METSPELLANEOUS: The Mets were off yesterday...On Wednesday, the Mets fell to the Cardinals, 10-5, in the series finale of a three-game set...The Mets are coming off a six-game road trip against the Diamondbacks (2-1) and Cardinals (2-1)...The Mets are 3.0 games ahead in the division...Tonight, the Mets begin their second homestand of the season, a six-day, seven-game homestand against the Phillies (three games) and Braves (four games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY! Happy Birthday to SNY broadcaster Gary Cohen!

LUCKY NUMBER 7: The Mets have struck out seven or more batters in 16 straight games...They have totaled 164 strikeouts in that span...That is the second-longest streak in franchise history...The 2014 Mets struck out seven or more hitters (totaling 151 strikeouts) in 17 straight games from July 6-26.

APRIL COME SHE WILL: The Mets own a .700 (14-6) winning percentage this month...That is the third-highest winning percentage in March/April in team history...Only the 1986 team at .813 (13-3) and the 1988 team at .714 (15-6) posted a better mark in March/April...The 2018 Mets set a team record with a 17 wins in March/April, finishing the month 17-9 (.654).

LIVIN IN THE CITI: The Mets are now 5-2 at Citi Field this year...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a .714 winning percentage at home...In 2021, the Mets recorded a winning season at home for the second time in the last three years (also, 2019)...The Mets have posted a 2.53 ERA (18 earned runs/64.0 innings) with 23 walks and 74 strikeouts at Citi Field this year...They are batting .263/.341/.408 at home...The Mets have outscored opponents 33-18 this season in Flushing.

PICK SIX: The Mets claimed their sixth series victory of the season against the Cardinals...That surpasses the previous Mets record of five series victories to begin the year, held by the 2018 Mets...The last team to win their first six series to start the year was the 2019 Rays...Only four NL teams since 2012 have won each of their first six series of the year (2022 Mets, 2018 Arizona, 2012 St. Louis, 2012 Washington).

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are now 6-2 against the NL East this season...They have posted a 2.51 ERA (17 earned runs/61.0 innings) with 15 walks and 69 strikeouts against the division...Last year, the team went 39-37 against the NL East...They posted a 3.58 ERA (255 earned runs/640.1 innings) and hit .243/.314/.400 against the division.

WINNING TIME: The Mets have posted a 14-6 record through the team's first 20 games...Only the 1986 Mets (16-4) and the 2015 Mets (15-5) posted better records through the first 20 games of the season...The 2018 team, 1988 team and the 1972 team all went 14-6 in the first 20 games as well...New York's pitching staff has struck out 201 this season...That ranks third in team history through 20 games...The 2018 Mets (198) own the record...The team's 201 strikeouts lead the major leagues.

EVERYBODY HURTS: The Mets have been hit by 19 pitches this year, which leads the majors...There is a two-way tie for second place at 14 HBP...New York was plunked 94 times last year, which ranked fourth in the majors and third in the National League...Since 2018, the Mets have been hit by 326 pitches, the most in the majors...In his career, Pete Alonso has been plunked 43 times...That is the fourth-highest total in the majors since he entered the league in 2019...Teammate Mark Canha ranks second in that span with 57 HBP, while Starling Marte is fifth (42) in the last four seasons.

TWO-OUT MAGIC: New York's hitters have combined for a .264/.362/.441 slashline with two outs this season...The Mets lead the majors in two-out OBP and RBI (45), are second in two-out hits (53) and fourth in average...In two-out RISP situations, the Mets rank third in the majors in both average (.321, 25-78) and second in on-base percentage (.424).

AW SNAP: New York's loss on Wednesday snapped a three-game winning streak, which matched their season-high...New York won three straight from April 7-9, from April 12-15 and again from April 17-19...On the other hand, the Mets have lost back-to-back games just once this season, from April 10-11.

YES WE McCANN: James McCann went 3-4 with a run, a double and an RBI in his last game on Tuesday in St. Louis...Over his last seven games, McCann is batting .300 (6-20) with three runs, a home run, four RBI, a walk, with a .348 OBP, a .550 SLG and an .898 OPS.

HIGH FIVE: Jeff McNeil is on a five-game hitting streak, batting .400 (8-20) with six runs, four doubles, a triple, an RBI with a 1.110 OPS in that span...Overall, he is batting .328 (20-61) with 11 runs, five doubles, a triple, a home run, seven RBI, five walks, a .388 OBP, a .492 SLG and an .880 OPS over 17 games this season...McNeil has recorded seven multi-hit games, which is tied for ninth in the majors...He has recorded 117 multi-hit games since he entered the majors on July 24, 2018...That is tied with Angel Pagan and Lenny Dykstra for 47th on the team's all-time list.

PHILS-METS NOTES: The Mets are 62-53 all-time against the Phillies at Citi Field.

STARTING OFF: The Mets starting staff has gone 10-3 with a 2.67 ERA (32 earned runs/108.0 innings) with 25 walks and 115 strikeouts this year...The starting staff leads the majors in WHIP (0.92), is second in the majors in strikeouts (115) and opponents average (.190) and third in ERA.

