TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners finish their first road trip of 2026 with the last of 3 games against the Texas Rangers (0-2)...Seattle also completed a 3-game series against the Los Angeles Angels (1-2) on the trip... following tomorrow's off-day Seattle will host the Houston Astros (4 G, 4/10-13)...today's game will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith**, **Angie Mentink** and Mariners Hall of Famer **Jay Buhner** on the call, with **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped yesterday's game against the Rangers by a 3-2 score...each of the Mariners last 4 games have been decided by 1 run and 7 of their 8 losses this season have been by 2 runs-or-fewer...since 2021, Seattle holds a 151-122 (.553) record in 1-run games.

- **Long Division** - The Mariners today are playing their sixth of 10 consecutive divisional games...from April 3-22, Seattle is playing an AL West Division opponent in 16 of 19 games.
- **Friday Night Fever** - In addition to being available on **Mariners TV**, Friday's game will also be available to be watched by fans in the Seattle area for free on **KING 5** as well as various affiliate stations in the Pacific Northwest...Friday's game is the first of 10 Friday home games that will be televised on KING 5.
- **The Fireman** - **Matt Brash** is 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER, 4.0 IP) in 4 games this season...last season he set the Mariners record, beginning his season with 19 consecutive scoreless appearances.

HERE FOR A GOOD TIME...the Mariners pitching staff owns a 2.73 ERA (33 ER, 108.2 IP), ranking 4th in the big leagues behind the Braves (2.04), Yankees (2.42), and Mets (2.54)...the Mariners pitching staff has held opponents to a .208 batting average...Seattle's 0.94 WHIP **leads the American League**, ranking 2nd in MLB to Atlanta (0.90)...the Mariners also **lead the Majors** in strikeout-to-walk ratio (5.00) and fewest walks-per-9 innings (1.90) in the early-going...Seattle ranks T-3rd in MLB in fewest hits-per-9 innings (6.5).

EASY COME, EASY GO...**Bryan Woo** ranks 3rd in the Majors in WHIP (0.54), while rotation-mate **Emerson Hancock** ranks 4th (0.55)...additionally, Woo ranks 4th in MLB in lowest opponent batting average (.116) through his first 2 starts of 2026.

WRITE THIS DOWN...through his first 2 starts of 2026, **Bryan Woo** has a 1.38 ERA (2 ER, 13.0 IP) with 2 walks, 15 strikeouts and a 0.54 WHIP...since the start of 2025, Woo ranks 6th in the AL in ERA (2.84), 2nd in WHIP (0.90), 2nd in Opp. AVG (.193), 7th in SO/9 (9.60) and 3rd in SO/BB (5.61)...Woo is coming off allowing just 1 hit in 7.0 innings against the Angels in his last outing, his 3rd game with at least 7.0 innings and 1-or-fewer hits allowed, tied for the most in MLB since 2025.

TROUBADOUR...in 10 games to begin his 2026 campaign, **Brendan Donovan** is batting .343 (12x35) with 5 runs, 2 doubles, 3 home runs, 5 RBI, 1 stolen base, a .452 OBP and slugging .657 (1.109 OPS) with a 224 OPS+...Donovan was acquired this offseason in a trade from the St. Louis Cardinals.

ACE IN THE HOLE...Mariners Hall of Famer **Félix Hernández** celebrates his 40th birthday today... Félix surged in Hall of Fame voting in 2026, going from 20.6% in his first year on the ballot in 2025 to 46.1% this year...his 25.56% gain in voting percentage is the largest year-over-year jump since 1967...among MLB pitchers during his peak (2006-15), he led in strikeouts (2,065), IP (2,178.0), and fWAR (50.1).

HE'LL LEAVE YOU WITH A SMILE...**Ichiro Suzuki** is set to be the third Mariners legend to be honored with a statue outside of the ballpark, joining Ken Griffey Jr. and Edgar Martinez...Fans first chance to see the statue is this Friday, April 10...in addition, the first 40,000 fans in attendance at Friday's game will receive a replica of the statue.

