- <u>Today</u>: Placed on the 10-day injured list, retroactive to 5/29, **OF Austin Hays** (left foot contusion); activated from the 10-day IL **OF Jake Fraley** (left calf tenderness); recalled from Louisville **RHP Lyon Richardson**.
- Yesterday: Optioned to AAA-Louisville RHP Luis Mey; acquired from the Dodgers RHP Mike Villani in exchange for RHP Alexis Díaz.

TODAY'S GAME:

- Is Game 1 of a 3-game series vs **John Steinmiller's Cubs** and the fourth game (2-1) of a 7-day, 6-game road trip that includes a 2-1 series victory vs the **Royals** at **Kauffman Stadium**.
- Following Sun's game, the Reds will return home to Great American Ball Park for a 6-game homestand vs the Brewers (6/2-6/4) and Diamondbacks (6/6-6/8).
- The Reds are coming off a brief 3-game homestand vs Chc (1-2).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds and **Cubs** are meeting for the second time in 2025... **Chc** won 2 of 3g last weekend in **Cincinnati**...the teams will square off again at **Wrigley Field** 8/4-8/6 before wrapping up the season series 9/18-9/21 at **Great American Ball Park**.

- The Reds led each game of last weekend's series by 4 or more runs (4-0 & 6-2 on Fri, lost 13-6; 6-1 on Sat, won 6-4; 8-3 on Sun, lost 11-8).
- Cin went 8-5 last season vs Chc, and won 3 of the 4 series.
- The Reds are 189-187 vs Chc since 2003 and 86-105 since 2014.
- Cin is 466-498 (.483) all-time at Wrigley Field, having the third-most wins among all Cubs opponents at the Friendly Confines.
- The Redlegs are 98-87 all-time vs the Cubs at Great American Ball Park, having won 20 of the last 34g there against their division rival.

TJ MAX: OF TJ FriedI has multiple hits in each of his last 6 games (13-for-27) and in 8 of his last 9 games (18-for-40, .450, 3 2B, 1 3B, 9r).

- His 6-game multi-hit streak is the longest by a Red since Jonathan India's 8-game run in 2024 (6/22-6/29).
- Began the season with 6 hits over his first 29 at-bats (.207/.258/.207)... since then is slashing .316/.400/.446.
- Enters today's game with 39 hits on the road (ranks fourth in majors).

ELLY GOING FOR 50: SS EIIy De La Cruz on Tue at KC produced his second multi-homer game of the season and the <u>fifth</u> of his career, tying **Pete Rose** for most by a Reds switch hitter since 1900 (courtesy Elias).

- 8 of his 11 HR this season have either tied the game or put Cin ahead.
- His next homer will be the 50th of his career...at <u>23 years</u>, <u>139 days</u> today, would be the fifth-youngest Red to reach that mark (**Adam Dunn**: 23 years, 154 days in 2003).

REDS BATTING: Through the Reds' first 16 games (3/27-4/13), Cin batters slashed .200/.272/.320 and averaged 3.88 runs per game...in 41 games since then (4/15-5/28), the club ranks <u>fourth</u> in the majors with a .266 AVG, <u>third</u> with a .341 OBP, <u>sixth</u> with a .426 SLG, and <u>sixth</u> by averaging 4.93 runs per game.

 The Reds on Wed at KC had their streak of scoring at least 6 runs in a game snapped at 5...was their longest such streak since plating 6+ runs in 6 straight games from 7/20-7/26, 2016.

HOME (RUNS) AWAY FROM HOME: The Redlegs are averaging 4.83 runs per game on the road compared to 4.43 runs per game back home in Cincinnati... overall during the Great American Ball Park era (since 2003), the team has averaged 4.60 runs per game at GABP and 4.26 runs per game on the road.

- 5 times in the history of GABP has Cin averaged more runs per game on the road than at home (2023, 2013, 2009, 2004, 2003).
- Cin has homered 29 times in 28 games this year at home compared to 29 times in 29 road games.
- 2004 marks the only season during the GABP era in which the Reds hit more home runs on the road (102) than at home (92).

OPEN FOR BUSINESS: Cin is 11-7 in series openers this season and 44-27 (.620) dating back to last year...only **NYM** (46-26, .639) has a better record in the first game of series since the beginning of 2024.

 Cin is outscoring opponents in series openers this year, 87-69 and holding opponents to a .210/.277/.374 slash line.

REHABBERS: Updates on the following Reds who are currently on rehabilitation assignments in the club's minor league system:

• INF Christian Encarnacion-Strand (low back inflammation) began his rehab assignment Thu (5/22) and has made 6 apps (5-for-19, 2 2B, 1 3B, 1hr, 3rbi, 2bb, 4k).

