METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets opened a five-game series against the Braves with a 6-4 victory last night...The Mets have won nine of their last 10 games and 13 of their last 17...This Mets are in a stretch of 27 games in 26 days (6-1), a span that includes two doubleheaders (August 6 vs. Atlanta and August 20 at Philadelphia) and one scheduled off day (August 11)...The Mets are 51-11 when scoring first this season...New York is 24-6-3 in 33 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-game homestand (1-0), their longest of the year, against the Braves (1-0), Reds (three games) and Phillies (three games).

LIGHT IT UP:: Tonight, the Empire State Building will act as a virtual scoreboard...Any time the Mets score a run, the Building will sparkle in blue and orange for one minute. Prior to tonight's game the Empire State Besties will throw out the honorary first pitch.

TYLER IS ON FIRE: According to *Elias,* Tyler Naquin became the first Mets player ever to have a multi-HR game in their first home game with the team...Previously, the last player in MLB to have two or more home runs in first home game with team was Eric Sogard on August 3, 2019 with Tampa Bay...Tyler Naquin slugged a solo home run in his first at-bat as a Met at Citi Field last night...He joined Rajai Davis (5/22/19) and Aaron Altherr (5/24/19) as the only Mets to homer in their first at-bat at Citi Field...In five games with the Mets, Naquin is batting .333 (6-18) with three runs, a double, a triple, two home runs, three RBI and a 1.167 OPS.

PAINT IT BLACK: Taijuan Walker is 3-0 with a 1.93 ERA (nine earned runs/42.0 innings) with 12 walks and 28 strikeouts in seven starts at Citi Field...Since the start of the 2021 season, Walker is 7-4 with a 2.98 ERA (44 earned runs/133.0 innings) with 40 walks and 116 strikeouts in 23 games (22 starts) at Citi Field...He has tossed four straight quality starts at Citi Field, going 2-0 with a 1.33 ERA (four earned runs/27.0 innings) with five walks and 22 strikeouts in that span

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 9-3 in the second-half...The team's nine wins are tied for the third-most in the majors...The team is batting .295/.356/.506 following the All-Star break...They lead the majors in average and are second in OBP and SLG following the All-Star Game...The team has posted a 3.20 ERA with 30 walks and 101 strikeouts in the second-half...The Mets are outscoring opponents 61-40 following the break

A BUCK 20: Buck Showalter has 1,618 career wins as a manager, one win shy of tying Ralph Houk for 20th place on the all-time list.

FIVE GUYS: The Mets have held opponents to five runs or less in 27 consecutive games, the longest streak in franchise history...The streak began on July 3...The previous mark was 24 games from September 30, 1977-April 28, 1978.

THE ROAD TO 100: Diaz has struck out 87 batters in 43 games this season...He is seeking to become the seventh reliever in franchise history to strike out 100 batters in a season... The last player to do that was Seth Lugo in 2019...His career-high best is 124 strikeouts in 73 games in 2018...His record with the Mets is 99 strikeouts in 66 games in 2019.

LET'S GO STREAKING!: Edwin Díaz converted his first career six out save last night...He has not allowed a run in his last 16 outings dating back to June 22, covering 16.1 innings, establishing a new career-high scoreless streak...33 of Díaz last 45 outs have been recorded via the strikeout...He was won back-to-back NL Reliver of the Month awards and since the start of June, Diaz has posted a 0.39 ERA (one earned runs/23.0 innings) with 11 hits, two walks and 49 strikeouts...He has converted all 13 saves in that period.

BRING OUT THE TRUMPETS: Díaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 87 strikeouts...That is 21 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has struck out 52.1% of batters faced (87/167), the highest strikeout rate by a relief pitcher through 43 appearances of a season in MLB history...His 17.93 strikeouts per nine innings is the best in the majors No other reliever has a K/9 rate over 16.00. Overall, he is 2-1 with 24 saves 1.44 ERA (seven earned runs/43.2 innings), allowing 27 hits and 12 walks...The Mets are 38-5 when Díaz appears in a game this year.

ALL THAT POWER: The Mets matched their season-high with four home runs last night... The team has hit nine home runs in their last four games and 18 in their last 10 games... The team has homered in nine of their last 10 games...The Mets are 53-17 when hitting a home run this year...They are 25-5 when hitting multiple home runs in a game in 2022.

**BACH IN BLACK:** The Mets acquired infielder Daniel Vogelbach from Pittsburgh on July 22...In 10 games with New York, the lefty has hit .333 (10-30) with four runs, two doubles, two home runs, seven walks, five RBI, with a 1.074 OPS...He has reached base safely in nine of those contests and in all of his starts...Vogelbach has posted a .275/.384/.550 slashline with 26 extra-base hits against right-handed hitters this year.

