ON THE CLOCK—The Rays have signed all 21 of their selections from the 2021 Amateur Draft...their last three unsigned players—third-round INF Ryan Spikes (Parkview HS), eighth-round LH Patrick Wicklander (University of Arkansas) and 16th-round RH Ian Leatherman (Central Michigan University)—agreed to terms yesterday...Spikes hit .400 (48-for-120) with 10 2B, 6 3B, 10 HR and 17 SB in 36 games as a high school senior and committed to the University of Tennessee before signing with the Rays.

RAY MATTER—The Rays have lost back-to-back games on the heels of a 5-game winning streak...it marks the first time the Rays have lost consecutive games since July 2-3 at TOR (in Buffalo), the final two of a 5-game losing streak from June 27–July 3...the Rays are 5-2 in their last 7 games, 7-4 since the All-Star break and 60-41 this season, tied with the White Sox for 3rd in the AL behind the Red Sox (62-39) and Astros (62-40)...the Rays and Red Sox entered Sunday's games tied for the AL East lead but the Rays have dropped to 2 GB within the last three days, their largest deficit since before the All-Star break at the end of play on July 9 (-2.5).

- + The Rays are 13-5 since July 4, 41-22 since May 13 and 47-26 since May 2, all of which are the best in the majors over those stretches.
- + The last 2 games have both ended in 1-run losses...the Rays are 14-16 (.467) in 1-run games this season, 20th in the majors, after going a majors-best 14-5 (.737) in 1-run games in the shortened season.
- + The Rays have played 69 games against teams currently .500 or better and are 40-29 (.580) in them, 4th in the majors by winning pct. behind the Astros (46-26), Padres (32-21) and Red Sox (39-27).
- + The Rays currently occupy the AL's first Wild Card spot, holding a 4½-game lead over the Athletics (56-46)...the Rays hold a 5½-game cushion over the Mariners (55-47) in regard to a postseason berth.
- + The Rays are 26-16 (.619) against AL East opponents, including 20-8 in their last 28 games against divisional foes following a 6-8 start.
- + The Rays have won five consecutive series beginning July 5-7.
- + The Rays have held a lead in 77.2 pct. (78 of 101) of their games—they have led in 46.3 pct. (19 of 41) of losses and trailed in 30 of 60 wins... the 30 come-from-behind wins rank 2nd in the majors (Boston, 33).

**UNDER THE DOME**—The Rays have lost three of their last five home games but are 30-19 (.612) at home this season, 10th in the majors and 4th in the AL...since May 13, the Rays are 23-7 (.767) at home, best in the majors over that stretch ahead of the Padres (25-9)...the Rays have outscored their opponents, 165-91, since then, and their 2.76 home ERA over that stretch is the best in the majors (Marlins, 2.99)...this comes on the heels of a 7-12 start, which ranked 28th in the majors through May 12...the Rays are 10-4-2 in home series and 9-8 in home series openers and they haven't lost a home series since May 11-13 vs. NYY (1-2), going 9-0-1 since then.

- + The Rays lead the majors with 279 runs scored on the road, but they rank 20th with 218 runs scored at home...their 73 HR on the road rank 2nd in the majors but their 53 HR at home rank 22nd.
- + The Rays have a 3.00 ERA at home, 3rd in the majors behind NYM (2.75) and MIA (2.94), and 1st in the AL over the White Sox (3.21).

FASHIONABLY LATE—This season the Rays have scored 193 runs in the 7th inning or later, most in the majors ahead of the Reds (177)...they have outscored their opponents, 193-119, in these frames, and the +74 differential ranks 1st in the majors (Padres, +63)... by inning, the Rays rank 8th in the majors in runs scored in the 7th (57), 5th in the 8th (59), 1st in the 9th (57) and are tied for 4th in extras (20)...their 119 runs allowed in the 7th inning or later are the 5th-fewest in the majors and 2nd among AL clubs (Indians, 114).

