METSELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Yankees, 8-7, last night...New York is 4.0 games back for the second Wild Card spot...The Mets are 23-32 (does not include the resumption of the April 11 suspended game on August 28) since the All-Star break... The Mets continue their penultimate homestand of the season (1-1), a nine-game, 10-day stand against the Yankees (1-1), the Cardinals (three games) and Phillies (three games).

SUBWAY SERIES: The Mets and Yankees finish the Subway Series tonight...The Mets are 3-2 against the Yankees this season...The two teams will face each other a total of six times this year, three games from July 3-4 and this weekend at Citi Field...The two teams went 3-3 against each other last season...The Mets and Yankees have gone .500 against one another in each of the last three seasons.

ONE IS THE LONELIEST NUMBER: Each of the last eight Mets losses have been by one run...That is the longest streak in franchise history, surpassing the previous high of six straight losses by one run from June 9-19, 1998...15 of the team's last 17 losses have been by one run...Overall, the Mets are 27-30 in one run games this season... Courtesy of Elias.

FIRST IS THE WORST: Carlos Carrasco has posted a 14.63 ERA (13 earned runs/8.0 innings) with two walks and five strikeouts in the first inning this season...He has allowed six first inning home runs in this season...Outside of the first frame, Carrasco has posted a 3.16 ERA (nine earned runs/25.2 innings) with four walks and 27 strikeouts...He has allowed only one home run outside the initial frame.

MEET THE METS: The Mets are batting .308/.398/.467 with 14 extra-base hits, 22 walks and an .865 OPS in five games against the Yankees this year...They have scored seven or more runs in four of the team's five games...The Mets have scored seven or more runs in 18 of the team's other 138 games...The Mets have outscored the Yankees 37-23 this season...The team's 37 runs is the their third-highest total against the Yankees in a single season...The 2004 Mets scored 43 runs in six games and the 2009 Mets scored 38 in six contests as well.

JAVY A NICE DAY: Javier Báez has reached base safely in each of his last nine starts...He is batting .472 (17-36) with 13 runs, four doubles, four home runs, eight RBI, two walks, a .537 OBP and an .917 SLG in that span...Since returning from the injured list on August 22, Javier Báez is batting .352 (25-71) with 19 runs, seven doubles, six home runs, 12 RBI, a .410 OBP, a .704 SLG and a 1.114 OPS...In 30 games with the Mets, Báez has hit .299/.359/.589 with 24 runs, seven doubles, eight home runs, 16 RBI, five walks and a 1.58 OPS+.

CONNECT FOUR: Báez is on a four game hitting streak, batting .533 (8-15) with six runs, two doubles, two home runs, four RBI, two walks three steals, a .588 OBP and a 1.067 SLG in that span.

LET'S GO STREAKING: The Mets have homered in nine straight games, their longest streak of the season...The Mets have hit 16 home runs in that span...New York has homered in 16 of their last 17 games (including the resumption of the April 11 suspended game on August 28), hitting 27 home runs in that span...The Mets hit 90 home runs in the first-half and have hit 67 in the second-half...The Mets are 53-44 when hitting at least one home run this season and 25-13 when hitting two or more.

IT'S BEEN TWO WEEKS: Michael Conforto is batting .292 (14-48) with 11 runs, a double, four home runs, 14 RBI, a .404 OBP and a .563 SLG over his last 14 games...In 39 games since the start of August, Conforto is batting .276/.390/.480 with 23 runs, seven doubles, six home runs, 20 RBI, 19 walks and an .870 OPS...This compares to a 1.98/.322/.324 slashline with 16 extra-base hits and 25 RBI in his first 69 games.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked in five of their last seven games, a total of seven times in that span...In 25 games since August 16, the Mets have been hit 27 times by pitches...That is the most in the majors in that span...Overall the Mets have been hit by 87 pitches this season...That is the third-most in the majors and in the National League...Since 2019, the Mets have been plunked by 227 pitches...That is the most in the majors in that span.

WE NEED TO TALK ABOUT KEVIN: Over his last 13 games, Kevin Pillar is batting .342 (13-38) with nine runs, three doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI, two walks, a .422 OBP, a .737 SLG and a 1.159 OPS.

BOTH BOROUGHS, BOTH TEAMS: There have been 147 players who have played for both the Mets and Yankees.

