FLIGHT PATTERN: The St. Louis Cardinals continue a nine-game, 10-day road trip with the first game of a three-game series in Houston. The Cardinals longest road trip of the season has encompassed three-game series in Cincinnati (2-1), Philadelphia (1-2) and Houston (June 3-5). The team had an open date in Philadelphia. Tonight is the fourth of five straight night games for the Cardinals after playing 2-of-3 day games in Cincinnati.

RECENT REDBIRDS: The Cardinals arrived at their Houston hotel at 3:00 AM after a 10-inning, 5-4 win against the Phillies on Sunday Night Baseball at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia. **Nolan Gorman** hit a clutch two-out game-winning single to score **Masyn Winn**, who scored a career-high three runs, in the top of the 10th inning. The St. Louis bullpen was outstanding finishing the game with 6.0 scoreless innings limiting the Phillies offense to four singles.

WILD RIDE: With last night's win, the Cardinals slid into the final Wild Card position in the National League postseason standings. Currently, the Cardinals reside in 2nd place in the National League Central, 7.0 games behind Milwaukee.

YOU MESS WITH THE BULL, YOU GET THE HORNS: The Cardinals bullpen fired 6.0 scoreless innings allowing four singles and stranded four inherited runners to hold off the Phillies last night until the offense pushed across a run in the 10th inning for the win. The 6.0 relief innings tied their season-high output for the 3rd time, but was the first time the 'pen registered 6.0 or more scoreless innings since October 4, 2022, against the Pirates at PNC Park. That night, the St. Louis bullpen completed 7.1 scoreless frames in a 10-inning, 8-7 win, after trailing 7-3 early.

ONE GIANT LEAP: The last time the Cardinals played a game at Minute Maid Park was eight seasons ago August 17, 2016 (8-2 Redbirds win), representing the 5th-longest active timespan between visits to a current Major League venue. (chart left). The Cardinals are one of nine visiting teams with a .500 record or better at Minute Maid Park since it was built in 2000. The 56 wins here rank 2nd among opponents behind Texas (63).

CRAWFORD STREET: Entering today's game, Cardinals shortstop **Brandon Crawford** holds the longest active hit streak against the Astros among current players. Crawford is currently on a 14-game hit streak dating back to May 12, 2015, with his last game against the Astros on August 1, 2021. **Ryan Klesko** holds the all-time longest hitting streak against the Astros, hitting safely in 29 straight games from 1999-2002 with the Braves and Padres. The Cardinals record is held by **Lou Brock** with 20 games from 1968-69, 6th longest in history.

GOLD-RUSH: **Paul Goldschmidt** extended his on-base streak to 19 games last night with an 8th inning single. Goldschmidt is six shy of the Cardinals mark for this season with 25 held by **Nolan Arenado**. The career-long for Goldschmidt is 46 games with the Cardinals in 2022. This is currently the 10th-longest of his career and 3rd-longest as a Cardinal.

CENTRAL CASTING: The Houston Astros were members of the National League Central from 1994-2012. Over that 19 year period, the Cardinals (7) and Astros (3) won the National League Central Division Title 11 of those season (strike season in 1994) as the teams tied for the Division Title in 2001, but the Astros were awarded the top-seed by winning the season series.

THIS DATE IN CARDINALS HISTORY (June 3, 1994): **Willie McGee** would hit his only career home run against the Cardinals as he socked a solo home run off **Allen Watson** at Busch Stadium II. McGee played 37 career games as a Cardinals opponent, but only homered once. Not to be out-done, his good friend **Ozzie Smith** homered later in the game off **Bryan Hickerson** in a 3-1 Cardinals win. It was also the only time the two teammates homered against each other. McGee would play three more games for the Giants in 1994 before one season with the Red Sox in 1995 and finished his career with the Cardinals (1996-99).

HOUSTON CONNECTIONS

Paul Goldschmidt graduated from The Woodlands (Tex.) High School...grew up a fan of **Jeff Bagwell** and **Craig Biggio**...as a high school senior, was seated in the center field upper deck at Minute Maid Park when **Albert Pujols** hit the famous home run off Astros closer **Brad Lidge** in Game 5 of the 2005 NLCS...played college baseball at Texas State University (2007-09) in San Marcos, Tex. where he left as the school's all-time leader in home runs (36) and RBI (178)...his No. 37 was retired in Feb. 2015, becoming the first TSU baseball player to have his jersey retired.

Paul Goldschmidt and **Nolan Arenado** were teammates with **Alex Bregman** on the gold-winning USA squad in the 2017 World Baseball Classic.

Kyle Tucker and **Ryan Pressly** were teammates with Goldschmidt, Arenado, **Miles Mikolas**, and **Adam Wainwright** on the USA squad in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.

Matt Carpenter was born in Galveston, Tex... graduated from Elkins High School in Prosper, Tex... played college baseball at Texas Christian University...resides in Glen Rose, Tex.