CARRYING YOUR LOVE WITH ME...during the Mariners opening homestand, they drew 239,504 total fans as of the morning of April 6, **highest total in the American League** and 4th-highest total in the big leagues so far behind only the Dodgers, Giants, and Padres...an average of 34,214 fans watched the Mariners at T-Mobile Park through 7 games

"THE CAL RALEIGH SHOW" RETURNS..."The Cal Raleigh Show" presented by the Puyallup Tribe returns for a second season on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)**...the show, hosted by Mariners insider **Shannon Drayer**, features in-depth conversations with Mariners star catcher, **Cal Raleigh**...the program will air **every Thursday**, usually at **5:00 p.m. PT**, moving into an earlier slot when the Mariners play in different timezones... 'catch' all of the episodes on SeattleSports.com or on the Seattle Sports app.

MARINERS TV...Mariners TV brings Mariners Baseball to fans across television and streaming services throughout the region...in-market streaming is be available on Mariners.TV for \$99.99/season or \$19.99/month...Mariners TV is available across major providers including XFINITY, DIRECTV, Fubo, Spectrum and more...fans can use the channel finder tool on Mariners.com/Watch to find providers in their area.

UPCOMING HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...the Mariners return to T-Mobile Park on Friday, April 10 for a 4-game set against the Houston Astros...notable events and promotions on the homestand include **Ichiro Replica Statue Night** on Friday, **Humpy Shoulder Plush Night** on Saturday, **Ichiro Statue T-Shirt Day** on Sunday and the first **Value Game** of the season on Monday...tickets and more information can be found at Mariners.com/Tickets.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Brendan Donovan** hit his 2nd leadoff home run of the season last night, also hitting a leadoff homer in his Mariners debut on March 26 vs. Cleveland, but...**DID YOU KNOW?...**that he is the 2nd Mariners player to hit multiple leadoff home runs within his first 10 games with the club, joining Hall of Famer Rickey Henderson?...Henderson hit 3 leadoff homers in his first 7 games: May 21, 2000 vs. Tampa Bay, May 21, 2000 vs. Tampa Bay and May 26, 2000 at Tampa Bay...Henderson holds the MLB record with 81 career leadoff home runs.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - APRIL 8

- **1977** - The Mariners win their first game in franchise history by defeating the California Angels 7-6.
- **1986** - Jim Presley went 3x4 with two home runs and six RBI, including the game-tying, two-run homer in the bottom of the 9th, and the game-winning grand slam in the bottom of the 10th, as the Mariners beat California, 8-4 on Opening Night, in front of 42,112 Kingdome fans.
- **2022** - Mariners agree to a 5-year contract extension with shortstop J.P. Crawford.
- **2022** - Julio Rodríguez makes MLB debut on Opening Day in Minnesota as the Mariners win 2-1 over the Twins.

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 3rd start of the season and 1st against the Rangers...marks his 73rd Major League start, and 8th career start against Texas.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on April 3 at Los Angeles Angels, tossing 6 strikeouts across 7.0 shutout innings while allowing just 1 hit and 1 walk...he threw 87 pitches (57 strikes) in his 2nd start of the season.

WOOOOO...has recorded 3 starts of 7.0+ IP and 1-or-fewer hits allowed since the start of last season, tied for the most such games in MLB during that span (also: Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD).

SO FAR, SO GOOD...currently ranks 3rd in the Majors in WHIP (0.54), while rotation-mate Emerson Hancock ranks 4th (0.55)...additionally, Woo ranks 4th in MLB in lowest opponent batting average (.116) through his first 2 starts of 2026.

WATCH ME WHIP...his 0.97 career WHIP is the lowest in franchise history (min. 400 IP) and is tied for the 2nd-best mark in MLB since 2023 (also: Paul Skenes-PIT, trailing Tarik Skubal-DET, 0.90 WHIP).

