TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue their opening series against the Houston Astros today at Minute Maid Park...today is the third (0-2) of a 4-game series at the Astros...following Monday's game, the Mariners will travel to Anaheim for a 3-game series at the Angels: July 28-30...today's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS NW and broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle and the Mariners Radio Network.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners continue their opening series against the Astros...are playing their third (0-2) of 20 consecutive games to open the 2020 season...are next scheduled to have an off day on Aug. 13.

- First Opening Day - 10 Mariners players are making their first appearance on an Opening Day roster: Justin Dunn, Kyle Lewis, Shed Long Jr., Tim Lopes, Matt Magill, Anthony Misiewicz, José Marmolejos, Austin Nola, Yohan Ramirez, Justus Sheffield and Evan White.
- Service Time - the Mariners have three players with at least seven years of Major League service time: Kyle Seager (8.085), Bryan Shaw (8.081) and Dee Gordon (7.154)... 14 players on the Mariners roster have less than 1 year of service time...(service time as of Opening Day).
- Young \& Old - third baseman Kyle Seager (32 years, 265 days) is the oldest player on the Mariners Opening Day active roster...left-handed pitcher Nick Margevicius ( 24 years, 37 days) is the youngest player on the Mariners Opening Day active roster.
- International Game - the Mariners Opening Day roster is represented by four countries: Cuba (Nestor Cortes), Dominican Republic (Yohan Ramirez), Japan (Yusei Kikuchi), United States (27 players).
-2019 in Review - Completed the 2019 season 68-94 (.420), finishing 5th in the American League West (39.0 games behind division-winner Houston)...went 35-46 (.432) at home and 33-48 (.407) on the road...were 23-26 in one-run games and 9-4 when games went to extra-innings.
- Score!...Kyle Seager is 2 runs scored away from 600 in his career....he will become only the 6th players in franchise history to score at least 600 runs as a Mariner....he will join Edgar Martinez $(1,219)$, Ichiro Suzuki $(1,181)$, Ken Griffey Jr. $(1,113)$, Jay Buhner (790) and Alex Rodriguez (627) as the only Mariners players in club history with at least 600 runs scored.
GOODBYE BASEBALL...after belting 6 home runs in 18 games last season - and becoming the first player in Major League history to homer in 6 of his 10 career games - Kyle Lewis picked up right where he left off homering in each of his first two games this season...Lewis' 8 home runs in his first 20 career games are 2nd-most of any Mariner in his first 20 career games...he trails only Alvin Davis (9), while ranking ahead of Bucky Jacobsen (6), Greg Pirkl (6), Dae-Ho Lee (5), Wladimir Balentien (5) and Justin Leone (5)... via STATS INC.

HOMER HAPPY...since making his Major League debut on Sept. 10, 2019, Kyle Lewis has homered 8 times in 20 games...during this stretch his 8 home runs are tied with Eloy Jimenez, Matt Olson and Jorge Soler for 2nd-most in the Major Leagues...he trails only George Springer's 9 home runs dating back to Sept. 10, 2019.
MARINER MILESTONES...with his 4th-inning home run on Thursday night, Kyle Seager equaled Alvin Davis for the 4th-most RBI in club history with 667 career RBI...Hall of Famer Edgar Martinez $(1,261)$ holds the all-time club record, followed by Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. $(1,216)$ and Jay Buhner (951)...Seager's home run last night also marked his 199th career home run...with his next homer, Seager will become the 4th player in club history to record at least 200 home runs for the Mariners; he will join Griffey (417), Martinez (309) and Buhner (307)...since his debut season of 2011, Seager ranks 7th among left-handed batters in RBI (667) and 8th in home runs (199).
BULLPEN BULLY ...since making his Major League debut in 2011, Bryan Shaw has made 607 career appearances...his 607 appearances are currently T7th-most (also: Tony Watson) in the Major Leagues among all active pitchers...he trails only Joe Smith (782), Tyler Clippard (752), Joakim Soria (711), Sergio Romo (708), Oliver Perez (670) and David Robertson (661).
ALL HANDS ON DECK...in the first two games of the season, the Mariners have used 21 players, including 10 pitchers...the only active players yet to appear in a game for the Mariners this season are Dan Altavilla, Justin Dunn, Kendall Graveman, Joe Hudson, Yusei Kikuchi, Matt Magill, Dylan Moore, Nick Margevicius and Justus Sheffield.
YOUTH MOVEMENT ...the Mariners fielded the youngest Opening Day roster in the Majors with an average age of 27 years, 259 days (ages on 7/24)...ranked ahead of San Diego (27.349), Miami (28.017), Detroit (28.029) and Kansas City (28.047)...Seattle's roster includes just 5 players with at least 4 years of MLB service time and features 14 players with less than 1 year of MLB service.
WHO ARE THESE GUYS? ...Dee Gordon and Marco Gonzales are the only players remaining on the Mariners active roster from the 2019 Opening Day lineup (Mitch Haniger is currently on the IL, and Kyle Seager was on the IL for Opening Day last season)...the Mariners did not return a position player from their Opening Day starting lineup in 2019 to 2020.
SUMMER CAMP RECAP...the Mariners played 12 intrasquad games at T-Mobile Park during Mariners Summer Camp...Kyle Lewis led the way on offense, batting .435 ( $10 \times 23$ ) with 4 home runs, 7 RBI and 5 walks in 9 games...Justin Sheffield was a standout for the pitching staff, tossing 9.0 innings and allowing just 1 run (1.00 ERA) with no walks and 13 strikeouts over 3 outings.
IT'S A SPRINT....as part of its COVID-19 response, Major League Baseball has restructured the 2020 schedule to span only 60 games compared to the normal $162 \ldots$ the Mariners will face off against the AL West in 40 games and the NL West in 20 games... with the shorter season, each game in the 2020 season carries the equivalent weight of 2.7 regular season games in a typical MLB season...the trade deadline will take place on August 31.

