TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 2 (1-0) of a 4-game series vs **Jon Erik Alvarez'** Marlins and the fifth game (4-0) of the Redlegs' first road trip of 2026, a 7-game jaunt that includes a 3-game weekend sweep at **Texas**.

- The Reds opened the season with 3-3 homestand vs the **Red Sox** (2-1) and **Pirates** (1-2).
- Following Thu's game at **Mia**, the Reds will return to **Great American Ball Park** for a 6-game homestand vs the **Angels** and **Giants**.

WINCINNATI: At 7-3, the Reds are off to their best start since the 2021 club also went 7-3 out of the gates...a win tonight would equal the 2011 team for the franchise's best start after 11 games (.727) in the **GABP** era (since 2003).

WINS OVER RUNS: The Reds have won 7 of their first 10 games despite ranking last in the majors with 28 runs scored...this is the first Cin team in *any* 10 game span to score 28 or fewer runs and win 7 times since the 1980 club did it from 8/10-8/20 (10 games, 7 wins, 28 runs).

- The last Major League team to win 7 times in any 10-game span while scoring 28 runs or fewer was the 2024 **Rays** (7w/28r, 9/12-9/22).
- Each of Cin's 7 wins this season have come in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the most such wins in the majors.
- The 1918 Reds club was the last to have all of their first 7 wins decided by 2 runs or fewer.
- The 2025 Reds went 35-38 in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the ninth-worst record in the majors.

HEN FRUIT: The Reds have blanked opponents 3 times already over the season's first 10 games...it marks the first time Cin pitchers have collected 3 shutouts over *any* 10-game span since April of last year.

- The 2017 and 1980 Reds were the only others to open the season's first 10 games with 3 shutouts (since 1900).

CLEAN LIVIN': The Reds have yet to commit an error this season (10g), their longest streak of errorless games to begin a season since 1900 and the third-longest streak by *any* Major League team to begin a season (since 1900) behind the 2022 **Padres** (16g) and, oddly, the 2022 **Royals** (11g).

- The Redlegs had 7 errors after 10 games in 2025, and 8 after 10g in '24.

FRANCONA TIES ALSTON: With last night's 2-0 win at **Mia**, Reds manager **Terry Francona** tied **Hall of Famer Walter Alston** for 11th on the all-time wins list with 2,040...**Francona** is now 86 victories away from tying **Hall of Famer Joe McCarthy** (2,126) for 10th.

EL CABALLO DE HIERRO: SS **Ely De La Cruz** has appeared in each of Cin's last **228 games**, beginning 7/30/24...it's the fifth-longest consecutive games played streak by a Red since 1970 (see box below).

3-4-5: Reds' 3,4,5 batters have combined to slash .284/.357/.509 in the first 10 games of the 2026 season (33-for-116, 7 HR, 19 RBI, 46 times on base).

- The rest of the batting order has combined for a .171/.255/.240 slash (37-for-217, 3 HR, 8 RBI, 62 times on base).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are 138-106 all-time vs the **Marlins**, including 23-23 here at **loanDepot park** and 44-29 at **Great American Ball Park**.

- The **Marlins** (4-3) won the 2025 season series vs **Cin**...it marked **Mia's** first season series victory over the **Reds** since 2018 (5-2).
- The 2 teams split the 4-game set at **GABP** from 7/7-7/10, 2025.
- Cin went 1-2 at **Mia** from 4/21-4/23, 2025 when the roof was open for all 3 games at **loanDepot park**...it marked the Reds' first series loss to the **Marlins** since 8/7-8/9, 2023 at **GABP** (1-2).
- The Reds have gone 27-15 over the last 8 seasons (6-1 in 2019, 0-0 in 2020, 5-2 in 2021, 4-3 in 2022, 3-3 in 2023, 5-2 in 2024, 3-4 in 2025, 1-0 in 2026) following 4 straight season series losses to the **Marlins**.

SWITCH BLADE: SS **Ely De La Cruz** homered in each of the Reds' previous 6 regular-season series dating back to 9/19/25 vs **Chc**...he's the first switch hitter in Reds history to homer in at least 6 consecutive regular-season series.

- The last Red prior to **Ely** to homer in 6 straight series was **INF Christian Encarnacion-Strand** (9/15/23-3/31/24).
- De La Cruz** has homered twice in 17 at-bats vs **LHP** this season...in 2025, he hit 5 HR in 199 at-bats vs **lefties**.

OFF THE BENCH: Reds substitutes have combined to bat .333 with a .924 OPS over the season's first 9 games (6-for-18, 1hr, 3rbi, 5k).

- In 2025, Reds in-game replacements batted .180 (28th in the majors), with a .266 OBP (28th), a .212 SLG (29th), and a .478 OPS (29th)...Cin was the only team in the majors last year not to produce a HR off the bench.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: **1b Sal Stewart** on 3/30 was named National League Player of the Week for 3/25-3/29 to become the 10th Reds rookie to win NL Player of the Week honors since the award's inception in 1973 (last: **Rece Hinds**, 7/8-7/14, 2024).

