METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Braves, 3-2, last night...New York has dropped nine of their last 10 games...The Mets are in a stretch of 13 straight games (1-6)...New York is 19-22 on the road compared to 27-11 at Citi Field in 2025...The Mets are in the middle of a brief four-game homestand against the Braves (0-1)...Following this series, the Mets head to Pittsburgh for a brief three-game trip against the Pirates.

ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves: RHP Frankie Montas has been reinstated from the 60-Day IL...RHP Chris Devenski was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse...OF Jesse Winker was transferred to the 60-Day IL.

LET'S BE FRANK: RHP Frankie Montas is set to make his Mets debut today...The right-hander was signed to two-year major league contract with a player opt out after the 2025 season in December of 2024...The 6-2, 255-pounder combined to make 30 starts between the Cincinnati Reds and the Milwaukee Brewers in 2024...He posted a 7-11 record with a 4.84 ERA (81 ER/150.2 IP), 66 walks and 148 strikeouts...After joining the Brewers at the trade deadline, his strikeout rate improved from 19.0 to 28.7 percent. He finished with 70 strikeouts in 57.1 innings as a member of the Brewers...Overall, he owns a record of 44-46 with a 4.09 ERA (338 ER/744.1 IP), 263 walks and 760 strikeouts over the course of nine major league seasons with the Chicago White Sox, Oakland Athletics, New York Yankees, Reds and Brewers.

IN THE CITI: Yesterday was just the third time the Mets have lost a series opener through 13 home series openers this season...It is their fourth straight loss at home which is their longest losing streak at home this season and it marks the first time they have lost four straight home games since 6/1-6/11/24...They are still 27-11 (.711) at home this season which is the best mark in the majors and is tied for the best home start in franchise history with the '21, '15, '10, '88, and '86 teams. •

JUAN OF A KIND: In 21 games this month, Juan Soto is batting .324/484/704 with 19 runs, three doubles, eight home runs, 16 RBI, 21 walks and one steal...He ranks second in the NL with eight home runs in June, third in the NL with a .484 OBP in June and tied for fourth with a .704 SLG...Over the last 16 games, he is batting .357 (20-56) with eight extra-base hits and a .486 OBP...He has recorded a Major League-leading 64 walks...His 64 walks through the team's first 78 games are the most in franchise history...John Olerud owns the single-season franchise record with 125 walks in 1999...Soto has recorded at least 125 walks in a season four times in his career (145 in 2021, 135 in 2022, 132 in 2023 and 129 in 2024).

UPCOMING MILESTONES: Francisco Lindor is two steals away from 200 career SB and one steal away from 100 as a Met...He would become the 12th Met to reach 100 stolen bases and the sixth Met to record at least 100 homers and 100 steals with the team (also: Darryl Strawberry, David Wright, Howard Johnson, Carlos Beltrán and José Reyes).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Francisco Lindor has hit eight lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Tommie Agee and Lenny Dykstra for fourth-most in team history...Brandon Nimmo is third with 13 leadoff homers...Curtis Granderson and José Reyes are tied atop the franchise leaderboard with 21 leadoff dingers.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: In 21 games this month, Pete Alonso is batting .280 (23-82) with 12 runs, four doubles, seven homers, 21 RBI, seven walks, a .366 OBP and a .585 SLG...His 21 RBI this month are the third-most in the NL, while his seven homers are tied for fourth in the NL in June...He is tied for third in the Majors with 64 RBI.

WE FOUND NIMMO: Brandon Nimmo is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .429 (9-21) in that span with three runs, two doubles, two homers, three walks, one steal with a .500 OBP and an .810 OPS...Over the last 26 games, Nimmo is batting .330 (33-100) with 18 runs, five doubles, seven homers, 14 RBI, 10 walks, five steals and an .986 OPS...In 19 games when batting in the two-spot, Nimmo is hitting .351/422/662 with five doubles, six homers, 12 RBI, eight walks and three steals.

STEAL THIS BASE OR DON'T: Mets runners have now recorded an 85.9 (61-71) stolen base percentage this season which is the best mark in the majors...Mets catchers have combined to throw out 38.2% of potential base stealers this year (21-55), the second-best mark in the majors.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 10 straight games against the NL East...They are 1-6 in that span...New York is 13-10 against the NL East this season, sporting a 3.72 ERA...They have hit .248/314/428 against the division.

