METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Philadelphia Phillies, 6-5, in walkoff fashion yesterday...The Mets have won consecutive series for the first time since they swept both the Angels and the Giants from July 21-27...They won their first one-run game since their 2-1 victory at San Francisco on July 26...The team had lost their previous nine such contests...The Mets are in a stretch of 16 straight games...The team is 5-3 in that span...Tonight, the Mets play their third game of a seven-game homestand (2-0) against the Phillies (2-0) and Marlins (four games).

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME: This week, the U.S. Open begins at the Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in Flushing Meadows, NY...The Mets encourage all fans who attend next week's homestand to utilize mass transportation...Mass transit is the easiest and fastest way to access Citi Field.

ONE OF A KIND: Noal McLean iis the first Met in franchise history to record a win, strikeout at least seven batters, and throw at least 5.0 innings in each of their first two Major League starts...He joins Logan Henderson (MIL) as the only rookies this season to accomplish this in each of their first two Major League starts this season and since 2015 only six players have accomplished this feat (also: Taj Bradley 2023, Nick Kingham 2018, Dinelson Lamet 2017, and Eduardo Rodriguez 2015)...McLean's 15 total strikeouts are the second most in franchise through two games only trailing Matt Harvey's 18 in 2012...Harvey holds the franchise record for strikeouts through three games is 23.

AUGUSTUS BLOOM: The Mets are 9-14 in August...In 22 games this month, the Mets are batting .281/.358/.491 with 43 doubles, one triple, 41 home runs, 137 RBI and 88 walks...They rank first in the majors with an .849 August OPS and pace the NL in home runs during the month.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games against the NL East...They Mets are 5-3 in that span...Overall, they are 21-16 against the division...The Mets are batting .271/.341/.467 against the NL East, while posting a 411 FRA

RISPY BUSINESS: In 23 games in August, the Mets are batting .358 (73-204) with 15 doubles, one triple, 10 home runs, 99 RBI, 34 walks, a .432 OBP, and a .588 SLG with RISP...Their .358 average and .415 OBP tops the majors in August, while their .588 SLG is second.

HOME SWEET HOME: This season, the Mets are 43-24 (.642) in home games... The team is tied for fourth in the NL and tied for fifth in the majors in home winning percentage...Their 3.64 home ERA is the sixth-lowest mark in the NL and the 10th-lowest in the majors...Over their last eight home games, including August 17's game in Williamsport, PA, the Mets are batting .339/.402/.558 with 14 home runs. 20 doubles and 60 RBI.

PHILLY SPECIAL: Including the 2024 NLDS, the Mets have won their nine home games against the Phillies dating back to September 21, 2024...It is the second-longest home winning streak against the Phillies and one shy of tying the franchise record of 10 from June 20, 1984 - August 13, 1985...During that span, the Mets have posted an .839 OPS and have pitched to a 2.30 ERA (21 ER/82.0 IP)... The longest home winning streak for the Mets against the Phillies was 10 games from June 20, 1984 - August 13, 1985.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso recorded a two-run double with the bases loaded in the fifth...His 14 RBI with the bases loaded this season are his secondmost in any season of his career (most: 18, 2022)...His career-high 33 doubles are the fifth-most in the NL and the eighth-most in the majors while his 105 RBI rank second in the NL and third in the majors...His 105 RBI are tied with himself (2022) for the second-most by a Met through the team's first 132 games of a season.

DISGUSTING DIAZ: Last night, Edwin Diaz retired all five batters he faced, including four via the strikeout...His four strikeouts tonight were a season high and were his most in a game since September 22, 2024 vs. Philadelphia...His 76strikeouts this season are the fourth-most among NL relief pitchers...He has pitched to a 0.68 ERA (3 ER/39.2 IP) over his last 39 games...He earned his careerhigh-tying sixth win of the season (also: 2024).

ON THE MARK: Over his last nine games, Mark Vientos has a .382/.436/.941 slashline with five home runs, four doubles and 14 RBI...He is batting .292 (28-103) with 10 runs, eight doubles, six homers, 22 RBI, four walks and an .883 OPS in 26 games following the All-Star break.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stole 109 bases in 123 attempts this year... Their 88.6% success rate is the highest in the majors...The 2024 team stole a total of 106 bases, while the 2023 team stole a total of 118.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is the first primary shortstop in Major League history with five separate 20/20 seasons...His three 20/20 seasons as a Met are the second-most in franchise history behind Darrly Strawberry and Howard Johnson who each had five such seasons.

