STAY INFORMED

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RAY REPORT—The Rays continue their eight-game, seven-day road trip against the Red Sox (0-2, two to play) and the Blue Jays (four to play) today at Fenway Park...marks their first road trip with back-to-back four-game sets since July 12-18, 2019 against the Orioles (3-1) and the Yankees (1-3)...are 13-7 (.650) in their last 20 contests (June 24–pres.), the third-best record in the majors over that span behind only the Red Sox (16-3/.842) and Cubs (13-6/.684)...had a season-high nine-game winning streak from June 24–July 3 (T4th-longest in TB history)...prior to the streak, went an MLB-best 22-4 from April 22–May 22 and an MLB-worst 9-18 from May 24–June 23...lead the AL with a 56-40 (.583) record, tied for the third best in the majors...they are currently 0-2 on a stretch of 11 games in 10 days (July 17-26) and 20 games in 20 days (July 17–Aug. 5)...have spent 62 days leading the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth, including 20 consecutive days in first...hold a 3.0-game lead in the division.

- ✦ The Rays dropped both games of a doubleheader yesterday to the Red Sox, falling 10-0 and 5-3...marked their first doubleheader since Aug. 19, 2023 at LAA and the first time they have been swept in a doubleheader since July 18, 2019 at NYY.
- ✦ The 10-run set back in game one was their second-largest loss this season (14-3, May 30 vs. LAA) and was the 19th time in team history they have been shut out and allowed double-digit runs (last: May 10, 2022 at LAA, 12-0).
- ✦ They went 454 games without playing a doubleheader (Aug. 20, 2023–July 12, 2026), the longest stretch in franchise history, surpassing a streak of 422 straight games from Oct. 1, 2004–July 20, 2007...according to Stats Perform, the 454-game stretch without a twin bill is the 18th-longest streak in major league history.
- ✦ The Rays are an AL-best 19-9 (.679) against left-handed starters this season...the Red Sox have accounted for eight of those games, starting a southpaw in each game against the Rays thus far in 2026...with today's probable starter **Patrick Sandoval**, the Red Sox are set to be the first team to start nine games or more with a left-handed pitcher against the Rays in a single season since 2021 (TOR, 10)...the last time a team faced nine or more left-handed starters to begin a season against a single club was the 2003 Rangers, who faced 11 straight southpaw starters against the Athletics (Stats Perform).
- ✦ With a loss today, the Rays would fall to 0-6-9 in their last 15 four-games series (June 7, 2024–pres.)...it would also mark their first defeat in a four-game set since Sept. 4-7, 2025 vs. CLE (1-3), after splitting each of their last three.
- ✦ According to FanGraphs, entering play today, the Rays have postseason odds of 95.8 pct., the fourth highest in the majors...they have the third-easiest remaining schedule by opponent winning pct. (.487), with just 28 of their remaining 66 games coming against teams currently above .500.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Yesterday, the Cardinals selected minor league **RHP Trey Pooser** as the player to be named later to complete the trade for **RHP Chris Roycroft** on June 23...Pooser was selected by the Rays in the 10th round (306th overall) of the 2024 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Kentucky...the Rays also returned **RHP Mason Englert** to Triple-A Durham after he served as the 27th man for yesterday's doubleheader.

- RISP & REWARD**—In their last three games since July 12 vs. SEA, the Rays are batting .149 (14-for-94) with three of their five runs coming via long balls...in those three games, they are 1-for-6 (.167) with runners in scoring position, the third-fewest at-bats with RISP over any three-game span in a single season in team history ahead of only July 17-19, 2021 (5AB) and May 12-14, 2006 (5AB)...it is the third time this season they have been held to one or zero hits with RISP over a three-game span, joining April 28–May 1 (1-for-13) and March 30–April 1 (0-for-16).
- ✦ On the year, the Rays (.276) have the second-best RISP average in the majors behind the Twins (.288)...they also lead MLB in RISP average with two outs, hitting .259 (100-for-386) with a .354 OBP that ranks third in the majors.
 - ✦ **Yandy Diaz** paces the majors leagues in average with RISP, hitting .435 (30-for-69) with 4 2B, 1 3B, 34 RBI, and a 1.045 OPS...his .435 average is on pace to be the best RISP average (min. 65AB) in franchise history, the 11th best in a single major league season in the divisional era (since 1969), and the best since **COL Nolan Jones** (.434) in 2023...under the same criteria, no AL hitter has had had a .435 average or higher since **BOS Manny Ramirez** (.435) in 2002.

- KEEP THE BALL IN THE YARD**—Rays pitchers have been tagged for multiple homers in nine of their last 15 games (June 30–pres.), including each of their last three (July 12–pres.)...over that 15-game stretch, they have allowed 26 home runs, third most in the majors, fewer than only the Athletics (29) and Padres (27)...across the season, Rays arms have allowed 187 runs on 123 home runs, the eighth-most long balls conceded in MLB...the 187 runs account for 45.8 pct. of all runs (408) they have allowed in the campaign, marking the fourth highest pct. of runs via long ball in the majors (see table on the right).
- ✦ Rays relievers have surrendered 60 home runs, tied for the third most in the majors with the Cubs and fewer than only the Nationals (72) and Athletics (61) bullpens...the 60 home runs have accounted for 91 runs against the bullpen and 45.5 pct (91/200) of their runs allowed.