THEY'RE OUT OF OUR LEAGUE: The Mets are 8-9 in Interleague play this year and went 9-11 against the American League last year...The team's .513 winning percentage (225-214) is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit vs. AL clubs since Interleague play began in 1997.

METS-YANKEES NOTES: The Mets and Yankees have split the season series for the three consecutive years...With a win tonight, the Mets would secure their first series win over the Yankees since 2013, when they went 4-0.

STARTING OFF: The Mets rotation has posted a 3.06 ERA (12 earned runs/35.1 innings) with five walks and 40 strikeouts over the last six games...The staff has gone at least 5.0 innings in each of those games...Overall this season, the starting rotation has posted a 3.68 ERA (286 earned runs/699.2 innings) with 191 walks and 717 strikeouts...Their 3.68 ERA ranks sixth in the majors and fourth in the National League.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets own a 42-28 record with a 3.28 ERA with 214 walks and 657 strikeouts at home...The Mets has secured a winning season at home...The Mets have had winning seasons at home in two of their last three years (also, 2019)... The team's 3.28 ERA at home is the fourth-best in the majors...This compares to a 29-44 record with a 4.23 ERA (287 earned runs/611.1 innings) with 192 walks and 624 strikeouts on the road this year.

A CENTURY: Pete Alonso become just the eighth player in major league history to hit 100 or more homers within their first three major league seasons...He became the second-fastest player in major league history to hit 100 home runs, hitting 101 in 347 games...Only Ryan Howard, 100 home runs in 325 games, was faster...He collected his 10th career multi-home run game last night...His 10 multi-homer games are tied with Kevin McReynolds and Bobby Bonilla for the ninth-most in franchise history... Darryl Strawberry is the franchise's record holder with 22 multi-home run games.

MOVIN' ON UP: Michael Conforto has hit 130 home runs, which is seventh on the team's all-time list...Carlos Beltrán is next with 149 home runs as a Met...Pete Alonso is now 15th on the team's all-time home runs list with 101 home runs...Carlos Delgado is 14th with 104 home runs...15 players, including Alonso have hit 100 or more home runs with the franchise...Alonso's 101 home runs are the most in the majors since he entered the league in 2019.

VILLAR THE WORLD: In 54 games following the All-Star break, Jonathan Villar is batting .290/.353/.464 with 25 runs, six doubles, a triple, eight home runs, 17 walks, 21 RBI and an .818 OPS...This compares to a .236/.318/.438 slashline with 21 extra-base hits and 19 RBI in 69 games before the break.

FIRST CLASS: In 44 games batting first this season, Jonathan Villar is hitting .293/.376/.494 with 32 runs, 10 doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 14 RBI and 21 walks...The Mets are 27-17 in games Villar leads off...His .293 average when batting first is ninth in the majors.

GIMME A BREAK: The Mets are batting .249/.323/.414 with 88 doubles, six triples, 67 home runs, 203 RBI and 159 walks in 55 games following the All-Star break...This compares to a .232/.311/.375 slashline with 113 doubles, six triples, 90 home runs, 319 RBI and 270 walks in 88 games prior to the break.

PINCH ME: The Mets are batting .256/.327/.444 when pinch-hitting this season... Their .256 batting average is the best in the National League and the fourth-best in the majors...Their 43 RBI are the most in the majors, while their eight home runs are tied for fourth.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1969, the Mets swept a doubleheader against the Expos to win their ninth in a row...The Mets won both games by a score of 1-0...The Mets declared victory in game one thanks to a complete game shut out by Jerry Koosman...He allowed only three hits, three walks and struck out four...He drove in the team's lone run with an RBI single in the fifth...Don Cardwell dominated in game two, allowing four hits with a walk and struck out three in 8.0 innings of work...Like Koosman in game one, Cardwell provided the team's lone run with an RBI single in the second... ALSO ON THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1984, Doc Gooden recorded his 251 strikeout to set a modern record for most strikeouts by a rookie...Gooden tossed a complete game shutout, allowing only five hits and striking out 16 as the Mets defeated the Pirates, 2-0, at Shea Stadium...He would go on to finish the season with a 17-9 record, a 2.60 ERA, walking 73 and striking out a National League leading 276 hitters... He was an All-Star that season, won the NL Rookie of the Year award and finished second to Rick Sucliff in NL Cy Young Award voting.

