Soto as recorded a Major League-leading 71 walks this season, the most by a Met through the team's first 87 games in franchise history...His 71 walks through the team's first 87 games are the most in franchise history...John Olerud owns the single-season franchise record with 125 walks in 1999...Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024).

**UPCOMING MILESTONES:** Francisco Lindor is two steals away from 200 career SB and one steal away from 100 as a Met...He would become the 12th Met to reach 100 stolen bases and the sixth Met to record at least 100 homers and 100 steals with the team (also: Darryl Strawberry, David Wright, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán and José Reyes).

**LAST TIME OUT:** Recorded his second consecutive loss after allowing a season-high-tying five earned runs over 4.2 innings on June 27 at Pittsburgh (7 H, 3 BB, 5 K)...Was his first time losing back-to-back games since he lost four straight contests from April 22 - May 15, 2023...Marked the second time in his career he has allowed at least five runs in consecutive games (also: 4/17-22/23).

**HOME SWEET HOME:** The Mets are 8-0 in Peterson's home starts this season...The team's eight consecutive wins in Peterson's starts are tied with Taijuan Walker (8-0 in2021) for the second-longest season-opening streak in franchise history...The team's 11 straight home wins in David Cone's starts to open the 1989 season are the most...Courtesy of *Elias*...The southpaw has gone 4-0 with a 2.22 ERA (12 ER/48.2 IP), 12 walks and 41 strikeouts at home this year...Has allowed three runs or fewer in each of those eight games and two runs or fewer in seven...The Mets are 14-3 in his 17 home starts since the beginning of 2024 and 39-17 in Peterson's games at home in his career.

**SOUTHPAW SHUTOUT:** In his last game at home on June 11 vs. the Nationals, tossed a complete game shutout for the first time in his career (6 H, 0 BB, 6 K)...Was the first Met to throw a shutout since Luis Severino on August 17, 2024 vs. MIA...He is the first franchise left-handed pitcher to throw a shutout since Steven Matz (7/27/19 vs. PIT)...Became the fourth pitcher in the majors this season to throw a 9.0+ IP complete game shutout without allowing a walk, and the first Met to do so since Jacob deGrom (4/23/21 vs. WAS)...He became the 63rd pitcher in franchise history to record a shutout without allowing a walk.

**ON A ROLL:** Over 16 starts this season, has gone 5-4 with a 3.30 ERA (35 ER/95.1 IP), 34 walks and 83 strikeouts...Had a career-high 15.0 scoreless inning streak from 6/5-17...Pitched 5.0 innings or more in 12 straight starts from April 12 - June 17, which was the longest such streak of his career...Had also recorded three consecutive starts of 7.0 or more innings from June 5-17, joining himself (3 GS from 8/19-29/24) as the only Mets pitcher to do so since Zack Wheeler's four such starts from 9/10-26/19...He has allowed three earned runs or less in 14 of his 16 starts this season and in 15 of his last 17 starts dating back to September 29, 2024...Among qualified Major League pitchers this season, is fifth in groundball percentage (55.8, third in NL) and sixth in HR/9.0 IP ratio (0.57, third in NL)...Is also seventh in the NL in opponents' SLG (.349).

**YEAR IN REVIEW:** Since making his season debut last year on May 29, 2024, Peterson has allowed three runs or fewer in 30 of his 37 starts, going 15-7 with a 3.08 ERA (74 ER/216.1 IP), 80 walks and 184 strikeouts...21 of those outings have been quality starts...The Mets are 24-13 over games in which Peterson has started in that span...Since 2024, has allowed just four runs in the first inning, which is the second fewest in the majors during that span, trailing only Reese Olson's two runs (min. 30 G)...Since May 29, 2024 (min. 30 GS), he is fourth in HR/9.0 IP (0.58), sixth in groundball percentage (52.8, fourth in NL), 10th in opponents' SLG (.349, fifth in NL), and 11th in ERA (3.08, fourth in NL).

**VS. MILWAUKEE:** In Game 3 of the NLWC vs. Milwaukee, Peterson recorded the series-clinching save, a career first...He became the first pitcher in franchise history and 19th in major league history to record their first career save in the Postseason...Courtesy of *Elias*...He last faced the Brewers in the regular season on September 29, 2024 and earned the win after tossing 7.0 innings of one-hit ball (0 R, 3 BB, 8 K).

**ELECTRIC SLIDE:** David Peterson has used his slider 21.1% of the time this season...Of his 83 strikeouts, 46 have come using this pitch...Has recorded a 33.1% put away rate and a 35.6% whiff rate with the pitch this season, both rates the highest among pitches in his arsenal.

**QUALITY CONTROL:** Has recorded nine quality starts in 16 total outings this season, including seven of his last 10 starts...Had four consecutive quality starts from May 6-24, which was the second-longest such streak of his career (longest: five quality starts from 8/14-9/3/24)...Peterson has recorded 21 quality starts since his start to last season (5/29/24), with 19 of them coming in his last 32 games (since July 1)...From July 1, 2024 to now, he is one of 13 pitchers (one of seven in NL) to record at least 19 quality starts and one of five left-handers to do so.

**APPLE PICKING:** This season, Peterson has recorded a net bases prevented of six (a sum of advances prevented and outs added assigned to the pitcher) according to Baseball Savant, which is the highest in the majors...Since his Major League debut in 2020, his 30 net bases prevented is the most among Major League pitchers...Chris Flexen and teammate Griffin Canning are next on the list with 21...Peterson has recorded 17 career pickoffs (two this season), which is the eighth-most by a Mets pitcher...He trails only Ron Darling (41), Jerry Koosman (36), Dwight Gooden (32), Al Leiter (28), Jon Matlack (24), Mike Scott (20), Sid Fernandez (18)...According to *OPTA*.

**CAREER NOTES:** With a 2.90 ERA (39 ER/121.0 IP) last season, Peterson became the 10th left-hander in franchise history to record an ERA of 3.00-or-under while making at least 20 starts and was the first to accomplish the feat since Johan Santana's 2.98 ERA (66 ER/199.0 IP) over 29 starts in 2010...Over parts of five major league seasons with the Mets, the southpaw has gone 33-28 with a 3.95 ERA (241 ER/549.1 IP), 231 walks and 547 strikeouts in 117 games (101 starts)...Was drafted by the Mets in the first round (20th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Oregon.
