HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Happy 29th Birthday to RHP Edwin Diaz...We wish him well today.

ROSTER MOVES: C Francisco Álvarez has been optioned to Triple-A Syracuse...C Nick Meyer has been reassigned to minor league camp.

MONDAY: The Mets fell to the Nationals, 3-2, in West Palm Beach...RHP Justin Verlander made his fourth start of the spring and allowed two runs on two hits, six walks and three strikeouts...CF Tommy Pham put the Mets on the board with an RBI single in the first...2B José Peraza added an RBI single in the ninth...RHP Dennis Santana tossed a scoreless innings in his first spring outing with the Mets...RHP Drew Smith struck out the side in the eighth.

SPEAKIN EASY: Yesterday, the Mets unveiled the Cadillac Club at Payson's, a new and first of its kind exclusive speakeasy membership club to Citi Field... Located inches away from the warning track in right field, The Cadillac Club at Payson's is a hideaway club that will provide fans with a trendy, intimate and up-close space for those looking for a unique ballpark experience. The members only space will feature a private bar with sightlines to the field and elevated dining options...The Cadillac Club at Payson's is a controlled climate club that also features premium lounge style seating, personal flat screen monitors, in-seat storage, personal beverage coolers, an in-stadium concierge, and unique Cadillac touches and finishes throughout...The club is named after Joan Whitney Payson, the Mets first owner and a pioneer... Payson became the first woman to purchase a majority ownership stake in a major league team.

SMILING IN THE SPRING: INF Francisco Lindor has had a successful spring both in Grapefruit League play and the World Baseball Classic...In eight Spring Training games, Lindor has batted .381/.480/.714 with two home runs and four RBI...In the WBC, Lindor batted .450 with six runs and five RBI in five games with Team Puerto Rico.

WELCOME BACK: Former Mets pitchers Al Leiter and John Franco will be in camp from March 20-27...A National League All-Star in 2000, Leiter won double-digit games in seven straight years (1998-2004) and ranks in the top 10 in franchise history in wins, innings, strikeouts and quality starts...The Toms River, NJ native will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on June 3 along with LHP Al Leiter and broadcasters Gary Cohen and Howie Rose...Franco spent 14 of his 21 major league season in Queens and is the franchise leader in saves and games pitched... The Brooklyn, NY native was inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame in 2012.

JUST(IN) SIMPLY AMAZIN: RHP Justin Verlander leads all qualified pitchers with a .145 opponent's batting average this spring...The 40-year-old ranks third among qualifiers in WHIP (0.88), sixth in ERA (2.25), tied for sixth in innings (16.0) and tied for ninth in strikeouts (19).

THAT'S MY DJ: OF DJ Stewart is batting .435/.581/.783 in 14 games this spring...The 29-year-old is tied for 12th in the majors with 11 RBI this spring and five of his 10 hits have gone for extra-bases...On March 19, Stewart hit for the cycle and drove in four runs in the Mets 8-7 loss to the Cardinals...Stewart was the first player to hit for the cycle in Spring Training since former Mets OF Johneshwy Fargas accomplished the feat on March 5, 2020

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Last season, INF Francisco Lindor set a Mets shortstop record for most RBI in a season with a career-high 107 RBI...The 28-year-old has led all shortstops with 184 home runs since he debuted in 2015...Lindor is one of 11 players to hit 150 or more homers and swipe 100 or more bags since 2015.

THE BUCK STARTS HERE: In his first season as Mets skipper, Buck Showalter took home the NL Manager of the Year Award...He led the club to 101 wins and its first playoff berth since 2016...Showalter was also named Manager of the Year in 1994 with the Yankees, 2004 with the Rangers and 2014 with the Orioles... His four Manager of the Year Awards are tied for the most in the award's history with Bobby Cox and Tony La Russa...Showalter ranks 18th all-time and third among active managers with 1,652 managerial wins... Showalter is the first Mets manager to record 100 or more victories in his first season with the club...He joins Yogi Berra as the only managers to guide both the Mets and Yankees into the playoffs.

