Over his last 10 games of the regular season, **Mitch Haniger** hit .351 (13x37) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 4 home runs, 10 RBI and 7 walks, getting on base at a .444 clip, slugging .730 with a 1.174 OPS.

VS. TORONTO

The Mariners and Blue Jays meet in the postseason for the first time...Seattle went 5-2 against Toronto during the 2022 regular season, with Toronto taking 2 of 3 at the Rogers Centre from May 16-18 and Seattle sweeping a 4-game series at T-Mobile Park from July 7-10.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners play game one of the best-of-three American League Wild Card Series today against the Toronto Blue Jays...the game will be televised live on **ESPN** with **Dave Flemming**, **Jessica Mendoza** and **Tim Kurkjian** on the call and broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs**, **Aaron Goldsmith**, **Dave Sims**, **Mike Blowers** and **Gary Hill Jr.**

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners finished the 2022 regular season with a 90-72 record (.556)...they went 46-35 at home and 44-37 on the road...the Mariners went 51-42 in the first half and 39-30 in the second half...Seattle was 72-17 (.809) when scoring at least 4 runs and 18-55 (.247) when scoring 3 or fewer runs during the season.

- **90 Wins** - The Mariners are 1 of 6 MLB teams to win 90+ games in both 2021 and 2022, along with the Dodgers, Astros, Yankees, Cardinals and Blue Jays.
- **Trending Up** - Seattle went 7-2 over its last 9, 21-14 over its last 35, 39-27 over its last 66, 53-30 over its last 83, 61-33 over its last 94 and 72-45 over its last 117 games of the season.
- **Extra, Extra!** - The Mariners went 11-5 in extra innings, including 6-0 in 11+ inning games during the season.
- **Walk-off Wins** - Seattle recorded 13 walk-off wins in 2022, tied for most in franchise history (2009).
- **I Want To Know What Glove Is** - The Mariners recorded a .988 fielding percentage in 2022, best in the American League and tied for 2nd-best in the Majors...Seattle's 69 errors were fewest in the AL.
- **From Fun To Run Differential** - Seattle went 90-72 with a +67 run differential (4th in the AL) during the regular season...they finished 2021 with an identical 90-72 record but with a -51 run differential (9th in the AL).
- **Mini Burgers** - Mariners pitchers limited opposing hitters to a .181 batting average (271x1497) on sliders in 2022, lowest opponent batting average on sliders in the Majors and ranking ahead of the Dodgers (.188).

THE MARINERS ARE BACK IN THE POSTSEASON...this marks the Mariners 5th postseason berth in franchise history (1995, 1997, 2000, 2001, 2022)...it marks the 2nd Wild Card berth in franchise history (2000, 2022).

JULIO RODRÍGUEZ: AL ROOKIE OF THE YEAR FRONTRUNNER...**Julio Rodríguez** batted .284 (145x511) with 84 runs scored, 25 doubles, 3 triples, 28 home runs, 75 RBI, 40 walks and 25 stolen bases, getting on base at a .345 clip, slugging .509 with an .853 OPS in 132 games during his rookie season...the 21-year-old **led Major League rookies** in home runs (28), total bases (260), slugging percentage (.509), OPS (.853), bWAR (6.0) and fWAR (5.3)...Julio ranked 3rd in hits (145), 2nd in runs (84), 2nd in RBI (75), 2nd in extra-base hits (57), 2nd in stolen bases (25) and 2nd in times on base (193)...Julio became the 3rd rookie in Major League history, and the **1st player in his debut season to reach 25+ home runs and 25+ stolen bases**...Rodríguez also became the **fastest player in Major League history** (125 career games) to reach those feats, surpassing Mike Trout-LAA (128 career games)...Rodríguez is 1 of 3 Mariners rookies to produce 6.0+ bWAR in a season, joining AL Rookie of the Year winners Alvin Davis (6.0 in 1984) and Ichiro Suzuki (7.7 in 2001)...Rodríguez was selected to the 2022 American League All-Star team along with teammate **Ty France**...Rodríguez was the only rookie All-Star in MLB.