CONNECT FOUR: The Mets have won 25 consecutive games in which they've scored at least four runs, and are 35–1 since May 27 when scoring at least four times...Their 25 wins scoring four or more runs is tied for the longest such streak in franchise history and is the longest single-season streak with the streak from August 25, 1971-May 10, 1972...The 2021 Mets went 62-19 when scoring four or more...New York is 57-5 when scoring at least four runs in a game this year...The team's 57 wins when scoring at least four runs is tied for second in the majors...Their .919 winning percentage when scoring four or more runs is the best in the majors

**30 FOR 20:** Pete Alonso has hit 29 home runs this season...He is seeking to become the fifth player in Mets history to record multiple seasons with 30 or more home runs...Mike Piazza is the franchise leader, recording four such seasons...Howard Johnson, Darryl Strawberry and Dave Kingman have all recorded three seasons with at least 30 or more home runs...Alonso ranks seventh in team history with 135 home runs. BRAVES-METS NOTES: Starting with this series, the Mets will play the Braves nine times over the next two weeks

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Last night, Alonso joined Mike Piazza (1999, 2000) and Carlos Beltran (2006) as the only Mets to have 90 or more RBI by their 104th game of the season...In 12 games since the All-Star break, Pete Alonso is batting .386 (17-44) with 11 runs, five doubles, five home runs, 13 RBI, seven walks with a .481 OBP and a.841 SLG...Alonso ranks second in the majors and tops the NL with 91 RBI...He is tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in the NL with 29 home runs...Alonso is seventh in the majors and third in the NL with a .554 SLG.

THE EAST IS A BEAST: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 straight games against the NL East and 18 of their next 21 games vs. their division...The Mets are 6-1 during the stretch... Overall, the Mets are 34-13 against the East this year...Their .723 division winning Overall, the Mets are 34-13 against the East this year...Their ...23 division winning percentage is the best in baseball...They have not lost a series in the division all season long...According to ESPN Stats & Info, New York has either won or tied each of their 14 series this season against the East...That is the third-longest streak by a team to start a season since the MLB implemented divisions in 1969...It's the longest since the Braves went 16 straight to start the 1999 season...Since May 27, the team has gone 21-6 in the division...Overall, the Mets have posted a 3.05 ERA against the East, while hitting 241/328/2426. The Mets have outscored their divisional encempants 240-150. .261/.338/.426...The Mets have outscored their divisional opponents 240-150.

**HECK OR HIGH-WATER MARK:** The Mets are a season-high 29 games over .500...Prior to this year, it's the most games over .500 since they were 32 games over with a record of 97-65 to end the 2006 season...New York has won 67 games this season, second-most in the National League...Their .638 winning percentage is fourth in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 67-38 record through the team's first 105 games...Only the 1986 (71-34) team posted a better record through the first 105 games of games of the season

**CITI SLICKERS:** The Mets have played 49 games at Citi Field this year, which is tied for the third-fewest in the majors and the second-fewest in the National League...By comparison, the Braves have played 59 home games, the most in the majors...The Mets are 32-17 at home...They are fourth in the majors and second in the National League with a. 653 winning percentage at home...The Mets have posted a 3.29 ERA with 146 walks and 471 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

SEVENTH HEAVEN: Jeff McNeil is on a seven-game hitting streak, batting .433 (13-30) with four runs, five doubles, a home run, three RBI with a .452 OBP and a .700 SLG in that span...He has recorded four multi-hit games in that span...McNeil has recorded 106 doubles in his career, which times him with Curtis Granderson for 28th in franchise history...Next up is Tommie Agee with 107 doubles.

**FOR STARTERS:** Since Max Scherzer returned from the Injured List on July 5, Mets starters have posted a 2.01 ERA (34 earned runs/152.1 innings) in the team's last 25 games with 157 strikeouts and 39 walks...That is over a full run better than the next-best club, the Dodgers (3.02)...The team's starters ERA has dropped from 4.09 to 3.54 in that span...The Mets rank fifth in the majors and second in the National League with a 3.54 ERA from their starters

A HIT'S A HIT: The Mets lead the major leagues with 135 infield hits this year...That is eight more than the second-place team, the Cleveland Guardians...Brandon Nimmo and Jeff McNeil are tied for sixth in the National League with 17 infield hits...Mark Canha and Starling Marte have each recorded 16 of their own.

LINDOR CITY OVER HERE: Francisco Lindor had his hitting streak snapped at 10 games He is on an 11-game on-base streak...Since July 23, he is batting .400 (16-40) with 10 runs, four doubles, three home runs, eight RBI, eight walks with a .500 OBP and a .725 SLG...In 29 games since the start of July, Lindor is batting .310/.395/.558 with 19 runs, five doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 18 RBI, 15 walks and a .953 OPS...He ranks tied for second in the majors with 20 go-ahead RBI behind teammate Pete Alonso (26)...He ranks 11th in the majors and seventh in the National League with a 4.3 fWAR.

