PITTSBURGH PIRATES (43-43) vs. PHILADELPHIA PHILLIES (48-38)

July 1, 2026 - Citizens Bank Park - Philadelphia, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #87/Road #42
RHP Paul Skenes (6-7, 3.10 ERA) vs. RHP Zack Wheeler (8-1, 2.03 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have split the first two games of this seven-game road trip (their final road trip before the All-Star break) to Philadelphia (Monday-Thursday) and Washington (Friday-Sunday), including an 8-0 loss on Tuesday here at Citizens Bank Park...Won three of six games on their recent homestand vs. Seattle (2-1, June 23-25) and Cincinnati (1-2, June 26-28)...Are in the ninth game of a stretch of 35 straight games played in the Eastern Time Zone (their next game outside of the Eastern Time Zone will be on August 3 at Milwaukee)...Have scored the third-most runs (440) in Major League Baseball, behind Los Angeles-NL (461) and Washington (460)...Have struck out the third-most batters (789) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (824) and Milwaukee (820)...Are 20-21 on the road this year (went 27-54 on the road last season).

THE MAGICIAN: Esmerlyn Valdez reached base safely in three of four plate appearances after going 2-for-3 with a walk on Tuesday at Philadelphia...He has hit safely in seven of his last eight games (since June 19 at Colorado), going 13-for-24 (.542) with four doubles, four home runs, seven RBI and a 1.815 OPS...Valdez has reached base safely at least three times (including multiple hits) in three straight games (since Sunday vs. Cincinnati), making him the second Pirate to do that this season, joining Bryan Reynolds (April 30-May 2)...The only Pirates in the 21st century to do that in four straight games were Rob Mackowiak (June 7-11, 2005), Freddy Sanchez (May 29-June 1, 2006), Andrew McCutchen (August 3-7, 2013), Starling Marte (June 12-15, 2015, September 21-24, 2015 and August 17-20, 2017) and Reynolds (July 13-20, 2024)...He is also looking to become one of seven Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) with multiple hits and at least one walk in four consecutive games, along with Ginger Beaumont (September 4 [G2]-6 [G1], 1901), Arky Vaughan (August 17 [G1]-18 [G2], 1935), Elbie Fletcher (September 24 [G1]-26, 1946), Manny Sanguillen (September 13-16, 1975), Orlando Merced (June 5-9, 1996) & McCutchen (August 3-7, 2013).

FUTURE PLANS: Seth Hernandez and Edward Florentino were named to the National League roster for the All-Star Futures Game, which will be played on July 12 here at Citizens Bank Park, earlier today...The 20-year-old Hernandez, who is currently rated by both Baseball America and MLB Pipeline as the No. 6 prospect in all of baseball, has gone 6-1 with a 2.02 ERA (62.1ip/14er) and 100 strikeouts (the second-most in Minor League Baseball) in 14 starts split between Low-A Bradenton and High-A Greensboro during his first professional season...The 19-year-old Florentino, who is currently rated by both Baseball America (No. 30) and MLB Pipeline (No. 31) as a top-35 prospect in baseball, has an .807 OPS in 53 games split between Bradenton and Greensboro this season...Konnor Griffin and Esmerlyn Valdez represented the organization in the 2025 Futures Game at Atlanta's Truist Park.

EXTRA! EXTRA! Billy Cook doubled in the fifth inning on Tuesday at Philadelphia, extending Pittsburgh's streak of games with at least one extra-base hit to 59 straight games (since April 26 at Milwaukee)...The Pirates' only longer such streaks (within a single season) during the 21st century were a 97-game streak from May 23-September 7, 2007, a 75-game streak from June 21-September 15 (G1), 2015, a 71-game streak from April 4-June 23, 2005, a 64-game streak from June 1-August 14, 2019, a 61-game streak last year from July 22-September 28 and a 60-game streak from May 26-August 1, 2001...The current streak is the longest by any Major League team this season...The Pirates' 253 extra-base hits this year rank ninth in Major League Baseball.

RELIABLE RELIEVER: Isaac Mattson tossed 0.2 scoreless inning of relief on Tuesday at Philadelphia...He has posted a 1.08 ERA (8.1ip/1er), nine strikeouts, a .107 batting average against (3-for-28) and a 0.72 WHIP over his last eight appearances, dating back to May 16 vs. Philadelphia...Mattson has held opponents scoreless during 23 of his 27 appearances so far this year.

