The Brewers are 96-53 (.644) since 2022 during Interleague Play, trailing only the Dodgers (92-48, .657).....the team has gone 22-15 (.595) during Interleague Play this season, including 10-1 in the last 11 games with 7 consecutive wins.

Bringing the Heat

Jacob Misiorowski has 88 pitches of 100+ MPH in his 5 starts.....only the Reds' Hunter Greene (124) has more as a starting pitcher this season..... Greene has made 11 starts.

That's a Fact, Jack!

Jackson Chourio enters the day on a career-high 15-game hitting streak, batting .373 (22-for-59) with 3 HR and 14 RBI.....during this streak, he has a .397 OBP/.593 SLG/.990 OPS.

Let's Touch Base

Christian Yelich has reached base safely in 27 consecutive games, batting .333 (35-for-105) with 6 HR and 24 RBI.....during this stretch, he has a .391 OBP/.562 SLG/.953 OPS.

Making a Run at It

Christian Yelich needs just 4 runs for 1,000 in his Major League career.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is game 5 (4-0) of a 6-game road trip to Los Angeles-NL (3-0) and Seattle (1-0) coming out of the All-Star break.....following this trip and an off day on Thursday, the team returns to American Family Field for a 6-game homestand against Miami (3g) and Chicago-NL (3g).

IT WON'T BE THE SAME: This season marks just the second without **Bob Uecker** on the radio for the Milwaukee Brewers (also 1970).....the 2003 Hall of Famer passed away at the age of 90 on January 16.

IN THE STANDINGS (126 days): The team has spent the following number of days alone or tied at each spot in the NL Central standings: **FIRST:** 12*, **SECOND:** 57, **THIRD:** 43, **FOURTH:** 11, **FIFTH:** 3.....the Brewers are currently in first place, leading the second-place Cubs by 1.0 game (*9 days tied for first from 3/18-3/26 before playing a game).

AT HOME: The team is 33-17 at home, going 12-4-0 in series play.....are 21-8 in the last 29 home games, including 10-1 in the last 11 with a season-high 6 straight wins.

ON THE ROAD: The team is 27-23 on the road, going 7-7-2 in series play.....are 17-5 in the last 22 road games with 5 straight wins, tying a season high.....also 5-game road winning streaks from 5/25-6/2 and 6/19-7/2.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy is in his second season as Brewers manager.....he was voted 2024 NL Manager of the Year after going 93-69 and winning the NL Central division championship.....he is the first manager in franchise history (in either league) to earn the honor.....Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell.....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026.

COACHES: Returning from 2024 is associate manager **Rickie Weeks** (2nd season), field coordinator **Néstor Corredor** (3rd season/2nd in current role), pitching coach **Chris Hook** (7th season), assistant pitching & strategy coach **Jim Henderson** (4th season/2nd in current role), bullpen coach **Charlie Greene** (2nd season), hitting coach **Connor Dawson** (4th season), assistant coach **Daniel de Mondesert** (2nd season), infield coach **Matt Erickson** (2nd season) and third base coach **Jason Lane** (10th season/5th in current role).....first base coach **Julio Borbón**, lead hitting coach **Al LeBoeuf** and hitting coach **Eric Theisen** are all in their first seasons on the staff.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The team has made 15 replay challenges this season, going 9-6.....their last challenge (won) came on 7/7 vs. Los Angeles-NL as an out call at third base involving Isaac Collins was overturned.

BREWING SUCCESS: The Brewers have made the postseason six times in the last seven seasons (2018-24) and won the NL Central in four of the last seven, three of four, and two in a row.....Milwaukee is one of five teams to make the postseason in at least six of the last seven seasons, joined by the Astros (7), Braves (7), Dodgers (7) and Yankees (6).....the team was just 2 games away from qualifying for the postseason in eight straight seasons (2017-24), missing by a single game in both 2017 and 2022.

