METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets opened up a four-game series with the Giants with a 9-4 victory last night...The Mets are a season-high six games above .500...With the victory, the Mets secured a winning road trip (6-1)...New York has won back-to-back games and seven of their last eight contests...The Mets finish their second road trip of the season an 11-day, 10-game trip (6-1) against the Athletics (3-0), Dodgers (2-1) and Giants (1-0)...The Mets are off on Monday before they return home for a six-game homestand against the Nationals (three games) and Rockies (three games).

CALIFORNIA, HERE I COME: Joey Lucchesi is expected to make the start tonight...The left-handed pitcher grew up in Newark, CA, located less than 40 miles from Oracle Park...He will make his first major league appearance since June 18, 2021 at Washington...This will mark his eighth start against the Giants...He is 2-2 with a 3.52 ERA (15 ER/38.1 IP) mark with 12 walks and 45 strikeouts against the club.

CALIFORNICATION: The Mets are 6-1 on their current 10-game road trip...The team has hit .261/.370/.457 with 15 doubles, 11 home runs, 44 RBI, 37 walks and seven steals during the trip...The Mets are outscoring opponents 46-29 during the first six games of the trip...Overall, the Mets are 9-5 on the road this season.

RED HOT: The Mets have homered in seven of their last eight games...The team has hit 13 home runs in that span...The Mets hit a total of 10 home runs in the previous 12 games.

GIVE IT AWAY: New York's offense is second in the majors with 96 free passes this season...The team has struck out just 139 times this season, the second-fewest in the majors...That gives the Mets a 5.5 percent rate of K/BB ratio, the best in the majors...Only one other team (the Guardians at 8.2 percent) is under 10 percent...Courtesy Sportsradar.

WAR, WHAT IS IT GOOD FOR?: Brandon Nimmo leads the major leagues with a 1.5 fWAR...Francisco Lindor is sixth in the majors and fifth in the Senior Circuit with a 1.1 fWAR.

BY THE WAY: Brandon Nimmo collected three hits last night and has collected eight hits in his last two games...Nimmo is the 11th player in Mets history to record eight or more hits in a two-game span...The last to do it was Amed Rosario, who went 9-11 on August 14-15, 2019 at Atlanta...Rosario was also the last player to do this in the majors overall, logging a four-hit game in each end of a doubleheader on September 17, 2022.

ROAD TRIPPIN': Over the seven game road trip, Brandon Nimmo is batting .516 (16-31) with six runs, four doubles, a home run, six RBI, three walks with a .571 OBP and a .742 SLG...Overall, in 19 games this season, Nimmo is batting .368 with 12 runs, six doubles, 11 RBI, 15 walks, a .488 OBP and a .500 SLG...His .481 OBP ranks second in the majors and in the Senior Circuit...He is batting .362 (17-47) in his last 12 games vs. the Giants...In 2023, Nimmo is hitting .404 (21-52) on the road...He has a .323 (116-359) road average since the start of last year, which is the fifth-highest in the majors in that span.

GOING BACK TO CALI: Over the last five games, Jeff McNeil has batted .471 (8-17) with three runs, two doubles, a home run, three RBI, three walks, a .571 OBP and a .765 SLG...McNeil has raised his season batting average from .212 to .275 during this span.

THE FRANCISCO LINDOR WAY: Over the last 14 games, Francisco Lindor is batting .273 (15-55) with 15 runs, seven doubles, four home runs, 16 RBI, six walks, two steals with a .375 OBP, a .618 SLG and a .993 OPS...This comes after Lindor batted .111 (2-18) in his first six games.

THIS IS THE PLACE: Eduardo Escobar has an extra-base hit in seven consecutive games against the Giants...Only six players have ever had a longer streak against the club...Overall, Escobar has hit safely in 10 straight games against San Francisco, going 18-40 (.450) with a 1.275 OPS.

GIANTS-METS NOTES: In 2022, the Mets won the season series for the first time since they went 4-3 in 2018...New York is 34-40 at Oracle Park since the ballpark opened in 2010.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets have stolen 21 bases this season, which is tied for fourth in the majors and is tied for second in the National League...New York is one of only six teams with 20 or more stolen bases in 2023, joining the Guardians (26), Orioles (25), Cubs (22), Pirates (21) and Yankees (20).

APRIL, SHE WILL COME: Alonso needs one home run in the next 10 days to set a Mets record for March/April homers...Alonso also hit nine home runs in March/April 2019...John Buck, Carlos Delgado, Dave Kingman and Neil Walker are the only other Mets in club history with nine home runs in the season's first month...He has nine home runs through 20 team games...That ties a Mets record also held by Dave Kingman (1976) and Neil Walker (2016).