Masyn Winn was born in Katy, Tex...graduated from Kingwood (Tex.) High School in 2020...resides in Kingwood, Tex.

John King was born in Laredo, Tex...graduated from Clements (Tex.) High School...played college baseball at Angelina College in Lufkin, Tex. before transferring to the University of Houston...resides in Grand Prairie, Tex.

First Base Coach **Stubby Clapp** worked five seasons (2007-12) in the Astros organization, serving as hitting coach for A-Lexington for three seasons (2007-09), one season as hitting coach for Double-A Corpus Christi (2010), and taking on his first managerial role with short-season Tri-City for two seasons (2011-12).

Giovanni Gallegos made his MLB debut (with the Yankees) against Houston on May 12, 2017 at Yankee Stadium...his first strikeout victim was Houston's Brian McCann (swinging) on May 14, 2017.

Astros Quality Assurance Coach **Jason Bell** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Parkway Central High School...played college baseball at Saint Louis Univ. and the Univ. of Central Missouri.

Astros Manager **Joe Espada** played in eight games for Triple-A Memphis in 2003.

Jeremy Peña is the son of **Gerónimo Peña**, who played six seasons with the Cardinals (1990-95).

Asst. Hitting Coach **Brandon Allen** was born in Conroe, Tex...graduated from Montgomery (Tex.) High School...earned football scholarship to Rice University as a linebacker/defensive end and a baseball scholarship at the University of Houston.

Astros Community Outreach Exec. **José Cruz** played five seasons with St. Louis (1970-74).

- Since 2013, leads active Major League Baseball pitchers in grounded into double plays (213). Has allowed 211 career home runs over that period for comparison.
- Posted career-highs for innings pitched (38.0) and strikeouts (29) in the month of April. Tied his most starts with six (also 2021 w/TEX). The 38.0 innings were the 3rd-most for Gibson in any calendar month, most recently tossing 39.1 with the Twins in 2018.
- St. Louis area resident and University of Missouri Baseball alum signed with the Cardinals as a free agent last November. Is one of three free-agent starters (**Sonny Gray** & **Lance Lynn**) that the Cardinals signed last off-season.
- Pitching for his fifth Major League team: Twins (2013-19), Rangers (2020-21), Phillies (2021-22), Orioles (2023) and Cardinals (2024).

- Durable starting pitcher has made 29 or more starts in eight of the last 10 seasons, the most by any MLB pitcher.
- Has worked 150+ IP (minors/majors combined) in 10-straight (2013-23) professional seasons, excluding the COVID shortened 2020 season.
- Has posted a 3.24 ERA (25.0 IP) with **Willson Contreras** behind the plate, the 4th-lowest ERA of any of the 25 catchers he has pitched with in his career. **Pedro Pagés** on 5/28 was the 25th catcher of his career.
- Owns career marks of 108-102, one of 14 active pitchers with 100 or more wins. Ranks T-10th among active pitchers with 108 wins with **Wade Miley**, one behind **Carlos Carrasco** (109) for 9th.
- Has posted eight 10-win seasons since his MLB debut in 2013, tied for 4th-most among over that period trailing only **Max Scherzer** (10), **Gerrit Cole** (9) & **Clayton Kershaw** (9).
- Is one of four pitchers since 2014 to record 100 or more strikeouts in 9-of-10 seasons with **Jacob deGrom**, **Clayton Kershaw** and **Max Scherzer**.

- Has faced Houston while pitching for the Twins, Rangers and Orioles. He made one relief appearance vs. HOU while pitching for the Phillies in 2022 World Series.
- His 2.64 career ERA vs. the Astros is his best against any team that he has faced 10 or more times.
- Has nine Quality Starts among his 14 career starts vs. HOU, including six in his eight career starts at Minute Maid Park.
- Tonight's start marks his 4th-straight against the Astros at Minute Maid Park and his last win against Houston came here on 9/16/20 when he threw a complete-game 1-0 shutout, allowing just four hits and striking out nine. The 4-hitter remains his best career low-hit game.

- Became the 9th active pitcher with 300 or more games started on April 30 [1] at Detroit. **Justin Verlander** leads the active list with 517.
- Pitched four straight quality starts (4/19-5/11), tied with **Sonny Gray** for the longest streak by a Cardinals pitcher since **Jordan Montgomery** ran off five straight (6/9-7/2/2023).
- Posted his career-highs for innings (38.0) and strikeouts (29) in the month of April. Tied his most starts with six (also 2021 w/TEX). The 38.0 innings were the 3rd-most for Gibson in any calendar month most recently tossing 39.1 with the Twins in 2018.
- Had three straight starts pitching 6.0 or more innings with one run allowed (4/19-30). Longest streak by a Cardinals pitcher since **Steven Matz** reeled off three last year (7/25-8/3/23). The last Cardinals pitcher with four straight starts (6.0+ IP & 1 R or less) was **Adam Wainwright** (9/2-18/19).
