METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Giants, 13-12, last night...Today, New York concludes a stretch of 16 games in 16 days...They own 9-6 record in that span...Today, the Mets finish a six-game West Coast trip (3-2) against the Rockies (2-1) and Giants (1-1)...The team is off tomorrow and then returns home to Citi Field on Friday for the start of a six-game homestand against the Phillies (three games) and Nationals (three games).

HIT ME: The Mets matched their season-high with 18 hits last night after achieving that feat on Monday night...The Mets recorded 18 or more hits in consecutive games for just the fourth time in franchise history...The team also did so from August 15-16, 2018, June 28-29, 2011 and June 12-13, 1990.

RUNNING ON EMPTY: Including last night, the Mets have scored 12 or more runs in 181 games throughout their franchise history...Last night marked their first loss in such a game...It was the first time a team lost a game after scoring 12 or more runs since August 27, 2021 when the Cubs fell to the White Sox in a 17-13 slugfest...Last night was just the third time in team history that the Mets and their opponent scored at least 12 runs...The previous occurrences were in 1985 when the Mets defeated the Braves, 16-13, in 19 innings on the Fourth of July and in 1963, when the Mets beat the Reds, 13-12, in the second game of a doubleheader on May 12, 1963...*Courtesy Sportsradar.*

NINE IS FINE: New York recorded nine hits in the eighth inning of last night's game...It was just the seventh time in franchise history that the Mets collected nine or more hits in an inning...It was the first time the team lost after collecting nine or more hits in an inning...The last team to lost after collecting nine or more hits in an inning was in 2008, when Texas recorded nine hits in the third inning but fell to the Angels, 15-13...*Courtesy of Elias.*

DAY MAN: New York is 15-7 in day games this season...The team's .682 winning percentage in the sunlight is fourth in the majors and is second in the NL behind the Dodgers (10-4, .714)...The team's 15 wins in the day are the most in the majors...As a team, the Mets are batting .254/.331/.405 in the daylight...The team's .254 average is third as is their .331 OBP...Luis Guillorme ranks second in the majors with a .409 (18-44) batting average in the daytime...Francisco Lindor is hitting .286 (24-84) with 20 runs, five doubles, five home runs, 14 RBI, 13 walks with a .388 OBP and a .524 during the day.

A STARLING IS BORN: Starling Marte is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting .364 (12-33) with seven runs, three doubles, a home run, three RBI and two steals with a .970 OPS in that span...In 17 games this month, Marte is batting .338 (25-74) with 12 runs scored, six doubles, a triple, two home runs and eight RBI with a .347 OBP, a .527 SLG and an .874 OPS.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor collected a season-high six RBI last night...It was one shy from his career-high of seven which he achieved on July 2, 2018 against the Royals...He is batting .333 (9-27) with nine runs, a double, a triple, a home run, 10 RBI, four walks, a steal with a .424 OBP, a .556 SLG and a .980 OPS over his last seven games...He leads the team with 30 runs and is second on the team with 32 RBI.

MAY DAY: As a team, the Mets are batting .270/.326/.413 in 23 games this month...The have scored 121 runs, hit 39 doubles, seven triples, 20 home runs and walked 62 times...They are tied for the major league lead with seven triples, rank second this month in batting average and hits (213) and are third in runs and RBI (116)...The team's .270 batting average is their highest mark in any month since the club hit for a collective .279 average in August 2019...The last time the team had a higher batting average in May was in 2009 when they finished the month batting .280...Overall, the Mets are 14-9 this month.

MAY 12: In 22 games this month, Alonso is batting .311/.376/.589 with 15 runs, four doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, nine walks with a .965 OPS...His 28 hits are tied for third in the National League this month...He is also tied for second with seven home runs and tied for first with 24 RBI...His .589 SLG is fourth, while his .965 OPS is ninth in the NL.