- NEWER ENGLAND**—Madison, Conn. native and today's probable starter, **Ian Seymour**, is set to be the first Rays pitcher from New England (Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island, Vermont) to start at Fenway Park since **Aaron Civale** (East Windsor, Conn.) on May 14, 2024...Seymour made his major league debut on June 9, 2025 at Fenway Park, pitching the 10th and 11th innings en route to becoming the third New England native to earn a win in his major league debut at Fenway Park in the modern era (since 1900), joining **BOS Kevin Morton** (Norwalk, Conn.) on July 5, 1991 vs. DET and **NY Yankees Charlie Devens** (Milton, Mass.) on Sept. 24, 1932 at BOS.
- ✦ This season, Seymour has made his changeup the primary pitch in his arsenal (31.0%)...he is holding hitters to a .136 (12-for-88) average, a .193 slugging pct., and a 35.8 whiff rate against the pitch...the Red Sox (.219) as a team are hitting below league average (.223) against left-handed offspeed pitches in 2026...their 34.8 whiff rate is the fifth highest in the AL against offspeed pitches from southpaws.

- GET OUT BALL**—The Rays have homered in 17 of their last 23 games (June 21–pres.), tallying more multi-home run games (11) over that span than games without a long ball (6)...their 35 home runs over that span are the most in the AL, second most in the majors (WSH, 42), and are their most in any 23-game span since July 29–Aug. 24, 2023 (38)...they are 21-4 (.840) when they hit multiple home runs this season, the third-best record in the majors behind the Yankees (35-4/.897) and Dodgers (27-5/.844)...they have won 12 of their last 13 contests (June 14–pres.) when registering two long balls or more.
- ✦ Since the power surge began on June 21, 11 of the 13 position players the Rays have used during that span have have homered, with **Junior Caminero** (14), **Cedric Mullins** (5), **Victor Mesa Jr.** (3), **Ryan Vilade** (3), **Jonathan Aranda** (2), **Jonny DeLuca** (2), **Richie Palacios** (2) all recording multiple long balls.

- GREAT GREEN JEWEL OF THE COMMONWEALTH**—The Rays and Red Sox continue their 13-game season set today at Fenway Park...the Rays claimed the first two sets of the season against the Red Sox between May 7-10 (2-1) in Boston and June 8-10 (3-0) in St. Petersburg...the Rays are 5-3 against the Red Sox in 2026 after going 3-10 in 2025...they need to win two of their remaining five games against the Red Sox to clinch their seventh season series victory over the past eight seasons (2019–pres.).
- ✦ In six games against the Red Sox this season, **Nick Fortes** is slashing .500/.660/.636 (11-for-22) with 3 2B, 1 RBI, 5 R, and a 1.196 OPS...min. 25 PA, his 1.196 OPS would be the 10th best by a Ray over a single season against the Red Sox and the best since **Mike Zunino** had a 1.250 in 2021...he has reached base safely in 12 straight starts against the Red Sox (July 2, 2024–pres.) and in 13 of 14 career games against the club.
 - ✦ **Yandy Diaz** had a 20-game on-base streak against the Red Sox (Sept. 28, 2024–June 10, 2026) snapped yesterday...it was the third-longest on-base streak against the team in Rays history behind **Akinori Iwamura** (.26G, Sept. 22, 2007–May 3, 2009) and **Carlos Peña** (Sept. 11, 2007–Sept. 17, 2008)...over that span, Diaz slashed .373/.449/.560 (28-for-75) with 2 2B, 4 HR, 13 RBI, and a

TODAY'S START—**Ian Seymour** is scheduled to take the mound today for his seventh start and 34th appearance of the season...marks his 12th career start and 53rd career appearance...selected in the second round (57th overall) of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of Virginia Tech.

- He is the only AL arm and one of eight MLB pitchers with six wins or more while making in six starts or fewer this season, a group that includes MIL **Aaron Ashby**, STL **Gordon Graceffo**, PHI **Orion Kerkering**, MIA **John King**, SD **Adrian Morejon**, PIT **Yohan Ramirez**, and COL **Antonio Senzatela**.
- In his last four outings (three starts) since June 25, he ranks highly among AL pitchers (min. 20.0IP) in wins (T2nd, 3), SO (3rd, 30), WHIP (3rd, 0.89), opp. OBP (4th, .238), BB (T5th, 5), and opp. AVG (5th, .182).