SCOTT SERVAIS: AL MANAGER OF THE YEAR?...manager **Scott Servais** has a 528-504 (.512) record across 7 seasons (2016-c) as Mariners manager...he is the 2nd-winningest manager in franchise history, trailing only Lou Piniella (840 wins)...Servais tallied his 500th managerial win this season on Aug. 12 at Texas...since Servais took over as manager (2016-c), Seattle leads the Majors in 1-run wins (189), 1-run games (330) and winning percentage in 1-run games (.573)...Seattle also leads MLB in extra inning wins (66) and winning percentage in extra innings (.667) since Servais took over prior to the 2016 season.

WINNING MONTHS...the Mariners put together a winning month in 5 of 6 months this season (11-10 in April, 16-13 in June, 18-7 in July, 17-10 in August and 18-14 in Sept/Oct)...dating back to the start of 2021, Seattle has put together a winning month in 10 of its last 12 months.

LOS BOMBEROS...the Mariners bullpen went 34-20 with 40 saves and a 3.33 ERA (201 ER, 544.0 IP) with 181 walks and 583 strikeouts...Seattle led American League bullpens in opponent batting average (.207), WHIP (1.08), hits-per-9 innings (6.72), hard-hit rate (33.1%), opponent on-base percentage (.279) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.22), ranking 2nd in walks-per-9 innings (2.99), 3rd in strikeouts-per-9 innings (9.65) and 3rd in inherited runners scored percentage (27.6)...6 Seattle relievers recorded 50+ strikeouts out of the bullpen in 2022: **Andrés Muñoz** (96), **Penn Murfee** (74), **Paul Sewald** (72), **Erik Swanson** (69), **Matt Festa** (64) and **Diego Castillo** (53).

NUMBER ONE IN THE FIELD...the Mariners overall pitching staff went 90-72 with 40 saves and a 3.59 ERA with 447 walks and 1,391 strikeouts in 2022...they set a franchise record in strikeouts, surpassing the 1,328 strikeouts they registered in both 2018 and 2021...Seattle's 3.59 ERA ranked 3rd-best in team history, while its 1.191 WHIP ranked 2nd (1.173 WHIP in 2014) and 3.11 strikeout-to-walk ratio ranked 2nd (3.32 SO/BB in 2018)...Seattle starting pitchers tallied 79 quality starts in 2022, 3rd-most in the Majors behind Houston (94) and San Diego (84).

ONE-RUN FUN...the Mariners recorded 34 one-run wins in 2022, **most 1-run wins in the Majors** and ranking ahead of the Yankees (31)...for the second consecutive season, the Mariners led the Majors in 1-run wins, also pacing the league with 33 one-run wins in 2021...the Mariners are the first team to have sole possession of the Major League lead in 1-run wins in back-to-back seasons since the National League's Cincinnati Reds 124 years ago, in 1897-98...the most recent team to have at least a share of the Major League lead in 1-run wins in back-to-back seasons were the Los Angeles Dodgers in 1983-84.

RALEIGH TIME...**Cal Raleigh** batted .211 (78x370) with 46 runs, 20 doubles, 1 triple, 27 home runs, 63 RBI and 38 walks, getting on base at a .284 clip, slugging .489 with a .774 OPS in 119 games in 2022...the 25-year-old backstop set a franchise record for most homers (27) by a catcher in a season, surpassing Mike Zunino (25 HR) in 2017...Raleigh also led Major League catchers in homers, ranking ahead of Will Smith-LAD (24).

GENO AT THE HOT CORNER...**Eugenio Suárez** batted .236 (128x543) with 76 runs, 24 doubles, 2 triples, 31 home runs, 87 RBI and 73 walks, getting on base at a .332 clip, slugging .459 with a .791 OPS in 150 games in 2022...the third baseman led the Mariners in homers (31), RBI (87) and extra-base hits (57) in his first season with the team...Suárez supplied 2 walk-off home runs (7/8 vs. TOR, 9/11 vs. ATL) and hit the 200th home run of his Major League career on May 16 at Toronto.

