Ichiro Suzuki is set to become the third player inducted to the National Baseball Hall of Fame with the Seattle Mariners in <u>72 days</u> on July 27 in Cooperstown... he is also set to have his <u>#51</u> retired by the Mariners on Aug. 9 at T-Mobile Park.

The Mariners and Padres will meet for the first of two series...they will meet again from Aug. 25-27 in Seattle to decide the first official "Vedder Cup" winner:

TONIGHT'S TILT... the Mariners begin a 10-game, 3-city road trip with the first of 3 games against the San Diego Padres...Seattle is also set to visit the Chicago White Sox (3 G, 5/19-21) and Houston Astros (4 G, 5/22-25) on the trip...tonight's game will be televised live on **APPLE TV+** with **Wayne Randazzo** and **Dontrelle Willis** on the call, with **Heidi Watney** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and Mariners.com with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.**

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners lost Wednesday's game to the Yankees by a 3-2 final...Seattle is 21-11 (.656) when they homer and 15-4 (.789) when scoring 5+ runs...Seattle is 15-10 over its last 25 games and 19-11 over its last 30 games.

- Series-ly Solid The Mariners own a 9-4-1 series record, 4-3-1 at home and 5-1 on the road...the Mariners won 9-consecutive series from April 7-May 7, the second-longest series winning streak in club history...since **Dan Wilson** took the helm on Aug. 23, 2024, Seattle owns a 16-6-3 series record.
- Joy Division The Mariners are 13-5 (.722) against AL West Division opponents, and 10-14 (.417) outside the division.
- The Fireman is Back Since his return, Matt Brash has made 4 scoreless appearances spanning 3.2 innings with 3 hits, 2 walks and 5 strikeouts.
- Drop and Give Me Six Seattle is 13-3 (.813) when their starting pitcher goes 6.0+ innings.
- Casey at the Mound Casey Legumina is 3-1 with a 2.08 ERA (3 ER, 13.0 IP), 8 walks (2 intentional), 11 strikeouts and a 1.15 WHIP while holding opponents to a .159 (7x44) average.
- **Dilly Bar** In 30 games this season, **Dylan Moore** is batting .286 (26x91) with 18 runs, 2 doubles, 7 homers, 13 RBI, 8 walks and 7 stolen bases, getting on base at a .343 clip and slugging .538 (.882 OPS).

VEDDER CUP PART I... the Mariners and Padres are set to meet for the first of two series to decide the first official winner of the "Vedder Cup", with the series to be decided from Aug. 25-27 in Seattle... it was announced on March 14 that the two clubs would play annually for the Vedder Cup in their rivalry series, beginning this season...the winner of the series will take home the Vedder Cup Trophy, featuring a guitar provided by **Eddie Vedder**...as part of the series, both the Padres and Mariners are making annual donations to the EB Research Partnership.

- Past and Present Four members of the Mariners coaching staff have represented the Mariners against the Padres: Manager Dan Wilson (24 G), Major League Pitching Strategist and Assistant Pitching Coach Danny Farquhar (4 G), Sr. Director of Hitting Strategy Edgar Martinez (29 G) and Third Base Coach Kristopher Negrón (1 G)...24 players on the Mariners Active Roster and Injured List have appeared against the Padres while with Seattle.
- Last Time in San Diego the Mariners swept a 2-game set the last time they played at Petco Park
 winning by 8-3 and 2-0 final scores...Cal Raleigh homered from both sides of the plate while Julio
 Rodríguez collected 4 hits and a home run in the game 1 victory and Bryce Miller and Andrés Muñoz
 bookended the Seattle shutout in game 2.

THE BEST CATCHER IN ALL THE LAND...catcher Cal Raleigh was 2-for-4 with a stolen base in Wednesday's game...in 42 games, Cal has a .924 OPS, hitting .248 (38x153) with 27 runs, 8 doubles, 13 homers, 28 RBI, 27 walks and 5 stolen bases, getting on base at a .368 clip and slugging .556, with Cal's 13 homers tied for 5th-most in the Majors...among MLB catchers, Raleigh ranks 1st in home runs (13), T-1st in RBI (28), 1st in runs scored (27), 1st in extra-base hits (21), 1st in stolen bases (5), 1st in slugging percentage (.557), 1st in OPS (.922), 1st in fWAR (2.4) and 1st in bWAR (2.2).

THE OFFENSE...Seattle batters <u>lead the Majors</u> in walk rate (10.3%), ranking T-3rd in the Majors in walks (168), trailing only the Yankees (173) and Diamondbacks (173)...across the Majors, the Mariners rank 9th in on-base percentage (.327), T-6th in OPS+ (115), 12th in OPS (.727), 8th in runs-per-game (4.79), T-7th in home runs (56), T-7th in stolen bases (45) and T-3rd in hit-by-pitches (24) this season.