RIGHT ON TIME: The Mets are holding right-handed hitters to a major league-leading .181 (54-200) mark this year...The team has surrendered just 19 extra-base hits to righties in 2022...Chris Bassitt has allowed just three hits to right-handed hitters this year...He is holding righties to a .077 (3-39) mark...His .077 batting average against right-handed hitters is the fifth-best in the majors and third-best in the National League.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 11-1 when scoring first this season...That is the best mark in the majors...New York was 56-23 when scoring first last season.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: New York leads the major leagues in hits (174), second in OBP (.343) and average (.259), third in runs (95), fifth in OPS (.736), tied for sixth in doubles (33), tied for seventh in walks (69), 11th in SLG (.392)...Through 19 games this year, the Mets have outscored their opponents 94-61.

WIELDING AND FIELDING: The Mets have committed only six errors in 20 games this year...That is the second-fewest in the National League and the fourth-fewest in the majors...The Mets rank second in the NL and fourth in the majors with a .991 fielding percentage.

THE CHARMING MAN: Drew Smith is one of 16 players this season to pitch at least 8.0 innings and not surrender an earned run...In eight games this season, Smith has posted a perfect ERA, allowing only four hits and three walks while striking out nine in 8.0 innings of work...He owns a career record of 4-3 with a 2.88 ERA (27 earned runs/84.1 innings) with 27 walks and 75 strikeouts...Smith was acquired by the Mets from the Tampa Bay Rays on July 27, 2017 in exchange for Lucas Duda.

DESIGNATED FOR HITTING: As a team, Mets designated hitters are batting .297 (22-74) with 14 runs, six doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI, eight walks, a .381 OBP and a .581 SLG...They rank second in OBP and SLG, fourth in average, are tied for third in homers as well as doubles.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the NL with 16 RBI...He is batting .260 (20-77) with 10 runs, three doubles, three home runs, 16 RBI, three walks and a .416 SLG this year...He is batting .300 (6-20) with six runs, two doubles, three homes, 11 RBI with a 1.214 OPS in five games as a designated hitter this year.

MOVING ON UP: Pete Alonso's last home run on April 17 was the 109th of his career...That broke a tie with José Reyes for sole possession of 13th on the team's all-time list...He has gone 10 games without a homer...Ed Kranepool (118) is next, followed by Edgardo Alfonzo (120)...Alonso has socked 47 home runs at Citi Field...That is fourth in Mets history...David Wright is third with 49, followed by Michael Conforto (66) and the franchise leader, Lucas Duda (71).

OPS, I DID IT AGAIN: J.D. Davis owns a lifetime OPS of .882 OPS at Citi Field...It is the highest home OPS in franchise history (min. 100 PA)...Jeff McNeil is second with an .866 OPS and Brandon Nimmo is fifth with a .845 OPS at the home of the Mets.

NEED FOR SPEED: The Mets have totaled 12 stolen bases through 20 games...That is tied for sixth in the major leagues...The Mets did not record their 12th steal until May 19 last season in the team's 38th game...Starling Marte is tied for sixth in MLB with four steals, while Francisco Lindor is tied for 13th with three.

ED, EDD AND EDDY: Edwin Díaz has recorded 67 saves as a member of the Mets...That places him 10th on the franchise's all-time list...Next up is Neil Allen who recorded 69 as a member of the Mets...He has recorded 176 saves in his career, which places him sixth on the active list...Since arriving in New York, Díaz is 10-14 with 67 saves, a 3.88 ERA (67 earned runs/155.1 innings) with 64 walks and 252 strikeouts...His 252 strikeouts as a reliever in that span is the third-highest total in the majors...Only Josh Hader (286) and Liam Hendriks (284) have struck out more...Additionally, his 252 strikeouts are the 14th most by a reliever in franchise history...Turk Wendell is 13th with 259.

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Defeated the Diamondbacks in Arizona on April 24 after throwing 6.2 innings and surrendering two runs on five hits...Struck out seven and walked only one batter.

WINNING WAYS: New York has won each of Megill's last four starts...That is tied for the longest team winning streak in his outings in his career...New York also won the first four starts of his career (June 23-July 10, 2021).

CONTROL: Megill walked zero batters in each of his first two starts and has yet to issue more than two free passes in a game this year...He has walked just three hitters and has whiffed 22 in his first four starts of the season...In his career, Megill has walked just 30 in 112.2 innings and has racked up 121 strikeouts.

100 KLUB: Megill punched out César Hernández looking, his first batter faced, on April 7 at Washington for the 100th strikeout of his career...He is the seventh Mets hurler who began his career with New York to record 100 or more strikeouts in his first 19 career starts with the club...He is the first to accomplish the feat since Steven Matz in 2016.

2021 RECAP: Had his contract selected on June 23 and remained with the Mets for the rest of the season...Went 4-6 in 18 starts with a 4.52 ERA (45 earned runs/89.2 innings), 27 walks and 99 strikeouts...Among pitchers to make their first 18 career starts with the Mets, his 99 punchouts rank seventh...Posted a major league-leading 1.04 ERA in July (min. 25.0 IP), one of three pitchers in Mets history to post an ERA of 1.04 or lower in the month of July...Held right-handed batters to a .200 average, the 10th-best mark in the National League (min. 175 batters faced)...His .244 opponents' OBP against righties ranked fourth in the NL.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Megill made his major league debut when he earned the start on June 23, 2021 vs. Atlanta...He allowed two runs on three hits (one home run) and two walks with four strikeouts through 4.1 innings...He recorded his first big league punchout when William Contreras struck out on a foul tip in the second frame...Megill earned his first major league win on July 23, 2021 vs. Toronto after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings in his sixth big league start and his second straight quality start.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut last season...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).
