TODAY’S STARTERS: LHP NOAH CAMERON (9-8, 3.93) vs. LHP PAYTON TOLLE (9-6, 3.15)

YESTERDAY AT FENWAY: The Royals suffered a 5-1 loss to the Red Sox yesterday, going 0-for-7 in scoring situations.

- + **Carter Jensen** tied the game in the 6th inning with a solo home run that wrapped around Pesky’s Pole to mark his 24th of the season, matching **Bob Hamelin** (1994) for the Royals single-season rookie record.
- + **Randy Dobnak** exited after 5.2 innings in a 1-1 tie, but **Anthony Gose** yielded a 2-run double that plated a pair of inherited runners, charging 3 total runs to Dobnak’s line.

WHERE RUBBER MEETS THE ROAD: After splitting the 1st 2 games of this series, the Royals will play their 14th rubber game of the season today vs. the Red Sox.

- + The Royals 13 series-deciding games entering today are the fewest in the Majors, 1 fewer than the Marlins (14).
- + The Royals are 5-8 in rubber games but have won their last 2, on Aug. 16 in Anaheim and Aug. 27 in Toronto.
- + The Royals are 29-29 in rubber games vs. the Red Sox but have lost each of their last 4 since their last win on June 20, 2021 in Kansas City...their last series-deciding victory in Boston was nine years ago, on July 30, 2017.

WHAT’S AT STAKE: The Royals can clinch the series with a victory today...it would be their 1st series win since Aug. 28-30 in Cleveland and would snap a 3-series losing streak to the Marlins, Blue Jays and Diamondbacks.

- + A win today would mark their Royals 1st series victory in Boston since 2017 and would snap a run of 7 consecutive series losses here, during which they’re 6-17 (.261).
- + A win today would mark the Royals 4th consecutive road series victory, a streak that began in Anaheim from Aug. 14-16 and continued in Toronto and Cleveland...they have not won 4 straight road series in nine years, since 2017.
- + The Royals are 15-4-2 in series when they win the 1st game, as they did here Friday night, and they haven’t lost a series after winning the 1st game since July 7-9 in Queens.

FINAL THOUGHTS: The Royals are 20-27 (.426) this season in series finales, which is tied for the 4th-worst record in MLB.

- + They’ve won 7 of their last 8 finales, including all 3 on the last homestand vs. the Marlins, Blue Jays and D-backs.

SERIES OF EVENTS: The Royals have lost each of their last 3 completed sets on the heels of a 5-series win streak...this marks the first time they’ve lost 3 straight series since June 9-17 vs. Texas and Houston and at Washington...they are 17-26-4 in 47 series, including 8-7-1 since the All-Star break.

STREAKING HAVOC: The Royals are 17 games under .500 (66-83) and 9.0 games out of a Wild Card spot with only 13 games remaining, but they’ve embraced the role of spoiler of late...dating back to the last road trip, 14 of their last 17 games have come against teams currently within 1.5 games of a playoff spot, and they are 7-7 in those 14 games...in fact, 24 of their final 30 games—dating back to Aug. 26—are vs. teams who are within 1.5 games of a playoff spot.

STREAK MODE: The Royals have lost 8 of their last 12 games on the heels of a Major League-best 13-2 run from Aug. 14-29...in 15 games before that, they went 4-11 from July 28-Aug. 12, which followed a 7-3 run out of the All-Star break.

- + Since the start of their series in Anaheim on Aug. 14, the Royals are 17-10 (.630) in 27 games, which is tied with the Yankees for the best record in the American League.

ROAD WORK: The Royals this weekend began their final trip of the season, a 9-game trek to Boston (1-1), Houston and Pittsburgh...they are 27-47 (.365) on the road, but have won 7 of their last 11 road games since Aug. 14, a stretch in which they have allowed 3 runs or fewer in 8 of 11 games.

- + Since their series in Anaheim that started on Aug. 14, the Royals 7-4 road record ranks T-3rd in the Majors and their 3.41 ERA (36 ER in 95.0 IP) during that time ranks 8th.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Royals are batting .209 (19-for-91) with runners in scoring position in 11 games this month, including going 3-for-22 (.136) through the 1st 2 games of this series.