VIVE LA FRANCE...**Ty France** batted .276 (152x551) with 65 runs, 27 doubles, 1 triple, 20 home runs, 84 RBI, 35 walks and 21 hit-by-pitches, getting on base at a .340 clip, slugging .437 with a .777 OPS in 140 games in 2022...the first baseman registered the first 20+ home run, 20+ hit-by-pitch season in Mariners history...France was selected to the 2022 American League All-Star team alongside teammate **Julio Rodríguez**.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners hit 47 home runs in September/October...the 47 homers were tied for 7th-most homers in a month in franchise history, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that **the Mariners led the Majors in home runs (86) since Aug. 1?**...Seattle homered 86 times over its last 59 games of the regular season, out-homering Atlanta (85) and St. Louis (84) during that span...overall on the season, Seattle finished with 197 home runs, tied for 9th-most in the Majors...**AND DID YOU ALSO KNOW?**...that Seattle homered in 20 consecutive games from July 2-27, the longest homer streak in the Majors in 2022?...Seattle went 17-3 (.850) during their home run streak, becoming the **first team in Major League history** to homer in 20+ consecutive games and maintain a winning percentage of .850 or better during the streak.

ABOUT CASTILLO...

- The 29-year-old right-hander is set to make his 2nd career Postseason start...has made 1 career regular season against Toronto.
Has been named an All-Star in 2019 and 2022.
Originally signed as an international free agent by the San Francisco Giants on 12/23/11.
Made MLB debut on 6/23/17 vs. Washington (w/ Cincinnati)
Acquired by the Mariners in a trade with Cincinnati on 7/29/22 in exchange for minor leaguers Noelvi Marte (inf), Edwin Arroyo (inf), Levi Stoudt (rhp) and Andrew Moore (rhp).

LAST TIME OUT...W#8 in final start of the regular season on 10/1 vs. Oakland...tossed 6.0 innings allowing 1 run on 2 hits and 1 walk while striking out 8...threw just 77 pitches.

LA PIEDRA IN THE POSTSEASON...has made 1 career post-season start, tossing 5.1 innings, allowing just 1 run on 6 hits and 1 walk with 7 strikeouts against Atlanta in the 2020 Wild Card Round while with Cincinnati...allowed only an RBI-double to Ronald Acuña Jr....became just the second Reds pitcher ever to record at least 7 strikeouts while only allowing 1 run or less in a Postseason debut, joining Hod Eller (9k, 1919 World Series Game 5 at White Sox).

MADE FOR OCTOBER...In 11 starts this season against teams that qualified for the 2022 Postseason, Castillo had a 1.78 ERA (14 ER, 70.2 IP) with 74 strikeouts and 21 walks...made 3 starts against NYY, 2 starts against CLE, 1 start against TOR, TB, STL, SD, LAD and ATL...did not face PHI, NYM or ATL in 2022.

GAVE THE JAYS THE BLUES...lone career start against Toronto came on May 20, 2022 at the Rogers Centre...allowed 2 runs over 6.0 innings with 5 strikeouts.

AMONG THE GAME'S BEST...since he made his season debut on 5/9, Castillo ranks among the MLB leaders in ERA (16th, 2.99), strikeouts (16th, 167), batting average against (13th, .212/118x557), SO/9 (10th, 10.0) and fWAR (T9th, 3.7).

THE STONE WAS ROLLING...began his start on 9/7 vs. Chicago-AL by striking out the first 7 batters he faced, setting a franchise record for most strikeouts to begin a start, passing Michael Pineda (5 on 7/9/11 at LAA)...the 7 strikeouts also tied the AL record for most strikeouts to begin a game (done 4x, last: Blake Snell-TB, 6/3/18 vs. SEA).

OFF TO A GOOD START...struck out 77 batters through his first 11 Mariners appearances, the most in franchise history, ahead of Cliff Lee (76) and teammate Robbie Ray, who fanned 74 through his first 10 appearances with the club.

NOW THAT'S QUALITY...recorded 8-consecutive quality starts from 6/28-8/15, a career-best streak (previous: 5, 2x 8/14-9/5/21 and 6/15-7/6/21 w/CIN)...tossed a quality start in each of his first 3 starts with Seattle (8/3-8/15).

A PERFORMANCE FOR THE AGES...ND on 8/9 against New York-NL...tossed 8.0 scoreless innings allowing just 3 hits and 2 walks while striking out 7 on 110 pitches, 72 for strikes...marked the 5th time in his career he has thrown 8.0+ innings, and just the 2nd time he has tossed 8.0+ scoreless innings (also: 9/21/18 at MIA)...induced 20 swings-and-misses, the 3rd-most he has induced in a game this season.

