RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their nine-game, 10-day road trip against the Rockies (3-0), Mariners (3-0), and Athletics (three to play) tonight at Sutter Health Park...are a season-high 25 games above .500, the sixth season in 29 campaigns they have reached that mark (also: 2023, 2021, 2019, 2010, 2008)...reached 25 games over on Aug. 9, third earliest in club history behind 2023 (June 6) and 2010 (July 29)...have won six straight games, the longest active streak in the majors and their MLB-best fifth streak this season of six games or more—no other club has more than two streaks (ATL, BOS, CHC, DET, MIA, STL)...ties 2013 for the most such streaks in a season in Rays history...are a majors-best 15-4 in their last 19 games (July 20–pres.)...on the heels of a five-game losing streak (July 12-19)...have spent 85 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including a season-high 44 consecutive days in first (June 27–pres.)...the 85 total days leading their division are fifth most in MLB to the Dodgers (132), Braves (130), Brewers (100), and Guardians (95)...have held the best record in the AL outright for 83 of those days, second most in team history behind 2023 (106), per Stats Perform...hold a season-high-tying 5.5-game lead in the AL East (last: 34-15 on May 23), their largest in August or later since winning the division by 8.0 games in 2021...their 71-46 record is tied for the best in team history through 117 games (also: 2021, 2010, 2008).

- ✦ The Rays tallied their 30th comeback win, tying the White Sox for the AL lead, and their AL-most 19th victory without the benefit of a home run in yesterday's 4-1 win in Seattle, completing a three-game sweep...it was their fourth sweep at T-Mobile Park, first since Aug. 9-11, 2019.
- ✦ They have plated four runs or fewer in each of their last four games, tying the longest streak of wins with four runs or fewer in team history (3x, also: Sept. 19-22, 2024 & Aug. 25-29, 2020), the pitching staff has yielded four total runs in that span, turning in a 1.00 ERA (36.0IP, 4ER) while holding opponents to a 1-for-20 (.050) clip with RISP...this, after yielding 16 runs across the first two games of this road trip.
- ✦ Overall, during the Rays MLB-best 15-4 run since July 20, the staff leads the majors in ERA (2.51/172.0IP, 48ER); opp. average (.199), on-base pct. (.251), slugging pct. (.331), and OPS (.582); WHIP (0.94), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.42), walk rate (5.6%), and fewest pitches per IP (14.8).
- ✦ The club has won seven of its first eight games to open August for the first time and needs to go 8-12 or better over the next 20 games to secure a winning month...the Rays are attempting to complete a season without recording a losing month in a non-shortened season for the first time in team history...they did not tally a losing month during the 60-game 2020 campaign.
- ✦ The Rays have won five of their last six sets (July 20–pres.) and are 9-3-2 over their last 14 series (June 19–pres.)...they have won a season-high-tying three straight road series in the wake of a 1-6-1 stretch as visitors (May 22–July 19).
- ✦ The Rays 25-13 record in series openers is tied with the Dodgers (25-13) for second best in the majors to the Brewers (27-11)...they are 4-2 in their last six openers and 8-4 in their last 12.
- ✦ With a win tonight, the Rays would tie 2010 for their best record in franchise history through 118 games (72-46) and would stake out a season-high 6.0-game lead in the AL East standings, an advantage they have held in only four previous seasons in club history: 2023 (largest lead: 6.5), 2021 (largest lead: 9.5), 2020 (largest lead: 7.0), and 2010 (largest lead: 6.0).

SWEEP EMOTION—Following back-to-back sweeps over the Rockies and Mariners, their fourth time this season sweeping consecutive series, the Rays have tallied an MLB-leading 12 sweeps, tied with 2018 and 2013 for their second most in franchise history behind 2021 (14)...only the 2021 Rays have tallied more sweeps before the end of August (13)...after recording consecutive road sweeps for the first time since June 13-26, 2025 (at NYM/KC) and first time on the same road trip since Aug. 24-29, 2021 (at PHI/BAL), four of those 12 sweeps have come away from home...the Rays have swept three of their last six series away from Tropicana Field, their most sweeps in a six-series span on the road since Aug. 6-29, 2021 (also 3).

