TODAY'S GAME:

- Is Game 3 (2-0) of a 3-game set vs the National League Central Division champion Brewers and the final game of the 2025 regular season.
- With Sat's 7-4 win, the Reds secured their first series victory over the Brewers since 8/5-8/7, 2022 (3g) here at American Family Field, snapping their 13-series losing streak against Mil.
- Cin has posted a winning record for the fourth time in the last 6 seasons.
- The Reds are coming off their final homestand of 2025 in which they went 5-2 vs the Cubs (4-0) and Pirates (1-2).

DO YOU BELIEVE IN MAGIC?: With Sat's 7-4 win at **MiI**, the Reds lowered their magic number to clinch the third and final National League Wild Card spot to 1...can secure their first trip to the Postseason since 2020 and first in a full season since 2013 this afternoon with a win or a **Mets** loss.

- The Reds are looking to clinch a Postseason berth on the final day of a season for the first time in franchise history, according to Elias.
- Reds manager Terry Francona is aiming to become the fifth skipper in team history to guide Cin to the Postseason in his first year at the helm... he would join Lou Piniella (1990), John McNamara (1979), Sparky Anderson (1970), and Patrick Moran (1919), per Elias.

THE AMAZING RACE: Following a 5-4 loss on 9/5 vs **NYM**, the Reds trailed both the **Mets** and **Padres** by 6.0 games for the third and final National League Wild Card spot with 21 games remaining.

- Since then, the Reds have gone 13-7 while the **Mets** have posted a 7-13 mark over that same span.
- Cin owns the head-to-head tiebreaker over NYM (4-2 in season series).
- The Reds entered Tue's game tied with NYM for that coveted third Wild Card spot...it marked the first time after the All-Star break that the Reds held a Postseason position.
- The Redlegs climbed to within a <u>half-game</u> of that final spot on 8/22 before losing 10 of 13 and falling <u>6.0 games</u> off the pace.
- Had been "the first team out" until they were leapfrogged in the Wild Card standings by both SF and AZ during a 3-11 run.
- The Diamondbacks were eliminated from Postseason contention on Fri...SF, StL and Mia were eliminated from the race on Thu.

WHO DEY THINK GONNA SWEEP THE REDS: The Reds avoided being swept in all 26 of their series this season at **Great American Ball Park**.

- Went an entire season without being swept at home for the sixth time in franchise history (not counting the 2020 COVID-19 season).
- Only the Reds teams of 1940, 1943, 1944, 1994, and 2012 ran the home schedule without being swept (Elias).
- Have been swept just twice overall in 2025 (8/25-27 at LAD & 9/12-14 at Ath)...that sweep at LAD snapped a streak of 43 consecutive series without being broomed, dating back to September 2024.
- Was the only Major League team not to have been swept this season.

SERIES NOTES: The Brewers have won each of the last 14 of the last 16 sets and 17 of the last 19 series vs Cin dating back to 2021.

- Sat's 7-4 win at Mil marked the Reds' 100th win at American Family Field, which originally opened as Miller Park in 2001.
- With a win in today's season finale, the Reds can secure their first series sweep of the Brewers since 6/14-6/16, 2021 (3g) here at American Family Field.
- Since 7/16/21, Mil has won 44 of 63 meetings against Cin, including 26 of 38 contests against the Reds since the beginning of the 2023 season.
- The Reds have lost 44 of 80 games at American Family Field since 2016 and 17 of 27 here since 2022.
- The Reds have lost 33 of 45 games vs Mil at Great American Ball Park since 9/24/19.
- Cin ended Mil's franchise-record 14-game winning streak with the 3-2 win in 10 innings on 8/17 at GABP.

DEADLINE DEALS: Cin made 3 trades leading up to the 7/31 deadline:

- 7/31: Acquired from the Athletics INF/OF Miguel Andujar (ahn-DOOhar) in exchange for RHP Kenya Huggins.
- 7/30: Acquired from the Pirates 3B Ke'Bryan Hayes (key-Bryan, #3) in exchange for LHP Taylor Rogers, SS Sammy Stafura, and cash considerations.
- 7/30: Acquired from the Rays RHP Zack Littell (lih-TELL, #52) in exchange for LHP Adam Serwinowski and RHP Brian Van Belle.

HOUSEKEEPING: The Reds went 45-35 (.563) in 80 games this season at **Great American Ball Park**...it was their fourth-best record in stadium history (beginning in 2003), behind only the 2012 (50-31, .617), 2013 (49-31, .613) and 2010 (49-32, .605) clubs.

