**RECENT REDBIRDS:** The Cardinals continue their six-game road trip through Kansas City (2-0) and Cincinnati (0-1), playing the second game of a four-game series at the division-rival Cincinnati Reds tonight and wrapping up their play in the Queen City for the 2019 season ... the Cardinals enter play today tied for 1st place in the NL Central (63-56, .52941), .0005 pct. points ahead of Chicago (64-57, .52892) ... the Cardinals are 19-12 since the All-Star Break, 3rd-best winning percentage (.613) in the National League.

**PEAS & CARROTS:** For the first time since July 3 at Seattle, **Adam Wainwright** and **Yadier Molina** will be battery mates tonight for the Cardinals. The duo have been a starting battery for 14 games this season and 256 games since 2007, 8th-most all-time in Major League history (since 1908).

**SECOND HOME:** **Yadier Molina** is slashing .321/.361/.507 with 15 home runs and 60 RBI in 105 career games at the Great American Ball Park. The backstop is the all-time stadium leader for visiting players in games played, hits (123), doubles (26) and RBI (60).

**FAMILIAR FOES:** **Adam Wainwright** leads active pitchers in starts (26) and innings pitched (154.1) against Cincinnati, while posting a 9-12 record and 5.31 ERA. His nine wins rank 5th-most among active pitchers. One of Wainwright's 10 career homers has been hit against the Reds (Aug. 2, 2016 at GABP, solo, **Dan Straily**).

**MOLINA MILESTONES:** **Yadier Molina** needs one double to pass **Gary Carter** (372) for 10th all-time among MLB catchers, four RBI for 900 in his career, and nine games at catcher to tie **Benito Santiago** (1,917) for 11th in MLB history.

**GROUNDING:** Cardinals pitching hasn't allowed a home run in their last three games (August 13-present), matching the club's longest homerless stretch this season (sixth time) and tying Pittsburgh for longest active in MLB ... the last time St. Louis did not allow a homer in four straight games was August 26-30, 2018 ... the club has surrendered the 5th-fewest homers in the Majors this season (149), fewest since the All-Star Break (25), and fewest since August 1 (8).

**FOWLER PROWLER:** **Dexter Fowler** has reached base safely in his last 13 consecutive games (July 31-present), T5th-longest active streak in the National League (.353 OBP). Fowler is hitting .304 (7-23) with five walks and a .414 OBP while batting leadoff for the Cardinals in the last seven games (Aug. 6-present).

**STATE COLLEGE ATHLETIC TRAINER RECOGNIZED:** The Professional Baseball Athletic Trainers Society announced the winners of the Minor League Athletic Trainers of the Year Awards for the 2019 season, recognizing State College Spikes (SS-A) **Joseph Olsiewicz** as New York-Penn League Athletic Trainer of the Year. All 16 league winners, the DSL winner and the Minor League Coordinator of the Year, are eligible for the Minor League Athletic Trainer of the Year award, which is given at the upcoming 2019 MLB Winter Meetings in San Diego.

**BIRD BYTES:** Since August 5, 2017, the Cardinals are 15-5 in their last 20 games at the Great American Ballpark ... since July 1, **Kolten Wong** ranks 4th in the NL in batting (.356, 37-104) and 2nd in OBP (.433) ... St. Louis' 82 stolen bases in 2019 rank 2nd in the NL (Washington 84) and are the club's most since swiping 91 in 2012 ... **Jack Flaherty** (23.0) and **Giovanny Gallegos** (16.1) currently boast MLB's top two active scoreless innings streaks.

**THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (August 16, 1964):** **Curt Flood** collects eight consecutive hits during a doubleheader against Dodgers pitching. The Cardinals split the twin bill in Los Angeles, losing the opener to **Sandy Koufax**, 3-0, but take the nightcap when **Curt Simmons** tosses a six-hitter to give the Redbirds a 4-0 victory.

#### CINCINNATI CONNECTIONS

**Michael Wacha's** uncle, **Dusty Rogers**, was a Reds 1st round draft pick in 1984...played in the Reds minor league organization from 1984-88.

After the 2015 season, **Paul Goldschmidt** gifted his NL Silver Slugger Award to then current Reds hitting coach **Turner Ward**, who previously served as a Diamondbacks hitting coach (2013-15) and Mobile (AA) manager of Goldschmidt in 2011.

Pitching coach **Mike Maddux** was born in Dayton, Ohio...originally selected by the Reds in the 36th round of the 1979 MLB draft, but did not sign to attend the University of Texas at El Paso.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Vince Coleman** played in 33 games for the Reds in 1996.

Cardinals 2019 Hall of Fame inductee **Scott Rolen** played his final four seasons in a Reds uniform (2009-12), where he was a 2010 Gold Glove Award winner and two-time All-Star (2010-11).