<u>JULIO'S LAST TWO WEEKS</u>...over his last 14 contests (4/29-c), **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .293 (17x58) with 10 runs, 2 doubles, 3 home runs, 7 RBI and 2 walks with a .483 slugging percentage and .811 OPS... he has hit safely in 11 of those 14 contests...overall this season, Julio has played an elite center field, recording 5 outs above average (*Baseball Savant*) tied for the 2nd-most among AL outfielders...Julio is set to wear the 2-way microphone during the bottom of the 2nd inning during tonight's Apple TV+ broadcast.

THE MAN ON THE MUN...right-hander **Andrés Muñoz** leads the American League with 13 saves...in 19 appearances this season, the reigning American League Reliever of the Month is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 19.0 IP) with 7 hits allowed, 1 run allowed (unearned), 8 walks (2 intentional) and 26 strikeouts, sporting a 0.79 WHIP and 12.3 strikeouts-per-9 innings rate...Muñoz has limited opponents to a .113 batting average (7x62)...Muñoz has compiled 1.8 bWAR, <u>leading MLB relief pitchers</u>.

THE RANDY MAN CAN...outfielder Randy Arozarena has a .799 OPS, batting .236 (33x140) with a .385 OBP, slugging .414 with 18 runs, 10 doubles, 5 home runs, 20 RBI, 9 stolen bases, 27 walks and 7 hit-by-pitch...Arozarena is tied for the MLB in HBP, ranking T-2nd in the AL in walks...Arozarena had a career-high 34-game on-base streak from March 31-May 12, the longest on-base streak by a Mariners player since Robinson Canó's 34-game on-base streak from April 30-June 5, 2016.

THIS MEANS WAR...Cal Raleigh (2.2), Andrés Muñoz (1.8), Julio Rodríguez (1.5), Bryan Woo (1.4), Randy Arozarena (1.4), J.P. Crawford (1.3), Jorge Polanco (1.3) and Dylan Moore (1.2) all have been worth at least 1.0 WAR (Baseball-Reference) this season...6 position players with at least 1.0 bWAR is tied for the most in the AL (also: Yankees), trailing only the Cubs and Dodgers, who each have 7...the Mariners are also 1 of 5 teams with multiple pitchers with at least 1.4 bWAR.

KINGS OF THE ROAD...Mariners hitters are batting .269 (178x662) with 28 doubles, 26 home runs, 24 stolen bases, a .359 OBP, slugging .429 with a .788 OPS and a 128 OPS+ in 18 road games this season, averaging 5.5 runs-per-game...among MLB teams, they rank 1st in OBP, 4th in runs-per-game, 3rd in OPS, 3rd in OPS+ and 1st in walk rate (11.1%) while tied for the 3rd-lowest strikeout rate (19.8%) on the road... among players with at least 50 PA on the road this season, Cal Raleigh ranks 7th with a 1.055 OPS.

<u>UPCOMING HOMESTAND</u>...following the current 10-game road trip, the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park for a 9-game homestand where they will host the Washington Nationals (3 G, 5/27-29), Minnesota Twins (3 G, 5/30-6/1) and Baltimore Orioles (3 G, 6/3-5)...the homestand is highlighted by **Randy Arozarena Bobblehead 3-Day Giveaway** from May 27-29, **K-Pop Fireworks Night** on May 30, **Little League Day** on June 1, **Pride Night** on June 4 and a pair of **Mariners Value Games** on June 3 and June 5, with <u>tickets starting at \$11</u>.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...this year's season series between the Mariners and Padres is the first official installment of the "Vedder Cup" named for Pearl Jam lead singer and past resident of both San Diego and Seattle Eddie Vedder, but...DID YOU KNOW?...that in the previous 27 season series between the two clubs, Seattle owns an 11-10-6 record?...with a season series win in 2025, the Mariners would win 4-consecutive against their "rival" for the second time in club history (also: 2006-09).

ABOUT LOGAN EVANS ...

- The 23-year old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 4th career Major League start in tonight's game against San Diego, and his 1st career start against the Padres.
- Evans was selected by the Mariners in the 12th round of the 2023 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Pittsburgh.
- Spent 2 seasons at Penn State University, 2020-21, before transferring to the University of Pittsburgh, 2022-23.
- Was born in Ann Arbor, Michigan and attended Saline High School (MI).

