METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets fell to the Orioles, 2-0, yesterday...Tonight, the team returns home for the start of a 10-day, 10-game road trip against the Cubs (three games), Braves (four games) and Pirates (three games).

ROSTER MOVES: The Mets selected the contract of OF Abraham Almonte from Triple-A Syracuse and recalled INF Jonathan Araúz from Triple-A Syracuse...INF Brett Baty was optioned to Triple-A Syracuse and OF Starling Marte was placed on the 10-Day IL, retroactive to August 6, with a right groin strain.

LET'S NOT GO STREAKING: New York has lost six straight and seven of its last eight games...The Mets lost a season-high seven straight games from June 2-9... New York is a season-high 11 games below .500.

SENGA GENISIS: Kodai Senga is slated to make his 21st start of the season tonight...He is 7-6 with a 3.25 ERA (40 ER/110.2 IP) with 55 walks and 136 strikeouts this season...His 136 strikeouts through 20 career starts is tied with Nolan Ryan for the third-most in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (162) and Matt Harvey (144) have struck out more...His 136 punchouts are the fourthmost by a Japanese born player through 20 career starts...He trails Hideo Nomo (175), Yu Darvish (145) and Masahiro Tanaka (141).

KAMPAI KODAI: In 10 starts at Citi Field this year, Senga has posted a 3-2 record with a 2.40 ERA (15 ER/56.1 IP) with 27 walks and 71 strikeouts...His 2.40 ERA at home ranks third in the majors behind only Arizona's Zac Gallen (1.96) and San Francisco's Logan Webb (2.40).

SEVENTH HEAVEN: According to Sportsradar, Kodai Senga is just the seventh rookie in Mets history to make at least 20 starts with a 3.25 ERA or lower...He joins Tom Seaver, Jerry Koosman, JonMatlack, Dwight Gooden, Jacob deGrom and Noah Syndergaard.

MINOR LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Congrats to RHP Irving Cota of the DSL Mets Orange who was named the Dominican Summer League Pitcher of the Week today...Cota, 19, made one start last week and tossed 5.0 no-hit innings and struck out seven as the DSL Mets Orange defeated the DSL Arizona Red, 15-6...In 12 games this season, Cota is 3-1 with a 3.68 ERA (12 ER/29.1 IP) with nine walks and 32 strikeouts...The Mexican native was signed as non-drafted free agent on April 3, 2023.

COOKIE'S KIDS HOSPITAL VISIT: Earlier today, Mets pitcher Carlos Carrasco visited patients at the Cohen Children's Medical Center and gifted them with Mets swag, Cookie's Kids T-shirts and signed photos as part of his Cookie's Kids Program...Throughout this season, Carlos is partnering with Northwell Health to meet with pediatric cancer patients and their families to share his inspiring story and show his support.

POLAR BEAR VS. WINDY CITY CUBS: Pete Alonso has 11 home runs and 24 RBI in 24 career games against the Cubs...Averages one home run per 7.64 AB against Chicago-NL, the second-highest rate all-time (min. 100 PA) behind only Mark McGwire (5.43 AB/HR against the Northsiders)...Alonso has homered in four of his last five games against the Cubbies, including twice during a threegame set at Wrigley Field this May...He has hit safely in seven consecutive games vs. the Cubs, going 8-23 (.348) with four homers, seven RBI, five runs scored and a 1.334 OPS.

IN THE CITI: The Mets open up a 10-game homestand today...19 of their next 25 games will be at home...The Mets are 26-23 at home this season...The team has posted a 3.80 ERA in Citi Field...This compares to a 4.93 mark on the road...The team's 49 games at home are the fewest int he majors

JEFF McHITS: In 15 games since July 21, Jeff McNeil is batting .288 (17-59) with eight runs, two doubles, one triple, one home runs, nine RBI, three walks with a .354 OBP and a .407 SLG...In 21 games following the All-Star break, McNeil has struck out six times.

CLOUD NINE: Francisco Lindor has safely hit in eight of his last nine games, batting .394 (13-33) with seven runs, three doubles, seven RBI, four walks, with a .474 SLG and a .758 SLG....Francisco Lindor ranks 12th in the majors with a 4.1 fWAR...That is seventh-best in the National League.