IT'S A MARTE PARTY: Over his last 22 games dating back to July 3, Starling Marte has a .378/.429/.622 slashline with four home runs, six doubles, seven walks and eight RBI...Marte has hit safely in each of his last nine starts and has a 1.276 OPS during that span.

OUCH: The Mets were hit by a pitch three times tonight for the second time this season (also: 4/27 at WAS)...Mets batters have been hit by a pitch 74 times this season, tied with Los Angeles-AL for the second-most in the majors.

JUAN OF A KIND: Juan Soto has recorded a Major League-leading 107 walks this year...He recorded his sixth season with 100+ walks and became the second Mets player to break the 100 walk barrier...John Olerud recorded 125 walks during the 1999 season.

OVER THE WALL AND ON THE BASEPATHS: Juan Soto has 32 home runs and 21 stolen bases while Francisco Lindor has 25 home runs and 24 stolen bases... The pair joins Carlos Beltrán and David Wright (2007), Howard Johnson, Kevin McReynolds and Darryl Strawberry (1988) and Johnson and Strawberry (1987) as the only pair/trio of Mets teammates to record 20+ home runs and 20+ stolen bases in the same season...Lindor has recorded his fifth 20/20 season which ties Randy Arozarena for the second-most such seasons in the majors since 2018 (most: 7, José Ramírez).

MILITARY SOFTBALL CLASSIC: On Wednesday, the Mets hosted their annual Military Softball Classic, presented by Fiserv...Five teams made up of personnel from across the U.S. Military representing the Army, Air Force, Navy, Marines, and Coast Guard competed in a spirited round-robin tournament.

NIMMO'S 9: Brandon Nimmo will host guests from First Responders Children's Foundation at Citi Field on Wednesday...First Responders Children's Foundation provides financial support to children who have lost a parent in the line of duty as well as families enduring significant financial hardship due to tragic circumstances...They also support, promote, and facilitate educational activities and programs created and operated by first responder organizations whose purpose is to benefit children or the community at large...Brandon will meet with his quests, learn their stories, and distribute Mets swag.

NOLAN MOLEANIC LICHS

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his second consecutive win after tossing 7.0 innings and allowing two earned runs while striking out seven on August 22 at Atlanta...He didn't issue any walks to his 25 batters faced and only surrendered four hits...He has given up four or fewer hits in each of his first two starts.

ONE OF A KIND: He is the first Met in franchise history to record a win, strikeout at least seven batters, and throw at least 5.0 innings in each of their first two Major League starts...He joins Logan Henderson (MIL) as the only rookies this season to accomplish this in each of their first two Major League Starts and since 2015 only six players have accomplished this feat (also: Taj Bradley 2023, Nick Kingham 2018, Dinelson Lamet 2017, and Eduardo Rodriguez 2015) ...McLean's 15 total strikeouts are the second most in franchise history through two games only trailing Matt Harvey's 18 in 2012...Harvey's franchise record for strikeouts through three games is 23.

DAZZLING DEBUT: Made his Major League Debut on August 16 vs. Seattle...Earned his first Major League win after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings and striking out eight...He joins Matt Harvey as the only pitchers in Mets history to earn a win, strike out eight or more batters, and allow zero runs in their Major League Debut...His eight strikeouts are tied for the third-most by a Met in their Major League debut (also: Tom Seaver, Bill Denehy, and Kodai Senga)...The only Mets who have recorded more strikeouts in their Major League debut are Harvey (11) and Collin McHugh (9)...Becomes the second pitcher in franchise history to throw at least 5.0 scoreless innings, allow two or fewer hits and strike out eight or more batters in their Major League debut (also: McHugh)...He became the fourth starter in the majors this season to record eight or more strikeouts in their Major League debut (also: Mick Abel 9, Logan Henderson 9, and Chase Burns).

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: He became the sixth player (fifth pitcher) to make his MLB debut with the Mets this season, joining Hayden Senger, Alex Carrillo, Justin Hagenman, Jonathan Pintaro and Blade Tidwell...He is also the 43rd pitcher the Mets have used this season which is a franchise record topping the previous high of 42 in 2021.