- + The Royals are batting .285 in scoring situations at home this season, 6th best in the Majors...but they’re hitting .197 with runners in scoring position on the road, last in MLB.
- + The Royals are 47-30 (.610) this season when recording at least 2 hits in scoring situations and 19-53 (.264) when they have 0 or 1 hit with runners in scoring position.

CARTER BLANCHE: **Carter Jensen** claimed or tied several records yesterday with his 6th-inning homer that wrapped around Pesky’s Pole and tied the game at 1-1...it was his 24th HR of the season, matching **Bob Hamelin** (1994) for the most in a season by a Royals rookie.

- + Yesterday’s HR was also his 12th straight hit that went for extra bases, breaking a tie with **Hal McRae** (1977) for the Royals all-time record, according to *Elias*...it also broke a tie with **Aaron Judge** (2017) for the longest streak by a rookie in the Expansion Era (since 1961) and broke a tie with **Sean Murphy** (2023) and **Dustin Garneau** (2021) for the longest streak by any catcher in the Expansion Era.
- + Jensen’s streak of 12 straight hits for extra bases is the longest by any player, according to *Elias*, since **Matt Carpenter** had a run of 12 straight extra-base hits in July 2018...the last longer streak went for 13 straight by **Lucas Duda** in August/September 2017...the longest streak in the Expansion Era (since 1961) was 15 by **Brad Fullmer** in 2002.
- + He has reached safely in 16 straight games, during which he’s slashing .317/.432/.800 (19-for-60) with 16 runs, 14 extra-base hits, 14 RBI and 12 walks, for a 1.232 OPS.
- + Carter leads all rookies with 57 extra-base hits and is tied with **Bobby Witt Jr.** (2022) for the Royals rookie record...he’s tied with **Johnny Bench** (1968) for the 4th most XBH by a primary rookie catcher since 1947, trailing **Mike Piazza** (61 in 1993), **Geovany Soto** (60 in 2008) and **Carlton Fisk** (59 in 1972), all of whom won Rookie of the Year.
- + Among 66 American League players with at least 100 hits, Jensen’s pct. of hits for extra bases (50.9%) ranks 1st.
- + Among all rookies, he ranks 1st in XBH (57) and doubles (31), 3rd in RBI (71), 4th in HR (24) and 5th in walks (62).
- + He’s thrown out 18 of 50 would-be basestealers (36.0%), which ranks 1st out of 43 qualified AL catchers.

THAT NO. 1 SPOT: **Carter Jensen** has hit 18 HR from the No. 1 spot in the batting order, matching **Johnny Damon** (1998) and **Alex Gordon** (2011) for the Royals single-season record...of those 18 HR, 17 have come while Jensen was catching, which are by far the most in a single season by any catcher in Major League history, ahead of **Mitch Garver’s** 12 in 2019.

- + Jensen’s 18 HR from the No. 1 spot are the 6th most by a rookie since 1947, trailing **Mike Trout** (30 in 2012), **Nomar Garciaparra** (30 in 1997), **Chris Young** (21 in 2007), **Ellis Burks** (20 in 1987) and **Ronald Acuña Jr.** (19 in 2008).

- + Carter has hit 6 leadoff home runs, already a Royals single-season record and the most leadoff HR by a catcher in any season since at least 1900.

SOUTHPAW STORY: The Royals are 13-30 (.302) in 43 games vs. left-handed starting pitchers, which is the worst mark in the Majors, but they have won 4 of their last 6 games vs. southpaw starters dating back to Aug. 18.

- + Lefty starters own a 3.03 ERA (78 ER in 232.0 IP) vs. KC and have allowed 3 earned runs or fewer in 39 of 43 starts.
- + Royals left-handed batters have hit 18 homers vs. left-handed pitchers, 3rd most in the American League, trailing the Yankees (28) and Athletics (19).

DAILY DOUBLE: The Royals 270 doubles are now tied with these Red Sox for the Major League lead...the Royals are attempting to lead the Majors in doubles for just the sixth time in the 58-year history of the franchise, following 1977 (299), 1978 (305), 1982 (295), 1990 (316) and 1992 (284).