2024: Over 30 starts with Cincinnati and Milwaukee he finished with a 7-11 record, 4.84 ERA (81 ER/150.2 IP) and 148 strikeouts...Prior to being traded to the Brewers on July 30, 2024, he posted a 4-8 record, a 5.01 ERA (52 ER/93.1 IP), and recorded 78 strikeouts in 19 starts with the Red...In 11 starts with the Brewers he had 3-3 record, a 4.55 ERA (29 ER/57.1 IP), and 70 strikeouts...His K/9 went from 7.52 with Cincinnati to 10.99 with Milwaukee...He struck out eight or more batters in a career-high tying three consecutive games from September 6-17 (also: 7/23-8/4/21 and 6/9-6/20/19)...He started Game 2 of the NL Wild Card Series against the Mets at American Family Field...Allowed three runs (one earned) and struck out three over 3.2 innings.

VS. ATLANTA/NL EAST: He has pitched against Atlanta twice in his career, with both starts coming last season, and he gave up seven earned runs over 8.1 innings across the two starts...He did record 13 strikeouts over the two games, good for a K/9 of 14.04...In his career he has made 10 starts against NL East opponents and he has a 5.40 ERA (30 ER/50.0 IP) and a 3-3 record...He has 58 strikeouts over those 10 starts and he has struck out six or more in each of his last three starts against NL East opponents...Overall, he has six or more strikeouts in six of his 10 starts against the division...His teams own a 7-3 record in games he starts against NL East opponents.

REHAB RECAP: Was placed on the IL with a right lat strain on March 27 (retroactive to March 24) and he was sent on his rehab assignment on May 24...Between Brooklyn and Syracuse, he made six rehab starts and he threw 356 pitches over 18.2 innings...He struck out 12 batters over those eight starts including three in a game twice...In his final rehab start for Syracuse on June 18 he tossed 5.0 innings allowed seven hits, five runs, and he struck out two...He threw 80 pitches (47 strikes) in his final rehab start.

RIGHTIES BEWARE: He has held righties to a .234 batting average over his career, and he has held righties to a .653 OPS opposed to a .800 OPS against left-handed batters...Last season right-handed batters hit .209 (59-282) with 21 extra-base hits against him compared to lefties who hit .276 (81-294) with 32 extra-base hits against him...Last season, 81 of his strikeouts came against right-handed batters and 67 were at the expense of left-handed batters.

SPLIT THE DIFFERENCE: The splitter was one of Montas's most effective pitches last season and he generated a 42.6% whiff rate which was the fourth-best in the majors...He also picked up 34 of his strikeouts with the pitch and generated 92 swing and misses with the pitch which was the 11th most in the majors.

THE KITCHEN SINK: Last season Montas threw his sinker 19.3% of the time and he ended with a seven-run value with the pitch according to Baseball Savant...That was tied for 17th-best in the majors and he was one of 20 pitchers in the majors to have a run value as high with his sinker.

FIRST IMPRESSIONS: Over his Major League career, he has pitched for five different teams and over his first five debuts he has a posted a 4.58 ERA (9 ER/17.2 IP)...He has allowed one or zero earned runs in three of his five first games with a franchise...Last season he made his Reds debut as their opening day starter, and he fired 6.0 scoreless innings with four strikeouts and zero walks.

INNINGS EATER: From 2021-24 Montas threw 483.1 innings and recorded a 4.02 ERA (216 ER/483.1 IP)...He is one of 40 pitchers in the majors to throw as many innings and have as low of an ERA in that span...He has thrown over 140.0 innings in three of his last four seasons and he is one of 37 pitchers to do so over that time.

HOME COOKING: In 81 career appearances (65 starts) at home he has a 3.66 ERA (158 ER/388.1 IP) compared to a 4.55 ERA (180 ER/156.0 IP) over 79 games (64 starts) on the road...In home games he has recorded 417 strikeouts compared to 343 on the road.

