TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin a 6-game homestand with the first of 3 games against the Houston Astros...the Mariners will also host the Texas Rangers (3 G, 4/11-4/13) on the homestand...tonight's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Dave Valle** on the call with **Jen Mueller** serving as dugout reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and Mariners.com with **Rick Rizzs** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners fell to the Giants in yesterday's series finale 5-4 in walk-off fashion...the Mariners tied the game at 4 in the bottom of the ninth on a **Randy Arozarena** RBI double before the Giants pushed the winning run across in the bottom half of the inning.

- **More Moore** - **Dylan Moore** has hit safely in each of his 5 starts so far this season, and is batting .368 (7x19) with 3 runs, 2 home runs, 2 RBI, 3 walks and 1 stolen base, getting on base at a .455 clip and slugging .684 with a 1.139 OPS in 8 games.
- **Raleigh Rolling** - **Cal Raleigh** is batting .296 (8x27) with 4 runs, 1 double, 2 home runs, 3 RBI, 1 stolen base and 4 walks, getting on base at a .387 clip and slugging .556 (.943 OPS) over his last 7 games (3/30-c), after going hitless in his first 3 games of the season (3/27-29).
- **Double Scoop of Beans** - **Luke Raley** was hit-by-pitch twice in yesterday's game, the 5th time since the start of last season he has recorded multiple HBP in the same game, most in the Majors during that span (second: Willi Castro-MIN, 3).

CAL GETTING ON BASE...catcher **Cal Raleigh** extended his on-base streak (via hit, walk, or hit-by-pitch) to 23 games yesterday reaching safely 4 times (3x4, 2B, HR, BB), the 9th time in his career he has reached base safely 4+ times in a game (last: Sept. 14 vs. TEX)...the 23-game streak started on Sept. 14, 2024 is the **longest active on-base streak in the American League**, 2nd-longest in the big leagues behind Shohei Ohtani-LAD (26 G)...Cal's on-base streak is the longest by a Mariners player since Teoscar Hernández (30 G) from Aug. 15-Sept. 16, 2023.

HOT ROD...**Julio Rodríguez** hit his team-leading 3rd home run of the season in yesterday's game...over his first 10 games this season, he has 7 runs, 1 triple, 3 home runs, 5 RBI, 3 stolen bases and 6 walks, getting on base at a .356 clip and slugging .514 (.869 OPS)...dating back to Aug. 28, 2024, Julio is batting .319 (53x166) with 35 runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, 12 home runs, 33 RBI and 9 stolen bases, getting on base at a .378 clip and slugging .578 (.957 OPS)...during that span, he ranks 2nd in the Majors with 2.4 fWAR, trailing only Shohei Ohtani-LAD (3.1 fWAR).

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...the Mariners begin a 6-game homestand against the Houston Astros and Texas Rangers tonight with the first of 3 **Cal Raleigh "Platinum Glove" Bobblehead Nights** with each game also being a **Mariners Value Game**, with tickets starting at \$10...upcoming events on the homestand include **Mariners Corduroy Hat Night** on April 11, **Mariners Salute to Armed Forces Night** on April 12 and **Mariners Little League Day** on April 13.

MAN ON THE MUÑ...Mariners reliever **Andrés Muñoz** tossed a scoreless 10th inning on Friday, recording 2 strikeouts and 1 walk (intentional)...the right-hander stranded the automatic runner on second base to get the game to an 11th inning...through 4 appearances so far this season, Muñoz has not allowed a run in 4.0 innings, going 3-for-3 in save opportunities with 4 walks and 7 strikeouts, while sporting a 15.8 strikeouts-per-9 mark...on Opening Day, he joined Edwin Díaz, Josh Hader, Craig Kimbrel, Kenley Jansen, Dellin Betances, Ken Giles and Greg Holland as the only pitchers since 2000 to post a 2.64 ERA, 12.4 SO/9 and a 3.53 SO/BB or better over his first 200 career games.

PAPÁ POLO...third baseman **Jorge Polanco** was reinstated from the Paternity List prior to Friday's game...in Friday's series opener against San Francisco, he went 3-for-5 with a game-tying, 2-run homer and 4 RBI...the 4 RBI marked his most in a game since May 1, 2022 while playing for Minnesota at Tampa Bay...in 5 games this season, "Polo" is batting .450 (9x20) with 2 home runs, 8 RBI and a 1.226 OPS.