- ✦ No other club has recorded more than nine sweeps this season (BOS)...the Rays eight home sweeps pace MLB, while their four on the road rank third behind the Red Sox (6) and Yankees (5).

ROAD REVERSAL—The Rays have won a season-high six straight road games, their longest streak since another six-game run from June 13-26, 2025, to improve to 30-28 away from home, the first time they have been multiple games over .500 in road affairs since June 5 (16-14)...their last longer streak was eight consecutive road wins from April 19–May 7, 2022, and the club record is nine straight (3x, last: May 9-31, 2021)...they have won nine of their last 10 road games following a six-game skid to cap a 6-17 stretch away from home (May 24–July 19)...the 9-1 run ties their best 10-game span on the road in team history (40x, last: April 17–May 7, 2022)...this is the first time the Rays have won the first six games of a road trip since May 2-7, 2022 (at OAK/SEA), which was a three-city, 10-game trip they finished 7-3 (also: at LAA)...they last won the first seven games of a trip when they completed a 7-0 trip from May 18-24, 2021 (at BAL/TOR)...they have never gone undefeated on a three-series (or more) road trip, but they have finished with one loss on three separate occasions: Aug. 10-20, 2020 (9-1: BOS, TOR, NYY); April 12-22, 2010 (9-1: BAL, BOS, CWS); and June 15-24, 2004 (8-1: SD, AZ, TOR).

- ✦ Rays pitching has yielded two runs or fewer in four straight road games for the seventh time in team history, first since June 15-26, 2025 (4G)...it falls one game shy of the club record of five straight games, established from June 4-17, 2015.
- ✦ **Chandler Simpson** has hit safely in 13 of his last 16 road games since the beginning of July, batting an MLB-best .435 (27-for-62) in road affairs over that timeframe (min. 50AB).

FOUR FOR 2—Yesterday, **Yandy Díaz** recorded his fifth game of the season with four hits or more, tying **SF Jung Ho Lee** for the MLB lead while matching **Corey Dickerson** (2017), **Carl Crawford** (2007, 2004), and **Randy Winn** (2002) for second most in a season in team history behind Crawford's 2010 season (8G)...he is the first AL hitter with five such games out of the leadoff spot since BAL **Hanser Alberto** (5G) in 2019...Díaz's 12 career four-hit games with the Rays are second most in club history to Crawford's 29.

- ✦ Díaz enters this series with 1,013 hits in his Rays career, three shy of tying **Ben Zobrist** (1,016) for third on the club's all-time list (see table on the right).
- ✦ He is attempting to become the fourth active player to rank among his current franchise's top-three all-time leaders in hits, along with HOU **Jose Altuve** (2nd, 2,477), AZ **Ketel Marte** (2nd, 1,209), and LAA **Mike Trout** (2nd, 1,838)...additionally, despite no longer being with the club, NYY **Paul Goldschmidt** has the third-most hits in Diamondbacks history (1,182), and SD **Manny Machado** (1,110) is only 24 hits shy of entering the Padres top three.

ALL HEART, ALL HUSTLE—Since his average dipped to a season-low .259 entering play on June 19, Rays Heart & Hustle Award winner **Chandler Simpson** has batted an MLB-best .379 (58-for-153) over his last 41 games, pacing the majors in stolen bases (17) over that span while leading the AL in hits and multi-hit efforts (18G)...Yesterday, Simpson and **Yandy Díaz** became the 15th pair of Rays teammates to both record four hits in the same game and second this season after Simpson and **Ben Williamson** turned the trick on July 21 at TOR...collectively, Rays players have tallied an AL-leading 14 four-hit games (2nd in MLB: SF, 15G), third most in franchise history behind 2007 and 2004 (both 16)...Simpson (304) and Díaz (298) are one of two pairs of qualified teammates in the majors both batting .295 or better, joining McCarthy (.306) and COL **TJ Rumfield** (.295).