AS YOU KNOW...J.P. Crawford went 3-for-4 with 1 run score and 2 triples yesterday vs. the Astros... BUT DID YOU KNOW?...Crawford is 15th Mariners player to record a club record 2 triples in a game and first since Kyle Seager on June 2 at NYY (4x5, 3 R, 2B, 2 3B, HR, 3 RBI)? ....he joins Larry Cox (9/25/1979 at MIL), Spike Owen (6/28/1983 vs. CWS), Steve Henderson (9/13/1983 vs. TOR), Al Cowens (7/20/1985 at MIL), Danny Tartabull ( $5 / 13 / 1986$ vs. MIL), Phil Bradley (5/22/1987 vs. TOR), Dave Valle (6/26/1987 at KC), Edgar Martinez ( $5 / 3 / 1992$ at BAL), Joey Cora ( $6 / 28 / 1996$ vs. TEX), Mark McLemore ( $10 / 5 / 2001 \mathrm{vs}$. TEX), Ichiro Suzuki (4/21/2002 vs. TEX), Carlos Guillen (5/9/2003 vs. CWS), Brad Miller (7/5/2013 at CIN) and Seager (6/2/2014 at NYY).

- 29-year-old left-hander is making his 1st start of the season, his 33rd Major League start and his 5th career start against the Astros.
- Signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021 with options through 2025.
- Native of Morioka, Japan...pitched for Hanamaki Higashi High School
- Was the top pick in the 2009 NPB Draft by the Saitama Seibu Lions of Japan's Pacific League.
- In 7 seasons with Seibu, was $69-45$ with a 2.69 ERA ( 286 ER 956.1 IP) with 879 strikeouts and 363 walks in 148 games (144 starts)...had 13 complete games, including 7 shutouts.
- Resides in Tokyo, Japan with wife, Rumi (married in 2016), and son, Leo...Rumi previously worked as a broadcaster for NHK TV.
SPRING RECAP...made 3 starts in Spring Training in Arizona, goin 1-1 with a 4.05 ERA (3 ER, 6.2 IP ) with 5 walks and 10 strikeouts, in what was his second career Spring Training with Seattle.
SUMMER CAMP RECAP...went 0-2 with a 7.11 ERA (5 ER, 6.1 IP) over 2 games in Summer Camp in Seattle...struck out 4 batters while walking 6.
2019 RECAP....went 6-11 with a 5.46 ERA ( 98 ER, 161.2 IP ) with 50 walks and 116 strikeouts in first Major League season.. led American rookies with 161.2 innings pitched, ranking 4th in strikeouts (116).
ROOKKKKKKIE LEADER...finished his rookie campaign ranked 6th all-time among Mariners rookies with 116 strikeouts during his rookie campaign, trailing only Matt Young (130), Roenis Elías (143), Freddy García (170), Michael Pineda (173) and Mark Langston (204)...his 116 strikeouts also ranked 4th among American League rookies in 2019 (most: Trent Thornton-TOR, 149).