PATIENCE PAYS OFF...the Mariners offense is tied for the American League lead with 45 walks this season (also: Boston)...Seattle is averaging 4.50 walks-per-game through its first 10 contests of the year...the 45 walks are tied for 2nd-most in the Majors with Boston and Arizona, trailing only the Chicago Cubs (66 BB in 12 G)...**J.P. Crawford** leads the pack with 9 walks, followed by **Randy Arozarena** (7 BB), **Cal Raleigh** (7) and **Julio Rodríguez** (6).

IN-SPEIER-ING PERFORMER...Mariners left-handed reliever **Gabe Speier** has not allowed a run across 4 appearances so far this season...Speier has struck out 6 batters with no walks...in 32 career games during the months of March/April (2022-c), he has a 0.29 ERA (1 ER, 31.0 IP) with 3 walks and 35 strikeouts.

MARINERS, SEATTLE SPORTS ANNOUNCE "THE CAL RALEIGH SHOW"...the Mariners and flagship radio station **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** are bringing "**The Cal Raleigh Show**" to Mariners fans every Thursday at 5 p.m. PT during the 2025 season (will air at an earlier hour on Thursdays when the Mariners are on road trips in the CST and EST time zones)...the show debuted this past Thursday, April 3, with its next episode set for April 10...Mariners star catcher **Cal Raleigh**, who signed a 6-year contract extension with Seattle through 2030 with a vesting player option for 2031 on March 26, sits down with Mariners insider **Shannon Drayer** for a weekly conversation to give Seattle fans an inside look into the M's 2025 season.

KEEPING UP WITH THE JONESES...the Mariners had a pitcher named "Luis Castillo" start for them in 2 consecutive games: #58 **Luis Castillo** "La Piedra" in Wednesday's series finale win over the Tigers, and #43 **Luis F. Castillo**, who made his first career MLB start in Friday's opener against the Giants...the two Luis Castillos became the second duo with the same name to start back-to-back games for a team, joining Bobby Jones and Bobby Jones, who did it for the New York Mets on July 3-4, 2000 and again for the San Diego Padres on Aug. 10-11, 2002...additionally, the two Castillos became the third set of players with the same name to appear for the Mariners in franchise history, joining Ken Griffey (Jr.) and Ken Griffey (Sr.) who were famously teammates in 1990-91, and also Brian Hunter (1996) and Brian Hunter (1999).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Logan Gilbert** holds a 3.00 ERA (4 ER, 12.0 IP) with 1 walk and 18 strikeouts in his first 2 starts this season, leading the American League in strikeouts and SO/9 (13.50), but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that since the start of the 2022 season, Gilbert has recorded 601 strikeouts, 2nd-most in the American League over that span, trailing only Kevin Gausman-TOR (608)?...during that span he also ranks 7th in the Majors, trailing Dylan Cease-CWS/SD (679), Aaron Nola-PHI (644), Corbin Burnes-MIL/BAL/ARI (635), Zack Wheeler-PHI (617), Pablo López-MIA (614) and Gausman.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT...

- The 27-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 3rd start of the season and 1st against Houston...he will also make the 124th start of his MLB career and 13th career start against the Astros.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau.
- Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
- Was named the 2022 and the 2024 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.

LAST TIME OUT...L#1 on 4/1 vs. DET, allowing 2 hits, 3 earned runs, 1 walk and 10 strikeouts across 5.0 innings of work...reached double-digit strikeouts for the 6th time in his career (last: 9/7/24 vs. STL)...it also marked his 1st career start with 10 K's in 5 or less innings pitched...threw 92 pitches and 61 strikes, tying a career-high mark of 22 swing-and-misses (also: 7/4/23 vs. SFG).

LEADING THE WAY...Gilbert's 18 strikeouts so far this season is currently tied for 2nd most in the Majors, joining MacKenzie Gore-WSN and Zack Wheeler-PHI...his 0.667 WHIP is also 3rd-best in the AL (min. 12.0 IP), trailing Drew Rasmussen-TB (.600) and Nathan Eovaldi-TEX (0.467) who currently leads the Majors.

HOME SWEET HOME...currently leads the MLB in strikeouts at home with 18 on the season, ahead of Hunter Greene-CIN and Cristopher Sánchez-PHI (16)...his 369 strikeouts at home ranks 5th all-time in Mariners history for most career strikeouts at T-Mobile Park, trailing Félix Hernández (1348), Jamie Moyer (478), Hisashi Iwakuma (393), and Freddy García (378).