THE BAKE SHOW—Bryan Baker has converted a franchise-record 23 consecutive save opportunities, the majors longest active streak and the third longest by any pitcher this season, trailing stretches by SD **Mason Miller** (28) and TOR **Louis Varland** (24)...with an MLB-most 34 saves, Baker would need 14 saves over the Rays final 45 games to match **Fernando Rodney's** club record set in 2012 (48), the right-hander has tallied 15 saves over the team's last 45 contests (June 20-Aug. 9)...he's already the fifth Ray to hold the outright MLB lead in saves at any point from Aug. 1 on, joining **Alex Colomé** (2017, led MLB), Rodney (2012, latest date: Sept. 18), **Rafael Soriano** (2010, latest date: Sept. 21), and **Roberto Hernández** (1999, latest date: Sept. 4), according to Stats Perform.

RAYS AND A'S—The Rays and Athletics open a six-game season series tonight, with the clubs reconvening next month from Sept. 15-17 at Tropicana Field in the Rays penultimate home series...the clubs split, 3-3, last season, with both sides earning road series victories...the Rays took two of three games in their first series at this venue last August, a set in which they scored seven of their 15 runs (46.7%) via 5 HR and the bullpen yielded only one run in 6.2 IP (1.35 ERA)...they are 4-1-2 in their last seven series against the A's (May 2, 2022–pres.), going 2-0-2 on the road in that stretch since their last series road loss to the Athletics from May 7-9, 2021 at Oakland Coliseum...since registering consecutive 11-0 victories over the A's from April 8-9, 2023, which was the third instance in the modern era (since 1900) of a club recording back-to-back shutout wins by 11 runs or more, the Rays are 9-8 in the last 17 matchups, with 15 of those games being decided by three runs or fewer (June 12, 2023–pres.), including eight one-run affairs...both clubs have scored exactly 58 runs in that span.

- ✦ Their .434 (95-124) all-time winning pct. against the A's is their second lowest vs. any AL opponent, better than only their .433 (210-275) mark vs. the Yankees...however, they are 38-31 vs. the club under **Kevin Cash** (since 2015) compared to 57-93 before Cash took the helm (1998-2014).
- ✦ The Rays have won five straight games vs. AL West foes (July 29–pres.), their longest single-season streak since June 1–Aug. 25, 2022 (6G), on the heels of a 6-7 start against the division.
- ✦ **Chandler Simpson** went 6-for-10 (.600) in three games at Sutter Health Park last season, reaching base safely in eight of his 12 PA (6H, 2BB)...he is 9-for-17 (.529) with 3 SB in six career games against the Athletics, reaching base safely in all five games with a PA.
- ✦ **Yandy Díaz** has a 14-game on-base streak against the Athletics (June 14, 2023–pres.), batting .321 (17-for-53) with 5 2B, 1 HR, 5 RBI, and 9 BB during the streak, which is the second longest in franchise history behind **Randy Winn**, who reached safely in 15 straight opposite the A's from May 26, 1998–May 30, 2001.

TONIGHT'S START—**Freddy Peralta** is slated to make his second career start as a Ray tonight, his 24th start of the season and 186th (235th outing) of his career... was traded to Tampa Bay from New York-NL on Aug. 2 in exchange for minor leaguers **RHP Gary Gill Hill**, **INF Émilien Pitre**, and **OF Aidan Smith**...was traded to the Mets from the Brewers on Jan. 21, 2026 and pitched to a 4.99 ERA (113.2IP, 63ER) with 113 strikeouts across 22 starts.

- ✦ He has 99 career strikeouts against AL West competition...with a **strikeout** tonight, Peralta will have 100 career strikeouts or more against five of six divisions (78SO vs. AL East).
- ✦ His career .205 (280-for-1,365) opp. average following the All-Star break ranks second among active MLB starters (min. 350.0IP) behind LAD **Blake Snell** (193/377-for-1958).
- ✦ Since 2023, Peralta's 118 starts are tied with CHC **Kevin Gausman** for third most in the majors behind SF **Logan Webb** (121) and TOR **Dylan Cease** (119).

