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GO WEST YOUNG MEN

Following their first day off in 16 days on Thursday, the Washington Nationals open a six-game West Coast road trip starting Friday night against the Los Angeles Dodgers...Following this three-game series, the Nationals will travel to San Diego for three games against the Padres.

- The Nationals enter this series having won five of their last seven and six of their last 10 games.

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Jacob Young is 23-for-73 (.315) with five doubles, one triple, one homer, six RBI, three hit by pitch, seven walks and 12 runs scored in his last 23 games...He's posted a .393 on-base, a .452 slugging and an .845 OPS over this stretch.

- Young has posted career-highs in homers (10), triples (3), RBI (43) and his 19 doubles are approaching his career mark of 24 in 2024.

RUIZ IS ROLLIN'

Keibert Ruiz leads Major League catchers in batting average (.371), on-base percentage (.435), OPS (.935) and is third in slugging percentage (.500) since Aug. 2 (min. 65 PA).

- He's 23-for-69 (.371) with two doubles, two homers, nine RBI, seven walks, six strikeouts and eight runs scored during this 19-game stretch.

CJ Abrams (29 RBI, 94 RBI) and **Daylen Life** (20 HR, 80 RBI) have both eclipsed the 20/80 mark this year, while **James Wood** (30 RBI, 73 RBI) is close to joining them.

- There are only eight players in MLB age 25 and younger to hit the 20/80 mark this season and Washington is the only team with more than one player in that group...With eight more RBI, **James Wood** joins the club.
- If Wood reaches the 80 RBI mark, the 2026 Nationals would become the eighth team in Major League history with at least three players age 25 and younger to record a 20/80 season...The last team to do so was the 2007 Milwaukee Brewers, who hold the record with four (**Ryan Braun, Prince Fielder, J.J. Hardy, Corey Hart**)...The last team to have three was the 1999 Kansas City Royals (**Carlos Beltran, Jermaine Dye, Mike Sweeney**).

HOW'S IT GOING, OLD CHAP?

Andrés Chaparro ranks second in Major League Baseball in OPS (1.012) and is third in slugging percentage (.625) since the All-Star break.
