ROSTER MOVES: Prior to tonight's game, the Mets announced the following roster moves: C Patrick Mazeika has been recalled from Triple-A Syracuse and INF/OF Brandon Drury has been optioned to Triple-A Syracuse...Additionally, the Mets have claimed RHP Robert Stock off of waivers from the Chicago Cubs...He has been optioned to Triple-A Syracuse...Stock made one start for the Cubs this year, allowing five earned runs in 4.0 innings of work on June 16...He has appeared in 53 career games between San Diego, Boston and Chicago and is 2-3 with a 4.66 ERA (35 earned runs/67.2 innings) with 37 walks and 70 strikeouts.

METSELLANEOUS: The Mets split a doubleheader with the Braves yesterday, winning game one, 4-2, and falling in the second game, 1-0...The Mets have been in first place since Saturday, May 8...This is their longest streak atop the NL East since the end of the 2015 season...The Mets continue a six-day, eight-game homestand (1-1) against Atlanta (1-1) and Philadelphia (four games).

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets have won 15 of their last 19 home games...The team has lost back-to-back home games only once this season, from April 27-28 to Boston...Overall, the Mets are 21-8 with a 2.04 ERA (57 earned runs/251.0 innings) with 81 walks and 290 strikeouts at home...The team's 2.05 ERA at home is the best in the majors as is their .724 winning percentage...This compares to a 16-22 record with a 3.97 ERA (139 earned runs/315.0 innings) with 104 walks and 347 strikeouts on the road this year...The team will play just eight more road games before the All-Star break, including three at Yankee Stadium.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets will play their next 10 games against divisional opponents...New York is 15-12 against the NL East this season, posting a 2.89 (73 earned runs/227.0 innings) ERA in those games...The Mets own the largest divisional lead in the majors...The Mets are batting .237/.315/.378 in 27 games against the division this season.

BRAVO: Marcus Stroman is 4-0 with a 1.88 ERA in four career starts vs. the Braves...He has earned a win in all four of his starts vs. the Braves...He has allowed two earned runs or fewer in all four of those outings...The last pitcher to win his first four career starts vs. Atlanta with a sub-2.00 ERA in those games was Adam Wainwright (2007-2009).

EXTRA, EXTRA: Stroman has allowed only 14 extra-base hits in 84.1 innings, the second-fewest among the 49 pitchers in the majors who have thrown at least 75.0 innings this season...Only Brandon Woodruff (12) has allowed fewer...Ranks 15th in the majors and 11th in the NL in opponent slugging (.325)...He has four starts this season in which he's pitched at least 5.0 innings without allowing a single extra-base hit, tied for the second-most in the majors.

THE SUMMER OF JAKE: The Mets have won Jacob deGrom's last seven starts, which is the third-longest such streak since his debut in 2014...The Mets won eight consecutive starts by deGrom in 2017 (June 12-July 24) and 2015 (July 8-August 24)...deGrom himself won his fifth consecutive decision yesterday and extended his scoreless streak to 30.0 IP, one inning shy of matching his career-high and 3.0 innings away from setting the all-time Mets mark...He is the first pitcher in club history with multiple scoreless streaks of 30+ IP.

deGOAT: Last night, deGrom lowered his ERA to 0.50...Only two other pitchers have ever had an ERA of 0.50 or better in a 12-start span in one season (min. 60.0 innings): Bob Gibson (1968) and Jake Arrieta (2015)...Retired 21 consecutive hitters from his start on June 11 through the third inning today...His career-high is 23 straight hitters retired (May 21, 2015)...Thanks to Elias for research assistance...He has allowed one or no earned runs in all 12 of his starts this season, the longest streak by a non-opener since the ER became official in 1913 (broke Bob Gibson's record of 11 in 1968)...He pitched a perfect first inning for the 11th start in a row...According to Elias, he is the first pitcher in the divisional era (since 1961) to retire his opponent's first three hitters in 11 consecutive starts...Lowered his career ERA vs. ATL to 1.88, the second-lowest ever (min. 20 GS).

THE AMAZING JONATHAN: Jonathan Villar is batting .316/.519/.368 in the first inning this season...His .519 OBP in the first inning is the fifth highest in the majors (min 15 PA)...He is batting .28-/407/.427 with seven extra-base hits, five RBI and 15 walks in 26 games at Citi Field this season.