- + The Royals boast an AL-most seven players who have recorded at least 20 doubles this season, led by **Carter Jensen’s** 31 doubles, which rank tied for 4th in the AL and lead all Major League rookies...he’s just 5 doubles shy of the Royals rookie record, set by **Alex Gordon** (36) in 2007.

OUTS FROM THE OUTFIELD: The Royals have 33 outfield assists this season, 2nd most in the Majors to these Red Sox (34) and their most since 2023, when they led the American League and ranked 2nd in the Majors with 37 outfield assists.

VS. RED SOX: With a win today, the Royals would clinch their 1st series victory at Fenway Park since 2017 and would snap a run of 7 consecutive losing series in this ballpark...a win today would also be the Royals 1st series victory vs. the Red Sox since Aug. 4-7, 2022 at Kauffman Stadium, and would snap a run of 8 consecutive series losses.

- + The Royals are 1-4 vs. the Red Sox this season and have already clinched a losing record in the season series for the fourth consecutive year, since their last win in 2022.

NOAH CAMERON is making his career-high 28th start of the season (29th appearance) and the 52nd start of his career in the finale of this 3-game set today at Fenway Park vs. the Red Sox, who he is facing for the first time in his career...he's in his second season in the Majors, after finishing 4th in AL Rookie of the Year voting in 2025.

- + With 1 more win this season, he would become the 17th different left-handed pitcher—and just the seventh this century—to reach the 10-win mark in Royals franchise history and would be the first to do so since **Cole Ragans** (11) in 2024.
- + With his start on July 30 in Minnesota, Cameron became the first Royal to make at least 20 starts in each of his first two career seasons since **Brad Keller** from 2018-19 and the first left hander to do so since **Glendon Rusch** from 1997-98.
- + On Sept. 3, Major League Baseball announced that Noah was named the American League Pitcher of the Month for August, becoming the 11th different Royals pitcher (18th instance) to win the award and the first to do since fellow left hander **Kris Bubic** in May 2025...he went a perfect 4-0 with a 1.87 ERA (7 ER in 33.2 IP) and a .155 opponents' average (18-for-116) in 5 August starts.

LAST TIME OUT: In his start last Monday vs. the Diamondbacks, Cameron did not factor into the decision of the Royals 5-4 loss despite spinning 6.0 shutout frames on just 3 hits and 2 walks with 7 strikeouts...threw a 1-2-3 1st inning before erasing **Nolan Arenado's** leadoff single in the 2nd...struck out the side in the 3rd and worked around a 2-out walk in the 4th...stranded **Tim Tawa's** 1-out single in the 5th and **Geraldo Perdomo's** leadoff walk in the 6th, after which he was lifted for **Nate Pearson** in a scoreless tie.

- + Cameron did not exit with a lead for the first time in a start since July 19 vs. San Diego, snapping a 7-start stretch in which he did so and the Royals went 4-3.
- + The start marked Noah's 4th outing (3 starts, 1 relief appearance) of at least 6.0 scoreless innings since the All-Star break, which is tied with **Reid Detmers** of the Angels and **Grant Holmes** of the Braves for the most in the Majors during that stretch...he had 1 such outing (May 22 vs. Seattle) in 18 starts before the break.
- + Noah recorded at least 7 strikeouts for the 11th time this season—eighth in his last 12 outings—a mark that he reached just seven times as a rookie in 2025.
- + The Diamondbacks fouled off a career-high 27 of his 99 pitches (27.3%), which were the most foul balls yielded by a Royals pitcher in any game this season.

TURNING IT AROUND: Over Noah's last 9 appearances since July 24, he has yielded 11 runs over 59.2 innings (1.66 ERA) on 29 hits (0.77 WHIP) with 53 strikeouts...these last 9 outings come on the heels of a 19-start stretch in which he posted a 5.27 ERA (59 ER in 100.2 innings) and a 1.46 WHIP to begin the year...[according to an article](#) by *MLB.com's Anne Rogers*, Noah revealed that he began calling his own pitches using the PitchCom device in his July 24 game at Detroit, where he tossed 7.0 shutout frames in relief of an opener...he has followed that up with some sensational starts, including on July 30, when he took a no-hit bid into the 7th and then on Aug. 5, when he matched a career high with 9 strikeouts before tossing a 1-hit shutout on Aug. 16 in Anaheim.

