**AUGUST, HELLO:** Winners of four straight games and tied with Toronto for the best record in the American League, the Detroit Tigers tonight play the first of three games at the Philadelphia Phillies, the lone brief respite from Detroit's stretch of 13-of-16 games at Comerica Park that started this past week with a winning 4-3 homestand vs. Toronto (1-3) and Arizona (3-0).

- In the past calendar year starting last August 1, the Tigers have posted a 98-65 (.601) record in 163 games, good for the best record in the American League and tied with the Los Angeles Dodgers (also 98-65) for the best record in all of baseball ... the Tigers are 3.0 games up on the Houston Astros (95-68), the next-best A.L. club in this past calendar year.
- The Tigers have awoken on August 1 leading the A.L. Central (+9.0 games) for the first time since 2014 (+4.0 games on Kansas City) but this year have a 9.0-game lead or better in their division or league on August 1 for just the second time in the 125-season history of the franchise, joining the 1984 club that had a 12.0-game lead in the A.L. East on August 1.
- The Tigers have a 64-46 record through 110 games this season, their best mark since going 65-45 in 2013 ... overall, the Tigers have now won 64 of their first 110 games only six times in the last 42 seasons (2025, 2013, 2006, 1988, 1987 and 1984).
- After this three-game set in the City of Brotherly Love, the Tigers return to Comerica Park on Monday to begin a six-game homestand vs. the Twins (three games) and Angels (three games).

**A TOUGH MONTH THAT WASN'T SO ROUGH:** The Tigers just wrapped up a month of July that saw them go 11-14, their first losing month of the 2025 season and first overall since going 10-17 in June 2024 ... nevertheless, the Tigers saw their division lead drop by only 2.5 games as they began the month up 11.5 games in the division and today lead by 9.0 games.

- The Tigers won 11 games in July despite losing 12 of 13 games during a stretch last month ... the Tigers reached double digit victories despite enduring a 1-12 stretch entirely within the same calendar month for the first time since August of 1989.
- In August, the Tigers play six games against clubs with winning records (this weekend and August 18-20 at home vs. Houston) while Detroit plays 22 games vs. current sub-.500 teams.

**CASH IS GREENE:** Riley Greene is the first Tigers left-handed hitter with 26 homers by the end of July in 63 years since Norm Cash had 30 homers through the end of July in 1962 ... Greene and Cash, who also had 27 homers thru the end of July in 1961, are the lone left-handed batters in Tigers franchise history with 26 homers by the end of July in any single season.

- With 84 RBI, Greene is the first Tiger to enter the month of August with at least 84 RBI since Miguel Cabrera had 99 RBI at the end of July in 2013 and the first Tiger to enter August with at least 26 homers since J.D. Martinez had 28 at the end of July 2015.
- Greene is the first Tigers left-handed hitter with 84 RBI by the end of July since Rusty Staub had 86 RBI through July 31, 1978 ... only seven left-handed hitters in Tigers history have reached 84 RBI by the end of July: Riley Greene (2025), Rusty Staub (1978), Norm Cash (1961), Vic Wertz (1949 and 1950), Goose Goslin (1936), Bobby Veach (1921) and Ty Cobb (1911).
- Greene's 26 homers are already the most by a Tigers left-handed hitter in a single season since Prince Fielder had 30 in 2012.

**WHEN LEFT IS RIGHT:** Detroit boasts a 20-10 (.667) record vs. lefty starters this year, tied with/percentage points ahead of Milwaukee (21-11, .656) for the best mark against lefties in the majors.

- Collectively, the Tigers have a .773 OPS vs. left-handed pitching this season, the third-highest mark in all of baseball behind only the Yankees (.781) and Houston (.774).
- Individually, the Tigers have six players with an OPS greater than .800 vs. left-handed pitchers: Spencer Torkelson (1.001), Wenceel Pérez (.977), Zach McKinstry (.927), Dillon Dingler (.904), Jahmai Jones (.868) and Gleyber Torres (.852), not to mention Andy Ibáñez (.782) and Javier Báez (.777) are on the outside looking in to make it eight players with excellent OPS' vs. lefties.
- Spencer Torkelson ranks sixth in the A.L. with a 1.001 OPS vs. southpaws (among qualifiers).