TOTAL DOMINATION: Dominic Smith recorded his 100th career extra-base hit in game one yesterday...He has 11 RBI in June after having eight RBI in both April and May...He had four extra-base hits this April, five in May and now has six so far in June...Smith is batting .346/.356/.475 in 20 games this month.

QUALITY EATS: The starting rotation has put up a 1.57 ERA (13 earned runs/74.2 innings) with 16 walks and 89 strikeouts over the last 14 games...Overall, the Mets have made 29 quality starts this season...The Mets starting rotation owns a 2.63 ERA (98 earned runs/335.2 innings) this season, the best mark in the major leagues...deGrom leads the major leagues with a 0.54 ERA, while Marcus Stroman is 13th in the majors with a 2.35 mark...Taijuan Walker is 15th with a 2.42 ERA.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets are looking for their first series victory against the Braves at Citi Field since they swept a three-game set to end the 2019 season, September 27-29...The Mets have lost the season to the Braves in each of the last three years.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets have drawn 10 walks with the bases loaded this year, which is tied for third in the majors...The Brewers lead MLB with 14 walks with the bases full...Each of New York's 10 bases-loaded walks have been by a different player...The Mets are batting .151 with the bases loaded this year, which ranks 30th in the majors...Their .304 OBP is 20th.

REPLACE-METS: The Mets have used 46 players through 67 games this season...The team used a total of 47 players in 2020...The franchise record for most players used in a season is 56 by the 2018 Mets...New York has used 11 starting pitchers this year...The Mets also used 10 starters in 2020...The franchise record is 20 starters used in 1967.

SMILE LIKE YOU MEAN IT: Francisco Lindor is batting .274 (23-84) with 17 runs, four doubles, a triple, five home runs, 12 RBI, eight walks and an .868 OPS over his last 23 games...He is batting .257/.337/.486 slash line in 21 games this month with eight extra-base hits and 10 RBI...Lindor is one double away from 200 in his career...He is four home runs away from 150 as a major leaguer.

THREW ME FOR A LOUP: Aaron Loup has made 10 straight scoreless appearances, allowing four hits and striking out 11 in 8.1 innings...Overall, he is 2-0 with a 1.83 ERA (four earned runs/19.2 innings) with 18 hits, three walks and 24 strikeouts...He has held left-handed hitters to a .214 (6-28) batting average this season.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets are 29-5 when scoring four or more runs this season...The team is 7-25 when scoring three or fewer runs...The Mets are 32-7 when scoring first this season...The team's .821 winning percentage is the best record in the major leagues when scoring first this season.

HOMER BOUND: The Mets are 25-17 when hitting at least one home run and 12-5 when hitting two or more bombs...The Mets have hit 67 home runs this year, the third-fewest in the majors...On the other hand, the Mets have allowed only 57 home runs this season which is the second-fewest in MLB...They own a 0.91 home runs per 9 IP ratio...That is the third-best mark in the majors.

YES WE McCANN: James McCann is batting .296 (16-54) with six runs, three doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, three walks, a .356 OBP, a .519 SLG and an .874 OPS in 17 games this month...McCann hit one home run over his first 33 games with the club and has hit five in his last 23 games...He owns a .268/.325/.394 slash line against the NL East this season.

GET WELL SOON!: RHP Dellin Betances is currently on a rehab appearance with the St. Lucie Mets (A)...He has appeared in three games, allowing five earned runs on five hits with three walks and four strikeouts in 2.1 innings...OF Brandon Nimmo is on a rehab assignment with Syracuse yesterday...He went 1-2 with a run and started in centerfield in his first game on Sunday...Nimmo has been on the 10-Day IL since May 5 with a left index finger bone bruise.

HONORING HIS LEGACY: The New York Mets will wear a "41" Tom Seaver tribute patch on the right sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2021 season...Seaver passed away on August 31, 2020 at age 75...Seaver won 311 games, had a 2.86 ERA and struck out 3,640 batters over a 20-year major league career that spanned from 1967-1986, earning 12 All-Star selections in the process...He won three Cy Young Awards with the team in 1969, 1973 and 1975 as well as the NL Rookie of the Year Award in 1967.

