TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners embark on their final road trip of the season, beginning with the 1st of 3 games against the Oakland Athletics...following an off day Thursday, the Mariners will also visit the Texas Rangers (3 G, 9/22-24) on the current road trip...the Mariners are coming off a 2-4 homestand against the Los Angeles Angels (2-1) and the Los Angeles Dodgers (0-3)...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Mike Blowers** on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and **Mariners.com** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Dave Sims** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners lost yesterday's game against the Dodgers by a 6-1 score...despite the loss, the Mariners are 18-13 over their last 31 games, 26-16 over their last 42, 28-17 over their last 45, 31-18 over their last 49, 34-20 over their last 54 and 43-26 over their last 69 games...the Mariners are 62-24 when scoring at least 4 runs and 19-44 when scoring 3-or-fewer...the Mariners are 41-33 at T-Mobile Park and 40-35 on the road this season...they are 27-26 in day games and 54-42 at night.

- Wild Wild West** - The Mariners final 13 games of the season are against AL West Division opponents (OAK 3, TEX 7, HOU 3).
- Brashty** - **Matt Brash** has 101 strikeouts this season, the 6th-most in franchise history by a reliever, trailing Edwin Diaz (124 in 2018), Bill Caudill (111 in 1982), Enrique Romo (105 in 1977), J.J. Putz (104 in 2006) and Paul Sewald (104 in 2021)...Brash's 73 appearances are also tied for the 4th-most by a pitcher in team history, trailing Ed Vande Berg's franchise record of 78 games in 1982.
- Leaders** - **Julio Rodríguez** (6.1 fWAR, 2nd among OF), **Cal Raleigh** (4.0 fWAR, 5th among C), **J.P. Crawford** (4.1 fWAR, 6th among SS) and **Matt Brash** (2.0 fWAR, 4th among RP) all rank in the top 10 in the Majors at their position in fWAR this season
- Yard Work** - The Mariners have hit 195 home runs this season, 12th-most in the Majors...Seattle has hit 200+ home runs in a season 7 times: 1996-99, 2016-17 and 2019.

PLAYOFF PICTURE...the Mariners enter play today in 3rd place in the AL West, 2.5 games back of division-leaders Houston Astros, 1.0 game back of Texas Rangers for the 3rd AL Wild Card and 1.5 games back of the Toronto Blue Jays for the 2nd AL Wild Card...the Astros have 12 games remaining (3 vs. BAL, 3 vs. KC, 3 at SEA and 3 at ARI), Texas has 13 games remaining (3 vs. BOS, 3 vs. SEA, 3 at LAA and 4 at SEA) and Toronto has 12 games remaining (3 at NYY, 3 at TB, 3 vs. NYY and 3 vs. TB).

THE J-ROD SHOW IS MUST-SEE TV...since July 1, **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .344 (97x282) with 48 runs, 21 doubles, 1 triple, 17 home runs, 57 RBI and 18 stolen bases, getting on base at a .389 clip and slugging .606 (.996 OPS)...since Aug. 4, he is batting .395 (64x162) with 31 runs, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 13 home runs, 41 RBI and a 1.168 OPS...overall this season, Julio leads the American League in hits (174), ranks 2nd in the AL in total bases (303) behind Shohei Ohtani-LAA (325), 3rd in RBI (99), T-4th in extra-base hits (67), 7th in home runs (30), 5th in runs (95) and 3rd in stolen bases (36).

- Keeping It 100** - Rodríguez is 1 RBI away from a 100-RBI season...Julio would join Alex Rodríguez-SEA (1998) & Ronald Acuña Jr.-ATL (2019) to become just the 3rd player age 22-or-younger with a 30/30 season and 100 RBI in the same year...Julio would join Ken Griffey Jr. (2x, 1991-92) and A-Rod (2x, 1996, '98) as the only Mariners with 100+ RBI in age 22-or-younger seasons.
- Playing the Hits** - J-Rod leads the AL in hits this season with 174, ranking ahead of Marcus Semien-TEX (171 H) and Bobby Witt Jr.-KC (165 H)...if he finishes with the league lead in hits, he will become just the 3rd player in franchise history to lead the AL in hits, joining Alex Rodríguez (1998) and Ichiro Suzuki (7x, 2001, 2004, 2006-10) and just the 9th player age 22-or-younger to lead the AL in hits...he would join Ty Cobb-DET (3x, 1907-09), Dick Wakefield-DET (1943), Harvey Kuenn-DET (1953), Al Kaline-DET (1955), George Brett-KC (1975), Rickey Henderson-OAK (1981), Cal Ripken Jr.-BAL (1983) and Alex Rodríguez-SEA (1998).