+ Opposing starting pitchers have a 3.97 ERA (524-IP, 231-ER) and .222 opp avg. (438-for-1,972) when pitching against

the Rays this season, but opposing relievers have a 5.23 ERA (375.1-IP, 218-ER) and .248 opp avg. (360-for-1,452) against the Rays.

**ABOUT THE OFFENSE**—The Rays have been held to 5 runs in their last 2 games, both losses, compared to 37 runs on the 5-game winning streak (7.4 runs per game) and 91 runs on the 13-3 stretch from July 4-24 (5.69 runs per game)...last night marked the first time the Rays lost when scoring 3 runs (or more) since July 3 at TOR (6-3), going 13-0 when doing so in

between...since the All-Star break, the Rays are tied for 5th in the majors with 57 runs scored, behind the Padres (70), Braves (66), Tigers (65) and Nationals (64)...they are tied for 6th in the majors at 5.18 runs per game since then, and T-3rd in the AL behind Toronto (5.67) and Detroit (5.42).

- + This season the Rays are batting .233, 25th in the majors and 12th in the AL...the .233 avg.—which would be the lowest mark in franchise history—includes .237 with RISP and .226 with RISP/2 outs.
- + The Rays have scored 198 runs this season with 2 outs, 4th-most in the majors behind the Red Sox (218), Dodgers (212) and Giants (199).
- + The Rays have struck out a majors-most 1,010 times and are on pace for 1,620 SO, which would be a ML record ahead of the 2019 Tigers (1,595)...they have double-digit strikeouts in 9 of their last 27 games (33.3 pct.), compared to 51 of their first 74 games (68.9 pct.).
- + 49.2 pct. (62 of 126) of homers this season have come with runner(s) on base, which would pass 2005 (47.1) for the highest in club history...this ranks 4th in the majors this season and 1st in the AL.
- + This season the Rays are batting .277 (151-for-546) with RISP in the 60 wins, compared to .169 (53-for-314) with RISP in the 41 losses.
- + DH Nelson Cruz has 2 HR in 4 games with the Rays and 438 HR in his career, tied with Andre Dawson for 45th all-time...his next homer will tie Paul Konerko for 44th in major league history.

**PITCHING PROPERLY**—The Rays have a 3.58 ERA this season, which leads the AL over the White Sox (3.60) and ranks 6th in the majors...the Rays are attempting to finish among the majors' top ten in ERA for a fifth consecutive season...the Rays have allowed 3 runs (or fewer) 54 times this season—most in the AL (Astros, 53)—and are 43-11 (.796) when doing so.

- The Rays have a 3.14 ERA (63-IP, 22-ER) in their last 7 games (5-2).
- + The Rays bullpen has a 1.53 ERA (64.2-IP, 11-ER) in the last 16 games and a 3.12 ERA (426.2-IP, 148-ER) this season, which ranks 1st in the AL and 2nd in the majors behind the Padres (3.02)...the Rays bullpen ranked 26th in the majors with a 5.07 ERA through games of April 21, but since April 22 their 2.66 ERA ranks 1st in the majors.

RAYS vs. YANKEES—The Rays are 8-6 against the Yankees this season (3-4 at home, 5-2 on the road) and the two clubs most recently split a 4-game series from May 31-June 3 in the Bronx...the Rays went 5-1 to start the season series but are 3-5 in the last 8 games since May 11...following this series, the only games remaining in the season series are Oct 1-3 in the Bronx, which represents the final series of the regular season.

- + The Rays have outscored the Yankees, 67-41 (+26), in 14 games and have held them to 3 runs (or fewer) in nine of 14 games (64.3 pct.).
- + Since April 11, the Rays are 1-4 in the 5 games at Tropicana Field.
- + This season the Rays and Yankees rank 13th and 15th in the AL in batting avg. with RISP at .237 and .218, respectively...the two clubs are batting a combined .194 (42-for-217) with RISP in the season series, with the Rays batting .210 with RISP and the Yankees at .172.
- + Since Sep 24, 2019, the Rays are 18-8 against them in the regular season with a +44 run differential (120-76)...the two clubs also met in the 2020 ALDS, with the Rays advancing in a decisive Game 5.