TOMÁS THE TANK ENGINE: C Tomás Nido has a .344/.364/.688 slashline in 11 games this spring... Five of Nido's 11 hits this spring have gone for extra-bases, including three home runs...The 28-year-old has hit safely in nine of 11 Grapefruit League games.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: Several Mets relievers have had stellar springs so far...RHP Jimmy Yacabonis and RHP Tommy Hunter each have not allowed a run in 6.0 innings... RHP Drew Smith has allowed one earned run and has struck out 11 batters over 6.0 innings this spring...RHP John Curtiss has allowed two earned runs on four hits over 6.2 innings in Grapefruit League play...RHP Jeff Brigham has allowed two runs with eight strikeouts in 6.2 innings of work...LHP Zach Muckenhirn has yet to allow an earned run in 5.0 innings.

GET OUT THE TAPE MEASURE: INF Ronny Mauricio has belted four home runs this spring, two of which have traveled 450+ feet...Mauricio's four homers this spring have traveled an average distance of 432 feet.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: Several of the Mets top prospects are among the major league leaderboard in several offensive categories this spring...Ronny Mauricio is tied for fifth in the majors with four home runs...Brett Baty leads all qualified batters with a .342 batting average, is second among qualifiers in OBP (.468), and is 12th in OPS (.915)...Mark Vientos is tied for 12th in the majors with 11 RBI.

T-LO: Tim Lincecum has had an excellent spring and is among the major league lead in several offensive categories...Lincecum is tied for third in stolen bases (six), fifth in OBP (.417), sixth in OPS (.978), tied for eighth in runs (10), ninth in SLG (.561) and 12th in average (.317).

POLAR POWER: Last season, INF Pete Alonso tied for the major league lead with 131 RBI, the most ever by a Met in a single season...Alonso finished third in the majors with 40 home runs in 2022 and became the first Met ever with multiple seasons of 40 or more home runs...His 146 career home runs are the fourth most by a major leaguer through his first four major league seasons trailing Ralph Kiner (168), Albert Pujols (160) and Eddie Mathews (153)...Alonso ranks seventh in franchise history in home runs...He is three home runs behind Carlos Beltrán and trails Dave Kingman by eight long balls.

EXPECTED TO START

RHP KODAI SENGA: Will make his third start of the spring tonight...Enters the season as the 16th-best prospect in baseball according to Baseball America...Spent the past 11 seasons in Japan's Nippon Professional Baseball with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...Went 87-44 with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0) in his NPB career...Is a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017, 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019, 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019, 2020)...Will become the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team.

McFarland (minor league free agent), INF Danny Mendick (free agent), LHP Zach Muckenhirn (minor league free agent), C Omar Narváez (free agent), INF José Peraza (minor league free agent), OF Tommy Pham (free agent), LHP José Quintana (free agent), LHP Brooks Raley (trade), RHP Denyi Reyes (minor league free agent), RHP Stephen Ridings (waiver claim), RHP David Robertson (free agent), RHP Kodai Senga (free agent), OF DJ Stewart (minor league free agent), RHP William Woods (minor league free agent), RHP Justin Verlander (free agent) and RHP Jimmy Yacabonis (minor league free agent).

THAT'S A LOTTA HARDWARE: With Justin Verlander and Max Scherzer, the 2023 Mets are the third team in major league history to boast multiple three-time Cy Young award winners on their roster in the same season, joining the 1986 White Sox (Tom Seaver and Steve Carlton) and the 2021 Dodgers (Scherzer and Clayton Kershaw).

THE BATTING CHAMP IS HERE: Last season, INF/OF Jeff McNeil became the first Met ever to win a major league batting title and joined José Reyes (2011) as the only other Met to win a National League batting title...The two-time All-Star owns a .307 career batting average, the second-best clip by a Met through their first five big league seasons behind David Wright's .309 mark (min. 1,500 AB).