**GRAND CENTRAL:** Despite angst, the Tigers maintain a 9.0-game lead in the A.L. Central, the largest lead within any of the six divisions in baseball, double the next-largest division lead in baseball and tied with Toronto for the best record in the American League.

**TELL IT TO THE JUDGE:** Riley Greene joins New York's Aaron Judge as the only two players in all of baseball to reach 23 doubles, 26 homers and 84 RBI this season ... Greene has those exact totals through 110 team games, which puts him on pace for 34 doubles, 38 homers and 124 RBI in a 162-game season, shattering previous career bests.

**THIS DIFFERENCE ISN'T NEGLIGIBLE:** The Tigers are tied for the best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +81 overall run differential, trailing only the Yankees (+99) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +110 edge on the second-place Guardians (-29), are +99 on the third-place Royals (-18) and are +114 on the fourth-place Twins (-33).

**AND FINALLY:** With 24 RBI in May, 23 in June and 21 in July, Riley Greene is the first Tiger to exceed 20 RBI in three-straight months in the same season since Miguel Cabrera in April/May/June 2013.

- Earned his sixth win of the season last time out, tossing six scoreless innings against Toronto...allowed five hits and one walk compared to seven strikeouts, marking his sixth consecutive outing with at least six strikeouts.
- Retired the final seven batters against Washington on July 2 via strikeout...finished the game with nine punchouts over five innings.
- Had four straight quality starts from May 22 - June 8, going 3-1 with a 1.46 ERA (4ER/24.2IP) over that span...came one out shy of a quality start on May 16 against Toronto, allowing two earned runs over 5.2 frames.
- Struck out José Ramírez to end the first inning on May 22 for his 1,000th career strikeout, becoming the 567th player in MLB history to record 1,000 strikeouts.
- Lost a career-high five straight games from April 15 - May 10 this year.
- Flaherty returned to the Tigers this offseason by signing a two-year contract...was with Detroit to start last season before being sent to the Los Angeles Dodgers for catcher Thayron Liranzo and infielder Trey Sweeney on July 30.
- Won the World Series with the Dodgers in 2024...went 1-2 with a 7.36 ERA in five postseason starts and started the final game of the World Series.

- Earned 20 saves with the Nationals this season prior to the trade, sixth-most in the N.L. at the time...went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (19 ER/39.0 IP) in 40 relief outings, including 34 games finished for Washington.
- Named to the National League All-Star team last year, a season in which he collected a career-high 38 saves, second-most in the N.L., with a 3.68 ERA (26 ER/36.2 IP) in 65 relief appearances...the 2024 campaign marked his fourth in a row with 65 or more relief outings.

- Did not allow an earned run in April, going 2-0 over the month...allowed 12 hits and three walks while striking out nine.
- Earned a spot on his first career Opening Day roster in 2025, didn't allow a single earned run over 10.2 innings (nine games) of relief in Spring Training...surrendered seven hits and three walks while striking out nine.
- Appeared in 21 games (three starts) for the Tigers in 2024, posting a 1-1 record with a 1.84 ERA (6ER/29.1IP), six walks and 23 strikeouts...also made 34 appearances with Triple-A Toledo last year, going 1-2 with one save, a 5.17 ERA (27ER/47.0IP) and 53 strikeouts.

- After allowing three earned runs on June 19 against Pittsburgh, threw seven consecutive scoreless outings spanning 9.2 innings from June 22-July 8.
- Has been an "opener" five times this season, totaling 7.1 innings...over that span, has allowed seven hits and five earned runs while striking out nine.