- The Reds played 1 "home" game at Bristol Motor Speedway on 8/3 (completed on 8/4; 4-2 loss vs Atl).
- In 80 home dates this year, the Reds attracted 2,079,931 fans to GABP...
 marked the first time Cin drew over 2M fans in 3 straight seasons since
 doing so in 6 consecutive seasons from 2010-2015.
- Reds pitchers posted a 3.88 ERA this season at Great American Ball Park, the fifth-lowest staff ERA in the ballpark's 23-year history and the lowest since 2020 (3.84).
- The Reds spent 15 hours, 37 minutes in weather delays this season at GABP and 19 hours, 49 minutes total.

DOLOMITE!: In Thu's 2-1 win vs **Pit**, **LHP Nick Lodolo** matched his career high by striking out 12 batters over 6.1 scoreless innings.

- His 156 strikeouts this season are the most by a Cin left-handed pitcher since John Smiley fanned 171 batters in 1996.
- Lodolo issued 2 walks or fewer in each of his 28 starts this season, the second-longest streak by a Reds' pitcher since 1900, trailing only Paul Derringer's 30-game streak in 1940 (Elias).
- Became the first Reds pitcher since 1900 with at least 150 strikeouts and 30 walks or fewer in a single season (Elias).

- · Was the first time he allowed 4 or more runs in an outing since 8/7 at Pit (4r/4er).
- Allowed his 100th career home run (Oneil Cruz, 2nd inning).

SEPTEMBER 17 at STL: Earned the 6-2 win on 9/17 at StL (5.2ip, 3h. 2r/1er. 2bb. 6k. 1hr. 97TP).

- His 6th-inning strikeout of Alec Burleson marked the 800th of his career.
- Snapped a streak of 6 consecutive quality starts.
- · His career-high 14th win is the most by a Reds pitcher since RHP Luis Castillo won 15 games in 2019.

SEPTEMBER 12 at ATH: Suffered the 3-0 loss on 9/12 at Ath (6.0ip, 3h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 4k, 2hr, 90TP).

- · Allowed a home run to the first batter he faced, Lawrence Butler, to end his homereless-innings streak at 32.2.
- · Was his sixth-straight quality start, extending his career-high streak...is the longest quality-starts streak by a Reds pitcher this season (also: RHP Nick Martinez posted 6 consecutive QS from 4/28-5/26).

SEPTEMBER 6 vs NYM: Earned the 6-3 win on 9/6 vs NYM (6.0ip, 4h, 1r/1er, 4bb, 5k, 0hr, 99TP).

- · Was his fifth-straight quality start, the longest-such streak of his career.
- Extended his single-season career high with his 13th win.
- Extended his homerless innings streak to 32.2ip.
- Was his third straight start in which he held opponent to 3 or fewer hard-hit balls (balls-in-play at or above 95mph).

AUGUST 31 vs STL: Earned the 6-1 win on 8/31 vs StL (6.0ip, 5h, 3r/3er, 0bb, 8k, 102TP).

· Was his fourth-straight quality start, matching a career high for the fourth time (most recently: 9/5/22-9/23/22).

AUGUST 24 at AZ: Did not factor in the decision in the 6-1 win on 8/24 at AZ (6.0ip, 1h, 1r/1er, 3bb, 9k, 95TP).

- It marked the second time this season in which he pitched as many as 6.0 innings and allowed no more than 1 hit (also: 3/31 vs Tex, 7.0ip, 1h).
- Was his third straight quality start...is his longest quality start streak of the season and his longest since 7/20-7/31, 2024 for KC (3 straight qs).
- · Retired his last 10 batters he faced.
- Was his third-straight outing in which he didn't allow a home run...was his 12th homerless app of the season.

AUGUST 18 at LAA: Earned the 4-1 win at LAA on 8/18 (6.0 ip. 6h, 1r/1er, 1bb, 4k, 88TP).

- · Was his second straight quality start, his third over his last 4 apps, and his fifth over his last 7 apps
- Threw first-pitch strikes to 16 of his 23 batters.

AUGUST 12 vs PHI: Earned the 6-1 win vs Phi on 8/12 (6.0ip, 3h, 0r, 0bb, 6k, 71TP).