CARRASCO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his first win with the Mets against the Marlins on September 7...Allowed four runs (one earned) on seven hits, one walk, and four strikeouts in 5.0 innings of work...Threw a season-high 92 pitches.

VS. YANKEES: Tonight, Carrasco will 13th career appearance (10th start) against the Yankees...Lifetime, Carrasco is 5-5 with a 4.04 ERA (25 earned runs/55.2 innings) against the Bronx Bombers...Since 2013 Carrasco is 4-4 against the Yankees with a 3.83 ERA (19 earned runs/44.2 innings), a 1.030 WHIP, and a 10.07 SO/9 rate

SUCCESS IN SEPTEMBER: In 59 games (43 starts) in September, Carrasco is 18-16 with a 3.33 ERA (106 earned runs/286.2 innings)...His 18 wins, 59 appearances, 43 starts, 286.2 innings and 323 strikeouts are his highest totals in any month for Carrasco...Since 2014, Carrasco is 16-12 with a 2.83 (71 earned runs/225.2 innings) in 45 games (33 starts) in September.

2020 REVIEW: In his 11th big league season, Carrasco finished with a 3-4 record and a 2.91 ERA (22 earned runs/68.0 innings), seventh best in the American League... Carrasco ranked sixth in the AL in strikeouts with (82), eighth in innings pitched (68.0), ninth in opponent average (.221), and 10th in HR/9 (1.06)...In is final six starts of the season, Carrasco went 1-1 with a 1.66 ERA (seven earned runs/38.0 innings).

CAREER REVIEW: Prior to joining the Mets, Carrasco pitched in 11 major league seasons, going 88-73 with a 3.77 ERA (520 earned runs/1242.1 innings) in 242 career games (195 starts), all with Cleveland...Carrasco was tied for the American League lead with 18 wins in 2017 and finished 4th in AL Cy Young voting that season... Since 2015, Carrasco is one of ten pitchers to have at least three seasons of 200+ strikeouts (2015, 2017, 2018)...From 2015-2020, Carrasco had 69 wins, tied for the 10th-most during that span.

VENEZUELAN SENSATION: On September 2, Carrasco passed Wilson Alvarez to move into sixth place all-time for most strikeouts by a Venezuelan-born pitcher... Carrasco is 11 wins away from becoming the eighth pitcher from Venezuela to reach 100 career wins.

NO FREE PASSES: In his first eight starts with the Mets, Carrasco has issued one walk or fewer in each of those starts...That is tied with Bartolo Colon (2015) and AI Leiter (2001) for the third highest total by a Met starting pitcher to begin the season... It is the highest total by a Met starter in their first season with the franchise.

C IS FOR COMMUNITY: In 2019, Carrasco earned the Roberto Clemente Award for his numerous community endeavors...Formed two foundations in 2016, one in the U.S. and one in his native Venezuela...He and his family have raised nearly \$2.7 million, primarily sending medical supplies to his native Venezuela, the Dominican Republic and Puerto Rico...Has donated thousands of books via his book drive in Cleveland and in his offseason home of Tampa, he helps to feed and clothe immigrants from Venezuela...Collected thousands of books through the United Way Stuff The Bus initiative, as well as collecting food items for the Step Up To The Plate. Campaign.

#59 IS #57: Carrasco became the 57th player used by the Mets this season, breaking the previous franchise record of 56 players used in 2018...He became the 17th starter used by the Mets this year...Only the 1967 Mets used more starters.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP RICH HILL (6-6, 3.82 ERA)

LAST START: Allowed one earned run in 6.0 innings on five hits, zero walks, and eight strikeouts against the Marlins on September 8...Has allowed three runs or fewer in his last six outings.

METS WHO PLAYED FOR THE YANKEES: Hill is the 147th player to suit up for both the Mets and Yankees...He is the eighth player to join that list in 2021... Brandon Drury, Cameron Maybin, Billy McKinney, Stephen Tarpley and Mason Williams all played for the Mets this year after previously appearing in a Yankees uniform...Jay Bruce and Darren O'Day made their Yankees debuts in 2021 after previous stints with the Mets.