**20/20 VISION:** Francisco Lindor has recorded 74 RBI in 104 games this season (72 as a shortstop)...That is the second-most RBI by a shortstop in Mets history...José Reyes owns the record, recording 81 RBI in 153 games in 2006...He has hit 19 home runs this season (18 as a shortstop)...Asdrúbal Cabrera set the franchise record with 22 home runs as a shortstop in 2016...He is seeking to become the first shortstop in Mets history to record 20 home runs in multiple seasons...Lindor blasted 20 home runs in 2021...Lindor has recorded 104 hits this season, matching his total from 2021...Francisco Lindor is sixth in the majors and fourth in the NL with 74 RBI...The Mets are the only team in the majors with two players with 70 or more RBI this season.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Picked up his ninth win of the season on July 31 against the Marlins at Marlins Park...Walker allowed three runs over 5.2 innings on seven hits, two walks and four strikeouts...Was the first time Walker allowed three or more runs in consecutive games since he did so in four straight starts from August 18-September 11, 2021 and was the first time allowing seven or more hits in consecutive starts since August 16-21, 2017...Ended a career-best streak nine straight starts with at least 6.0 innings.

**WINNING WAYS:** Walker has earned the win in his last six decisions, a careerhigh...He joins Carlos Carrasco (May 3-June 6) as the only Mets pitcher to win six straight decisions this season...The last Mets pitcher to win in seven straight decisions was Zack Wheeler who did so from July 14-August 25, 2018...Walker's six-game winning streak in his last six decisions is the fourth-longest active winning streak.

**QUALITY EATS:** Walker had a quality start in eight consecutive starts from June 24-July 26, the longest streak of his career...The streak came to an end in his last start on 7/31 when he fell 0.1 inning short of extending the streak...During that span, Walker went 5-0 with a 2.12 ERA (12 ER/51.0 IP) with 51 strikeouts and 11 walks...His streak was tied with Noah Syndergaard (July 13-August 22, 2019) for the longest quality start streak by a Mets pitcher since 2019.

**NO FLY ZONE:** Walker has allowed just seven home runs in 103.1 innings this season, good for a 0.61 HR/9 ratio...That is the 10th-lowest rate among qualified starting pitchers...Walker allowed a three-run home run to Brandon Drury in third inning on July 4, ending a season-high streak of 32.2 innings, spanning five starts...In five starts from May 12-June 2, Walker had not yielded a long ball, totaling 29.2 innings...The streak ended after he allowed a leadoff home run to Jurickson Profar on June 7.

**FEW Ks, THAT'S OK:** Through 18 starts this season, Walker has a K/9 rate of 6.97 and an ERA of 2.79...Miles Mikolas (2.86 ERA, 6.80 K/9) is the only other pitcher with an ERA under 3.00 with a lower strikeout rate (min. 18 starts)...Since 2013, Walker's 80 strikeouts are tied for the 13 fewest by a pitcher's first 18 starts of the season (Min. 90.0 IP).

**FLOURISHED IN THE FIRST HALF:** In 16 first half starts, Walker went 7-2 with a 2.55 ERA (26 ER/91.2 IP)...His 2.55 ERA is the lowest first half mark in his career and his seven wins are tied with 2021 season for the most in Walker's career during the first half of the season...Walker is the eighth Mets starting pitcher to allow four or fewer first half home runs (Min. 12 first half starts).

**BRINGING THE HEAT AGAINST HOTLANTA:** In five career starts against the Braves, Walker is 1-1 with a 2.88 ERA (8 ER/25.0 IP)...Last season, Walker went 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (5 ER/13.0 IP) with 17 strikeouts in three starts against Atlanta last season.

**CITI SLICKER:** In seven starts at Citi Field this season, Walker is 3-0 with a 1.93 ERA (9 ER/42.0 IP)...Walker has the ninth-lowest ERA at home this season among starting pitchers that have made at least seven home starts in the majors...In each of the last two seasons, Walker has sported a sub-2.000 ERA through his first seven home starts of the season (2021: 1.98 ERA)...Since joining the Mets in 2021, Walker is 7-4 with a 2.98 ERA (44 earned runs/133.0 innings) in 23 games (22 starts).

**NICE TRY:** Walker leads the majors with four pickoffs this season...Since 2021, Walker has eight pickoffs, the most by a right-handed pitcher during that span and tied for the second-most overall in that span...His 17 pickoffs since his debut year of 2013 are the fourth-most by a right-handed pitcher.