AST TIME OUT...ND on 5/10 vs. TOR, he threw 5.0 innings pitched, giving up 3 runs on 5 hits (1 HR), with 3 strikeouts against 2 walks...Evans still managed to get through 5 innings on 86 pitches, and has reached the 5th inning in all 3 of his starts so far this season.

EFFICIENT STUFF...he is the 17th pitcher in franchise history to throw 5.0+ innings in each of his first 3 career games (last: Bryce Miller, 5 games: 5/2/23-5/24/23)...has reached the 5th inning in each of his last 7 starts between Tacoma and Seattle... Evans only threw 5+ SO in 9 of his 22 starts in the minor leagues last season (all with Arkansas)...he also did so twice in 2023, tossing 6 SO in back-to-back starts with Modesto (9/01 and 9/07/23).

MAKING A STATEMENT...became the 9th pitcher in Mariners history to allow 2 or fewer hits with 5.0+ innings of work in his Major League debut, also joining fellow teammates Emerson Hancock (8/9/23 vs. SD) and Bryce Miller (5/2/23 at OAK)...he also became the 13th pitcher in Mariners history to have 1 or fewer earned runs with 5.0+ innings work in their first career road start (last: Emerson Hancock, 8/9/23 vs. SD).

SIMILAR FOOTSTEPS...also became the 7th pitcher in Mariners history drafted in the 10th round or later to start their MLB debut (does not include non-drafted players), joining: Bob Stoddard (10th round), Joel Piñeiro (12th), Jim Converse (16th), Anthony Vasquez (18th), Brandon Maurer (23rd), and George Glinatsis (32nd).

DEBUTANTS...was the 3rd Mariners player to make his Major League debut this season, joining **Ben Williamson** (April 15 at Cincinnati) and **Sauryn Lao** (April 21 at Boston). Since then, Rhylan Thomas also made his MLB debut on May 2 vs. TEX...Evans was also the 48th pitcher in franchise history to start his MLB debut and first since Emerson Hancock (August 9, 2023 vs. San Diego)...he was also the youngest starting pitcher to make his MLB debut at home for the Mariners (23 years, 325 days), since Andrew Moore (23 years, 10 days) on June 22, 2017 vs. DET.

PROSPECT WATCH...was the Mariners top pitching prospect entering the season, and 8th overall in the Mariners system by Baseball America...he is also ranked as the No. 10 Mariners prospect (MLB Pipeline).

CAREER STATS...has appeared in 3 minor league seasons going 11-6 with a 3.05 ERA (50 ER, 147.2 IP), 48 walks, 136 strikeouts and a 1.15 WHIP in 42 games (32 starts)...he has made 5 starts for Triple-A Tacoma this season, going 1-1 with a 3.05 ERA (11 ER, 25.2 IP), 4 walks, 23 strikeouts and a 1.25 WHIP.

PITCHER OF THE MONTH...the 6-foot-4 right-hander earned Pacific Coast League Player of the Week honors on April 14 after tossing 6.0 innings allowing just 1 run on 2 hits and no walks with a season-high 7 strikeouts on April 9 against Sacramento.

MAYNIFICENT PERFORMANCE...in 5 starts during May for Arkansas last season, Evans threw 5.0+ innings pitched in all of his starts, compiling a 4-1 record, a 0.63 ERA (2 ER, 28.2 IP), .163 AVG against, 0.70 WHIP, with 33 strikeouts against 4 walks...was named both Mariners Minor League Co-Pitcher of the Month and Texas League Pitcher of the Month for his efforts.

TIME WITH THE TRAVS...was 9-5 with a 3.20 ERA (38 ER, 107.0 IP), 42 walks and 98 strikeouts in 32 games (22 starts) with Double-A Arkansas last season...in 10 starts before his transition to a reliever, he was 5-2 with a 1.23 ERA (7 ER, 51.1 IP), 15 walks and 47 strikeouts...he made 10 appearances as a reliever from June 4-30 before transitioning back to a starter.

PANTHERS IN THE MLB...became the only University of Pittsburgh Panther to appear in the Majors this season...he was also the 19th pitcher in program history to play in MLB, and only the 2nd pitcher to make a start since the 2000 season.

AWARDED... was named Texas League Pitcher of the Week on Aug. 11, 2024 after tossing 6.0 perfect innings with 7 strikeouts on Aug. 9 vs. Tulsa.

HIGHS...during his minor league career, struck out a career-high 9 batters twice (5/4/24 vs. San Antonio and 9/25/24 vs. Midland, both w/ Double-A Arkansas)...has tossed a career-high 6.0 innings 8 times (last: 4/9/25 vs. Sacramento w/ Triple-A Tacoma).