FUGGEDABOUTIT: The Mets have won franchise-record 14 straight games following a loss, surpassing the previous club record of 12 straight wins following a loss during the 1985 season...*Courtesy of Elias.*...Overall, the team is 14-1 in the game following a loss this year...The Mets have lost back-to-back games only once this season (April 10-11).

ON THE RECORD: New York is seeking their 30th win of the season today...New York has posted a 29-16 record through the team's first 45 games...Only the 1986 (32-13), 1972 (32-13) and 1988 (31-14) teams posted a better record through the first 45 games of the season...The 2007 and 1985 teams also went 29-16 through the first 45 games...New York's pitching staff has struck out 419 this season...That is tied for the third-most strikeouts in team history through the first 45 games.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: New York is 16-8 on the road this year...Their .667 road winning percentage is the third-best in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The Mets did not record their 16th win on the road until June 19 in 2021 in their 36th road game (16-20)...New York is batting .269/.338/.405 away from Citi Field...Their .269 road average ranks second in the majors, while their .338 OBP ranks third.

GIANTS-METS NOTES: The Mets have won the season series for the first time since they went 4-3 in 2018...New York is 33-39 at Oracle Park since the ballpark opened in 2010.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: The Mets lead the majors with a .263 batting average and 401 hits and are tied for first with 10 triples...They are second with a .336 OBP, 219 runs and 208 RBI...The team is tied for fifth with 73 doubles...The Mets have outscored their opponents 219-168 this year...Their +51 run differential is fourth in the majors and second in the National League.

RIGHT AWAY: As a team, the Mets are batting .276/.346/.414 against right-handed pitching this year...Their .276 average is the best in The Show...The Guardians are second with a .258 mark...They also top the majors with a .346 OBP and 309 hits against righties.

WAY AWAY, AWAY FROM HERE: Jeff McNeil is batting .346 (27-78) with 13 runs, eight doubles, a triple, two home runs, nine RBI, eight walks with a .414 OBP and a .551 SLG in 22 games on the road this year...His .346 average on the road is second in the NL and sixth in the majors.

MULTIPLICITY: Jeff McNeil has recorded 17 multi-hit games, which is tied for second in the major leagues, while Pete Alonso has collected 15 multi-hit efforts, which is tied for eighth in MLB...McNeil has recorded 127 multi-hit games since he entered the majors on July 24, 2018...That places him tied for 40th all-time by a Met with Ruben Tejada and Ron Hunt...Gary Carter is next with 128 multi-hit games...Pete Alonso has recorded 104 multi-hit efforts in his career, which places him 54th in team history...Jim Hickman is 53rd with 105 games.

CALIFORNIA DREAMIN': J.D. Davis, who was born in Elk Grove, CA, has posted a .410 (16-39) average with four runs, three doubles and four RBI in nine games at Oracle Park...Travis Jankowski has hit .341 (15-44) with nine runs, two doubles, a triple, two home runs, three RBI and four walks in 22 games at the yard...Eduardo Escobar has posted a .343/.388/.500 slashline with 13 runs, nine doubles, a triple, two home runs, 17 RBI and eight walks in 28 career games at Oracle Park...Mark Canha, who was born in San Jose, CA is a .311/.396/.578 hitter with 10 runs, a double, a triple, three homers, 11 RBI and seven walks in 14 games at the home of the Giants.

LET'S GO STREAKING!: Brandon Nimmo is on an 12-game road hitting streak...He is batting .362 (17-47) with nine runs, two doubles, six RBI, six walks with a .439 OBP and an .843 OPS in the span that dates to April 27...He is on an eight-game hitting streak, batting .303 (10-33) with a .342 OBP in that span...His .322 road batting average ranks 13th in the majors and sixth in National League.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has safely hit in 19 of his last 20 games, batting .333/.407/.436 in that span with 15 runs, four doubles, two triples, nine RBI, nine walks with an .842 OPS...He has reached base safely in 36 of his 40 games this year...He is 12th in the majors and fifth in the Senior Circuit with a .391 OBP...Overall, Nimmo is batting .295 with 27 runs, seven doubles, three triples, three home runs, 16 RBI, 22 walks with a .389 OBP, a .443 SLG and an .832 OPS...He has posted a 2.0 fWAR this year, which is 12th in the majors and sixth in the National League.