MINOR LEAGUE RECAP: The Mets number three prospect and the number 37 prospect in baseball according to MLBPipeline.com, appeared in 21 games between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse and posted a 2.45 ERA (31 ER/113.2 IP)...He recorded 127 strikeouts over those 113.2 innings, good for a K/9 of 10.06...His 127 strikeouts were the second-most among Mets minor leaguers and the 18th among all minor leaguer players...He has only surrendered two or more earned runs in one of his last 14 appearances.

TWO-WAY COWBOY: The Willow Spring, North Carolina native, was a two-way player during his time at Oklahoma State and during the beginning of his professional career...During his final collegiate season he pitched in 14 games and posted a 3.30 ERA (11 ER/30.0 IP) while batting .250 (31-124) and having a .911 OPS...Overall he finished he career at Oklahoma State with a career .957 OPS and 36 HR...Was originally drafted by Baltimore in the third round of the 2022 draft but decided to return to school and was drafted by the Mets in the third round of the 2023 draft...He hit in his first two professional seasons and overall he finished as a .185 (27-146) hitter with nine home runs and 24 RBI.

SPIN THAT THING: Through his first two starts he has thrown his sweeper 36.3% of the time and his curveball 17.8% of the time...He has generated a 26.3 whiff rate on his sweeper and a 43.8% whiff rate on his curveball...He has picked six of his strikeouts with his curveball...In the minors, he threw his sweeper 28.4% of the time and recorded 51 swings and misses with the pitch...Opposing hitters only hit .186 (17-91) in atbats ending with his sweeper.

LET ME GET A WHIFF: In the minors he had a 12.5% whiff percentage this year...Of his 1,363 pitches, he has generated whiffs at least 20 times with four different pitches in his arsenal...Sweeper (51 pitches), Curveball (30 pitches), sinker (29 pitches), and 4-seam fastball (28 pitches).

CAREER: Overall, in three minor league seasons he has posted a 3.10 ERA (78 ER/226.2 IP) and has recorded 245 strikeouts, good for a K/9 of 9.72In three seasons at Oklahoma State he finished with a 4.55 ERA (29 ER/57.1 IP) and recorded 76 strikeouts good for a K/9 of 11.93.

- Allowed one run over 1.0 inning and earned a hold on August 26 vs. Philadelphia (1.0 IP, 3 H, ER)...Has allowed at least three hits in two of his last three outings in the majors after only allowing three or more hits in three of his first 43 appearances.
- Made his first appearance since being recalled on August 24 at Atlanta and he got the final out of the seventh inning (0.1 IP, H).
- Was recalled from Triple-A Syracuse on August 23...In seven games with Syracuse he posted a 6.75 ERA (8 ER/10.2 IP) with 12 strikeouts...Five of his seven appearances were scoreless...Prior to being sent down he had gone 5-2 with two saves, 11 holds and a 3.83 ERA (22 ER/51.2 IP) through 44 appearances (three as an opener), holding batters to a .223 average (40-179)...Right-handed hitters have batted .184 (19-103) against him compared to a .276 average against left-handers (21-76)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .167 average (15-90)...His 1.11 ERA through his first 24 games of the season was the eighth-best in franchise history through as many games.
- Has made four appearances against the Phillies this season and has a 1.80 ERA (ER/5.0 IP) with three holds against them.
- Has a 3.33 ERA (9 ER/24.1 IP) in 21 appearances (two starts) at home this season.
- Was used as an opener for the third time this season and threw a scoreless first inning on July 2 vs. Milwaukee (G2)...Has not allowed a hit over 4.0 scoreless innings as a starter this season.

- Prior to his outing on June 19, had not allowed more than one earned run in each of his first 30 outings of the season...He allowed 14 earned runs over 13 appearances in the month of June (9.95 ERA) after allowing just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April and May (1.34 ERA)...Five of his last six appearances have been scoreless dating back to July 8.
- 12 of his appearances this season have been for four or more outs...11 of those appearances have been scoreless...Has
 posted 10 scoreless relief appearances of 1.2 innings or more which is tied for the 10th-most such outings among Major
 League relievers...His seven scoreless outings of 2.0+ innings are tied for the 14th-most in the majors and he is of 21
 relievers to post such numbers.