THIS DAY IN METS HISTORY: On this day in 1987, Tom Seaver officially retired from baseball...He finished his career going 311-205 with a 2.86 ERA, 1,390 walks and 3,640 strikeouts across 20 seasons...Seaver spent 12 seasons with the Mets and went 198-124 with a 2.57 ERA with 847 walks and 2,571 strikeouts in 401 games (395 starts)..."The Franchise" was a three-time Cy Young Award winner, the 1967 NL Rookie of the Year and a 12-time All-Star...He was inducted into the Hall of Fame on his first ballot, receiving 425 of a possible 430 votes on the 1992 ballot...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

CONGRATS: Manager Gil Hodges, who helped transform the Mets from lovable losers to World Champions and pitcher Jerry Koosman, who won two games in the 1969 World Series vs. the Baltimore Orioles, will be enshrined in the New York State Baseball Hall of Fame on August 15 in Troy, NY...The duo was selected in 2020 but the ceremony was postponed because of COVID.

STROMAN NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Will make his 15th start of the season and eighth at Citi Field tonight...Will be his fifth career start against Atlanta and second against the Braves with the Mets...In his last start, Stroman pitched 7.0 innings, giving up two runs, earned, on four hits against the Cubs at Citi Field on June 17... After giving up a two-run homer in the first inning, Stroman pitched six-straight scoreless innings...Struck out a season-high-tying eight batters and walked just one in the Mets' 2-0 loss to the Cubs at Citi Field...Suffered his fifth loss of the season and first in his last six games.

A GOOD RUN: Stroman's 2.35 ERA (22 earned runs/84.1 innings) through 14 starts this season is his best 14-start stretch by that measure in his career...He has allowed two earned runs or fewer and pitched 5.0 innings or more in 11 of his 14 starts this year, tied for the sixth-most in the majors.

FEELING SIX-Y: Stroman has completed at least 6.0 innings in each of his last eight starts...That is the longest streak of his career...Stroman has a 2.50 ERA (14 earned runs/50.1 innings) over this stretch.

EXTRA, EXTRA: Stroman has allowed only 14 extra-base hits in 84.1 innings, the second-fewest among the 49 pitchers in the majors who have thrown at least 75.0 innings this season...Only Brandon Woodruff (12) has allowed fewer...Ranks 15th in the majors and 11th in the NL in opponent slugging (.325)...He has four starts this season in which he's pitched at least 5.0 innings without allowing a single extra-base hit, tied for the second-most in the majors.

KEEP IT ON THE GROUND: Stroman currently ranks second in the majors and leads the NL with a 54.7 percent ground ball rate...He is 17th in the NL with a 0.96 HR/9 ratio.

STAY HOT: Stroman has earned three wins in his last six starts, posting a 1.89 ERA (eight earned runs/38.0 innings)...He has allowed only three home runs in the stretch while walking nine and striking out 40...The Mets are 4-2 in those games.

VS. ATLANTA: Making his fifth career start against the Braves...Has gone 4-0 against Atlanta in those four starts with a 1.88 ERA (five earned runs/24.0 innings)...In his last start against the Braves on September 27, 2019, Stroman earned the win, tossing 6.0 innings and allowing two runs, earned, on six hits... Struck out eight batters and walked one in the Mets' 4-2 win at Citi Field... Stroman has earned a win in all four of his starts vs. the Braves...He has allowed two earned runs or fewer in all four of those outings...The last pitcher to win his first four career starts vs. Atlanta with a sub-2.00 ERA in those games was Adam Wainwright (2007-2009).

LET'S GO STREAKING: Stroman did not allow a run in his 14.1 innings until giving up a run in the seventh inning at Colorado on April 18...This scoreless streak extended from the last 2.0 innings of his first start on April 6, his 0.1 innings on April 11, his 6.0 scoreless innings on April 13 and his 6.0 scoreless innings on April 18...He fell 1.2 innings shy of tying his career-best streak (16.0 IP).

WITH THE METS: Stroman has gone 10-7 with a 2.94 ERA (47 earned runs/144.0 innings) in his 25 starts with New York...The Mets have gone 16-9 in his 25 starts after he joined the team on July 28, 2019...In 2019, he struck out 60 in 59.2 innings with the Mets (Stroman never averaged more than 9.0 K/9 in a season with Toronto).

 - Is hitting .274 (23-84) with four doubles, a triple, five homers, 12 RBI and 17 runs scored in his last 23 games (.868 OPS).
 - Has whiffed once per 6.34 PA (44 K/279 PA), the 13th-best rate in the NL...On the other hand, his 9.30 PA per walk ratio (30 BB/279 PA) is 20th in the NL.
 - Had a season-high eight-game hitting streak (.400, 14-35) from May 27-June 5...Had two doubles, a triple, two homers, four RBI and 10 runs scored in that span.