CAN'T STOP: Pete Alonso hit his ninth home run of the season last night...He leads the major leagues in home runs, tied for fourth with 19 RBI, is fourth with a .649 SLG and 11th with a 1.024 OPS...Alonso has safely hit in 12 of his last 14 games, batting .345 (19-55) with 13 runs, eight home runs, 17 RBI, seven walks with a .419 OBP and an .782 SLG.

ROAD WARRIOR: Alonso has hit 89 home runs on the road in his career...That places him in sixth place in franchise history, ahead of Carlos Beltran...Beltran recorded 88 homers in 434 road games...Next up is Howard Jonson who socked 102 in 580 away games.

WALK THIS WAY: Brandon Nimmo has drawn 15 walks and struck out just eight times this season...Jeff McNeil has 13 walks and has also struck out only seven times...There are 25 players with at least a dozen walks in 2023 and Cleveland's Steven Kwan is the only other with fewer than 10 strikeouts.

CANHA GET AN AMEN: Mark Canha has recorded eight extra-base hits through 19 games this season...He had no extra-base hits until his 15th game last year and did not collect his seventh until June 6, his 45th game...He is hitting .308 (20-65) with a .961 OPS in his last 16 games against the Giants with two doubles, a triple, five home runs, 15 RBI and 16 runs scored.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed just four errors in 20 games this season, the fewest in the majors...The team's .994 fielding percentage is the best in the majors...Francisco Lindor has recorded five DRS (defensive runs saved) according to the Fielding Bible...That is tied for the most in the majors.

BROTHERS IN ARMS: Together, Adam Ottavino and David Robertson have combined to post a 1.58 ERA (3 ER/17.1 IP) with five walks and 19 strikeouts...They have converted seven of eight save opportunities...They are one of three pairs of teammates who have each recorded multiple saves this season (also, Devin Williams and Bryse Wilson of the Brewers, Carlos Estévez and José Quijada of the Angels).

LUCCHESI NEWS & NOTES

JOEY FUEGO: LHP Joey Lucchesi is set to make his season debut today...He made his major league debut on March 30, 2018 while with San Diego in a start against Milwaukee...Played for the Padres for three seasons before coming to the Mets in 2021...As a Met, Lucchesi—who adopted the nickname "Fuego" while in college—made eight starts in 11 appearances, pitching to a 4.46 ERA (19 ER/38.1 IP) and racking up 41 strikeouts before his season was cut short after undergoing "Tommy John" surgery...Made his Mets debut in relief on April 7, 2021 at Philadelphia, tossing 2.0 scoreless innings...Pitched to a 1.19 ERA (3 ER/22.2 IP) with 24 strikeouts over his last five outings of the 2021 season before his season-ending injury.

LAST TIME OUT: Lucchesi threw 6.2 shutout innings on April 13 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre with Syracuse, allowing just two hits and two walks while striking out five to earn the win.

AWAKE THE SLEEP (AGAINST THE) GIANTS: Lucchesi has not made an appearance or start against the Giants since joining the Mets...His last start against the Giants came on August 31, 2019 at Oracle Park, when he allowed one run on eight hits, one walk and three strikeouts in 6.0 innings while with the Padres...In his career, Lucchesi has faced San Francisco seven times, pitching to a 2-2 record and a 3.52 ERA (15 ER/38.1 IP).

SLINGIN' IN SYRACUSE: Lucchesi has made three starts so far this season for Triple-A Syracuse...In his three starts at Syracuse, he has pitched to a 2.30 ERA (4 ER/15.2 IP) and has tallied 16 strikeouts...Lucchesi has held opponents to a .196 average thus far, while pitching to a 1.15 WHIP.

2022 HIGHLIGHTS: Last season, Lucchesi made his return to the mound after recovering from Tommy John surgery in June of 2021...Made eight rehab appearances across three minor league affiliates, posting a 2.13 ERA (3 ER/12.2 IP)...He allowed 12 hits in eight appearances—four of which were starts—while tallying three walks and fanning 12 batters.

TROUBLE WITH THE CHURVE: Has gained attention throughout his career for a pitch he created, called the "churve"...Developed from a basic changeup, Lucchesi holds the ball deep in his palm and tinkered with his wrist action and position to throw the pitch in a similar nature to a breaking ball...Since then, it is a go-to weapon for Lucchesi...In 2019, his curve had an average 8.9 vertical drop, per Statcast, which was the most movement of any pitcher's changeup by more than a full inch...According to Baseball Savant, Lucchesi's pitch arsenal also featured a sinker, curve, cutter and change the last time he was in the majors.

NOT SO NEW(ARK): Lucchesi hails from Newark, CA, which is a 38.8-mile drive along the Bay to San Francisco, making this appearance somewhat of a homecoming for the southpaw.
