### WALKER NEWS & NOTES

**LAST TIME OUT:** Picked up his ninth win of the season on July 31 against the Marlins at Marlins Park...Walker allowed three runs over 5.2 innings on seven hits, two walks and four strikeouts...Was the first time Walker allowed three or more runs in consecutive games since he did so in four straight starts from August 18-September 11, 2021 and was the first time allowing seven or more hits in consecutive starts since August 16-21, 2017...Ended a career-best streak nine straight starts with at least 6.0 innings.

**WINNING WAYS:** Walker has earned the win in his last six decisions, a career-high...He joins Carlos Carrasco (May 3-June 6) as the only Mets pitcher to win six straight decisions this season...The last Mets pitcher to win in seven straight decisions was Zack Wheeler who did so from July 14-August 25, 2018...Walker's six-game winning streak in his last six decisions is the fourth-longest active winning streak.

**QUALITY EATS:** Walker had a quality start in eight consecutive starts from June 24-July 26, the longest streak of his career...The streak came to an end in his last start on 7/31 when he fell 0.1 inning short of extending the streak...During that span, Walker went 5-0 with a 2.12 ERA (12 ER/51.0 IP) with 51 strikeouts and 11 walks...His streak was tied with Noah Syndergaard (July 13-August 22, 2019) for the longest quality start streak by a Mets pitcher since 2019.

**NO FLY ZONE:** Walker has allowed just seven home runs in 103.1 innings this season, good for a 0.61 HR/9 ratio...That is the 10th-lowest rate among qualified starting pitchers...Walker allowed a three-run home run to Brandon Drury in third inning on July 4, ending a season-high streak of 32.2 innings, spanning five starts...In five starts from May 12-June 2, Walker had not yielded a long ball, totaling 29.2 innings...The streak ended after he allowed a leadoff home run to Jurickson Profar on June 7.

**FEW Ks, THAT'S OK:** Through 18 starts this season, Walker has a K/9 rate of 6.97 and an ERA of 2.79...Miles Mikolas (2.86 ERA, 6.80 K/9) is the only other pitcher with an ERA under 3.00 with a lower strikeout rate (min. 18 starts)...Since 2013, Walker's 80 strikeouts are tied for the 13 fewest by a pitcher's first 18 starts of the season (Min. 90.0 IP).

**FLOURISHED IN THE FIRST HALF:** In 16 first half starts, Walker went 7-2 with a 2.55 ERA (26 ER/91.2 IP)...His 2.55 ERA is the lowest first half mark in his career and his seven wins are tied with 2021 season for the most in Walker's career during the first half of the season...Walker is the eighth Mets starting pitcher to allow four or fewer first half home runs (Min. 12 first half starts).

**BRINGING THE HEAT AGAINST HOTLANTA:** In five career starts against the Braves, Walker is 1-1 with a 2.88 ERA (8 ER/25.0 IP)...Last season, Walker went 1-1 with a 3.46 ERA (5 ER/13.0 IP) with 17 strikeouts in three starts against Atlanta last season.

**CITI SLICKER:** In seven starts at Citi Field this season, Walker is 3-0 with a 1.93 ERA (9 ER/42.0 IP)...Walker has the ninth-lowest ERA at home this season among starting pitchers that have made at least seven home starts in the majors...In each of the last two seasons, Walker has sported a sub-2.000 ERA through his first seven home starts of the season (2021: 1.98 ERA)...Since joining the Mets in 2021, Walker is 7-4 with a 2.98 ERA (44 earned runs/133.0 innings) in 23 games (22 starts).

**NICE TRY:** Walker leads the majors with four pickoffs this season...Since 2021, Walker has eight pickoffs, the most by a right-handed pitcher during that span and tied for the second-most overall in that span...His 17 pickoffs since his debut year of 2013 are the fourth-most by a right-handed pitcher.

- Is tied for second in MLB with 20 go-ahead RBI...Tied for 10th in the NL with 64 runs...Ranks sixth in MLB and fourth in the NL with 74 RBI.
- Has a 1.121 OPS since the All-Star break, the eighth-best mark in the NL.
- Is one home run shy of his second 20-homer season with the Mets...Asdrúbal Cabrera has the only other 20+ HR season by a Mets shortstop (23 in 2016).
- Needs eight RBI to establish a Mets single-season record for a shortstop...José Reyes (81 in 2006) currently holds the mark.
- Has homered in three of his last six games...Has five doubles, a triple, six home runs, 17 RBI and 16 runs scored in his last 22 games.
- Has four multi-hit games in his last 10 contests...The Mets are 20-5 when he has multiple hits in a game this year.
- Crushed a three-run shot on August 1 at Washington...Hitting .412/.500/1.059 with runners in scoring position since July 9.
- Stole his 10th base of the season in the first half finale at Chicago-NL on July 17...Stole 10 bases all of last season...He is one of five players in the majors with 10+ home runs and 10+ steals in at least seven of the last eight seasons, joining José Ramírez, Trea Turner, Mookie Betts and Marcus Semien.
- Has 55 RBI and 46 runs scored in his last 70 games...Had a 10-game RBI streak from May 22-June 1 and had 20 RBI overall in that span...It was the longest streak in the majors this season and tied for the second-longest in Mets history...The only Met with a longer RBI streak is Mike Piazza (15 games).
- Has surpassed his season production from 2021 in hits and RBI...Had 16 home runs and 66 RBI in 92 first-half games this season...Last year, had 11 home runs and 36 RBI in 87 first-half games and finished the year with 20 home runs and 63 RBI in 125 games.

- Is one of the toughest players to strike out in the majors...Ranks 12th in the majors and fourth in the NL in strikeout rate (8.09 PA/K).
- Named the starting second baseman for the NL All-Star squad...Went 0-1 with a hit by pitch in the game at Dodger Stadium...Joined Ron Hunt (1964) as the only Mets 2B to start a Midsummer Classic.

- Missed 31 games on the Injured List from June 1-July 4 with a strained left quad.