BREWING CONSISTENCY: The Brewers, Astros and Dodgers are the only teams with 86+ wins in each of the last seven full seasons (2017-24).....this does not include 2020.....the Brewers have 726 wins since 2017 (4th in MLB/2nd in National League).

TONIGHT'S STARTER: #32 - RHP JACOB MISIOROWSKI (5gs, 4-1, 2.81) - 2025 ALL-STAR
2025 Arsenal: 4-Seam Fastball (53.5%) - Slider (28.7%) - Curveball (13.1%) - Changeup (4.7%)

MISIOROWSKI AT A GLANCE: Jacob Misorowski, 23, will make his sixth start....Misorowski last started on 7/8 vs. Los Angeles-NL and earned a 3-1 win as he notched the first double-digit strikeout game of his career (6ip, 4h, 1r, 1er, 1bb, 12k, 1hr, 91 pitches)....he has 2 quality starts....opponents are batting .138 (12-for-87, 4hr)....his 88 pitches of 100+ MPH trails only **Hunter Greene** (CIN-124) among Major League starters....Misorowski was selected by Milwaukee in the second round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft from Crowder (MO) College, where he pitched one season (2022) and became the highest drafted player in school history....name is pronounced "miz-uh-RAO-skee."

AWESOME! Misorowski became the first pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1900) to have more wins (2) than hits allowed (1) after his first two career starts and as many wins (3) as hits allowed (3) after three starts....he joined **Logan Henderson** (also 2025) as the only pitchers in franchise history to win each of their first three career Major League games....he became the ninth pitcher - sixth starter - in the Modern Era (since 1900) to throw at least 5.0 hitless innings in a Major League debut as he earned a 6-0 win on 6/12 vs. St. Louis (5ip, 0h, 4bb, 5k, 81 pitches)....Misorowski followed that performance with a 17-6 win on 6/20 at Minnesota as he took a perfect game into the seventh inning (6ip, 1h, 2r, 2er, 1bb, 6k, 1hr, 86 pitches)....he produced the longest hitless innings streak (11.0 IP) in the Modern Era by a starting pitcher to begin a career....the hat he wore in his second career outing went to the National Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum in Cooperstown, NY....the crowd of 42,774 in his start against **Paul Skenes** on 6/25 vs. Pittsburgh marked the highest home attendance of the 2025 season as he earned a 3-0 win (5ip, 2h, 2bb, 8k, 74 pitches)....he was named NL Rookie of the Month for June, joining **Ben Sheets** (June 2001) as the only Brewers pitchers ever to take home Rookie of the Month honors....Misorowski had just five Major League games under his belt when he was named an All-Star, the fewest in Major League history....he tossed a scoreless eighth inning in the All-Star Game (1ip, 1h).

HIGHLY-TOUTED: Misorowski made his Major League debut as the second-best prospect in the organization according to *Baseball America* (MLB No. 21 overall) and the fourth-best prospect in the organization according to *MLB Pipeline* (MLB No. 68 overall).

AT NASHVILLE: Misorowski, who entered the season as the third-best prospect in the organization according to *Baseball America*, joined the team from Triple-A Nashville, where he was 4-2 with a 2.13 ERA in 13 games/12 starts....he was International League Pitcher of the Week twice and Brewers Minor League Pitcher of the Month for May....the team went 6-6 in his starts....he made 4 quality starts....opponents batted .175 (38-for-217, 4hr)....he produced 80 strikeouts in just 63.1 innings pitched (11.37 K/9IP).

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER: Misorowski has gone 11-9 with a 3.04 ERA and 1 save in 68 games/55 starts in the Brewers farm system (2022-25)....opponents have batted .170 and he has produced 320 strikeouts in just 233.2 innings pitched (12.33 K/9IP)....he pitched in the 2023 All-Star Futures Game at T-Mobile Park in Seattle.

AT HOME: Is 3-0 with a 0.56 ERA in 3 starts (16ip, 1er).... **ON THE ROAD:** Is 1-1 with a 6.52 ERA in 2 starts (9.2ip, 7er).