END(Y) IN SIGHT: Endy Rodríguez, who made his second appearance at first base this season (also 2.0 innings on June 9 vs. Los Angeles-NL) and his first start at the position since April 13, 2025 at Cincinnati, had a ninth-inning single on Tuesday at Philadelphia...He is 14-for-43 (.326) with four doubles, three home runs, 10 RBI, seven walks, a 1.048 OPS and seven runs in his last 14 games (since June 12 vs. Miami)...His average in that time is tied with Minnesota's Victor Caratini for the fourth-best mark among Major League switch hitters (minimum 50 plate appearances), behind only Washington's Nasim Núñez (.347), Bryan Reynolds (.344) and Arizona's Ketel Marte (.328).

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 1, 2015: Neil Walker posted the seventh four-hit game of his career and his first since September 19, 2013 vs. San Diego in Pittsburgh's 9-3 win over Detroit at Comerica Park. The Pirates' 21 hits were their most in a game since May 13 (G2), 2004 at Colorado. Walker went 4-for-6 with two home runs, three RBI, a stolen base and three runs scored (was the third multi-homer game of his career).

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Skenes had a no-decision after allowing four runs and striking out seven batters over his 5.0 innings in Pittsburgh's 6-4 loss on June 26 vs. Cincinnati...He has gone 0-5 with a 4.40 ERA (43.0ip/21er) and 58 strikeouts over his last eight starts, dating back to May 17 vs. Philadelphia (the Pirates have lost each of those eight starts).

AGAINST THE PHILLIES: Skenes is 0-2 with a 2.61 ERA (20.2ip/6er) and 23 strikeouts in three career starts against Philadelphia...He tossed his first career complete game, but lost a 1-0 decision, after allowing one run and striking out nine batters over 8.0 innings on May 18, 2025 here at Citizens Bank Park...Skenes had a no-decision after allowing an unearned run and striking out seven batters over 7.2 innings in Pittsburgh's 2-1 win on June 8, 2025 at PNC Park...He lost a 6-0 decision after allowing five runs and striking out seven batters in 5.0 innings this year on May 17 at PNC Park.

THE 500 CLUB: Skenes' fourth-inning strikeout of Elly De La Cruz in his last start on June 26 vs. Cincinnati was the 500th of his Major League career (it came in his 72nd start)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the fastest Pirates pitcher (by starts) since at least 1893 to reach the mark, surpassing Bob Veale (77 starts, 1962-65).

LET'S FACE IT: Skenes has represented Pittsburgh at the All-Star Game in each of the last two seasons, getting the starting nod for the National League in 2024 at Texas and last season at Atlanta...According the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the first pitcher and one of only five players ever to start the All-Star Game in each of his first two Major League seasons, joining Joe DiMaggio (seven, 1936-42), Ichiro Suzuki (four, 2001-04), Rod Carew (three, 1967-69) and Frank Robinson (two, 1956-57)...Skenes is now looking to become the third Pittsburgh pitcher to be named to three straight All-Star teams...He would join Rip Sewell (1943-44, 1946) & Elroy Face (1959-61) on that list.

BEST OF THE BEST: Skenes' 2.22 ERA (413.2ip/102er) through 72 Major League starts ranks second among all Major League pitchers through their first 72 starts during the Live Ball Era (since 1920), behind only New York (NL)'s Dwight Gooden (1.91, 1984-86).

DON'T WALK HERE: Skenes pitched 39.0 consecutive innings without issuing a walk (the streak began in the fourth inning on April 13 vs. Washington) before allowing a walk to Adolis Garcia in the fifth inning on May 17 vs. Philadelphia...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that was the second-longest streak without a walk by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Bob Friend (46.1ip, May 28-June 22, 1963).

CRAZY EIGHTS: Skenes pitched 8.0 scoreless innings while allowing two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts on May 6 at Arizona and May 12 vs. Colorado...He joined Bob Veale (Sept. 16-22, 1963) and Steve Blass (Sept. 15-20, 1968) as the only Pirates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings and allow two or fewer hits in back-to-back starts...He also became just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1901 to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings while giving up two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts, along with Boston (AL)'s Cy Young (1905), Chicago (AL)'s Billy Pierce (1958) and San Diego's Mat Latos (2010).

WHAT'S UP, DOC: Skenes won the National League Cy Young Award in 2025, one year after being named the National League Rookie of the Year...He became the second pitcher in Major League history to win the Rookie of the Year Award and the Cy Young Award in consecutive seasons, along with the Mets' Dwight Gooden (1984-85)...Skenes joined Vernon Law (1960) & Doug Drabek (1990) as the only Pirates to win the award.