- Stewart** became the fifth Red to win the award in the season's first week (others: **Kal Daniels** 1988, **Eddie Milner** 1984, **Johnny Bench** 1983, **Dave Collins** 1980).
- In the 3 games vs **Bos**, he went 7-for-10 with a home run, 3 doubles, 3 walks, and 5 hard-hit balls (exit velo of +95mph).

NAPOLI AT FIRST: Assistant Bench Coach **Mike Napoli** will fill in as Cin's first base coach while **Collin Cowgill** recovers from knee surgery.

LAST TIME OUT: Was outdueled by Paul Skenes in the 8-3 loss on 4/1 vs Pit (5.2ip, 5h, 4r/4er, 3bb, 5k, 1hr, 88 TP)...was his first loss of the 2026 season.

- After giving up a 1st-inning, 3-run homer to Oneil Cruz, went on to retire 14 of his next 17 batters.
- Had a chance for a quality start when he retired the first 2 batters he faced in the 6th inning, but was removed when the next 2 batters reached (single, walk).

OPENING DAY, 3/26 vs BOS: Did not factor in the decision in the 3-0 loss vs Bos on Opening Day (3/26)...threw 6.0 shutout innings (7h, 1bb, 4k, 83 TP).

- Was his first Opening Day start, becoming the 19th different left-handed pitcher to start for the Reds in a season opener since the club joined the National League in 1890 (last: Mike Remlinger, 1998).
- Became the ninth Reds starter since 1890 to pitch at least 6.0 scoreless innings in a season opener (last: Frankie Montas, 2024)...is the second Cin lefthander to ever accomplish the feat (also: Johnny Vander Meer, 1943).
- Snapped the Reds' streak of 27 consecutive season openers started by a right-handed pitcher...was the longest such run in franchise history.
- At 26 years, 298 days old, became the youngest left-handed pitcher to start a Reds' season opener since Don Gullett (24-091) in 1975.
- Reds manager Terry Francona on 3/8 announced Abbott as the Opening Day starter.

SPRING RECAP: Went 1-3 with a 11.72 ERA in 6 Cactus League starts (17.2ip, 28h, 25r/23er, 8bb, 22k, 6hr, 362 TP).

- His final Cactus League tuneup came on 3/21 in the 11-7 win over the White Sox in Goodyear (4.2ip, 4h, 5r/3er, 1bb, 5k, 1hr, 84 TP).

AWARD TOUR: Following the 2025 season, received from the local chapter of the Baseball Writers' Association of America the 2025 Ernie Lombardi Award as the Reds' Most Valuable Player and the Johnny Vander Meer Award as the Reds' Most Outstanding Pitcher.

- Became the sixth Reds pitcher since the Vander Meer Award was established in 1969 to receive both awards in the same season.
- Became the seventh Reds pitcher (eighth occurrence) to be named team MVP.

2025 ALL-STAR: Was named to the National League All-Star team as a replacement for LAD's Yoshinobu Yamamoto...was his first career All-Star selection..

- Pitched a perfect 6th inning in the National League's 7-6 victory (Jazz Chisholm Jr lineout, Riley Greene flyout, Randy Arozarena groundout; 13 total pitches).

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision in Fri's 5-3 win at Tex (5.0ip, 6h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 5k, 0hr, 87TP).

- After allowing a pair of 2-out runs and 4 hits in the 2nd inning, proceeded to scatter 2 hits over his final 3.1 innings.
- Was struck in the right leg on a 107mph Corey Seager grounder in the 5th inning but recovered to make an outstanding sliding play to throw out Seager at first...remained in the game.

3/28 vs BOS: Did not factor in the decision in the 11-inning 6-5 win vs Bos on 3/28 (4.0ip, 5h, 3r/3er, 2bb, 5k, 1hr, 74 TP).

- Left the game after 4 innings with the Reds leading 4-3.
- Was originally slated to start the season's third game but was moved up in the rotation when Nick Lodolo was placed on the injured list.

2026 SPRING TRAINING: Went 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA in 5 spring starts (16.2ip, 11r/10er, 8bb, 12k, 292 TP).

- In his final Spring Training start on 3/23 vs the Brewers in Milwaukee, allowed 6 runs (5er) on 6 hits over 4.0 innings (1bb, 3k, 1hr, 78TP).

ACCOLADES: Was recognized as a finalist for the 2025 All-MLB Team and received votes in 2025 for National League Cy Young Award and Rawlings Gold Glove Award.

HE EARNED IT: His 3.41 ERA through his first 77 career starts is the lowest by a Reds starting pitcher in that span since RHP Mario Soto (3.27, 1977-82).

PERSONAL: Graduated from Halifax County High School (South Boston, VA), the same school attended by All Elite Wrestling champion "Hangman" Adam Page and Major League pitcher Jeremy Jeffress...was named 2017 Gatorade Virginia Player of the Year...was a 4-year member of the Halifax swim team...at the University of Virginia became only the second pitcher in school history to record at least 300 strikeouts.