**UNDER THE LEATHER**—The Rays have made 9 errors in 11 games since the All-Star break, tied for 3rd in the majors over that stretch behind the Marlins (11) and Nationals (10)...since the start of July, their 17 errors rank 4th in the majors behind the Marlins (21), Dodgers (19) and Twins (18).

- + Since June 8, the Rays have made 30 errors in 40 games, 3rd in the majors behind the Marlins (35) and Twins (33)...through June 7 the Rays made 22 errors (2nd-fewest in the majors) in 61 games and led the majors with 49 Defensive Runs Saved, with a comfortable lead over the 2nd-place Mets (36)...since then, the Rays have dropped into 2nd with 50 Defensive Runs Saved behind the Rockies (52).
- + The Rays are 24-19 when making an error and 36-22 when not.

HOW NOW BROWN LOWE—Last night Brandon Lowe hit a 2-run homer in the 6th inning, extending his career high and the team lead...his 22 HR are tied for 4th in the majors among middle infielders (min. 50 pct. of games there) behind SD Fernando Tatís Jr. (31), TOR Marcus Semien (24) and HOU José Altuve (23)...he ranks 4th for a single season in franchise history—the club record for a middle infielder is held by Brad Miller (30) in 2016...his 22 HR are tied for 7th in the majors among left-handed hitters, are more than the combined number of homers hit by Cardinals (18) and Blue Jays (14) lefties and match the total homers by Yankees lefties.

+ Lowe is batting .311/.452/.743 (23-for-74) with 9 HR since June 23.

**LAST START**—On Wed vs. BAL, took no decision after allowing 3 runs in 5 IP...his first 2 BF doubled, leading to a run in the 1st inning...after a 5-pitch 2nd, yielded homers to **Pat Valaika** and **Ryan Mountcastle** leading off the 3rd and 4th...went 1-2-3 in the 5th before being removed from the game...his line: ND, 5 IP, 6 H, 3 R/ER, 0 BB, 2 SO, 2 HR, 58 pit., 41 str.

- + Yielded multiple homers on the first pitch of an at-bat for the second time in his career, joining May 29, 2019 at PHI (with STL).
- Allowed an avg. exit velocity of 83.4 mph, his lowest in a start (min. 10 batted balls) since Aug 1, 2020 at ATL (82.0 mph, with NYM).

**START ME UP**—Is 2-2 with a 3.98 ERA (52-IP, 23-ER) in 12 starts this season, compared to a 9.42 ERA (14.1-IP, 15-ER) in 5 apps in relief...as a starter, has limited opponents to .260/.311/.418 (51-for-196) with 7 HR...in comparison, has yielded a .333/.379/.767 (20-for-60) line with 7 HR in relief.

- + Has held opponents to 3 runs (or fewer) in nine of his 12 starts and 1 run (or fewer) in seven of his 11 starts...as a reliever, has allowed 3 runs (or more) in three of 5 apps and 4 runs (or more) in 2 apps.
- + In his last 4 starts, has recorded a 9.00 SO/9 IP ratio (20-IP, 20-SO), compared to a 6.19 SO/9 IP ratio (32-IP, 22-SO) in his first 8 starts.

**HOMER HAPPY**—Has allowed 8 HR in his last 4 apps (3 starts) since June 30, his most over a stretch of 4 apps in his career...has yielded at least 1 HR in each of these 4 apps, tied for the 2nd-longest streak of his career behind May 4-29, 2019 (5, with STL)...his 14 HR allowed overall are tied for 2nd on the team behind **Ryan Yarbrough** (16)...prior to these last 4 apps (3 starts). had allowed 6 HR in his first 13 apps (9 starts) spanning 48.1 IP.

