TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners play the last of a 3-game series today against the Athletics (0-2)...Seattle collected a series win against the Texas Rangers (2-1) on the homestand...following an off day tomorrow, the Mariners embark on a 6-game road trip at the St. Louis Cardinals (3 G, 4/24-4/26) and Minnesota Twins (3 G, 4/27-4/29)...today's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryon Healy** on the call, with **Ryan Rowland-Smith** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's middle game to the Athletics by a 5-2 score.

- **Let The Sunshine In** - Seattle is 5-3 in day games (5-1 in home day games) this season, as opposed to 5-12 at night.
- **Middle Earth** - The Mariners are an even 21-21 all-time on Earth Day (April 22) in franchise history.
- **Don't 'Challenge' Garv** - When **Mitch Garver** catches, he has been successful on 90% (9 of 10) of his ABS strike zone challenges.
- **Value!** - Today's game is a **Mariners Value Game**, with tickets starting at under \$12...more information at Mariners.com/Value.

SPLENDID STARTERS CEMENT PLACE IN SPECIAL CLUB...only 11 pitchers in MLB history have recorded 400+ strikeouts while walking fewer than 100 batters through their first 75 career starts and the Mariners have 3 of them currently in their rotation: today's starter **Logan Gilbert**, **George Kirby**, and **Bryan Woo**, who just made his 75th career start on Sunday against the Rangers.

IN ROTATION...Mariners starting pitchers have been excellent to start the 2026 season, with the rotation of **Logan Gilbert**, **George Kirby**, **Bryan Woo**, **Emerson Hancock** and **Luis Castillo** combining to go 7-9 with a 3.32 ERA (54 ER, 146.1 IP), 32 walks and 136 strikeouts...among MLB rotations, the Mariners ranks T-2nd in fWAR (3.3), 2nd in quality starts (13), 1st in fewest BB/9 (1.97), 1st in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.25), 4th in WHIP (1.11) and T-6th in ERA.

LOGAN BRINGS HIS 'A' GAME...today's starter **Logan Gilbert** is 4-1 with a 2.82 ERA (26 ER, 83.0 IP) with 83 strikeouts and 11 walks in 14 career starts against the Athletics...in 2 starts last year against the A's, Gilbert went 1-0 with a 1.38 ERA (2 ER, 13.0 IP) with 21 strikeouts and 1 walk...since 2024, he has 42 strikeouts and just 2 walks against the A's.

JULIO ABOARD...**Julio Rodríguez** reached base 3 times last night, going 2-for-3 with a walk...J-Rod has reached base safely (via hit, walk or HBP) in 18 consecutive games (4/3-c), tied with Nick Kurtz-ATH for the longest on-base streak by an American League batter this season (both are active streaks) and tied for the 4th-longest active streak in the Majors...it's the 3rd-longest on-base streak of Julio's career, trailing streaks of 27 G (2023) and 22 G (2022)...Julio has also hit safely in his last 6 games (4/16-c), during which he is batting .381 (8x21) with 1 double, 2 RBI, 2 walks and 1 stolen base.

YOUNG AND SPRY ON DEFENSE...Mariners infielder **Cole Young** has 7 defensive runs saved (*FanGraphs*) this season, leading MLB second basemen and tied for the lead among all defenders, regardless of position, with Cubs center fielder Pete Crow-Armstrong...Young leads the Mariners with 1.0 win above replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) and has accumulated 0.6 defensive WAR.

MARINERS RECALL RHP ALEX HOPPE...the Mariners recalled right-handed pitcher **Alex Hoppe** (pronounced 'hoppy') from Triple-A Tacoma...in 8 appearances with Triple-A Tacoma in his first year in the Mariners organization, the righty has not allowed an earned run in 8 appearances, recording 4 saves with 12 strikeouts and 3 walks...the 27-year-old was originally a 6th round draft selection (2022) by the Boston Red Sox out of the University of North Carolina-Greensboro...in a corresponding move, right-handed pitcher **Casey Legumina** was designated for assignment, bringing the 40-man roster to 39 players... additionally, right-handed pitcher Blas Castaño was claimed off waivers by the Colorado Rockies.