THIS IS 40: Pete Alonso is second in the majors and leads the National League with 41 RBI in 45 games this year...He is just the third Met to ever drive in at least 40 runs before Memorial Day...His total matches Robin Ventura, who drove in 41 in 50 games in 1999...The franchise record in 44 before the holiday, set by Bernard Gilkey in 1996 (in 47 games).

IRON PETE: Pete Alonso has played 415 games of a possible 429 games (97 percent) since he joined the major leagues in 2019...Alonso has played in all 45 games this season...He missed one game his rookie season in 2019, three games in 2020 and 10 games when he was on IL in 2021...His 415 games since he made his big league debut ranks fifth in the majors.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: The Mets have completed 13 series this season...They have won 11 of those series, lost one and split one...The Mets did not lose any of their first 10 series...It was the longest span the Mets have gone into a season without losing a series, surpassing the 1998 Mets, who did not lose any of their first eight series.

EARLY EDITION: The Mets own a season-high 8.0-game lead in the division...It is their largest division lead since they were 9.5 games ahead on September 27, 2015...It's the earliest the Mets have held an 8.0 game lead in the division...The previous record was June 5, 1986 when the Mets were 34-14 and held an 8.5 game lead in the NL East...The Mets are the 10th team (17th occurrence) to ever have an 8.0 game lead or larger after 43 games.

THE GUILLORME CHEF: Over his last 13 games, Luis Guillorme is batting .424 (14-33) with four runs, a double, a home run, two RBI, a walk, a steal with a .441 OBP and a .987 OPS...Overall in 28 games this season, Guillorme is batting .333/.405/.439 with 10 runs, four doubles, a home run, three RBI, eight walks and a steal...As a starter, he is batting .344/.420/.459 with nine runs, doubles, three RBI, eight walks and a steal...He has recorded a hit in each of his last five starts, batting .529 (9-17) in that span with two runs, a double, an RBI and a steal...The Mets are 13-6 when Guillorme starts.

SZAPUCKI NEWS & NOTES

SEASON DEBUT: Szapucki was recalled from Triple-A prior to today's contest...Will be the first start of his major league career.

ON THE FARM: Has gone 0-3 with a 2.86 ERA (seven earned runs/22.0 innings) in seven starts for Triple-A Syracuse this season before his promotion to New York...Has issued nine walks against a team-high 30 strikeouts...His 30 punchouts rank 10th-most among Mets minor leaguers... Made his most recent start on May 20 at Buffalo where he struck out one batter in a pre-planned outing of 1.0 inning.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: Made his major league debut on June 30, 2021 at Atlanta, entering in relief in the fourth inning...Allowed six runs on seven hits (two home runs) and three walks with four strikeouts through 3.2 innings of work...Struck out LHP Max Fried looking for his first big league punchout to open the fifth inning.

2021 RECAP: Appeared in 10 games (nine starts) for Triple-A Syracuse, going 0-4 and posting a 4.10 ERA (19 earned runs/41.2 innings) with 28 walks and 41 strikeouts...Was recalled by the Mets on May 27, but was optioned on May 28 without making an appearance...Was recalled again on June 29 before making his major league debut on June 30...Underwent left Ulnar nerve transposition surgery on July 13 at the Hospital for Special Surgery, performed by Mets Medical Director Dr. David Altchek...Was placed on the 60-Day Injured List on September 17, 2021 to recover from the procedure.

MEET THE MET: Szapucki was selected by the New York Mets in the fifth round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft...Initially committed to the University of Florida before signing with the Mets...He grew up two hours South of Citi Field in Toms River, NJ before moving to Florida at 10 years old.
