SNAKEBITES

THE NL CHAMPS: The 2023 National League Champion D-backs captured their second NL pennant and made their second trip to the World Series, first since winning it all in 2001, in their seventh Postseason berth ('99, '01, '02, '07, '11, '17, '23) last season.

LAST GAME: The D-backs won 12-1 vs. Blue Jays last night.

- ◆ Yilber Diaz collected his first Major League win following 6.0 innings of 1-run, 4-hit ball.
- ◆ Corbin Carroll led the offense with 2 homers and 6 RBI.
- ◆ Eugenio Suárez delivered a multi-hit performance, including his 10th homer of the season with 2 RBI.
- ◆ Jose Herrera collected 3 hits to tie a career high in his 100th career game.

BACK TO WHERE WE BELONG: The D-backs are 2 games above .500 for the first time since April 2 (4-2).

♦ The D-backs finish the pre-All-Star half above .500 for the 13th time in franchise history and the fifth time in the last 7 seasons, including last season (.571; 52-39).

WIN THE SERIES: The D-backs have won or split their last 5 series (4-0-1) and 11 of their last 13 series overall since May 30, going 8-2-3.

FINISHING THE HALF STRONG: The D-backs have won 10 of their last 14 games dating back to June 29, which are tied for the most wins in the span (also: Astros).

THE KID DELIVERED: Yilber Diaz, at age 23, became the youngest D-back starting pitcher to toss 6.0+ innings and allow 1-or-fewer runs in each of his first 2 career starts (previous: Brandon Webb, 2003) and is the sixth D-backs starter all-time to meet the feat (also: Ryne Nelson/2022, Josh Collmenter/2011, Webb/2003, John Patterson/2002 and Geraldo Guzmán/2000).

RISP-Y BUSINESS: Over their last 9 games (since July 5), the D-backs are hitting .314 (22-for-70)/1.011 OPS with runners in scoring position with 2 doubles, 1 triple, 5 homers and 17 walks.

ALL ABOUT SACRIFICE: The D-backs' 39 sacrifice flies are the most in the Majors, ahead of the Yankees (33), Giants (33) and Royals (33).

MOST RBI BY A LEADOFF: Corbin Carroll's 6 RBI marked a career high and the most ever in a game by a D-back leadoff hitter (previous: 5) [Stats Inc.].

◆ Earlier this season, on May 7 @ Reds, Carroll became the third D-back leadoff hitter (fourth time) to collect 5 RBI in a game (also: Chris Young, 7/2/2010 & 9/2/2006) and Steve Finley (4/26/2001).

10+-RUN FACTS: The D-backs' 5 games won by 10+ runs this season are the most in the Majors, ahead of the Mets (4) and Yankees (4).

♦ The D-backs' 10 occurrences scoring 10+ runs in a game are tied for third most in the Majors (also: Royals), behind the Dodgers (12) and Twins (12).

AMONG THE LEAGUE: Since June 29, the D-backs' 89 runs scored are the most in the Majors, ahead of the Astros (86), Reds (81) and Tigers (80).

In the span, the D-backs rank among the Majors in walks (1st, 62), sacrifice hits (1st, 6), OBP (1st, .366), AVG (2nd, .283), hits (2nd, 137), XBH (T-3rd, 54), total bases (3rd, 236) and SLG (3rd, .488).

TAKING BASES: The D-backs' 126 bases taken [bases advanced on fly balls, passed balls, wild pitches, balks, defensive indifference] are the most in the Majors, ahead of the Cardinals (116), Dodgers (102) and Giants (99).

HOMER HAPPY: The D-backs' 21 home runs in July are third in the Majors, behind the Reds (28) and Tigers (23), and ahead of the Rockies (19) and Pirates (19).

VS. BLUE JAYS: The D-backs are hosting the Blue Jays for just the fifth time ever (also: 2002, '10, '13, '16) and first time since July 19-20, 2016.

- ♦ Are 7-1 in their last 8 home games vs. Blue Jays (6-7 all-time).
- ♦ Were swept last July 14-16 @ Blue Jays and prior to that swept the Blue Jays in Toronto June 7-9, 2019.

INTERLEAGUE INSIGHT: The D-backs, in their last 14 games vs. AL, are hitting .279 AVG/.830 OPS with 87 runs (6.2 R/G).

- ♦ Among NL teams in Interleague play since June 11, rank first in runs (87), hits (128), walks (58), times on base (196) and extra-base hits (48), and second in AVG (.279), OBP (.367), OPS (.830) and SLG (.463).
- **Ketel Marte** has hit safely in 9 of his last 12 Interleague starts, batting .405 (17-for-42)/1.214 OPS with 4 doubles, 3 homers, 11 RBI and 9 walks...has hit safely in 15 of 19 home starts vs. AL at a .362 clip (25-for-69)/1.112 OPS with 6 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers, 15 RBI and 15 walks.
- Lourdes Gurriel Jr. has hit in 5 of his last 6 games vs. AL, all home games, at a .348 clip (8-for-23)/.993 OPS with 1 double, 1 triple, 1 homer, 6 RBI, 1 walk and 1 hit by pitch.
- **Christian Walker** has hit safely in 7 of his last 9 Interleague games at a .394 clip (13-for-33)/1.080 OPS with 4 doubles, 1 homer and 6 RBI.

ALL-STAR STARTER: Ketel Marte is now a 2-time All-Star as the fan-elected NL starting second baseman (besting Luis Arraez/Padres 55% to 45%)...second career All-Star selection/start (also: 2019)...second D-back with multiple fan elections (also: Paul Goldschmidt)...D-backs' eighth fan-elected start for a position player.

MARTE CHASING PRE-ALL-STAR CAREER BESTS: Ketel Marte is 1 RBI shy of setting a pre-All-Star career best (53 RBI, set in 2019, tied last night).

EL PIKE: Ketel Marte has reached base in 18 straight home games since June 11, batting .361 (22-for-61)/.474 OBP/1.097 OPS with 14 walks.

- Has not struck out in 32 consecutive plate appearances, since July 4, the team's fifth-longest streak since 2023 [source: Elias Sports Bureau].
- His 5 strikeouts since June 24 are tied for the fewest in NL with Miguel Roias/LAD and Luis Arraez/SD.