MARINERS IN THE MEDIA...nearly 300 interviews and media sessions have taken place during the Mariners 2026 season so far, in a variety of local, national, and international outlets...national media this season have included MLB Network, Apple TV, ESPN, FOX, NBC/Peacock, and more.

BAZARDO LOSES OBSCURE RECORD...right-hander **Eduard Bazarido** recorded his first career regular season loss last night...before last night, he held the MLB record for most innings pitched (151.0) without a loss...the record now reverts back to Ernie Herbert, who went undefeated in 115.2 innings pitched from 1913-15 with the Cincinnati Reds and St. Louis Maroons...the active pitcher with the most innings thrown without a loss is Yankees reliever Brent Headrick (63.2 IP).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Cal Raleigh** homered last night, his fourth homer of the season and his second in as many games...last night marked the 157th home run of his career, surpassing Raúl Ibáñez for sole possession of 8th on the Mariners all-time home runs list, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that "Mr. Mariner" Alvin Davis is next on the list with 160 home runs?...also within reach this season are Nelson Cruz (163 HR, 6th) and Alex Rodríguez (189 HR, 5th)...the most home runs in franchise history belong to Hall of Famer **Ken Griffey Jr.** (417 HR).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 22

- **1977** - The Mariners turn their first triple play in franchise history against the Kansas City Royals at the Kingdome. It was only the club's 16th game of existence.
- **1993** - **Chris Bosio** hurls the second no-hitter in Mariners history, beating the Boston Red Sox 7-0 in the Kingdome. Bosio walked the first two batters, then tossed a double play ball to start a string of 26 straight batters retired.
- **2003** - **Mike Cameron** belts a walk-off grand slam to beat Cleveland, 8-5. The blast marks the sixth time in franchise history a Mariner has hit a walk off grand-slam.
- **2013** - **Félix Hernández** recorded his 100th career victory in the Mariners 7-1 win at Houston. Felix became the 6th-youngest pitcher to record his 100th victory among players who began their career since divisional play began in 1969.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- Gilbert, 28, is making his 6th start of the season and 1st against the Athletics...it is the 152nd start of his career and 15th career start against the Athletics.
• Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau on June 16, 2018.
• Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
• Named the 2022 and the 2024 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.
• Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2024.

LAST TIME OUT...in his 5th start of the season on April 17 vs. Texas, allowed only 2 runs (2 ER), 7 hits (1 HR), and 1 walk while striking out 7 batters over 5.1 innings...he threw a season high 99 pitches (67 strikes)...has not thrown 99+ pitches since April 19 of last season at Toronto...recorded back-to-back 7+ strikeout games for the first time this season and the 27th time in his career.

FACING THE A'S...the Mariners are 11-3 when Gilbert starts against the Athletics...have yet to lose a game in T-Mobile park against the A's with Gilbert as the starting pitcher...his SO/BB ranks 1st (7.55), WHIP ranks 2nd (0.761), and opponent batting average ranks 4th (.186) among active starting pitchers against the Athletics (min. 5 GS)...In his last outing against the A's, Gilbert set a career high in strikeouts with 13 over 6.0 IP...his 6 games with no walks allowed against the A's leads starting pitchers since 2021, with the 2nd most games being 3.

NEW SHERIFF IN TOWN...his 347 strikeouts against AL West teams leads starting pitchers since 2021, while his 20 wins amassed against the AL west is T-3rd, trailing Framer Valdez-HOU/DET (25), and George Kirby-SEA (26)...his WHIP over 343.1 IP ranks T-10th (0.96) and his base runners per 9 innings ranks 11th (9.02) among active starting pitchers against the A's (min. 25.0 IP)...has faced AL West teams in his last 3 starts, recording quality starts with 1-or fewer walks in 2 of 3 starts and throwing 5.0+ innings with 2-or-fewer runs allowed in all 3.