- + Across this 9-outing stretch, Cameron has leaned more heavily on his slider, a pitch that he threw just 9.8% of the time over his 1st 19 starts this season, but is now using at an 18.5% rate...opponents are just 4-for-their-last-41 (.098) with 21 strikeouts vs. his slider, which marks a sharp turn from the beginning of the season when opponents slashed .327/.327/.653 (16-for-49) against the pitch.
- + He's allowed 3 hits or fewer in 6 of his last 9 outings, during which opponents are batting .144 (29-for-201) off him, the 2nd-best mark by any qualified pitcher in that span to only American League **Cy Young** candidate **Dylan Cease** (.140)...prior to this 9-game stretch, opponents hit .279 (113-for-405) against him.
- + Since July 24, Cameron leads the American League with 59.2 innings pitched, while ranking 4th with a 1.66 ERA and tied for 10th with 4 wins...his 0.77 WHIP leads the AL and ranks 2nd in the Majors, trailing only Milwaukee's **Logan Henderson**, whose 0.66 WHIP is the best mark in MLB...additionally, his 0.3 HR/9 is tied with **Drew Rasmussen** of the Tampa Bay Rays for the best rate in the Majors.

LIFE ON THE ROAD: The St. Joseph, Mo. native is set to make his 14th road appearance (13th start) of the year today in Boston vs. the Red Sox...the Royals are 7-18 in his 25 career road outings despite him pitching to a 3.19 ERA (54 ER in 152.1 IP) with a 1.03 WHIP, while allowing 2 runs or fewer in 15 of his 25 outings (60.0%)...he's received just 1 run or fewer of support in 11 of his 25 games away from The K...this season, his 3.31 road ERA (30 ER in 81.2 IP) is more than a full run lower than his 4.58 mark (40 ER in 78.2 IP) in 15 starts at Kauffman Stadium.

- + Since the start of last season, Noah's 1.03 road WHIP is the 6th-best mark in the Majors (min. 20 starts), behind **Cam Schlitler** (0.82), **Tarik Skubal** (0.86), **Yoshinobu Yamamoto** (0.88) **Drew Rasmussen** (0.94) and **Shota Imanaga** (1.01).

VS. RED SOX: Noah has yet to face the Red Sox in his career and with the exception of the Royals, they are the lone AL team he has not appeared against...he has made 10 career starts vs. the AL East, 6 of which have come this year, including in his most recent start vs. the division on Aug. 27 at Rogers Centre, where he earned a 13-2 victory after spinning 6.0 innings of 2-run ball...he owns a 5.82 ERA (36 ER in 55.2 IP) against the AL East, and has allowed at least 5 runs in 4 of his last 6 outings vs. the division.

- + Noah has factored into the decision of all 10 of his starts vs. the AL East, going 3-7.
- + Across 6 starts vs. the American League in the 2nd half of the season, Cameron owns a 0.63 ERA (3 ER in 45.0 IP) and a 0.63 WHIP, which is in stark contrast to his 6.23 ERA (15 ER in 21.2 IP) and 1.38 WHIP over 4 outings vs. the National League.

UNCLE CHARLIE: Since making his MLB debut a year ago, Noah has enjoyed a great deal of success with his curveball, holding opposing hitters to a .152/.192/.220 (34-for-223) slashline...the .152 average in that stretch is the best in the American League and 2nd best in the Majors (min. 200 PA), trailing leader **Braxton Ashcraft** (.132).

NEED SOME HELP HERE: In his start last Monday, Noah did not receive any run support for the fourth time this season...despite this, his 4.93 run support average this year ranks 4th best in the AL and 15th in the Majors to Pittsburgh's **Braxton Ashcraft** (6.54).

HIGH QUALITY: Noah has recorded 10 quality starts this year—matching his total from his rookie campaign a year ago—5 of which have come in his last 8 starts, after notching 5 such outings in his 1st 19 starts to begin the season.

GAME OF ADJUSTMENTS: This season, Cameron has been sharp the first time through the batting order, holding opponents to a .174 average (38-for-219)...the second, third and fourth time through the lineup, however, have not been as kind to him, as opponents are slashing .269/.322/.447 (104-for-387) with 38 extra-base hits.