LAST TIME OUT—Recorded his shortest start of the season in his first outing with the Rays on Aug. 4 at COL (3.2IP, 9H, 7ER, BB, 3SO, 2HR)...allowed back-to-back singles to start the 1st inning, giving up a run on a **Mickey Moniak** GIDP... forced a 1-2-3 2nd frame before surrendering five base hits, two for extra bases, in the 3rd inning...yielded two hits in the 4th, including a **Will Castro** home run, before handing the ball to **Cam Booser** with two outs in the frame.

- ✦ Per Elias, Peralta and **Liam Hicks** became fifth starting battery pairing to each make their Rays debut in the same game, joining **Andy Sonnanstine**/**Raul Caranova** (June 5, 2007 vs. TOR), **Jim Parque**/**Javier Valentin** (April 2, 2003), **Tony Saunders**/**Mike DiFelice** (April 2, 1998), and **Wilson Alvarez**/**John Flaherty** (March 31, 1998 vs. DET)...each of the 1998 instances came during the club's inaugural series against the Tigers at Tropicana Field.
- ✦ Became the 12th different pitcher to start a game for the Rays in 2026 and the 27th pitcher used by the club this season.
- ✦ Has walked a batter in 22 straight starts since April 1 and in 22 of 23 starts this season.
- ✦ Pitched on eight days of rest (July 27–Aug. 3)...he fell to 14-10 with a 4.22 ERA (198.1IP, 93ER) across 41 career starts where he's pitched on six days of rest or more.

WEST SIDE A'S—The veteran right-hander will make his second start against the Athletics in 2026 and the fifth appearance (fourth start) of his career opposite the A's...in those outings, Peralta is 1-2 with a 3.06 ERA (17.2IP, 6ER), 18 strikeouts, and a .224 (15-for-67) opp. average...tossed 5.0 innings or more in all three starts against the club.

- ✦ In one career road appearance on July 30, 2019 at ATH (Oakland Coliseum), he delivered 1.2 innings out of the bullpen for Milwaukee and allowed one run on one hit and a walk with two strikeouts.
- ✦ In 17 career appearances (13 starts) against AL West foes, he has fashioned a 5-5 record with a 4.58 ERA (74.2IP, 38ER) and 99 strikeouts...in the 13 starts, he has a 5-5 record with a 4.79 ERA (67.2IP, 36ER) and 91 strikeouts...four of those 13 starts have been quality (last: June 3, 2026 at SEA), and he has registered three straight quality starts against AL West clubs since Sept. 16, 2025.
- ✦ Tonight's outing will mark his first career major league start at Sutter Health Park, the 29th MLB park he's made an appearance in...previously pitched in the ballpark in Triple-A on June 10, 2018 at Sacramento with Colorado Springs, posting a quality start with 11 strikeouts (6.0IP, 5H, 2ER, BB, 11SO)...in that contest, current Rays Brand Engagement Executive **Brett Phillips**' solo homer in the 4th inning was Peralta's lone run of support.

ON THE ROAD, AGAIN—In 10 road starts in 2026, Peralta is 2-5 with a 7.11 ERA (49.1IP, 39ER) and 47 strikeouts...has logged a .308 (64-for-208) opp. average and a 1.66 WHIP in those starts, with his teams going 4-6.

- ✦ Across 109 career road appearances (88 starts), he is 32-27 with a 4.35 ERA (481.2IP, 233ER), 576 strikeouts, and a .229 (416-for-1818) opp. average...his teams are 54-55 lifetime in his road appearances...his 576 punchouts on the road are the 13th most among active right-handers since 2018.
- ✦ As a starter, he's gone 29-27 with a 4.25 ERA (446.2IP, 211ER), 524 strikeouts, and a .226 (379-for-1680) opp. average...his teams are 44-44 in such outings.

SUMMER STUFF—In 44 career appearances (30 starts) in August, Peralta is 17-4 with a 3.62 ERA (179.0IP, 72ER), 212 strikeouts, and a .200 (129-for-644) opp. average...since 2018, he ranks highly among MLB arms (min. 150.0IP in Aug.) in August winning pct (2nd, .810), opp. average (4th), strikeouts per 9.0 IP (8th, 10.66), and WHIP (10th, 1.08).

- ✦ The 17 wins are his most in any month is his career, ahead of his 13 in both May and June.