LAST TIME OUT—The southpaw was dealt his second loss of the season after allowing a career-high-tying six runs (5ER) in an 8-2 loss on July 12 vs. SEA (L, 3.1IP, 6R, 5ER, 3BB, 3SO, HR)...yielded a walk to start the game, but still faced the minimum in the 1st inning...three hits (2 1B, 2B), two walks, and a sacrifice fly plated three runs for the Mariners in the 2nd before Seymour worked a scoreless 3rd frame...in the 4th, he surrendered a solo home run to **Weston Wilson** before a batter reached via error and then a single that led to his removal..**Randy Arozarena**, the first batter to face reliever **Cole Sulser**, blasted a three-run homer that scored both of baserunners on Seymour's ledger.

- Matched a career high (2x, last: June 14 at LAA) by allowing three walks, his most allowed as a starter.
- His 3.1 innings marked his fewest as a starter since he threw 2.0 frames in his first start of the year as an opener on May 15 vs. MIA.

NORTHERN ATTITUDE—Seymour will be making his fourth career appearance and second career start against Boston...is 1-0 with a 1.13 ERA (8.0IP, ER), 8 SO, and a .077 (2-for-26) opp. AVG against the club...he earned the win in his major league debut against the Red Sox after tossing 2.0 innings of relief on June 9, 2025 at Fenway Park (W, 2.0IP, R, 2BB, 2SO)...is 5-1 with two saves, a 4.27 ERA (46.1IP, 22ER), 54 SO, and a .221 (38-for-172) opp. AVG over career 20 outings (four starts) against AL East clubs...includes a 2-1 mark with a 4.58 ERA (19.2IP, 10ER), 27 SO, and a .230 (17-for-74) opp. AVG in the four starts.

- Fenway Park is roughly 30 miles from Westborough, Conn., where Seymour spent most of his childhood...was teammates with White Sox starter **Sean Burke** at St. John's (Mass.) High School, with the two anchoring a state-title-winning pitching staff in 2017...St. Johns is also the alma mater of current Mets color commentator and former All-Star pitcher **Ron Darling**.
- The Connecticut native is the third pitcher in MLB history born in New England (Conn., Maine, Mass., N.H., R.I., Vt.) to earn the win at Fenway Park in his first career game, joining BOS **Kevin Morton** (Conn. - July 5, 1991 vs. DET) and NYY **Charlie Devens** (Mass. - Sept. 24, 1932).

HE'S GONNA GO FAR—Seymour has appeared in 14 games (one start) on the road this season...over his last 10 appearances (one start) as a visitor dating back to April 18 at PIT, he has gone 3-0 with a 3.26 ERA (19.1IP, 7ER), 25 SO, and a .208 (15-for-72) opp. AVG, allowing two earned runs or fewer in each outing...the Rays have gone 8-2 in those games.

- He is 3-2 with a 3.65 ERA (24.2IP, 10ER), 36 SO, a .202 (19-for-94) opp. AVG, and a 1.05 WHIP in five career starts on the road.

WHIFF WATCH—He boasts a 29.4 pct. whiff rate this season, ranking third among AL southpaws (min. 1,000 pitches) to DET **Tarik Skubal** (31.5%) and CLE **Joey Cantillo** (30.0%)...his whiff rate ranks second among Rays arms (min. 750 pitches) behind **Griffin Jax's** 31.4 pct. clip.

THESEYMOURSHOW—On June 25 vs. KC, Seymour was utilized as a bulk reliever behind opener **Casey Legumina** and delivered 6.2 hitless innings with one walk and seven strikeouts...the pairing carried a perfect game through 5.1 innings and a no-hitter through the 8th inning before turning the ball over to **Craig Kimbrel**...it marked the 16th time in franchise history Rays pitchers have made it through 5.0 innings with no baserunners allowed (last: June 24, 2025 at KC).

- Became the third pitcher in the majors since 1980 to throw 6.2 hitless innings or more in relief, joining LAA **Félix Peña** (July 12, 2019 vs. SEA) and CLE **Jake Westbrook** (April 19, 2004 vs. DET)...was the sixth southpaw in the modern era (since 1900) to turn the trick alongside BAL **Tippy Martinez** (July 23, 1979 vs. OAK), STL **Al Brazle** (Aug. 1, 1951 vs. BSN), BOS **Herb Pennock** (Sept. 3, 1917 vs. NYY [G2]), CWS **Dave Danforth** (Aug. 29, 1917 vs. SLB [G2]), and BOS **Dutch Leonard** (July 20, 1914 vs. DET)...all six of these instances occurred at home...it was the most innings pitched by a Rays reliever since **Jalen Beeks** (6.2IP) on May 1, 2019 at KC.
- Seymour's seven strikeouts were the most by a Rays reliever since **Jesse Scholtens** struck out nine batters on Sept. 25, 2025 at BAL.
- He became the seventh southpaw in the modern era (since 1900) to pitch 6.0 hitless innings of relief or more and start his next outing (July 2 at KC), joining LAD **Eric Lauer** (June 22-29, 2026), DET **Ed Glynn** (Sept. 5-12, 1976), CAL **Clyde Wright** (Aug. 20-27, 1968), MLN **Juan Pizarro** (April 29–April 15, 1960), CWS **Dave Danforth** (Aug. 29–Sept. 1, 1917), and BOS **Dutch Leonard** (Sept. 20-25, 1914).