TEO THE TERRIFIC...**Teoscar Hernández** had his 30-game on-base streak snapped in yesterday's game (8/15-9/16)...the streak was the longest by a Mariners player this season, surpassing **Julio Rodríguez** (27 G, July 1-Aug. 2), the longest on-base streak by a Mariners player since Robinson Canó's 34-game on-base streak from April 30-June 5, 2016, and the 28th streak of at least 30 games in franchise history...Since August 1, Teo is batting .323 (54x167) with 21 runs, 11 doubles, 9 home runs and 30 RBI, getting on base at a .359 clip and slugging .551 (.910 OPS).

PITCH PERFECT...the Mariners pitching staff leads the Majors in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.60), walks-per-9 innings (2.53) and ERA (3.74), while ranking 3rd in fewest runs allowed (612), 2nd in fWAR (20.1), T-2nd in WHIP (1.18), 2nd in FIP (3.82), 2nd in quality starts (69), T-5th in opponent batting average (.236), 7th in strikeouts (1,351), and 8th in strikeouts-per-9 innings (9.11).

STEADY SHORTSTOP...**J.P. Crawford** went 2-for-4 with 1 double, 1 walk and 1 RBI in yesterday's game, tying his career-high of 54 RBI previously registered during the 2021 season...the Mariners shortstop this year has already tallied career-highs in home runs (15) and walks (83) and is on pace to set career-highs in on-base percentage (.378), slugging (.425) and OPS (.803)...among qualified Major League shortstops this season, Crawford ranks 7th in fWAR (4.1), 2nd in wRC+ (130), 2nd in OBP and 5th in OPS.

CAL RALEIGH IS QUITE A CATCH...Mariners catcher **Cal Raleigh** has 16 home runs over his last 50 games (7/22-c) batting .258 (47x182) with 30 runs, 8 doubles, 33 RBI and a .896 OPS during that span...he leads Major League catchers with 28 home runs overall this season and leads AL catchers in fWAR (4.3) trailing only William Contreras-MIL (4.7 fWAR) and Sean Murphy-ATL (4.4) for the MLB lead among catchers...with 2 more homers this season, #29 would become the 29th catcher in MLB history (min. 60% of games at catcher) with a 30+ home run season.

THE 100 RBI CLUB...**Julio Rodríguez** (99 RBI), **Teoscar Hernández** (89 RBI) and **Eugenio Suárez** (88 RBI) all have a chance to reach 100 RBI this season...they could become just the 7th trio of Mariners with 100 RBI in a season and the first since Bret Boone, Mike Cameron and Edgar Martinez in 2001...only 18 different players in franchise history have had 100 RBI in a season, most recently done by Mitch Haniger (100 RBI) and Kyle Seager (101 RBI) in 2021.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners lead the Majors in fWAR among players age 26-or-younger, with 28.3 fWAR among that group (14.1 batting fWAR, 14.2 pithing fWAR), ranking ahead of Atlanta (24.1 fWAR) and Houston (19.1 fWAR), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that the Mariners have the top pitcher and hitter aged 26-and-younger in the American League according to fWAR?...**Julio Rodríguez** leads AL hitters with 5.9 fWAR, while George Kirby leads AL pitchers with 4.0 fWAR...**Cal Raleigh** (T-7th, 4.3) also ranks among the top 10 hitters age 26-and-younger, while **Logan Gilbert** (T-2nd, 3.2 fWAR) and **Bryce Miller** (T-7th, 2.3 fWAR) both rank in the top 10 in fWAR in that age group.

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 23-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 16th Major League start and 1st career start against Los Angeles-NL.
- Selected by Seattle in the 6th round (174th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of Cal Poly University... signed by Mariners scout Chris Hom.
- Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly before being drafted, making 31 appearances (6 GS) for the Mustangs.
- Did not pitch in 2021 while recovering from right elbow surgery.

LAST TIME OUT...W#3 in his 15th Major League start vs. Los Angeles-AL, tossed 5.2 scoreless innings and allowed 4 hits while striking out 8.