WHAT A SEASON: In 2021 he established career highs in wins (13), starts (32), innings (187.0) and strikeouts (206)...In the AL, was tied for first in starts, ranked third in innings and fourth in strikeouts and fourth among qualifiers in ERA (3.37)...His 206 strikeouts were the second-most in a single season in franchise history during the Oakland Era (1968-2024)...As a result he finished a career-best sixth in AL Cy Young voting...He posted a 2.17 ERA (21 ER/87.0 IP) in 14 starts after the All-Star Break compared to a 4.41 ERA (49 ER/100.0 IP) in 18 starts prior to the All-Star Break...In the second half, ranked second in the AL among qualifiers in ERA and third in strikeouts (102)...He was named AL Pitcher of the Month for September/October after going 3-0 with a 2.19 ERA (9 ER/37.0 IP) and 40 strikeouts in six starts.

CARRER NUMBERS: Owns a record of 44-46 with a 4.09 ERA (338 ER/744.1 IP), 263 walks and 760 strikeouts over the course of nine major league seasons with the Chicago White Sox, Oakland Athletics, New York Yankees, Cincinnati Reds and Milwaukee Brewers.

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- Allowed one hit over 2.0 scoreless innings on June 21 at Philadelphia (2 K, HP)...Stranded an inherited runner in the sixth inning...Marked his longest outing since May 21 (2.1 IP)...Was his seventh scoreless outing of six or more outs which is tied for the fifth-most such appearances among major league relievers.
- On June 19 at Atlanta, allowed a season-high four earned runs over 0.2 IP (2 H, 3 BB)...Stranded two of three inherited runners after entering the game in the fifth inning...Also pitched in the sixth, giving up a two-run double to Matt Olson and then left the game with a runner on base who eventually scored...Allowed four or more runs for the third time in his career and first since June 26, 2024 at Kansas City...Also marked the first time he allowed more than one earned run this season...His three walks were his most in an outing since June 1, 2024 vs. Texas...Came on to start the 10th inning on June 17 at Atlanta and he allowed the free runner to score on a sacrifice fly for the game winning run (L, 0.2 IP, R, 2 BB)...It was his second loss of the season.

- Has gone 3-2 with one save, nine holds and a 2.38 ERA (11 ER/41.2 IP) through 32 appearances (two as an opener) this season, holding batters to a .187 average (26-139) including right-handers to a .150 average (12-80)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .125 average (8-64).
- Over his last nine home appearances (one as an opener), has posted a 1.50 ERA (2 ER/12.0 IP) with three walks and eight strikeouts.
- Has allowed six earned runs over seven appearances in the month of June after allowing just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April and May.
- Has faced the Braves 13 times in his career...Had a 9.1 scoreless inning streak vs. Atlanta from 9/2/22-9/30(G1)/24...Has allowed seven runs over his last three appearances vs. the Braves (9/30(G2)/24-6/19/25) after allowing just one run in his first 10 appearances against the club.
- Has stranded 21 of 24 inherited runners this season...His inherited runners scored percentage (12.5%) is the fourth-best mark in the majors and the second-best in the NL (min. 20 IR).
- 12 of his appearances this season have been for four or more outs...11 of those appearances have been scoreless, which is tied for the third-most in the among Major League relievers...Has posted 10 scoreless relief appearances of 1.2 innings or more which is tied with teammate José Buttó for the most such outings among Major League relievers...His seven scoreless outings of 2.0+ innings are tied for the fifth-most and he is one of seven relievers to post such numbers.
- Has produced a run value of six with his sinker this season, tied for the ninth-best among qualified Major League pitchers.

- Entered the game on June 23 vs. Atlanta with two on in the fifth inning and stranded both of those runners (1.1 IP, K)...Extended his current scoreless inning streak to 9.2 (dating back to June 7) and has not allowed an earned run in each of his last nine appearances (12.1 IP)...His nine games without an earned run marks the longest such stretch of his career as a reliever.
- On June 20 at Philadelphia, tossed 2.0 hitless innings in relief (3 K) and stranded an inherited runner in the fifth...Threw 1.1 scoreless innings on June 18 at Atlanta (H, BB).
- Has allowed just one hit to 19 batters faced in his career vs. Atlanta (BB).