Cardinals Translator **Carlos Villorria** is related to Reds Hall of Fame infielder **Dave Concepción**.

Cardinals broadcaster and Hall of Famer **Jim Edmonds** played 13 games for the Reds during his final professional season in 2010.

Reds Bullpen Coach **Lee Tunnell** pitched in 32 games for St. Louis in 1987.

Reds first base coach **Delino DeShields** played two seasons with St. Louis (1997-98).

Reds manager **David Bell** previously served as a Cardinals assistant hitting (2014) and bench coach (2015-17)...played parts of four seasons with St. Louis (1995-98)...traded by Cleveland with catcher **Pepe McNeal** and pitcher **Rick Heiserman** to the Cardinals for pitcher **Ken Hill** (July 27, 1995).

Reds Executive Advisor to the CEO **Walt Jocketty** served as the Cardinals General Manager for 13 seasons (1995-2007)...during tenure, the Cardinals compiled seven NL Central Division championships (1996, 2000-02, '04-06), two NL Championships ('04, '06), and one World Series Championship ('06)...the Cardinals recorded seven straight winning seasons under Jocketty, including a pair of 100+ win seasons ('04-05)... named MLB Executive of the Year (2000, '04, '10).

**Matt Bowman** pitched three seasons (2016-18) with St. Louis...drafted by the Cardinals from the Mets in the 2015 Rule 5 draft (Dec. 10, 2015).

Reds pro scout **Bruce Manno** worked in the Cardinals front office for six seasons as Director of Player Development (2002-06) and Senior Director of Pro Scouting & Special Assistant to the General Manager (2007) before joining Atlanta.

Reds broadcaster **George Grande** previously worked as a Cardinals play-by-play announcer for two seasons (1991-92).

Reds Special Asst. to the GM **Marty Maier** spent 24 seasons with St. Louis as an area scout, Latin American coordinator, asst. director of scouting, scouting director and special asst. to the GM.

Reds Player Performance Special Asst. **Eric Davis** played two seasons (1999-2000) for St. Louis.

Reds broadcaster **Jeff Brantley** pitched in 48 games for St. Louis in 1998.

Reds Special Assistant to the GM **John Morris** played five seasons for St. Louis from 1986-90.

Cardinals Principal Owner and Chief Executive Office **William DeWitt Jr.** was a prior owner of the Reds and shareholder of the Cincinnati Bengals... his father, **William O. DeWitt**, was a sole owner of the Reds from 1961-67.

Reds CEO **Robert Castellini**, Chairman **W. Joseph Williams Jr.** and Vice Chairman **Thomas Williams** were Cardinals investors from 1995-2006...their interests were sold as a condition of their acquisition of a controlling ownership stake of the Reds.

**TONIGHT'S GAME**

- Makes his 23rd start of the season (308th career start) and his 375th career appearance.
- He and Yadier Molina have been a starting battery for 256 games, 8th-most all-time in Major League history (since 1908). Molina last caught Wainwright on 7/3 at Seattle.
- Is 4-1 with seven no-decisions in 12 starts against opponents with a sub-.500 win pct.
- Ranks 9th among active pitchers with a 3.38 ERA (min. 1,500 IP) and 15th in starts.
- Has reached the 100 inning threshold in a season for first time since 2017 (123.1) and 100 strikeouts for first time since 2016 (161).
- Has a 61-34 (.642) career mark in post All-Star break games with a 3.40 ERA. He ranks 4th among active NL pitchers in post All-Star winning pct.
- Passed Bill Sherdel (1918-30, '32) for 4th all-time in wins (154) in franchise history in his 7/14 start vs. ARI. Is seven wins back of Bob Forsch (163) for 3rd all-time.
- Is one of five Cardinal pitchers to make 300 or more career starts, joining Bob Gibson (482), Bob Forsch (401), Jesse Haines (387), and Bill Doak (320).
- Since 2016, St. Louis sports a 52-34 record (.605 win pct) in his games pitched.

**LAST TIME OUT**

- Struck out eight batters over 6.0 innings allowing one run in a Cardinals 3-1 win over the Pirates improving his home record to 6-2 on the season. Was his 6th game with eight or more strikeouts

- 7.8% of his curveballs (157) have been called for strikes, highest in MLB (minimum 1,000 total pitches). Stephen Strasburg is 2nd at 7.3%. (Statcast)
- Has allowed 15 runs in the third inning (6.14 ERA) of his 22 starts.
- Is 6-2, 2.19 ERA in 11 home starts, sporting the 4th-best home ERA in the National League and T7th-most wins (2-6, 6.96 ERA in 11 road starts).
- Is 4-1 (Cardinals 5-1) in his six day game starts, posting 2.23 ERA,