- · Was perfect before allowing a leadoff single in the 5th inning to Nick Castellanos...at 4.0ip, marked the second-longest perfect game bid of his career (4.2ip, 8/14/23 vs Sea).
- Matched his career high with his 10th win (also 10w in 2022).
- Is the first Reds pitcher with 10 wins through his first 24 games with the team since Mat Latos (10, 2012).
- · Was the second time over his last 3 starts in which he produced 6.0 scoreless innings (also 8/1 vs Atl).
- Over his last 2 home apps, has fanned 16 over 12.0 scoreless innings...became the seventh Reds pitcher since 1900 with at least 16k and 0r in any single-season span of 2 home starts (last: Nick Lodolo, 2022).
- Was his 10th quality start of 2025 and the 59th of his career.

AUGUST 7 at PIT: Opposed Paul Skenes and suffered the 7-0 loss at Pit on 8/7 (3.2ip, 6h, 4r/4er, 4bb, 2k, 1hr, 86TP).

• Threw 36 pitches in the 1st inning, 9 pitches in the 2nd inning, 20 pitches in the 3rd inning, and 21 pitches in the 4th inning before he was lifted for reliever Sam Moll.

AUGUST 1 vs ATL: Earned the 3-2 win on 8/1 vs Atl (6.0ip, 4h, 0r, 1bb, 10k, 97TP).

- Season-high 10 strikeouts...was his fifth career double-digit strikeout game (last: 10k, 3/31/24 for KC vs Min).
- · Struck out all 3 batters he faced in the 1st inning, the 10th time he's done that in his career (last: 7/22/23 at NYY).
- Fanned Eli White in the 2nd inning for his 750th career K.
- Eclipsed the 800.0-inning mark for his career.

14 WINS: His 14 victories are a career high and rank tied for seventh-most in MLB. His 14 wins through his first 31 apps with the Reds are the most by a Cin pitcher in that span since RHP Edinson Volquez (16w) in 2008.

LAST 11: Over his last 11 starts, dating back to 7/27, is 7-3 with a 2.53 ERA (19r/18er, 64ip, 65k, 17bb, 6hr, 0.97 WHIP, .199/.269/.332...lowered his ERA from 4.84 to 3.95.

DABBLING IN PERFECTION: LHP Andrew Abbott (8/11) and RHP Brady Singer (8/12) are the first pair of Cin starters in the expansion era (since 1961) to each produce a perfect game bid of at least 4.0 innings in consecutive games

- Abbott on 8/11 vs Phi went 4 perfect innings before allowing J.T. Realmuto's leadoff double in the 5th inning.
- Singer on 8/12 vs Phi also began the game with 4.0 perfect innings until Nick Castellanos led off with a single in the 5th inning

2-3-4 BATTERS: Is holding Nos. 2-4 hitters in the lineup to a .219/.307/.388 slash line (49-for-224, 7hr, 25bb, 54k).

ANSWERS THE CALL: Since his 2020 debut his 155 starts rank T12th in the majors while his 851.2 innings rank 16th.

PERSONAL: Played collegiately at the University of Florida where he was named 2018 SEC Pitcher of the Year and winner of the Dick Howser Trophy...was named Baseball America College Player of the Year in 2018 and a finalist for the Golden Spikes Award... helped lead the Gators to the school's first NCAA College World Series championship in 2017...struck out 12 vs LSU in Game One of the CWS finals, the most strikeouts in the championship round since at least 2003...was teammates at Florida with another 2018 firstround pick, Jonathan India, for whom he was traded in 2024...Graduated from Eustis High School (FL), the same school attended by 1972 Nobel Prize winner John Robert Schrieffer, former NASA astronaut David Walker, and former Reds catcher Chris Okey.

In the Reds' 4-2 victory over the **Rockies** on 7/13 at **Great American Ball Park** manager **Terry Francona** earned his 2,000th win as a Major League manager.

- He became the 13th manager to reach the 2,000-win milestone.
- Francona is the second active manager in the majors with 2,000 wins (Tex' Bruce Bochy 2,251).
- 10 of the 13 managers with 2,000 career wins are in the **Hall of Fame...Dusty Baker** (just became eligible in 2024), **Bochy** (active), and **Francona** (active) will likely join the other 10 in **Cooperstown**.
- Francona joins Baker (2,183) and Sparky Anderson (2,194 wins) as the only 2,000-win skippers to manage the Reds.
- Francona joins Leo Durocher as the only 2,000-win managers to <u>play</u> for the Reds (1930-33).
- Francona is the fourth manager to earn his 2,000th win for a team he once played for (1987), joining Bochy (SF), Bucky Harris (Det), and John McGraw (NYG)...courtesy Elias.