HARD HIT, NO LONGER—Through his first 6 apps (4 starts) of the season, had allowed a 52.4 pct. hard-hit rate and an avg. exit velocity of 93.1 mph, according to StatCast, the 4th- and 9th-highest rates in the majors (min. 50 batted balls)...however, since returning from the injured list on May 23 his avg. exit velocity and hard-hit rate over his last 11 apps (8 starts)

have been 87.5 mph and 37.3 pct., respectively...this stretch has lowered his avg. exit velocity this season to 90.1 mph and hard-hit rate to 43.1 pct.

- + His 7.5 barrels/PA is T-9th-highest in the majors (min. 200 BBE).
- + Has held his opponent's avg. exit velocities below 90 mph in eight of his last 11 apps and below 86 mph in five of those contests.

vs. YANKEES—Is 1-1 with a 4.55 ERA (27.2-IP, 14-ER) in six career apps (4 starts) against the Yankees, including 1-0 with a 3.09 ERA (11.2-IP, 4-ER) in 3 apps (1 start) against them this season...last faced them on May 31 at Yankee Stadium, allowing 1 run in 1.2 IP of relief...entered the game in the 6th inning behind Rich Hill and retired his first 5 BF before yielding a 2-out Miguel Andújar solo homer in the 7th inning, then was replaced.

+ Is 1-1 with a 4.09 ERA (22-IP, 10-ER) in four career starts vs. NYY.

**CONTROLLING THE ZONE**—Has thrown first-pitch strikes to a careerhigh 69.9 pct. (178 of 260) of batters faced this season and is averaging 15.6 pitches/IP...min. 50 IP, his first-pitch strike rate is 4th-highest in the majors and 3rd in the AL...batters are swinging 40.9 pct. of the time on the first pitch of a plate appearance, the highest rate in the majors (min. 50 IP).

- + His 3.71 pitches/BF is tied for the 10th-best rate in the AL.
- + In 2020, recorded a career-high 9.79 SO/9 IP ratio and career-high 5.29 SO/BB ratio (37-SO, 7-BB)...his previous highs were 8.58 SO/9 IP and a 2.87 SO/BB ratio in 2017...his 1.85 BB/9 IP ratio ranked 9th in the NL (min. 30 IP) and was the lowest mark of his career.

**CHANGE IT UP**—Has thrown his changeup for 26.8 pct. of his pitches this season, according to StatCast...has induced a 34.7 pct. whiff rate on the changeup, 6th in the majors (min. 75 PA)...opponents are batting .229 (19-for-83) in at-bats ending with the changeup, compared to a .301 avg. (52-for-173) against his other three offerings (fastball, cutter, curveball).

+ Threw his changeup for 29.2 pct. of pitches last season (with NYM) and posted a 40.8 pct. whiff rate, 9th in the majors (min. 50 PA).

**LAST START**—On Thurs at CLE, took no decision after allowing 4 runs in a career-high-tying 5.1 IP (2nd time, also July 2 at TOR)...stranded leadoff baserunners in his first 2 IP, then allowed a 3-run homer to **Franmil Reyes** with 2 outs in the 3rd inning...his leadoff single came around to score in the 4th on a sacrifice fly...went flyout and single to start the 6th, then was replaced...his line: ND, 5.1 IP, 5 H, 4 R/ER, 3 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 98 pit., 66 str.

Recorded a career-high 13 swings-and-misses, surpassing his previous high of 12 on July 2 at TOR...induced 6 whiffs with his slider and 7 with his fastball, which also represented a career high.

vs. YANKEES—Will be making his second career start and app against the Yankees, last facing them on May 11 at Tropicana Field when he took the loss after allowing 2 runs (1 ER) in 4 IP...allowed a 2-out solo homer to Aaron Judge in the 1st inning, then went 1-2-3 in the 2nd...a pair of passed balls with 2-on, 1-out in the 3rd led to an unearned run, but he escaped additional damage with consecutive flyouts...erased a leadoff hit by pitch in the 4th with a ground ball double play, the first of his career.