RELIABLE ROOKIE...was just the 6th player in Mariners history to make 30 starts in his rookie season, the first since Freddy García in 1999...he joins Matt Young (1983), Mark Langston (1984), Rich DeLucia, Dave Fleming (1992) and Freddy García (1999)...was the 3rd left-hander to accomplish the feat (also: Langston and Young).
COMPLETELY KIKUCHI... recorded his first career complete game shutout on August 18 at Toronto, pitching 9.0 scoreless innings and allowing only 2 hits and 1 walk with 8 strikeouts...he became just the 14th pitcher (done 17 x ) in club history to throw a complete game shutout within his first 30 career starts (last: Mike Montgomery, 6/30/15 at SD)...was the 4th Mariners pitcher since 2000 to throw a complete game shutout within his first 30 career starts (also: Mike Montgomery, Roenis Elías, and Gil Meche).
HISTORIC DEBUT... with his start March 21, 2019 at Oakland in the Tokyo Dome, became the first Japanese-born player to make his Major League debut in Japan...was just his second career start (3rd appearance) as a professional in the Tokyo Dome...while with the Seibu Lions, started against the Yomiuri Giants on June 8, 2018 at the Tokyo Dome; earned the win, going 7.0 scoreless innings and scattering 2 hits and 3 walks while striking out 3...in 2011, made a 1.0-inning relief appearance against the Giants in a preseason game.
WELCOME TO SEATTLE...signed with Seattle on Jan. 2, 2019...is signed through 2021 with options through 2025...is the 10th Japanese-born player to appear with the Mariners, including the 6th pitcher...is the 3rd Japanese-born pitcher to start a game for the Mariners (also: Hisashi Iwakuma, 136 GS; and Mac Suzuki, 9 GS).
EARLY YEARS...the native of native of Morioka, Japan, pitched for Hanamaki Higashi High School...helped lead his high school to a runner-up finish at the national high school invitational in April and to the semifinals in the national championship in August before being the top pick in the 2009 NPB Draft...made his professional debut for Seibu's minor league team in 2011 and also pitched with Melbourne in the Australian Winter League that year.
CAREER...was a 3-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2018)...in 2017, led the Pacific League in ERA (1.97) and wins (16)...posted a 69-45 mark with a 2.69 ERA (286 ER, 956.1 IP) over 7 seasons with the Saitama Seibu Lions in Japan's Pacific League.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER: RHP KENDALL GRAVEMAN (0-0, ---)

29-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his long-awaited return to the big league mound tomorrow in the series finale in Houston...THE LONG ROAD BACK.. Graveman's last Major League pitch was thrown on May 11, 2018 as a member of the Oakland Athletics in Yankee Stadium...upon throwing his first pitch, he will have completed a track of 807 days (2 years, 2 months and 16 days) between Major League appearances...RECOVERY...missed all of the 2019 season recovering from Tommy John surgery... performed by Dr. Keith Meister on July 30, 2018...suffered the original injury (right forearm strain) on May 27, 2018 while pitching for Oakland's Triple-A affiliate in Nashville...had been 1-5 with a 7.60 ERA ( 29 ER, 34.1 IP) over 7 starts with Oakland prior to being optioned on May $15 \ldots$...vs. HOU: Graveman owns a career $4-3$ record with a 3.71 ERA ( 22 ER, 53.1 IP) in 9 starts against the Astros...he hasn't pitched against them since Sept. 10, 2017 in Oakland ( 6.0 IP, $5 \mathrm{H}, 1 \mathrm{ER}, 2 \mathrm{BB}, 3 \mathrm{SO}$ ) in a 10-2 A's win...this is his first appearance in Houston since taking a loss here on August 19,2017 ( $6.0 \mathrm{IP}, 6 \mathrm{H}, 2 \mathrm{ER}, 3 \mathrm{BB}, 3 \mathrm{SO}$ )...in 9 starts against them, Graveman has lasted at least 5.0 innings 7 times, at least 6.0 innings 5 times, at least 7.0 innings 3 times and at least 8.0 innings once...he has allowed the Astros to score more than three earned runs just twice, coming in 2015 and 2016...in fact, over his last 6 starts against Houston, dating back to July 9 , 2016 , Graveman owns a 2.54 ERA (11 ER, 39.0 IP), with an opponents' average of $.225(32 \times 142)$ with 5 quality starts...overall at Minute Maid, Graveman is $2-2$ with a 3.52 ERA ( $12 \mathrm{ER}, 30.2 \mathrm{IP}$ ), while holding the Astros hitters to a .234 batting average.