MAY 2 JUNE: If the Reds win both of the remaining 2 games in May, they would guarantee their first winning record before June 1 since 2013 (34-21, .618).

Cin's 264 runs scored are the most scored by a Reds team before June 1 since 2011 (275r).

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the 6-4 win on Sat (5/24) vs Chc (5.2ip, 6h, 1r/1er, 2bb, 2k, 1hr, 83TP).

- RF Kyle Tucker's single in the 1st inning snapped Abbott's streak of starts without allowing a 1st inning hit at 9 (dating back to 8/12/24 vs StL)...had last allowed a 1st inning hit in Mia's 6-4 win on 8/7/24 at loanDepotPark (Derek Hill grand slam)...the streak matched RHP Jim Maloney 9/17/68-4/30/69) for the longest such-run by a Reds pitcher in the expansion era (since 1961).
- Allowed 3rd-inning homer to 1b Justin Turner to snap his homerless streak at 23.2 innings...went 100 batters without giving up a round-tripper.

MAY 18: Earned the 3-0 win on 5/18 vs Cle (5.0ip, 4h, 0r, 3bb, 5k, 1hb, 96TP).

- Did not issue a base-on-balls to any of his previous 45 batters until he gave up back-to-back walks to Carlos Santana and Gabriel Arias in the 1st inning...streak started on 5/1 vs StL (walk to Jordan to lead off the 4th inning).
- 28 of his 96 pitches were thrown in the 1st inning.
- It was his ninth career scoreless start of at least 5.0 innings, third-most by a Cin pitcher through their first 53 starts since 1901, fewer than only Gary Nolan (11g, 1967-68) and Ewell Blackwell (11g, 1946-47).

MAY 13: Did not factor in the decision in the 5-1, 10-inning loss on 5/13 vs CWS (6.0ip. 4h. 1r/1er. 0bb. 7k. 96TP).

- Gave up Edgar Quero's 4th inning RBI-single to end his streak of having not allowed an ER in 13.1 straight innings.
- For the second consecutive start did not walk a batter.
- Was his second quality start of the season, his first since 4/18 at Bal...was his 20th career quality start.

MAY 6: Did not factor in the decision in the 2-1, 10-inning loss on 5/6 at Atl (5.0ip, 4h, 0r, 0bb, 8k, 91TP).

- Was his first scoreless outing of the season and his first since pitching 7.0 shutout innings vs Col on 7/8/24.
- Was his first career appearance in which he held his opponent without a run and walk.
- Was the first game in which he pitched that the Reds lost.

MAY 1: Collected a no-decision in series finale 9-1 win vs StL on 5/1 (4.0ip, 3h, 1r/0er, 4bb, 3k, 74TP).

- Did not return after a 1 hour 37-minute rain delay in the middle of the 4th inning.
- · Was his 50th career appearance/start.
- Was the 12th time since his debut in 2023 that he's allowed fewer than 2 runs in a start at Great American Ball Park.
- Following the game, an official scoring change redesignated the run he allowed in the top of the 3rd inning as an unearned run (was originally deemed an earned run).

IN HIS MAY ERA: His 0.70 ERA this month ranks third-lowest among Major League starters...would be his lowest ERA in a month since pitching to a 1.21 mark in June 2023 (5gs, 4qs, 29.2ip, 4er, 16h, 12bb, 30k, 3hr).

- Is the first Reds pitcher to post a 0.70 ERA over a 5-start span (min. 25ip) since RHP Hunter Greene's 0.27 ERA last year from 7/6-8/3.
- Is the first Reds starting pitcher to open a season with a 1.77 ERA or lower over his first 8 starts since RHP Trevor Bauer pitched to a 1.74 ERA over his first 8 starts of the 2020 season.

HE EARNED IT: His 3.50 ERA (288ip, 116r/112er) through his first 54 career starts is the lowest by a Reds starting pitcher since RHP Mario Soto (3.50, 1977-82).

LIMITING HARD CONTACT: Among all pitchers with at least 40.0 innings, his hardhit percentage of .317 is fifth-best in the majors...hard-hit percentage measures the percentage of pitches put in play at an exit velocity over 95 mph.

EASY AS 1-2-3: Is holding top of the order batters (1, 2, 3) to a .203/.277/.288 slash line (12-for-59, 1hr, 9 hard-hit pitches).

PERSONAL: Graduated from Halifax County High School (South Boston, VA), the same school attended by All Elite Wrestling champion "**Hangman**" **Adam Page** and Major League pitcher **Jeremy Jeffress...**was named 2017 Gatorade Virginia Player of the Year...was a 4-year member of the Halifax swim team...at the University of Virginia became only the second pitcher in school history to record at least 300 strikeouts.