- + Among 74 pitchers who have made at least 25 starts this season, Cameron's .174 batting average the first time through the batting order ranks tied for 9th in the Majors, trailing leaders **Walbert Ureña** and **Jacob Misiorowski** (.151 each).

TUESDAY NIGHT’S STARTER: RHP MICHAEL WACHA (9-8, 3.25)

- + **Michael Wacha** will make his 30th start of the season and the 318th of his career (339th appearance) in Tuesday night’s series opener in Houston.

+ In his most recent start last Tuesday night vs. the Diamondbacks, Wacha did not factor into the decision of a 5-3 Royals loss in 11 innings after tossing 6.0 scoreless innings of 3-hit ball with 4 walks and 4 strikeouts...after a clean 1st inning, he worked through a pair of baserunners in both the 2nd and 3rd to keep Arizona off the board...in the 4th, he surrendered a leadoff walk to **Nolan Arenado**, but got **Tim Tawa** to line into an unassisted double play...after a 5th inning in which he allowed 2 more baserunners, he pitched a spotless 6th, including striking out **Tommy Troy** to end his evening...he was lifted in favor of **Jose Cuas** for the 7th.

+ Last Tuesday night marked his 20th quality start this season, a new career high, topping his previous best of 19 in 2015 with St. Louis...his 20 quality starts lead the AL and rank tied for 2nd in MLB, behind Miami’s **Sandy Alcantara** (21).

+ With his next win, Michael would become the fourth pitcher in franchise history to record at least 10 wins in each of his first three seasons with the organization, according to *Elias*, following Royals Hall of Famer **Mark Gubicza** from 1984-89 (6), left hander **Charlie Leibrandt** from 1984-88 (5) and **Tim Belcher** from 1996-98 (3).
- + In 5 games (3 starts) vs. Houston in his career, Wacha is 2-0 with a 2.55 ERA (7 ER in 24.2 IP) and 23 strikeouts...his last game against the Astros came on May 12, 2025, when he earned the win after he allowed 2 runs on 8 hits and 2 walks in 6.1 innings, with 3 strikeouts as the Royals won 7-5 at Daikin Park.

+ Across 32 games (30 starts) vs. the American League West in his career, Michael is 12-12 with a 4.47 ERA (82 ER in 165.0 IP) and 125 strikeouts...his last game against an AL West foe came against the Athletics on Aug. 17, when he earned the win after allowing 4 runs on 6 hits in 5.0 innings, with 3 strikeouts in the Royals 9-5 victory...since joining Kansas City prior to the 2024 season, he has factored into the decision in all 16 of his starts vs. the division, going 8-8.

+ In 15 starts away from Kauffman Stadium this season, he is 3-5 with a 3.56 ERA (37 ER in 93.2 IP) and 78 strikeouts...his last game on the road came on Aug. 28 at Cleveland, where he earned the win after allowing just 4 hits in 8.0 scoreless innings with a season-high 10 strikeouts in the Royals 3-0 victory.

MANAGER MATT QUATRARO (kwuh-TRAIR-roe)

- + **Matt Quatraro** is in his fourth season as Royals Manager...in January, he agreed to an extension that runs through 2029 and includes a club option for 2030...the option would represent his eighth season, which would mark the 2nd-longest tenure in franchise history, trailing only **Ned Yost’s** 10 seasons as Manager.

+ His 290 wins are 5th most in club history, 10 shy of 300 wins and trails only Yost 746, **Whitey Herzog** 410, **Dick Howser** 404, **Tony Muser** 317 in Royals history.

+ Quatraro led the Royals to back-to-back winning seasons in 2024-25 for the first time since 2013-15...the Royals under Q are the eighth team in the Wild Card Era, according to *Elias*, to have back-to-back winning seasons after a 100-loss campaign.
- + Quatraro led the 2024 Royals to an 86-76 record in his second season as Manager.

+ Q finished runner-up in the 2024 American League Manager of the Year voting.

+ The 2024 Royals were the sixth team in the 162-game Era (since 1961), according to Elias, to have a 30-win improvement from one season to the next (excluding shortened seasons)...they were the third team to make the postseason following a 100-loss season, following the 2017 Minnesota Twins and 2020 Miami Marlins.