QUALITY STUFF...has tossed a quality start in each of his starts this season...threw a quality start in 21 of his 30 starts last season, tied for 4th-most in the Majors that season, trailing only Logan Webb-SF (22), Cristopher Sánchez-PHI (22) and Garrett Crochet-BOS (22)...his 37 total quality starts, are 8th-most in franchise history across a starter's first 72 career starts.

400...recorded his 400th career strikeout on March 28 vs. Cleveland, becoming the 2nd fastest starter to reach 400 strikeouts in franchise history (71 GS), behind only Felix Hernández (70 GS, 405 K).

THE WILD WEST...across 31 career starts against AL West teams, is 13-5 with a 2.95 ERA (56 ER, 170.2 IP) and 180 strikeouts to just 35 walks allowed...went 6-3 with a 2.81 ERA (23 ER and 73.2 IP) and 85 strikeouts across 12 starts against AL West teams in 2025.

DEEP IN THE HEART OF TEXAS...went 2-0 with a 0.47 ERA (1 ER, 19.1 IP) and 24 strikeouts to just 3 walks across 3 starts against Texas last season...has tossed 6.0 innings without an earned run in each of his last two starts vs. the Rangers and has gone 6.0+ IP in each of his last four starts vs. Texas.

DOMINATING THE DAY...is making his first day start of the season...across 14 day games last season, he went 6-5 with a 3.61 ERA (34 ER, 84.2 IP) and 9 strikeouts to 17 walks, throwing 6.0+ innings in all but one of those day starts.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN...making his 2nd road start of the season...has thrown 6.0+ innings in 25 of his 40 career road starts, and ranks T-1st in fewest runs allowed (92), 1st in fewest hits allowed (185), 2nd in fewest walks allowed (50), 5th in ERA (3.59), and 6th in strikeouts (198) among Mariners starters through their first 40 road appearances.

2025 TOTALS...went 15-7 with a 2.94 ERA (61 ER, 186.2 IP), 36 walks, 198 strikeouts and a 0.93 WHIP in 30 starts...held opponents to a .200/.243/.353 slashline last season...finished 5th in 2025 BBWAA Cy Young Award voting.

END OF THE ROAD...finished the 2025 regular season on Sept. 19, 2025 at Houston, throwing 5.0 scoreless innings and allowing 1 hit and 1 walk while striking out 7 batters before exiting with right pectoral inflammation...returned 27 days later to make Postseason debut in ALCS Game 5 vs. Toronto, allowing 1 run (1 ER) in 2.0 innings of relief.

WOO-NDERFUL STREAK...began the 2025 season with 25 consecutive starts of 6.0+ innings and 2-or-fewer walks, the 2nd-longest such streak in MLB history (Cy Young, 30 G, 1905)...his run of 6.0+ inning starts was also the longest to begin a season in Mariners history.

FIRST HALF WARRIOR...threw 6.0+ innings in all 18 starts before the All-Star break, while posting a 2.75 ERA (35 ER, 114.2 IP) with 109 strikeouts and 21 walks...his 2.75 ERA is the 6th-best by a starting pitcher in the first half (min. 15 GS) in franchise history, while his 0.93 WHIP ranks 3rd-best (1st: Logan Gilbert, 0.87 in 2024)...is 12-6 with a career 2.84 (61 ER, 193.1 IP) and 181 strikeouts across 34 starts pre All-Star Break.

AMONG THE BEST...recorded back-to-back seasons of a sub-3.00 ERA and a sub-1.00 WHIP (2024-25)...is the only starting pitcher in Mariners history with multiple such seasons...is 1 of 4 pitchers in MLB to have a sub-3.00 ERA and a sub-1.00 WHIP since 2024, joining Zack Wheeler-PHI, Tarik Skubal-DET and Paul Skenes-PIT (min. 300.0 IP)...his 2.92 ERA over that span is 7th best in MLB.

EXCLUSIVE COMPANY...was 1 of 6 pitchers in the Majors last season with 175+ strikeouts and 40-or-fewer walks, joining Tarik Skubal-DET, Sonny Gray-STL, Zack Wheeler-PHI, Joe Ryan-MIN, Jacob deGrom-TEX.
