DETROIT TIGERS (68-51) AT CHICAGO WHITE SOX (43-75)

WHAT A DIFFERENCE A YEAR MAKES: The Detroit Tigers arrive in Chicago to begin a three-game series with the White Sox tonight at Rate Field, the first stop of a two-city, seven-game road trip that ends with four games in Minnesota ... the Tigers have won eight of their last 13 games after dropping 12 of their previous 13 games into this current 13-game stretch ... starting tonight, the Tigers are scheduled to play 13 of their next 19 games on the road.

- One year ago today, the Tigers woke up with a 55-63 record, in fourth place and 13.5-games out of first place in the A.L. Central, and 10.0 games out of a 2024 playoff spot ... facing astronomically low post-season odds, the Tigers went on to win 31 of their next 41 games and clinch a spot in the playoffs via a Wild Card berth.
- In the past calendar year beginning August 11, the Tigers have gone 99-64 (.607), tied with the Brewers for the best record in all of baseball, and by far the best record in the American League in this past year, 6.0-games up on the Houston Astros (93-70).
- The Tigers have 19 games remaining in August, 16 of them against teams that have a record of below .500 ... the Tigers last homestand started a stretch during which they play 13-straight games against sub-.500 teams before hosting the Astros for three games from August 18-20.

THERE ARE ONLY TWO: Riley Greene joins the Angels' Taylor Ward as the only two players in all of baseball to reach 23 doubles, 27 homers and 87 RBI this season (Greene's .821 OPS is 24 points higher than Ward's) ... Greene has those totals through 119 team games, which puts him on pace for 31 doubles, 37 homers and 118 RBI in a 162-game season, shattering previous career bests.

A RETURN ENGAGEMENT: The Tigers this week play in both Chicago and Minnesota for the second time this season, their first return to any ballpark this season ... the Tigers have made it into August on the calendar without playing a second series in a road ballpark within a season for the first time in franchise history (non-work stoppage edition).

WHERE THINGS STAND: The Tigers have a 6.0-game lead in the A.L. Central over Cleveland, tied for the largest lead in any of the divisions this year, but Detroit's edge is down from the 11.5-game lead the club had on the Twins and the 12.0-game lead on the Guardians/Royals at the All-Star Break.

- The Tigers, with their 99-64 record in the past calendar year, boast a 13.0-game lead on the Cleveland Guardians (85-76), the next-best club within the American League Central in this span ... the Guardians are followed by the Royals (79-83, -19.5), Twins (73-90, -26.0) and White Sox (56-105, -42.0).

21 HOME-RUN SALUTE: Kerry Carpenter yesterday set a new single-season best with his 21st homer, surpassing his 20 from 2023, and boasts a .598 slugging percentage vs. right-handed pitching since the start of the 2024 campaign, the third-highest mark in all of baseball behind only Shohei Ohtani (.687) and Aaron Judge (.679) ... minimum 500 plate appearances vs. righthanders.

- Carpenter has seven hits against the White Sox this season, six of which have gone for home runs ... his eight-career home runs vs. Chicago are his most against any opponent, one more than his seven vs. Minnesota, where the Tigers go next.

GRAND CENTRAL: The Tigers are scheduled to play 13 of their final 19 games this month against American League Central competition ... Detroit has a 19-11 record within its division this season, the third-best intradivision mark in the majors.

THE WIN-DY CITY: The Tigers enter tonight having won 12 of their last 14 games here at Rate Field, their best-ever 14-game stretch in this ballpark ... only one other time have the Tigers won 12 of 14 games against the White Sox in Chicago (May 1, 1979-September 2, 1981 at Comiskey Park).

- The Tigers have won 17 of their last 22 games overall against the White Sox dating back to last season, with two of those losses taking place in the final two days of the 2024 campaign in the days after Detroit had clinched its playoff spot.
- The Tigers went a perfect 7-0 here last year, the first time the Tigers played and won all seven or more games in an opposing park since going a perfect 9-0 at Minnesota in 2016.

THIS IS SOME HIGH-END TORK: Spencer Torkelson Friday night crushed his 25th homer of the season, reaching the mark for the second time in the last three years (career-best 31 homers in 2023) ... Torkelson is the first Tiger to record a pair of 25-homer seasons in a three-year span since Miguel Cabrera and Victor Martinez both reached the mark in 2014 and 2016.

- Torkelson's 25 homers are one shy of Pete Alonso for the most by any player in baseball that primarily plays first base this year, while Torkelson's 48 extra-base hits are the most among first basemen in the American League, trailing only Alonso (56) for most in the majors.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?: The Tigers have the second-best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +77 overall run differential, trailing the Red Sox (+84) and Yankees (+81) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +96 edge on the second-place Guardians (-19), are +96 on the third-place Royals (-19) and are +101 on the fourth-place Twins (-24).

AND FINALLY: The Tigers are 30-30 since the beginning of June, tied with the Guardians (30-30) for the best record in the A.L. Central starting June 1.

- Made a career-best 26 starts in 2019, his first season in the big leagues...went 20-19 with a 4.21 ERA over 61 games (60 starts) in three seasons with the Padres.