SOMETHING ABOUT THE SUNSHINE...ranks 8th in K/BB (5.03), 10th in WHIP (1.03), and 9th in base runners allowed (9.52) during day games among active starting pitchers (min. 20 GS)...owns the 3rd most strikeouts in day games (357) in Mariners history behind Félix Hernández (815) and Randy Johnson (560).

HOME IS WHERE THE K IS...has recorded 7+ strikeouts in 24-of-33 home starts since the beginning of the 2024 season...his 24 games are the most in MLB over this span, just ahead of Dylan Cease-TOR/SD (22)...has thrown 7+ strikeouts in 36 home starts over his career to rank 4th in Mariners franchise history behind Randy Johnson (100), Félix Hernández (96), and Mark Langston (45)...also owns the 6th most strikeouts at home in Mariners history with 479.

IN COMMAND...his 5 outings with 5+ strikeouts and 3-or-fewer walks are tied for the most in 2026 with Cam Schlichter-NYY...he ranks 10th in strikeouts in the American League in 2026...of pitchers in the top-10 in strikeouts in the AL pitchers he has the second fewest walks allowed (5), just behind Cam Schlichter-NYY (3 walks).

QUALITY TIME...has thrown a quality start with 1-or-fewer walks issued in 57 career games (last: 4/12 vs. HOU), the 4th-most such games in MLB since 2021, ranking just ahead of rotation-mate George Kirby (56 G)...his 26 quality starts without a walk are 6th-most in MLB since 2021.

AMONG THE LEAGUE...his 916 strikeouts since 2021 lead the American League while his 864.1 innings pitched are 3rd most and his 151 starts are 2nd in the AL across that span.

KEEPING COOPERSTOWN COMPANY...ranks T-13th in WHIP all-time among starting pitchers in MLB that have recorded over 900 strikeouts, matching Hall of Famers Trevor Hoffman, Christy Mathewson, and Walter Johnson's 1.06 WHIP.

150 FOR THE M'S...made his 150th career start with the Mariners on April 12 vs. Houston Astros...he is the 7th pitcher to make 150 starts in a Mariners uniform...his 909 strikeouts rank second among Mariners pitchers' first 150 career starts, only behind Mark Langston (916 K)...ranks 9th in wins with 48 over a players' first 150 games pitched with the Mariners.

WHERE IT RANKS...his 11.9 SO/9 last season is the 4th-best mark among starters in a single season in Mariners history (trailing Randy Johnson's 1995, '97, '98 seasons) while his 9.528 career SO/9 ratio is 3rd-best in franchise history (min. 500 IP), trailing James Paxton's 9.545 and Randy Johnson's 10.585 career SO/9 mark...with tonight's start is looking to tie Jerry Reed and Russ Swan at rank 42 with 152 games played in Mariners history.

AMONG THE GREATS...his 3.59 career ERA (345 ER, 864.1 IP) is 7th-best among starters in Mariners history (min. 500 IP), trailing Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA, Luis Castillo (3.52), and George Kirby (3.55)...his 916 career strikeouts are 6th-most in Mariners history, behind Mike Moore's 937 strikeouts...he also ranks 1st in WHIP (1.062) and is tied for 2nd in both SO/9 (9.5) and BB/9 (1.9).

2025 TOTALS...in 25 regular season starts, went 6-6 with a 3.44 ERA (50 ER, 131.0 IP) with 173 strikeouts and 31 walks, posting a 1.031 WHIP...led the Majors in strikeouts-per-nine innings (11.89), and ranked 2nd in strikeout rate (32.3%) during the regular season (min. 100.0 IP).

- **Steady Eddy** - Made 8-consecutive relief appearances (3/30-4/18) without allowing an earned run...tossed 7.2 innings over those appearances.
- **2025 Totals** - Went 5-0 with a 2.52 ERA (22 ER, 78.2 IP) with 27 walks, 82 strikeouts and a 1.017 WHIP in 73 appearances, limiting opponents to a .187 batting average in 2025.
- **El Campeón** - Won the 2026 World Baseball Classic with Team Venezuela, which included a pitching appearance in the Championship Game against Team USA on March 17.