LINSANITY: Over the last 41 games, Lindor is batting .293 (44-150) with 30 runs eight doubles, two triples, 10 home runs, 25 RBI, 23 walks, 12 steals with a .390 OBP, a .573 SLG and a .963 OPS...Lindor has stolen 18 bases in 111 games this season, exceeding his total from 2022 (16 steals in 161 games)...His career-best is 25 steals 158 games in 2018.

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets have not won a season series against the Cubs since they went 5-2 against Chicago in 2016.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Alonso is third in the majors and second in the Senior Circuit with 31 home runs...He is tied for third in the NL and tied for eighth in the majors with 77 RBI...He is hitting .306 (19-62) with 10 extra-base hits, 15 RBI, nine runs and a .998 OPS in his last 16 games...He was hitting .132 (12-91) with seven extra-base hits and a .549 OPS over his previous 25 games (since his return from the IL on June 18-19).

IF YOU START ME UP: The Mets are 33-9 when the starting pitcher throws at least 6.0 innings...New York has gone 14-1 when its starter pitches 7.0+ innings and are a perfect 5-0 when the starter completes 8.0 innings.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: New York has recorded 80 steals in 89 attempts...The team's 89.9 percent success rate is the best in the majors...The Mets had a franchise-record run of 35 consecutive stolen bases without being caught from May 14-June 29...Overall, New York has been successful in 53 of their last 57 stolen base attempts.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 2007, David Wright recorded the lone walk-off home run of his career as the Mets defeated the Padres, 5-3...New York was up 3-1 thanks to Johan Santana's effort...The lefty made the start and allowed two earned runs on four hits with three walks and struck out seven in 7.0 innings...The Padres scored once each in the eighth and ninth innings to tie the game...In the bottom of the ninth, Endy Chavez singled to start the frame, but was followed by two outs by Jose and Argenis Reyes...Wright belted a 1-0 pitch to left field, securing the victory for the Mets.

DOWN ON THE FARM: OF Drew Gilbert went 2-3 with an RBI and was hit by a pitch as the Rumble Ponies fell to the Fisher Cats, 8-4, yesterday...In three games in the organization, Gilbert is batting .364 (4-11) with one run, one triple, two RBI, one walk with a .462 OBP and a .546 SLG...In 84 games across three teams in 2023, the left-handed hitter is batting .277/.367/.461 with 58 runs, 19 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs, 40 RBI, 10 steals with an .828 OPS...He ranks as the fourth-best prospect in the Mets organization according to MLB Pipeline.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: On July 8, Major League Baseball announced that Kodai Senga was added to the National League Basepail announced that Kodai Senga was added to the National League All-Star team, which took place on July 11 at T-Mobile Park in Seattle...Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He is the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo

SENGA GENESIS: Has recorded 136 strikeouts through his first 20 career major league games, that is tied with Nolan Ryan for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (162), and Matt Harvey (144) have recorded more in their first 20 career starts...His 136 strikeouts are the fourth-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 20 career games...He trails only Hideo Nomo (188), Yu Darvish (145) and Masahiro Tanaka (141).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: Senga's seven wins are tied for the third-most among all major league rookies this season and his 136 strikeouts are the most by any rookie...Among rookies with 50.0 or more innings pitched, Senga is third in the majors and second in the NL with a 11.06 SO/9 rate and fifth in the majors in opponent's average (.214).

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 73 of his 136 strikeouts through 20 starts...The pitch has a 58.6 percent whiff rate and a 27.5 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just 15 hits in 108 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .139 batting average.

SHUT 'EM OUT: On May 30 against the Phillies, Senga became the 10th rookie in franchise history to throw 7.0 or more innings, while one hit or less and was the first Met since Steven Matz did so on August 14, 2016...Joins Jonathon Niese, who tossed a complete game shutout on June 10, 2010, as the only Mets rookie to accomplish the feat without allowing a walk.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Senga became the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 and is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts...Senga fell just shy of becoming the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0, a record held by Steven

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika

NPB CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award without (2019 and 2020). winner (2019 and 2020).

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION: Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.