MAIDEN VOYAGE...struck out 8 in his first start with the Mariners on 8/3 at New York-AL...8 strikeouts are tied for the 3rd-most in a Mariners debut (also: Cliff Lee), trailing Andy Benes and Enrique Romo who struck out 9...Benes and Castillo both made their Mariners debuts on Aug. 3, after being acquired by the Mariners at the trade deadline.

LA PIEDRA...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed 1 run in 3-consecutive starts from 7/3-7/14/22, striking out 22 batters over the 3 starts...3-consecutive starts of 7.0+ innings while allowing no more than 1 run is tied for the longest streak in the Majors with 5 other pitchers...marked the 1st time in his career he has tossed 7.0+ innings in 3-consecutive starts.

WHIFF ARTIST...since 2017 (the season Castillo made his MLB debut), Luis has induced 2,109 swings-and-misses, 7th-most in the Majors over that span...he leads all pitchers since 2017 with 894 whiffs on his changeup, ranking ahead of Lucas Giolito-CWS (701) and Kyle Hendricks-CHC (691).

PITCH PERFECT...his 4-seam fastball (-18) and slider (-8) have been his most effective pitches according to Baseball Savant's run value metric.

SEASON-HIGH PUNCHIES...struck out a season-high 11 batters on 6/28 at Chicago-NL over 6.0 scoreless innings...marked the 2nd-time he has struck out 10+ this season, and the 14th time in his career...induced 23 swings-and-misses according to Baseball Savant, tied for the 6th-most he has induced in a game in his career (most: 26, 2x 7/15/19 and 8/5/19).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR...was named to his second All-Star team this season (also: 2019)...tossed a scoreless inning with 2 strikeouts at Dodger Stadium in this year's All-Star Game, presented by Mastercard, in Los Angeles.

COMPLETELY DOMINANT...threw his first career complete game on 9/11/20 at St. Louis with the Reds...allowed just 1 run on 2 hits and 3 walks with 6 strikeouts over 9.0 innings, earning the win for his efforts.

RARE AIR...from 3/28-4/9/19, Castillo became the 3rd pitcher in MLB history to record 3+ consecutive starts with at least 8 strikeouts and no more than 2 hits allowed, joining Rube Marquard for the 1911 New York Giants and Randy Johnson for the 1997 Mariners.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: LHP ROBBIE RAY (12-12, 3.71 IN 2022 AND 0-2, 5.59 IN POSTSEASON CAREER)

31-year-old left-hander is making his 4th career Postseason appearance and 2nd start...L#12 in last start on 10/2 vs. OAK (5.2,8,6,5,3,3,3 HR)...W#8 on 7/15 at TEX, setting season-high with 12 strikeouts...W#1 on Opening Day at Minnesota (7.0,3,1,1,4,5,HR)...was named the 2021 American League Cy Young Award winner for the 1st time in his career after going 13-7 with an American League-leading 2.84 ERA (61 ER, 193.1 IP) while striking out an MLB-high 248 batters...was one of 5 starting pitchers to be named to the All-MLB team following the 2021 season...CAREER: Is a veteran of 9 Major League seasons with Detroit (2014), Arizona (2015-20), Toronto (2020-21) and Seattle (2022)...made his Major League debut with Detroit on May 6, 2014 vs. Houston...came into the 2022 season as Major League Baseball's all-time leader in strikeouts-per-9 innings (11.21), minimum 1,000 innings pitched...his 1,241 strikeouts over his first 1,000 career innings pitched are the most all-time over a player's first 1,000 career innings in MLB history...drafted by Washington in the 12th round of the 2010 MLB First Year Player Draft out of Brentwood High School (TN)...signed a 5-year MLB contract with Seattle on 11/30/21...POSTSEASON: has made 3 career Postseason appearances (1 GS)...owns a career 5.59 ERA (6 ER, 9.2 IP) in the Playoffs...vs. TOR...has made 3 starts in his career against Toronto, going 1-1 with a 3.50 ERA (7 ER, 18.0 IP) with 24 strikeouts...made 1 start against Toronto in 2022, allowing just 1 run on 3 hits and 2 walks with 6 strikeouts.