STELLAR START...became 1 of 5 pitchers in Mariners history to total 18+ strikeouts in first 2 starts of the season, joining Randy Johnson (done 2x, 1993, 1996), Mark Langston (1996), Félix Hernández (done 2x, 2007, 2014), and Floyd Bannister (1982).

LIGHTS OUT...18 strikeouts across his first two starts is Gilbert's career-high to begin a season...it also marks his 4th time with 18 strikeouts across 2 games, trailing his career-high of 19 K's over back-to-back games (done 2x: 9/24-9/7/24, 8/27/24-9/2/24).

BEST OF THE AL WEST...this will be Gilbert's 1st start of the season against an AL West opponent...is 16-10 with a 3.15 ERA (100 ER, 286.0 IP) all-time vs. AL West teams with 48 career starts...has dealt 276 K's while allowing 222 hits, 36 HR, and 57 walks against AL West teams, holding them to a .211 AVG.

OPENING DAY DEBUT...made his first career Opening Day start, becoming the 19th different pitcher in Mariners history to start the season opener...Gilbert also became the 5th "homegrown" pitcher (signed or drafted and developed in the Mariners minor league system) to start Opening Day for the Mariners, joining Félix Hernández, Erik Hanson, Mike Moore and Mark Langston.

A DEBUT FOR THE BOOKS...joins Felix Hernandez (2015) and Randy Johnson (1994) as one of three pitchers in franchise history to have pitched 7.0 innings or more while giving up two or less hits on Opening Day...also became the fourth pitcher (done 8x) in franchise history to allow 1 or less runs over 7+ innings on Opening Day, joining Félix Hernández (2007, 2009, 2012-13 and 2015), Randy Johnson (1993) and Robbie Ray (2022)...tied for third-most strikeouts (8) in an Opening Day debut in franchise history, along with Erik Hanson (1991).

SPRINGING INTO ACTION...owns a career-best 2.38 ERA (27 ER, 102.0 IP) in the opening month of the season with a 6-2 record and 118 strikeouts...among active pitchers in March/April (min. 100 IP), he ranks third in ERA, trailing Aroldis Chapman (1.28 ERA) and Adam Ottavino (1.89 ERA).

200/200 CLUB...finished the 2024 season with 208.2 innings pitched and 220 strikeouts, becoming the 6th Mariners pitcher to reach 200+ in each category in the same season, joining Félix Hernández (6x, 2009-14), Randy Johnson (5x, 1991-93, 1995, 1997), Mark Langston (4x, 1984, 1986-88), Erik Hanson (1990) and Floyd Bannister (1982).

ALL-STAR CALIBER...was named to the 2024 American League All-Star team, his 1st All-Star selection...in 20 starts through the All-Star break last season, he led AL starters with 132.1 IP while ranking 2nd in ERA (2.79), 3rd in strikeouts (124), and gave up the 3rd fewest hits (88).

PUNCHING TICKETS...had 220 strikeouts in 2024, the 13th-most in franchise history and the most since Félix Hernández (248) in 2014...also became the 9th different pitcher to reach 200+ strikeouts and the 3rd different Mariners pitcher to do so in the last 3 seasons (Robbie Ray in 2022 and Luis Castillo in 2023).

LEAGUE LEADER...led the Major Leagues in innings (208.2 IP) and WHIP (0.89) in 2024, becoming the first pitcher in Mariners to ever do so...also tied for the MLB lead in starts (33)...tied for the AL lead in quality starts (22), ranked 2nd in Opp. AVG (.194), 3rd in strikeouts (220), 3rd in strikeouts-to-walks (5.95) and 5th in fWAR (4.1).

CAREER YEAR...set career-best marks with 33 games started (previous: 32 in 2022 and 2023), 208.2 innings pitched (previous: 190.2 IP in 2023), 220 strikeouts (previous: 189 in 2023), 1.6 walks-per-9-innings (previous: 1.7 in 2023), 0.89 WHIP (previous: 1.08 in 2023) and 4.1 fWAR (previous: 3.1 in 2023)...finishes 6th in AL Cy Young Award balloting.

TOUGH AB...opponents hit just .196 (148x756) against him in 2024, one of 2 qualified pitchers in franchise history with a sub-.200 opponents batting average (also: Randy Johnson, .194 in 1997).