FINDING HIS GROOVE...over his last 5 starts (8/3-c) Woo has gone 2-1 and owns a 2.70 ERA (8 ER, 26.2 IP) with 7 walks, 1 home run allowed and 22 strikeouts...over that span opponents are batting just .188 (18x96) against him and he has given up just 4 extra-base hits...in these 5 games Woo has made 2 starts of 6.0 innings and has recorded 2 scoreless outings.

WEST COAST, BEST COAST...is set to make his 2nd career start against Oakland...against teams from California, Woo owns a 1.92 ERA (6 ER, 28.1 IP) and has only given up 6 walks and 2 home runs while striking out 33 in 5 starts...Woo was born in Oakland and played 3 seasons at Cal Poly.

DIVISIONAL RIVALS...is set to make his 7th start against an AL West opponent and his 2nd start against Oakland...over his previous 6 starts Woo owns a 3.26 ERA (11 ER, 30.1 IP) with 6 walks and 34 strikeouts.

IN THE ZONE...has allowed 22 walks while striking out 76 batters in 15 starts...he currently has a 3.45 strikeout-to-walk ratio...Woo also owns a 9.0 strikeouts-per-nine which ranks 3rd on team behind **Luis Castillo** (9.9) and **Logan Gilbert** (9.2)...Woo's 2.6 walks-per-nine rank 5th among Mariners starters this season.

HIGH QUALITY...recorded his 3rd career quality start after pitching 6.0 innings and allowing just 3 hits and 1 walk in his outing on 8/28 against Oakland...his first career quality start came on 7/3 against San Francisco.

AUGUST REVIEW...Woo finished August with a 1.69 ERA (3 ER, 16.0 IP) and allowed just 4 walks with 14 strikeouts in 3 games started...his 1.69 ERA was the 5th best in the majors among pitchers who made at least 2 starts during the month...in those three games Woo did not give up a home run and he pitched at least 6.0 innings in two of those starts.

AMONG MARINERS GREATS...Woo's 76 strikeouts are the 6th most in Mariners history in a pitcher's first 15 career starts, he trails Michael Pineda (94), Félix Hernández (94), **Logan Gilbert** (84), **George Kirby** (81) and Roenis Elías (80).

IN THE WIN COLUMN...Woo earned his 1st career win on 6/22 against New York-AL...he carried a no hitter into the 6th inning before giving up a 1-out single to Gelyber Torres...he became the 5th Mariners pitcher this season to carry a no-hitter into the 6th inning (also: **Bryce Miller**, **Logan Gilbert**, **Luis Castillo**, **Easton McGee**).

CAREER-HIGH PUNCHIES...recorded a new career high in strikeouts in his outing against the White Sox on 6/16 with 9...his Minor League career high is 11 which he achieved on 8/19/22 against Vancouver.

PROSPECTING...became the 2nd top 10 Mariners prospect to debut this season...teammate **Bryce Miller**, who was ranked as the Mariners 2nd overall prospect by *MLB.com*, also debuted earlier this season.

POW POW...was named Mariners Minor League Pitcher of the Month in April and May while pitching for Double-A Arkansas...Woo was 0-0 with a 1.59 ERA (3 ER, 17.0 IP) with 27 strikeouts and 8 walks in 4 April starts and was 3-2 with a 2.33 ERA (7 ER, 27.0 IP) with 32 strikeouts and 8 walks in 5 starts in May.

AWARDS...won 2 League Pitcher of the Week Awards in his minor league career...Northwest League Pitcher of the Week on 8/21/22 and Texas League Pitcher of the Week on 5/14/23.

MINOR DETAILS...appeared in 25 career minor league games, going 4-6 with a 3.21 ERA (36 ER, 101.0 IP), 143 strikeouts and 34 walks...his 25 minor league appearances prior to his MLB debut is tied for the 2nd-fewest among the previous 4 Mariners pitchers to start their MLB debut (**Matt Brash**, **Logan Gilbert**, **George Kirby** and **Bryce Miller**), with Brash, who also made 25 appearances (20 GS) before his debut.

DEBUTS...became the 46th pitcher in franchise history to start their Major League debut, and 2nd this season (**Bryce Miller**, 5/2 at OAK)...he became the 24th starting pitcher in franchise history to make their debut on the road...he also became the 25th pitcher in the Majors this season to start their MLB debut.
